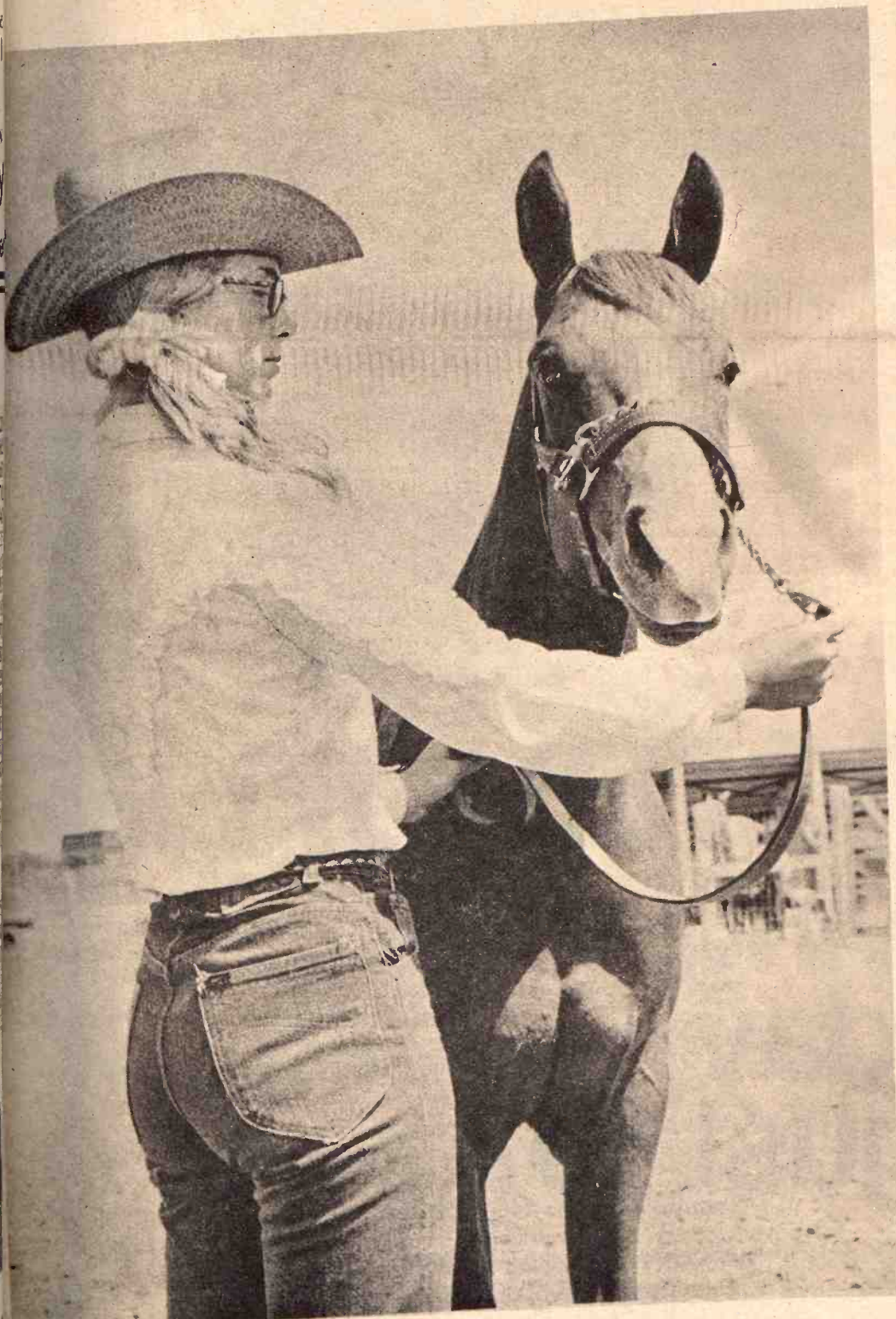

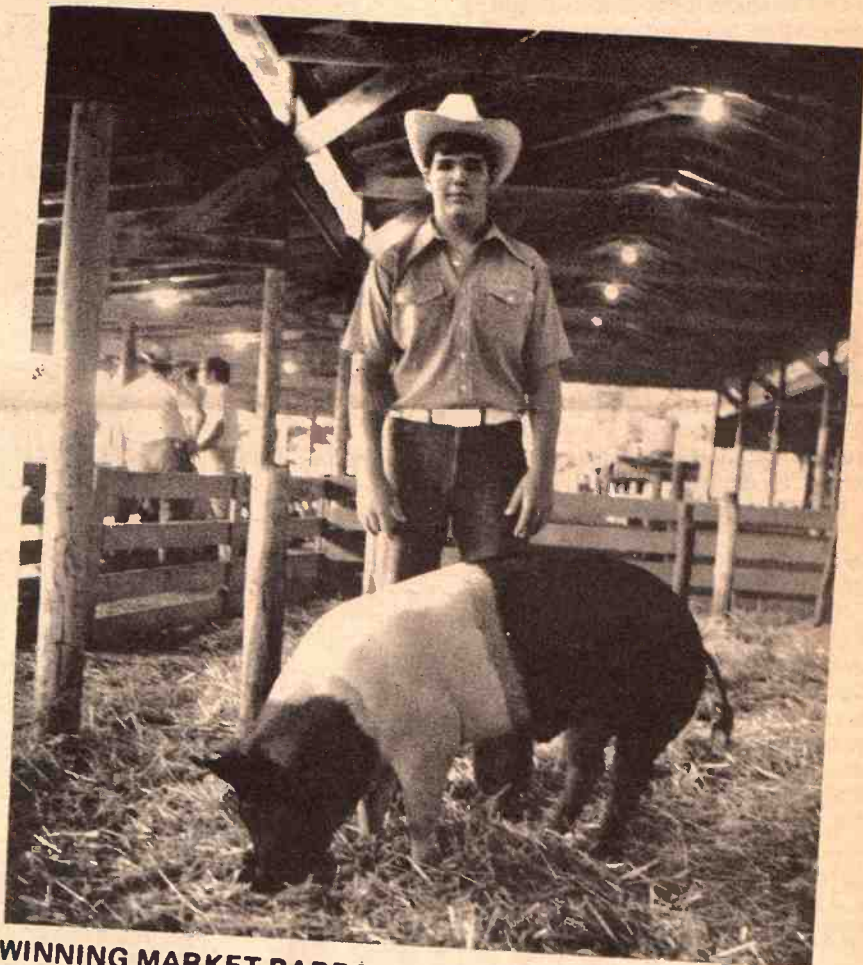

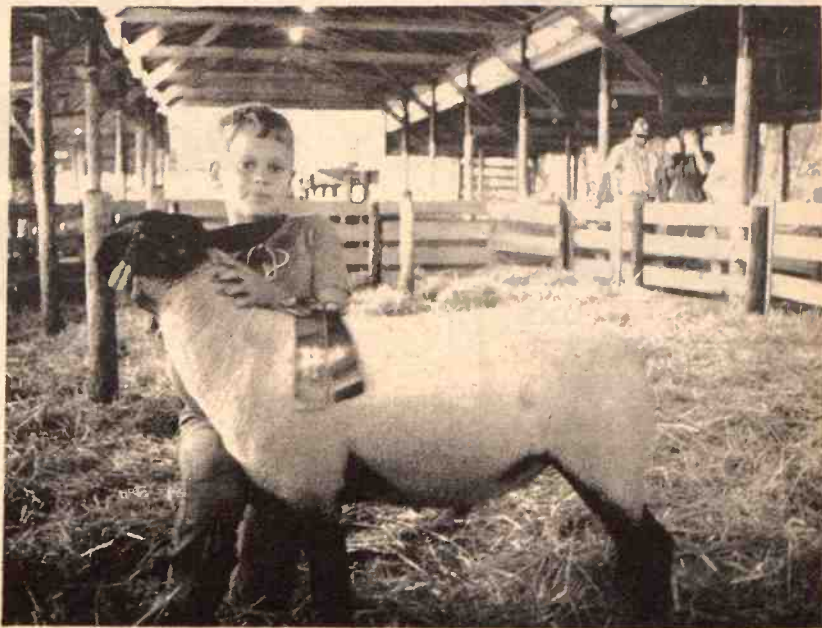
#### CHAMPION WITH HORSES

#### WINNING MARKET BARROW

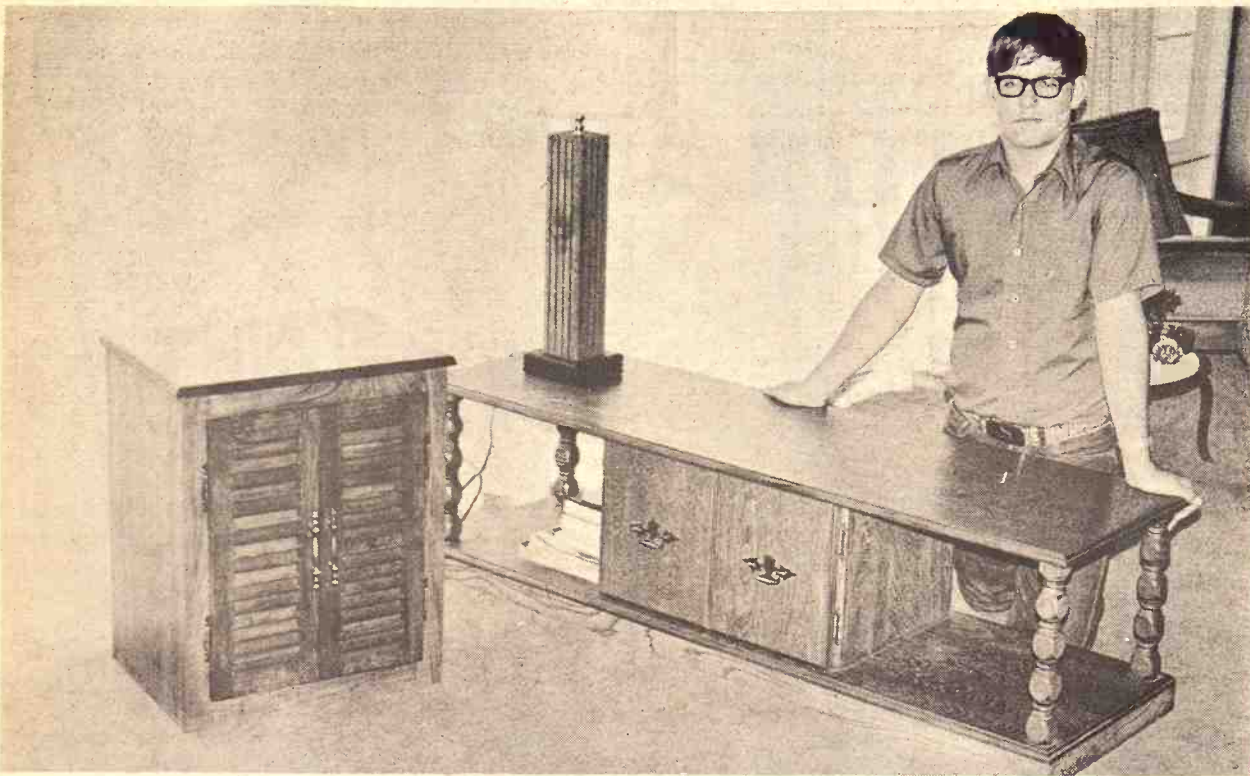

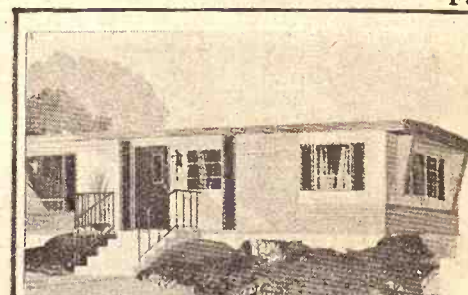

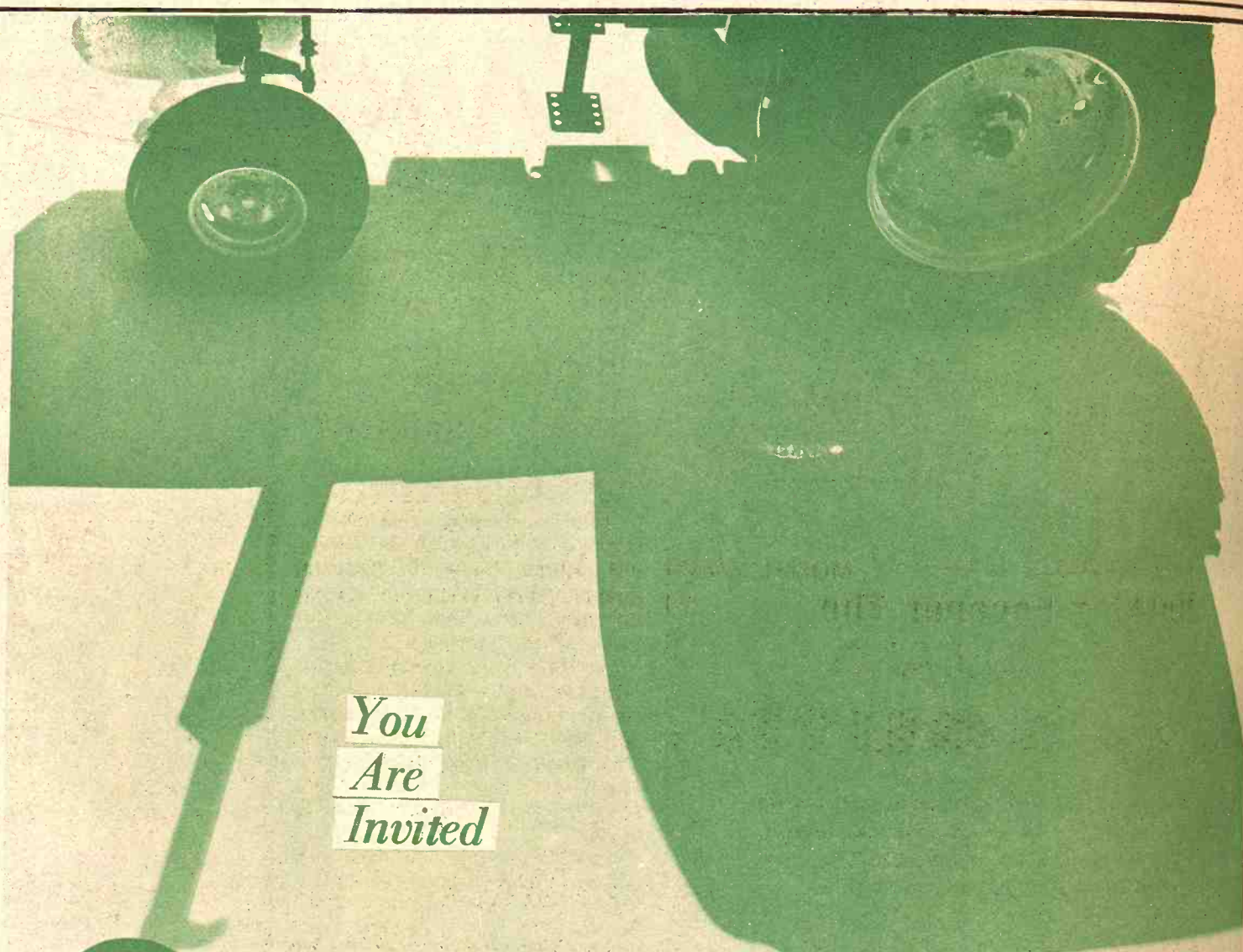

## McGovern After OP Farm Votes, Butz A Target

en. George McGovern is expected to make an all-out bid for the ally Republican farm vote this convinced that a troubled rural erican can help send him to the te House.  
ose associates of the South uta senator say he will soon n a clear-cut, determined, apaign for the rural vote.  
ey say he will accuse the Nixon nistration of trying to create a sy facade of prosperity to show ners this election year while owing a policy that can lead only ore supersize farms and an

agricultural scene where the very large dominate the very small.  
The sum of Nixon policies, McGovern will say, points to ghost-town rural areas, deprived of jobs, decimated in population and isolated from economic growth.  
But confident Republicans say McGovern will have a tough job convincing farmers and smalltowners to vote Democratic this year.  
The GOP strategists carefully avoid the phrase, but they mean "farmers never had it so good." At least, they say, not under the Democrats.  
Farm income is expected to be record high this year. Livestock prices, particularly for cattle, are high. Grain markets, burdened by surpluses six months ago, may be much improved next fall.

New trade accommodations with the Soviet Union point to expanded farm exports, a key factor in Nixon strategy for boosting farm income. Above all, the Nixon people say, farmers are the same as other Americans and will vote mainly on the big issues of Vietnam and the over-all economy.  
Why then does McGovern think he can develop a broad rural base, particularly among farmers?  
Foremost, according to one close McGovern associate, is the rosy Nixon line promulgated by Secretary of Agriculture Earl L. Butz, hand-picked late last year to lead the GOP farm wagon in 1972.  
"Butz is moving into the campaign with a very mushy position on farm policy issues," the source said, asking now to be identified. "With the 1970 farm act expiring next year, Butz and Nixon still are not willing to say what exactly they have in mind thereafter."

The 1970 farm program law, advocated by the Nixon team, will be a major McGovern target as indicated by the party's platform adopted in Miami Beach. McGovern voted against the 1970 act, preferring instead an extension of earlier — and more stringent — crop control programs.

Basically, the current programs affecting the key crops of feed grain, wheat and cotton through next year allow a relatively low government "price support" guarantee but also provide direct subsidies to supplement incomes of participating growers who agree to idle part of their land.

A major feature, one supported vigorously by Butz and others in the GOP, is the "set-aside" approach for taking surplus land from production.

pleasure ages 12 to 13 and western horsemanship ages 12 to 13.

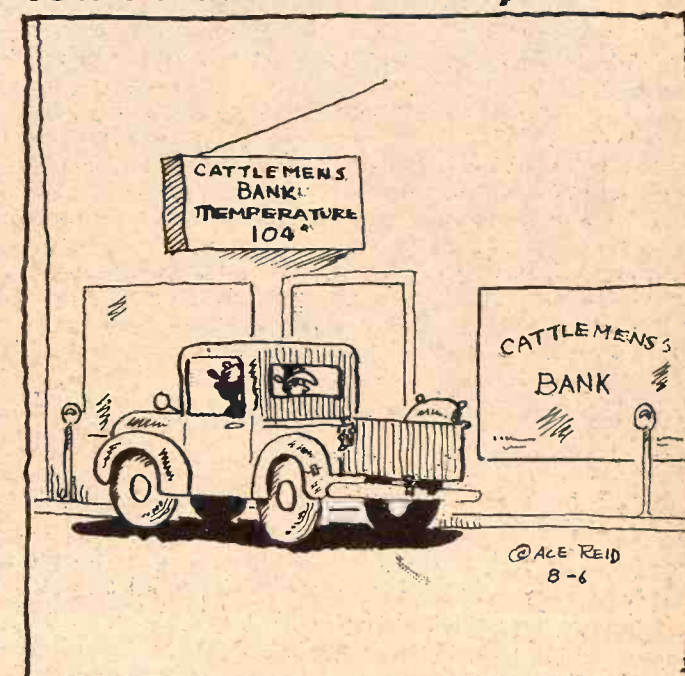
Vickie Miller and Debbie Miller of Kanwaka 4-H Club each won a blue ribbon in the western pleasure class for those 16 and older. Debbie and

#### TRAINING FOR THE FAIR

Kevin, Karen, and Brian Harris, of Hope, have been trying to tame down their wild woolies for the Dickinson County Free Fair, Aug. 21-25, in Abilene. It takes time and patience to get any animal ready for a fair and after all that work many 4-H'ers find it hard to part with their animals at fair sale time. Brian says that the Dickinson County Fair has one of the largest livestock entries in the state which makes competition even tougher. Their parents are Mr. and Mrs. Bill Harris and they are members of the Holland Sunflower 4-H club.

### Kansas Average Wheat Price Up

The State's farmers received an average price of \$1.31 per bushel for wheat at mid-July, 4 cents above the previous month and 2 cents above July a year ago, according to the Kansas Crop and Livestock Reporting Service.

The Kansas July wheat price was 1 cent below the U.S. average and the same as the average for the West North Central States.

Wheat prices by grades at mid-July were \$1.32 for No. 1, \$1.30 for No. 2, \$1.28 for No. 3 and an average of \$1.26 for No. 4 and lower grades. Country grain buyers in Kansas indicated about 86 percent of the wheat purchased graded No. 1, while 13 percent graded No. 2 and 1 percent graded No. 3 or lower.

The Nation's wheat producers received an average price of \$1.32 per bushel at mid-July, 1 cent below a month earlier, and 2 cents below July 1971.

The U.S. wheat price was 44 percent of parity, unchanged from a month earlier and 2 points below a year ago.

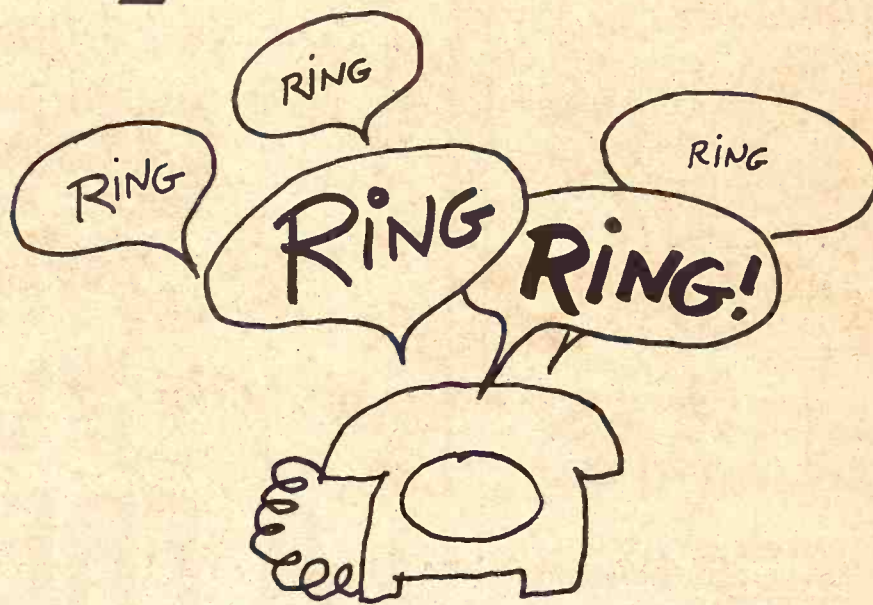

# Inners And Outers" Blamed For Farm Price Fluctuation

White corn serves to illustrate that "inner and outer" hasn't entirely disappeared from the farm scene. The obvious fact is that a lot of "outers" last year in the planting of white corn are "outers" again this year. The acreage planted to white in this year is less than half of what it was a year ago.

Years past, the inners and outers were blamed for many of the price fluctuations in farm prices. When prices rose on a product the blame was for everybody to at-

tempt to get in on a good thing. Hogs can serve as an example. Stimulated by a high market, farmers who had at all would decide to raise and feed a few litters. In addition, the barber, banker or anyone else in rural areas would get into the act by also raising some hogs for the apparent high price.

But when all this added production reached the market, prices would plunge. The newcomer would take a beating and quit the business at least until sometime in the future when he again would be lured by a strong market.

The farmer who maintained a steady level of production would

suffer from the low prices created by the surplus, but he at least would be in a position to benefit from a rising market, something the inner and outer seldom experienced.

Farmers still are not able to regulate production perfectly to demand, but production and markets are affected much less now by the inners and outers than some years ago. For one thing, it costs too much now suddenly to get into production on any product. Today's large farmers tend to vary their farming patterns much less than the small farmers of a few decades past. The larger farmers also indicate by their actions that they are better

students of markets and thus less inclined to go overboard in response to a strong price. In other words, they take better advantage of all market information.

In addition, current systems of production tend toward less violent swings in output. The big cattle feedlot operator, as an example, tries to maintain a steady population in his lots and he markets regularly throughout the whole year.

White corn is an excellent example of a crop on which reliable information is lacking, thus making it difficult for growers to come to prudent decisions. Price has been the only guiding factor.

For more than two decades until last year the U.S. Department of Agriculture had not maintained statistics on white corn. No mention was made regular crop reports on acreage devoted to white corn, nor to yields. Corn was corn, and it was all yellow as far as statistics were concerned. There was and still is no futures market on white corn.

Beginning in the spring of 1971, the USDA in a crop report estimated the white corn acreage as separate from the white. This estimate was that 922,000 acres would be planted. Since there had been no previous reports, no comparisons could be made with former years. But everybody knew that white corn had been traded as high as \$2.85 a bushel at the Kansas City Board of Trade the fall of 1970.

That was the year of the blight, and white corn presumably was affected the same as yellow. Prices on the white corn were much higher than on the yellow variety. White corn is used primarily for human food; yellow corn for livestock and poultry.

The USDA raised its sights on the white corn crop later in the year and finally estimated 1,131,000 acres were planted in 1971, with 1,067,000 acres harvested.

The crop was far more than the market would take at the previous year's prices. In fact, it was obvious that newcomers in white corn production had created a surplus. Prices dropped as low as \$1.10 a bushel in Kansas City which, of course, would mean an even lower quotation at the farm. Processors will pay a premium to get white corn for food for humans, when a premium is necessary to get what they want, but hog feeders would rather have the yellow variety for hogs. Thus, when there is a surplus of white corn and the only outlet is for livestock feed, it actually sells at a discount.

Millions of bushels of white corn were sold this last winter for livestock feed. Some of it was mixed with yellow - in a carload of corn, five bushels out of every hundred can be white without discounting the value of the yellow.

But the "outers" apparently learned their lesson. This year, the USDA estimated in its July crop report, farmers planted only 450,000 acres to white corn (57.3 million acres to all corn for grain). Illinois farmers cut back from 145,000 acres last year to 40,000 in 1972. Missouri reduced its acreage from 117,000 last year to 45,000; Kentucky from 289,000 to 113,000; 92.0. Percentage-wise Kansas made a smaller cut from 102,000 acres last year to 50,000 this year. The above are the big white corn states.

How much white corn is needed? No statistics are available. Some grain men at the Kansas City Board of Trade who specialize in handling the white variety say 45 to 50 million bushels might be in the ball park on utilization for human food.

With no futures market available, it is not possible at this time for the market to predict whether this year's planted acreage will provide an adequate supply. Nor are there any figures on the probable carry-over.

White corn in recent days has sold at around \$1.34 a bushel in Kansas City, a little over prices on the yellow variety, indicating that some of the surplus has been worked off.

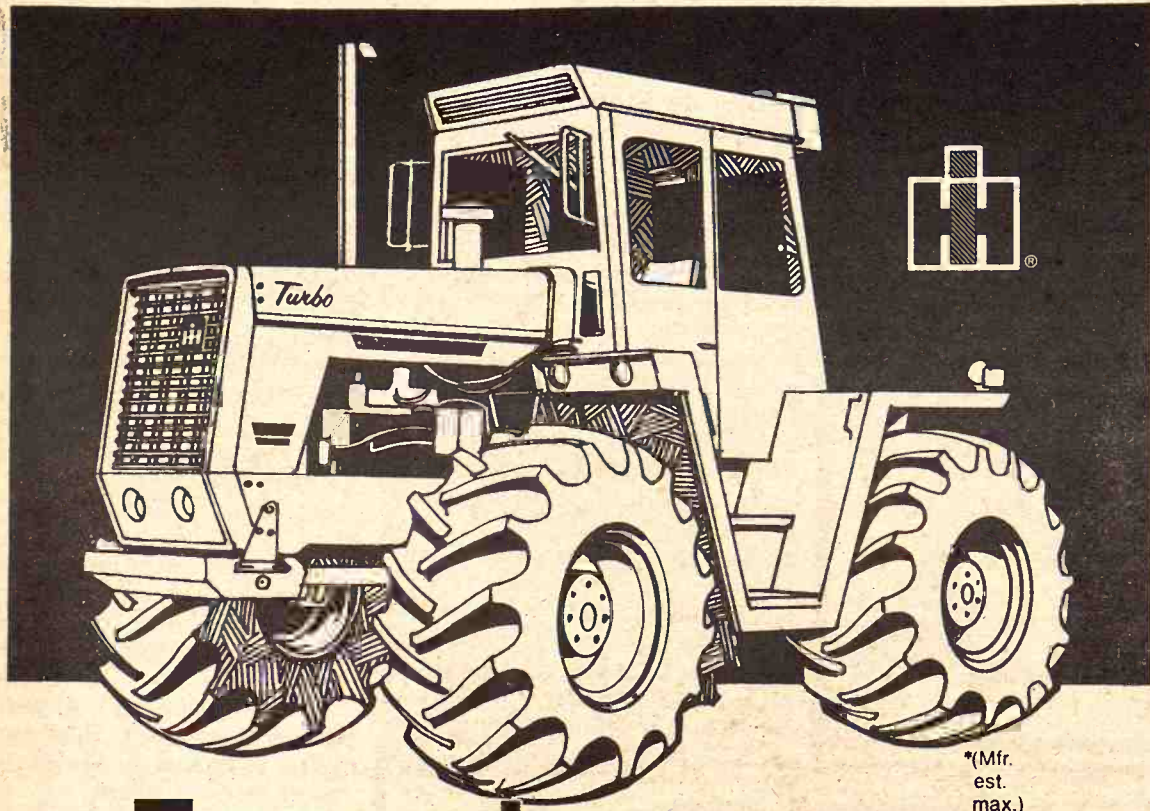

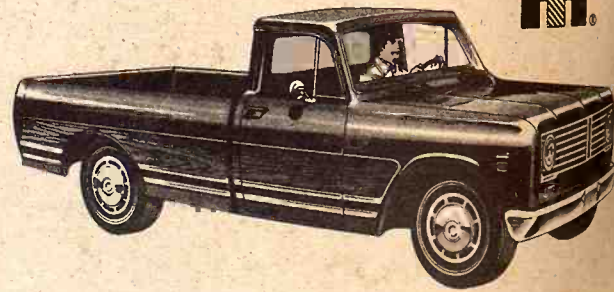

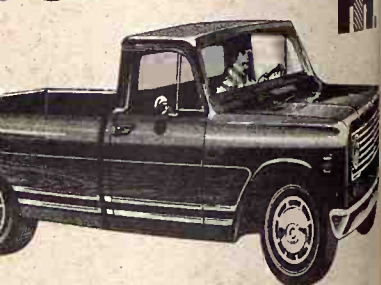

## Wood Floors Must Have Proper Sealing

Ninety per cent of all homes in the United States have at least one wood floor, making wood the most popular flooring material, according to a recent survey. Its two biggest assets, natural beauty and durability, have contributed greatly to its popularity.

In contrast to what many persons believe, wood flooring does not take care of itself. Like other flooring materials, it must be cared for to retain its beauty.

It is important to recognize that wood is porous and absorptive. Therefore, it is necessary to seal wood properly before using it. With few exceptions, the sealing job goes hand in hand with the installation or refinishing of wood floors.

Frequent cleaning of wood floors, combined with a regular program of waxing, is just as important as

proper sealing. How often floors should be cleaned depends on the amount of traffic in the room.

The most important thing to remember about cleaning wood floors is to avoid using water or water-based products when possible since water can cause warping or swelling.

An unoled dry mop or vacuum cleaner is best for day-to-day cleaning. Many stains can be wiped away with a damp cloth. A steel-wool pad may have to be used for more stubborn stains.

If the floor is particularly soiled, it must be rewaxed, using a specially formulated wood wax, often containing cleaner.

There are three types of wax for wood floors. Buffable paste waxes give a good shine but require frequent buffing with an electric

floor polisher. Buffable liquid wax is similar to the paste waxes but easier to apply. However, it is not quite as durable as the paste type.

The third type is a newcomer:

Self-polishing cleaner-wax. The manufacturer's directions must be followed carefully. It can also be used on wood cabinets and paneling.

Now on the market is a portable drier that goes anywhere there is a standard three-pronged grounded electrical outlet.

Weighing only 60 pounds and requiring no venting, the drier takes up less space than a kitchen chair and can be used or stored in a closet, bathroom, basement, alcove, under a counter, in a kitchen corner or even mounted on the wall off the floor.

The small drier offers the same features as a full-sized drier, even a permanent press cycle, but has a smaller five-pound capacity drum best suited to the personal needs of an individual or couple. It is also an ideal choice for the small home or efficiency apartment, dormitory room, summer cottage or mobile home. It will fit most anywhere.

The unit offers a normal drying cycle, a fluff cycle and a permanent press cycle. The normal cycle for cottons and linens offers up to 140 minutes of drying time; the permanent press cycle has a short 20-40 minute setting and a cool-down period. The fluff cycle tumbles without heat to remove wrinkles and restore naps to sweaters and deep

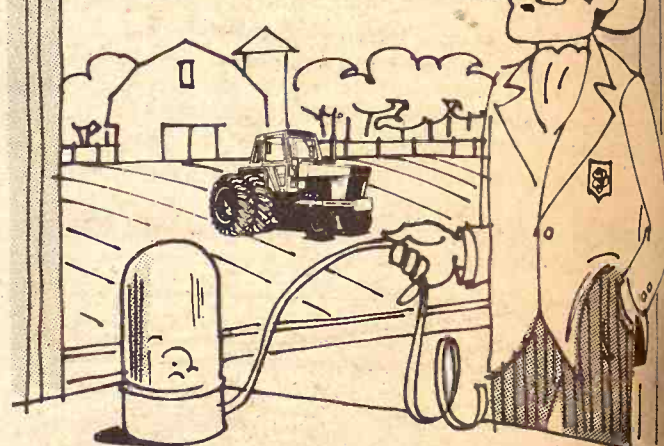

## Livestock Shipments From Southwestern United States Under Screwworm Check

Livestock moving from Texas, Oklahoma, Puerto Rico and parts of Arizona, California and New Mexico must be inspected and certified free of screwworms before being moved interstate under a new regulation proposed by the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA).

Ideal temperature and moisture conditions since the beginning of the year have resulted in an overwhelming invasion of screwworms in Mexico. The new regulatory ion was taken by USDA's Animal Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS) to help prevent the spread of screwworms — particularly in Florida and other southeastern states where the fly can overwinter. The Southeast is particularly vulnerable because livestockmen have stopped inspecting their animals for screwworm-infested areas. The last area of infestation

was eliminated from Florida in 1959. The new regulation will be in effect through Nov. 30 of this year, and from April 15 through Nov. 30 in subsequent years until the present invasion is overcome. All interstate animal shipments from the infested area—Texas, Oklahoma, Puerto Rico and parts of New Mexico, Arizona and California—must be inspected, treated if necessary, and certified free of screwworms 24 hours before shipping. In addition, livestock, except certain horses, moving from the infested area into or through Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Louisiana, Mississippi, South Carolina and Tennessee must be sprayed or dipped with an approved pesticide before shipment.

State and Federal veterinarians, State and Federal livestock inspectors and accredited

veterinarians are authorized to make the necessary inspections, supervise pesticide applications and issue shipping certificates.

The regulated area includes the entire States of Texas and Oklahoma; Cochise, Gila, Graham, Greenlee, Maricopa, Pima, Pinal, Santa Cruz, Yavapai and Yuma counties in Arizona; Imperial, Kern, Los Angeles, Orange, Riverside, Santa Barbara, San Bernardino, San Diego, San Luis, Obispo and Ventura counties in California; Catron, Chaves, DeBaca, Dona Ana, Eddy, Grant, Hidalgo, Lea, Lincoln, Luna, Ctero, Roosevelt, Sierra and Socorro counties in New Mexico; and the entire Commonwealth of Puerto Rico.

Record numbers of screwworm cases continue in the Southwest. To combat the unusual situation this year, sterile fly production at the Mission, Tex., facility was increased to full capacity this spring, and is being maintained at this level.

The livestock shipping regulations become effective on publication in the Federal Register scheduled for July 29.

## State Spending Exceeds Sources By \$25 Million

State spending in Kansas in fiscal 1971 exceeded revenue from all sources by more than \$25 million, statistics from the Division of Accounts and Reports in Topeka show.

Past fiscal records show revenue exceeded spending by more than \$30 million in 1969, and more than \$20 million in 1968. Figures for fiscal 1970 showed the state took in slightly more than \$1 million above expenditures.

The breakdown of State revenue in the fiscal year 1971 ending June 30, in rounded figures, is:

Ad valorem property taxes, \$10,459,000; income and inheritance taxes, \$116,820,000; sales and compensation taxes, \$158,435,000; motor fuel taxes, \$84,106,000; auto registration taxes, \$29,681,000; other excise taxes, \$37,125,000; gross receipts taxes, \$13,601,000; employee security contributions, \$15,506,000. Total taxes, \$464,996,000.

Agency contributions, (includes collection for licenses, and services) \$97,459,000; revenue from use of state funds and property, and dormitory collections, \$35,459,000.

Federal grants, \$229,459,000; other grants, \$12,104,000; social welfare contributions, \$1,794,000; other revenue, \$289,800; net operating revenue, \$841,405,000.

Fiscal 1971 expenditures: Salaries and wages, \$264,761,000; contractual services \$69,878,000; commodities, \$37,553,000; capital outlay, \$113,709,000; grants, claims, and shared revenue, \$395,860,000; debt service interest, \$2,341,000; total expenditures, \$884,102,000.

The adjusted net operating expenditures, with \$17,180,000 taken from the operating revenue, totals \$866,922,000.

An official in the Division of Accounts and Reports said the figures are based on cash paid out, regardless of what year the funds were appropriated for.

Nationally, revenue rose 9.3 per

cent to a record \$97.2 billion, according to the Census Bureau. Expenditures rose 16.2 per cent to \$98.8 billion, leaving a total 50 state deficit of \$1.6 billion.

The national revenue total includes contributions and investment earnings of retirement and unemployment insurance trust funds, and revenue from state-owned liquor stores.

Aside from taxes, the biggest single source of revenue for the states was grants from the federal government, which totalled \$22.8 billion in fiscal 1971.

The Census Bureau report showed that individual income tax produced \$10.2 billion in revenue for the states in fiscal 1971, up from \$9.2 billion in revenue for the states in fiscal 1971,

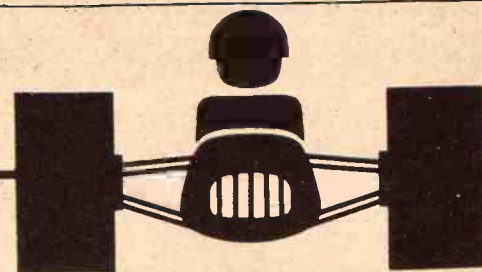

Forty per cent of total state expenditures was for education, about half of it in grants to school districts. The next two largest categories of spending were welfare and highways.

## Mother Nature Takes The Toll On 56,000 Fish

LACYGNE — A natural phenomenon last week killed an estimated 56,000 fish in a 90 acre lake of eastern Kansas.

There was no man-caused pollution to blame for this loss at Miami County Wildlife Management Unit Lake about five miles north of here. The kill was not the effort of law-breaking fishermen.

This time, nature cleaned its own clock, according to fisheries biologists of the Forestry, Fish and Game Commission. Johnny Ray,

Pittsburg, regional fisheries supervisor for the Commission, explained:

"A weather combination of thick cloud cover, high temperatures, high humidity and no breeze for three days running, unbalanced the natural system of the water."

"These weather conditions virtually stopped a heavy growth of algae in the Miami Unit Lake from producing oxygen and releasing it to the water," Ray continued. "Instead, the plants absorbed much of the oxygen from the water, resulting in a critical shortage of oxygen to the fish life in the lake."

Bob Hartmann, Pratt, fisheries research and management supervisor for the commission, commented, "In a sense, the fish suf-

focated from the lack of oxygen." Hartmann said some farm ponds in the vicinity of Miami County were reported to have suffered from the same conditions and some fish were lost. A few miles downstream on the Marais des Cygnes River, one of the waterfowl management lakes at the Marais des Cygnes suffered a much lighter kill, also due to the same phenomenon.

Ray estimated the 56,000 fish killed weighed nearly 18,000 pounds. The kill was composed of 98.6 per cent non-game fish—nearly 12,000 pounds of drum and more than 5,000 pounds of shad, according to Ray. Game and pan fish comprised a little more than one per cent of the kill.

High populations of carp and buffalo and some bullheads still exist in the lake due to their high ability to tolerate low supplies of oxygen, according to Ray.

Hartmann said the fisheries division of the Commission has plans for a rejuvenation of the Miami County Wildlife Management Unit Lake, but he was not sure when it would take place.

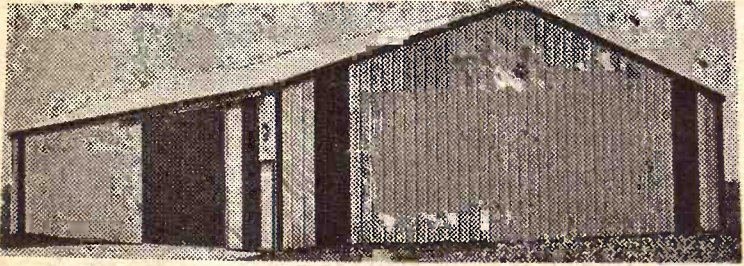

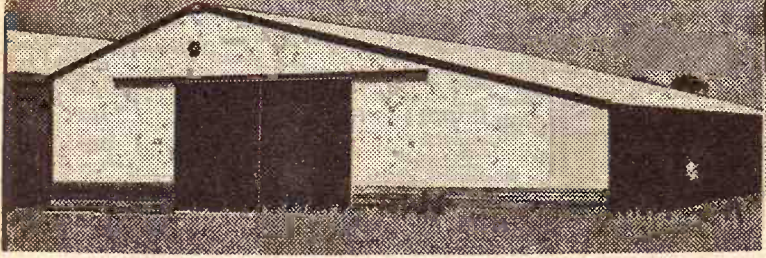

## Kansas Town Pays Doctor's Schooling Hoping For Services

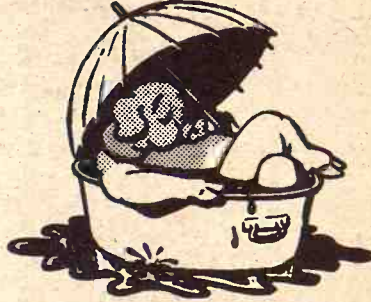

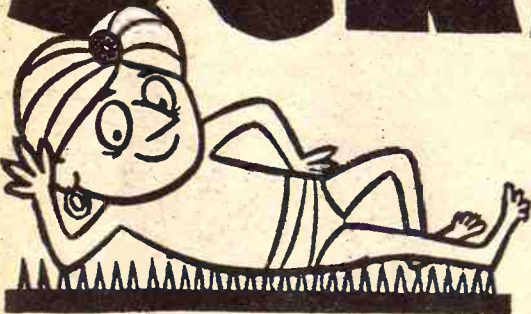

## Big Mac Labeled Ex-Angus Steer To Be Auctioned

DENVER — Anybody want to buy a dethroned king? This one has aged time, put on a little weight (about 10 pounds) and has faded from black to white.  
It is Big Mac, the scandal-heard, ex-Angus steer named and champion steer at the 1972 National Western Stock Show. The district court here declared at Big Mac is of unknown ownership (an estray). This decision clears the last obstacle in the way of the Colorado Brand Commission to sell the animal.  
Brand Commissioner Earl Brown said he hopes the sale can take place Aug. 9 but that sale advertising requirements may delay the sale until the middle of the month. The auction will take place at the Denver Livestock Market. Brown said Big Mac would likely sell for 32 to 33 cents a pound but added the publicity the animal has received may well push the bidding higher.  
"We've received a lot of calls from people who would like to be able to own him," Brown said.  
Big Mac was entered and exhibited by Rex Miller, Alta, Iowa, an Angus. Miller has since disclaimed ownership of the animal. POLYETHYLENE said the steer MacDonald's bought doesn't resemble the one he entered in the National Western Show.  
MacDonald's, which bought the steer for \$14,250, was given back their money by the court. Robert M. MacDonald said he was glad to have Big Mac off his hands. MacDonald's has been feeding the

steer since the dispute erupted more than seven months ago. Just last week, Big Mac was turned over to the brand commission. He is being kept at Denver Union Stockyard facilities.  
After an investigation and blood

tests proved the steer was of Charolais breeding, Willard Simms, National Western Show manager, termed the animal ineligible for the show. The reserve champion, "Old Dakota," a real Angus steer shown by Arendt Brothers, Highmore,

S.D., was moved up to top honors. The Denver show has no Charolais or crossbred class for steers.  
Big Mac was identified as "Jeep" — formerly owned by Kirk Daves, Limon, Colo. He was sired by the Charolais bull, Atlas.

## 'Kanza' Alfalfa Variety Maintains State Prominence

With alfalfa planting time just around the corner many questions are being voiced in county agents offices in the G & G area.

Many varieties on the market are being sold by commercial companies that the Kansas State University Experiment Station has little or no information.

The variety that has been in the spotlight since its release in February 1969 is "Kanza."

"Kanza" alfalfa was developed and released jointly by the U.S.D.A. and the Kansas Agricultural Experiment Station.

It is a seven-clone, synthetic variety. The parentage traces to "Cody," "Culver," "Kansas Common," and "Turkistan." The parent clones were selected so as to give Kanza insect and disease resistance, winter hardiness, and the yield desired in its area of adaptation.

Kanza has high resistance to the pea aphid, spotted alfalfa aphid, and

bacterial wilt. It is more tolerant to potato leaf hopper yellowing than Buffalo or Cody but does not have high resistance. Kanza is similar in winter hardiness to Cody and Buffalo. The foliage is dark green. The flowers color range from purple to blue. Kanza has shown tolerance too late spring frost.

Kanza has high resistance to the pea aphid and spotted alfalfa aphid. In 1968, Kansas lost half of its first crop to the pea aphid. In south-central Kansas, Kanza yielded 1.3 tons per acre of first cutting alfalfa compared to 0.6 tons for Buffalo, a susceptible variety. At Manhattan, Kanza had a yield of 2.29 tons compared to 1.27 tons per acre for susceptible variety Cody.

Protein yields of Kanza almost were double and carotene yields triple those of the susceptible varieties, Buffalo, Ranger, and Vernal when the latter were infested with the aphid.

According to research work at Manhattan, Kanza outyielded all other standard varieties for a four year period, starting in 1965. These varieties were Dawson, Cody, Buffalo, DuPuits, Alfa, and Ranger.

## Despite Lifting Beef Import Quota, Kansas Beef Industry In Good Shape

Despite the lifting of beef import quotas in June, there are no signs so far the Kansas beef industry has been permanently injured, John McCoy, a marketing specialist at Kansas State University, said.

Bill House of Cedar Vale, a past president of the Kansas Livestock Assn., the American Hereford Assn. and the American National Cattleman's Assn., said in June the increase in cattle production and the influx of foreign cattle would hurt the state's top industry.

He said it would begin to hurt the economy in 30 days and "in 60 to 90 days it could be rather disastrous."

The lifting of the import quota was announced June 26.

McCoy labeled the beef market as unstable.

He did warn cattlemen that they should begin limiting production to keep prices up.

He said, "All I can do is piece information together to give an opinion. I don't see us getting hurt in the near future, but there are countries that could increase beef production for export significantly if the unrestricted quotas are continued."

"There are South American countries that could cause concern. Argentina is rationing meat to its own people to have enough to export."

"New Zealand and Australia have a good market in Europe."

"I've had comments from Australia that there are two opinions there. Some of them want to scrape together all the beef they can now to establish a base here. Others think the quotas will be reinstated and the rug pulled out from under them in a year or two."

McCoy said the quality of most imported meat is too low to use for processed foods so there is still room for American increases in producing high quality cuts.

He is concerned that cattlemen in

Kansas and the other states are increasing the number of cattle faster than is good for the industry.

He said, "There are no signs that we are cutting back. The number of beef cows in the United States went up by 4 per cent this year. It's gone up from 3 to 3½ per cent the last several years. I think that's too fast. Demand won't increase that fast. We will have more demand as long as employment is up."

"This doesn't sound like what you'd expect when prices are still high, but you have to look ahead. If cattlemen keep production in line with demand, then prices will stay good and we'll get away from this cyclical market."

"There is no way to enforce this. The cattle industry probably will not accept control by anyone. It will have to be a self discipline thing and that will be very difficult."

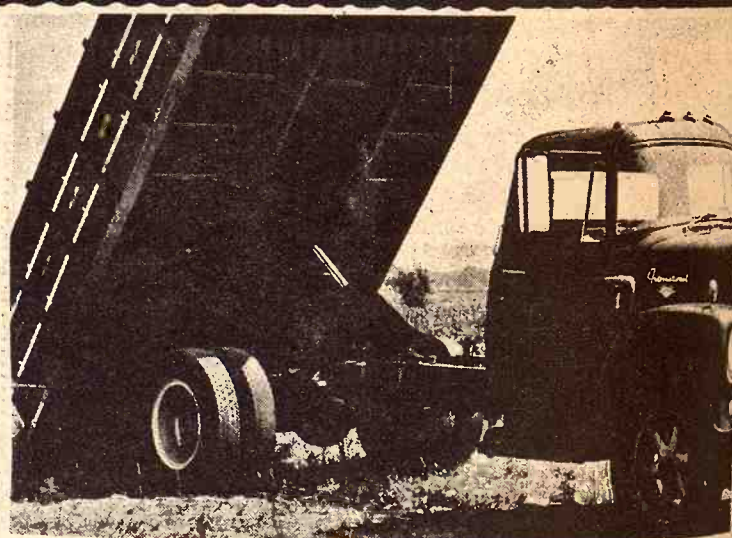

## July Farm Index Up Slightly

Prices received by Kansas farmers at mid-July, 1972 were up slightly from June this year and well above July last year, according to the Kansas Crop and Livestock Reporting Service.

The index of prices received for all farm products was 295 percent of the 1910-14 base period, compared with 285 in June and 254 in July 1971. Price increases from June were recorded for most meat animals, wheat, corn, sorghum, grain, hay, wool, butterfat and eggs. Prices declined for oats, soybeans and milk.

Large price increases from a year ago were shown for all meat animals and wool while soybeans, wheat, hay and milk prices were somewhat higher. On the other hand sorghum grain and corn prices were down

sharply from a year earlier, and barley and rye showed moderate decreases.

The crop price index was 160 percent of the 1910-14 base period at mid-July, 5 points above June this year but 3 points below July 1971.

Wheat prices at mid-July averaged \$1.31 per bushel, 4 cents above June and 2 cents above July 1971.

Corn was worth \$1.20 per bushel, 3 cents above a month earlier but 21 cents below a year ago.

Barley at 90 cents per bushel was unchanged from June but 6 cents below a year earlier.

Sorghum grain brought \$1.81 per cwt., compared with \$1.77 the previous month and \$2.32 in July last year.

Soybeans averaged \$3.28 per

bushel, 2 cents below June this year but 18 cents above July 1971.

The livestock and livestock products price index at mid-July was 450 percent of the 1910-14 base period, compared with 433 a month earlier and 358 a year ago.

The meat animal price index was 568 percent in July, up 24 points from June and 136 points above July last year.

Hog prices averaged \$27.20 per cwt., \$1.70 above a month earlier and \$8.00 above July a year ago.

The dairy price index was 337 in July, compared with 341 in June and 334 last year.

A preliminary wholesale milk price of \$5.50 was 15 cents below the previous month but 10 cents above the previous year.

Eggs averaged 21 cents per dozen, 1 cent above a month ago but unchanged from a year ago.

Prices paid by farmers for soybeans and cottonseed meal were up from July 1971, while bran and mixed feed prices were lower.

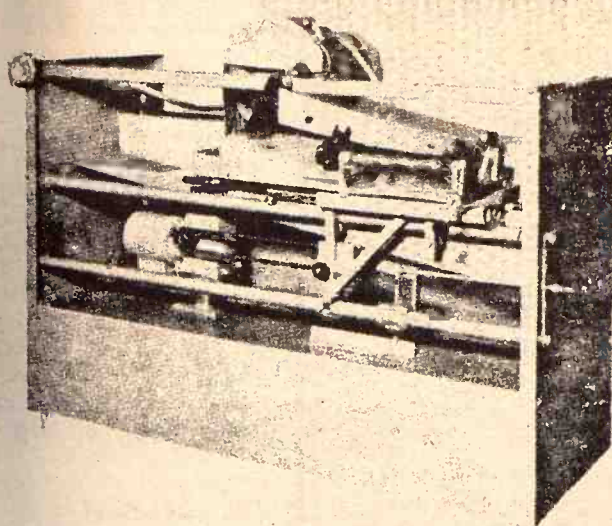
The index of prices received by the Nation's farmers for farm products at mid-July was 323 percent of the 1910-14 base period, up 6 points from mid-June and up 39 points from July 1971.

Price decreases from June were noted for small grain, hay, wool, butterfat and turkeys. Prices were higher for most meat animals, corn, sorghum grain, soybeans, milk and eggs.

The index of prices paid by farmers for commodities and services (including interest, taxes and wage rates) was 433, up 1 point from mid-June and 22 points above July a year ago. The parity ratio in July was 75, up 2 points from June and up 6 points from July 1971.

## Stafford Co. Rated As Top Potato Producer In State

ST. JOHN — Stafford County Vegetable Producers and their broker, produce man Wayne Vohland, Kansas City, Mo., are hard pressed to find adequate words for what they see as the finest potato crop harvested in Stafford County since the group began raising spuds four years ago.

The top potato producing county in the state, Stafford County dug 30,010 hundred-pound sacks in 1970, setting a yield average of 130 hundred-weight bags per acre from 230 acres harvested. Farm value was \$86,940.

Last year yields from the 11 growers in the association soared still higher, climbing to nearly 200 bags per acre. This year growers are anticipating a possible record crop yield.

Potato acreage in the association has dropped about 30 acres, Vohland said. Last years growers planted 160 acres in the St. John area.

At the St. John association-owned processing plant, potatoes are scrubbed, washed and dried by machines.

Sixteen people, mostly students make up work crews. The reduced crew, (last year 30 people were employed) with improved arrangements in the plant, is handling the larger potato volume as efficiently as in the past.

The first field harvested in the area belonged to Roger Russell, who had planted a red potato, Red Sioux, a variety which Vohland obtained from the Wyoming area. Potatoes

were large, uniform, smooth, sound and with firm skin. A large percentage of the crop is grading Number One with a minimum of runty potatoes and trash.

Vohland and growers are equally excited by the harvest performance

## Price Exempt Farm Products Continue To Cost Consumer

A new government report shows that farm prices exempt from price controls continue to dig deeper into consumer pocketbooks, particularly at supermarket meat counters.

The Agriculture Department said that average farm prices jumped 1 per cent last month to an all-time record, including a new high for cattle and a record-matching high for hogs.

Increases also were reported for a number of other items, including eggs, potatoes, milk and onions. Compared with a year ago, price farmers received in July were 13 per cent higher.

Meat animals, which provide nearly a third of the average farm diet, rose 3 per cent from June.

Beef cattle edged past previous record set in June, as hogs equaled the high mark of February 1970.

Last week the Agriculture Department reported that food costs rose 0.9 per cent in July with beef and pork strong factors that increase. But those figures do not reflect the latest movement in farm prices.

Nixon administration price officials have insisted more meat in its way to consumer's tables than that the price situation soon ease.

A USDA report shows the number of cattle being fattened as of July was up 14 per cent from a year earlier. Those animals, administration officials say, will be sold and help dampen prices.

But another report showed that June meat output by packing plants actually was down 4 per cent from a year earlier, led by a 9 per cent cutback for pork. Beef was up at the same level of June last year.

Agriculture Department economists still insist livestock prices soon will decline. But also predict farmers in 1972 have the best year ever for net income, largely because of high livestock prices.

This year, USDA said farmers' net at least a record \$18 billion more than in 1971.

"In the second half of this year livestock prices are expected to decline seasonally from summer highs but continue well above a year earlier," officials said in the report.

"Consumer demand will continue to expand," the report said. "Second-half beef supplies will be from a year earlier, but pork supplies will be smaller."

Prices farmers get for their products are not subject to government price controls.

Middlemen, although subject to some restraints, are allowed to pass along to consumers any added costs incurred at the farm level.

## Hunters Beware—Trespassing Laws Pack Extra Kick

When hunters start locking horns with trespass laws, they usually find the law has more kick than they bargained for.

With the dove season just around the corner and other seasons coming, Fred Warders, Pratt, assistant director of the Forestry, Fish and Game Commission, cautions hunters to abide by trespass laws for the well being of their sport as well as for their own good.

"As with most laws, the trespass statutes of Kansas are complicated," said Warders. "But, there is an extremely easy method to avoid being prosecuted for trespass."

"Three primary thoughts should stick in the mind of every hunter: Permission, permission and permission. Every person should understand the basic rule behind any trespass law, get permission from the landowner or legal tenant."

"Regardless of how land is posted, or even if it is not posted, to be within the law, access permission must be obtained in some form from the landowner or tenant."

New to Kansas is the "written permission" statute passed a year ago by the Kansas Legislature. It is entirely the landowner or tenant's decision whether the statute applies to his land. A hunter, or anyone desiring access to land posted with "Hunting by Written Permission Only" must obtain permission in writing from the owner or tenant and have the note in his possession while on that land.

"Probably the most frequent error made by hunters is the failure to check out their prospective hunting area before the season starts," said Warders. If the hunter and landowner become familiar with each other prior to the season, the hunt is less complicated. The hunting area is narrowed down to a few hot spots and a quick check with the owner at the beginning of the day is about all that's required.

"Hunters should remember 95 per cent of the hunting in this state is on private land. It's been that way because most hunters are conscientious of the landowner's rights. Most are aware that the landowner is probably the most valuable asset hunters and wildlife have," he stated.

In a February 1971 survey of landowners taken by the Forestry, Fish and Game Commission, a majority of landowners questioned said they would grant access to hunters if permission was sought. The survey questioned a random sampling of two per cent (2,000) of the landowners in Kansas.

In the western third of the state, only five per cent of the landowners restricted hunting on their land to members of their family or allowed no hunting. Nearly three-quarters, however, said they would allow strangers to hunt if permission was asked.

The survey showed landowners around more populated regions were less likely to allow strangers to hunt even if permission was asked. Yet, an average of only 15 per cent of the landowners in the eastern two-thirds of Kansas either restricted hunting on their property to members of the immediate family or no hunting at all.

The biggest share of the landowners in the eastern two-thirds said they would allow outsiders to hunt if they asked permission, with the exception of Flint Hills cat-

## VEE Not Only Disease Threat To Kansas Horses

Dr. G. D. Gurss, state livestock commissioner, said Kansans should switch concern about VEE to fighting forms of encephalomyelitis that are found in the state.

These include eastern St. Louis and western sleeping sickness. Gurss said most confirmed cases of sleeping sickness here are caused by the Western virus.

Gurss said two suspected cases of encephalomyelitis have been reported to his office this year, but they could be other forms of brain damage in the animals that produce

similar symptoms. He said reports on analysis of these two cases have not returned from the national disease laboratory.

There were approximately 30 reported cases of the types of encephalomyelitis common to Kansas in the state last year, Gurss said.

The nearest cases of VEE he knows about this summer were south of Mexico City. Gurss said the mass vaccination of horses along the middle and border states where mosquitos that carry the disease has minimized any VEE threat in the United States.

He said there is plenty of vaccine available for all types of encephalomyelitis. He urged horse owners to vaccinate their animals for the more common types, but said in his opinion vaccination for VEE would be only a discretionary

matter for the owner.

Gurss said western encephalomyelitis has been found in Kansas for at least 40 years.

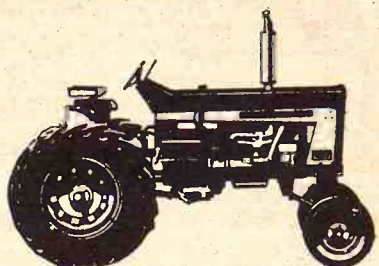

Mid-year livestock surveys indicate a probable record Kansas calf crop in 1972 but the smallest lamb crop and second smallest wool production in more than four decades, according to the Kansas Department of Agriculture and Livestock Reporting Service.

Mid-1972 cow numbers showed a gain of 3 percent from a year earlier but a continued decline in milk cows.

**Calf Crop**  
Calves born in Kansas during 1972 are expected to total 2,040,000 head, percent more than a previous record high set in 1971.

**1 Cow Inventory**  
All cows and heifers that have calved on Kansas farms and ranches totaled 2,130,000 head, up 3 percent from last year. Beef cows numbered 1,000,000, an increase of 3 percent from 1971, while milk cows totaled 1,130,000, down 2 percent.

**Lamb Crop**  
The 1972 lamb crop is expected to total 209,000 head, down 5 percent from last year and the smallest since 1926. The lamb crop percentage (number of lambs saved per 100 ewes one year old and older January 1) this year was 106 percent, down 1 percentage point from last year.

**Wool Production**  
Wool shorn from Kansas flocks in 1972 is expected to total 2,634,000 pounds, down 3 percent from last year and the next to smallest production since 1927. The number of sheep shorn totaled 310,000 head, changed from last year but otherwise the lowest since 1925. The average fleece weight per fleece is estimated at 8.5 pounds, lower than 8.8 pounds last year but above

**ated For Kansas**

**ate Fair Sept. 20**

An interesting new twist has been added to the livestock section of the 72 Kansas State Fair at Hutchinson. It's the Barrow Futurity class, which has attracted producers from 21 counties, including Anderson, Bourbon, Cherokee, Cowley, Decatur, Dickinson, Harvey, Kiowa, Labette, Marion, McPherson, Osage, Mitchell, Montgomery, Morton, Osborne, Scott, Sedgwick, Sumner, Thomas, and Wabaunsee counties.

The nominated pigs had to be identified when nursing the sows. Each farmer, who could nominate five pigs, will be allowed to show only two at the fair.

Wendell Moyer, Extension swine specialist at Kansas State University, said the barrows will be shown on Wednesday, September 20, beginning at 3 p.m.

Awards will be given in four categories: 1—Gain per day of age, based on the farrowing date and weight at the fair; 2—live placing; 3—carcass placing; 4—overall index, combining gain, live and carcass placing, carcass ham-loin index.

Moyer says the futurity class is more practical than many livestock events because the exact age of each animal will be known and each pig will be evaluated on rate of gain and the amount of red meat it produces rather than on the ability of its owner to fit it for show conditions. Both purebreds and crossbreds have been entered.

**U.S. Calf Crop**  
The 1972 calf crop for the United States is expected to total 48,445,000 head, 3 percent more than in 1971. Texas, the leading cattle State, expects to produce 5,444,000 calves, 3 percent more than in 1971, followed by Missouri with 2,375,000 and Oklahoma with 2,240,000.

**July Cow Inventory**  
All cows and heifers that have calved on U.S. farms and ranches totaled 52,131,000 head July 1, 1972. This is 3 percent more than on farms July 1, 1971. Beef cows, at 39,921,000 head, were 4 percent more than a year earlier. Milk cows, at 12,210,000 head, declined 1 percent from last year.

**Lamb Crop**  
Texas, Missouri and Oklahoma rank as the top three States in cow inventory. Texas had a cow inventory of 6,080,000 head, practically unchanged from a year ago. Missouri with 2,500,000 head showed a 6 percent increase, while Oklahoma slipped to third place with 2,400,000 head, a 1 percent increase.

**Lamb Crop**  
The 1972 United States lamb crop is estimated at 12,442,000 head, down

4 percent from 1971. The January 1, 1972 number of breeding ewes one year old and older totaled 12,854,000, a decrease of 6 percent from a year earlier, while ewe lambs under one year were down 14 percent. The lambing percentage for 1972 (number of lambs saved per 100 ewes one year old and older on hand January 1), at 97, is 2 points above 1971.

**The lamb crop was larger than a year earlier in New Mexico, Nebraska, Texas, South Dakota, Ohio and Utah, but lower in all other States for which estimates are available.**

**Shorn Wool Production**  
Wool shorn and to be shorn in the United States during 1972 is estimated at 152,513,000 pounds, grease basis. This is a decrease of 4 percent from the 1971 production of 159,084,000 pounds. The 1972 production is equivalent to 72,749,000 pounds, clean basis, compared with 75,883,000 in 1971, based on a conversion factor of 47.7 percent. The number of sheep shorn and to be shorn, estimated at 18,135,000, declined 4 percent from the 18,944,000 shorn in 1971. The 1972

# Kansas Corn Holdings Up' Stored Wheat Down

Total holdings of corn and old crop rye in Kansas on July 1 this year were quite large for the date, but stocks of old crop wheat and other grains were moderate in size according to the Kansas Crop and Livestock Reporting Service.

Old crop wheat holdings in Kansas on July 1 totaled 177,354,000 bushels compared with 187,089,000 bushels a year ago and a range from 81,739,000 to 475,436,000 on that date during the last decade. Off-farm stocks of 160,161,000 bushels were 5 percent below July 1, 1971 and farm holdings of 17,193,000 bushels were 4 percent less.

Combined rye holdings totaled 1,371,000 bushels, 4 percent less than a year earlier but second highest for July 1 on record. Off-farm holdings were 13 percent less than on July 1 last year but farm stocks were double a year ago.

Combined stocks of the 4 major feed grains in Kansas totaled 107,880,000 bushels, well above last year's relatively low 71,255,000 bushels on July 1 but much below stocks in the early 1960's.

Sorghum grain stocks in all storage positions totaled 60,743,000 bushels, nearly double the small stocks a year earlier but about average for the half-dozen previous years. Both stocks on farms of 18,684,000 bushels and off-farm stocks of 42,059,000 bushels were large increases from a year earlier.

Corn holdings on July 1 totaled

42,512,000 bushels, 19 percent larger than last year and third largest in records dating back through 1943. Farm corn stocks were about 1 1/2 times last year's, while off-farm stocks were 5 percent larger.

Old crop oats in storage totaled 2,704,000 bushels, 8 percent less than July 1 last year.

Old crop barley stored in all positions totaled 1,921,000 bushels, largest for July 1 since 1965 but well below the record 8,679,000 bushels ten years ago. Total stocks of soybeans were 5,596,000 bushels, down 6 percent from a year earlier.

Farm stocks of soybeans totaled 714,000 bushels and off-farm stocks 4,882,000 bushels.

## UNITED STATES

The nation's mid-year stocks of all old crop wheat showed a 19 percent increase from a year earlier. Large increases were also noted in corn, sorghum grain, and rye. Stocks of the four feed grains (corn, oats, barley, and sorghum) totaled 81.7 million tons, 35 percent more than on July 1, 1971.

Old crop carryover of all wheat in the nation on July 1 totaled 865 million bushels, 19 percent more than a year earlier.

Off-farm holdings of 509 million bushels were 4 percent more than a year earlier and farm holdings, at a record high of nearly 357 million bushels, were up 49 percent. Disappearance for April-June 1972 was 348 million bushels, compared

with 333 million a year earlier.

Old crop rye stocks in all positions on July 1 totaled 45.1 million bushels, 61 percent greater than a year ago and the largest for the date since 1943.

Sorghum grain stocks in all positions on July 1, 1972 totaled 277 million bushels, 56 percent above the amount on hand a year earlier. Off-farm stocks are 48 percent above a year ago and holdings on farms are nearly double last year's total.

Corn in all storage positions on July 1, totaled 2,176, million bushels, 39 percent more than a year earlier. Off-farm stocks were 55 percent more than a year earlier and farm holdings were up 34 percent.

Old crop oat carryover stocks in

all locations on July 1 totaled 549 million bushels, a record high for the date.

Old crop barley holdings in all storage positions totaled 174 million bushels on July 1, 1972, 11 percent more than a year earlier.

Soybeans in storage at all positions totaled 232 million bushels, 18 percent less than a year earlier. At 58 million bushels, farm stocks were 36 percent below last year's while off-farm stocks of 174 million bushels were down 9 percent.

## '72' Kansas Wheat Crop Rated Second Largest

The 1972 Kansas wheat crop is estimated at 309 million bushels, the State's second largest, according to the Kansas Crop and Livestock Reporting Service. The season's first forecasts of 201 million bushels of sorghum grain and 111 million bushels of corn grain as of August 1 were moderately below a year ago but otherwise the best in four decades or more.

Prospective soybean production of 21 million bushels is well above a

Oats production is estimated at 8,580,000 bushels, the seventh smallest Kansas crop in almost a century. This represents an excellent yield of 44 bushels per acre on 195,000 acres harvested.

Barley production is estimated at 3,360,000 bushels, the second smallest in 19 years. A record high yield per acre of 42 bushels is estimated on 80,000 acres harvested.

Rye production of 990,000 bushels was only two-fifths of last year, with

year ago and, if realized, will be the State's second best.

Hay production in 1972 is indicated at 5.2 million tons, the State's fourth largest. July was wet and cool, favoring development of row crops, hay, pastures and ranges.

Kansas wheat production in 1972 is estimated at 309,205,000 bushels, 1 per cent less than a year ago, but otherwise the State's largest.

Yield per acre averaged 33.5 bushels, second only to last year's record 34.5 bushels. Harvest of the State's 9,230,000 acres was completed during July.

Sorghum grain production is forecast at 200,750,000 bushels, 14 per cent below a year ago, but larger than any other previous crop. Acreage to be harvested for grain is estimated at 3,650,000 acres, down substantially from last year but otherwise largest in a decade.

Yield per acre is forecast at 55 bushels, 1 bushel higher than last year, but 1 bushel below the record 56 bushels in 1969.

Corn production is forecast at 110,565,000 bushels, 8 percent less than last year and second largest since 1932.

Yield per acre of 91 bushels is expected on 1,215,000 acres harvested for grain. Yield per acre prospects are second best of record, bolstered by a steadily rising percentage of the State's corn grown under irrigation.

Soybean production is forecast at 21,390,000 bushels, about one-fifth more than last year. Yield per acre is forecast at 23 bushels on 930,000 acres expected to be harvested for beans.

a record-equaling 22 bushels yield per acre on 45,000 acres harvested.

Sugar beet production is forecast at 578,000 tons, the smallest in five years. A yield per acre of 16.5 tons is anticipated on 35,000 acres harvested.

The State's dry edible bean production is forecast at a relatively small 91,000 cwt.

Hay production in 1972 is estimated at 5,239,000 tons, only 1 per cent below last year's third largest crop for the State.

Pasture and range feed condition on August 1 was 84 per cent of normal, the same as last year, but 6 points better than the 1961-70 average for August 1. Livestock were doing well on grass in nearly all areas.

## Shorn Wool Prices Recover But Still Below Record Level

Prices of shorn wool at the farm have recovered sharply from depressed levels last year but for all of 1972 still will not average as much as they did in the 1960's, says the Agriculture Department.

By midyear, shorn wool was bringing growers about 41 cents per pound, compared with last year's average of 19.4 cents, the lowest since the 1930's.

For all of 1972, the USDA said, wool may average around the 41-cent mark. During the past decade

wool averaged about 45 cents, of-  
ficials said.

Manmade fibers have bitten deeply into the textile use of wool, and world prices have been down the past few years. Now, according to USDA, the world market is im-  
proved and wool use is growing.

However, officials cautioned, recent price increases for raw wool and the continued pressure from synthetic fibers is expected to limit further price increases.

In another report, department analysts say the low wool prices last year has brightened the outlook for more woolen wearing apparel.

"This fall and winter, the 'classic' look is on the fashion runway," officials said. "It means some wider use of traditional wool fabrics such

as tweeds, plaids and houndstooth checks."

The new fall and winter fashions are made from last year's wool, officials said. In 1971, using higher priced stocks, textile mill use of wool for apparel dropped 29 per cent from 1970.

With lower prices, mill use of apparel wool last spring was up 10 per cent from a year earlier, the report said.

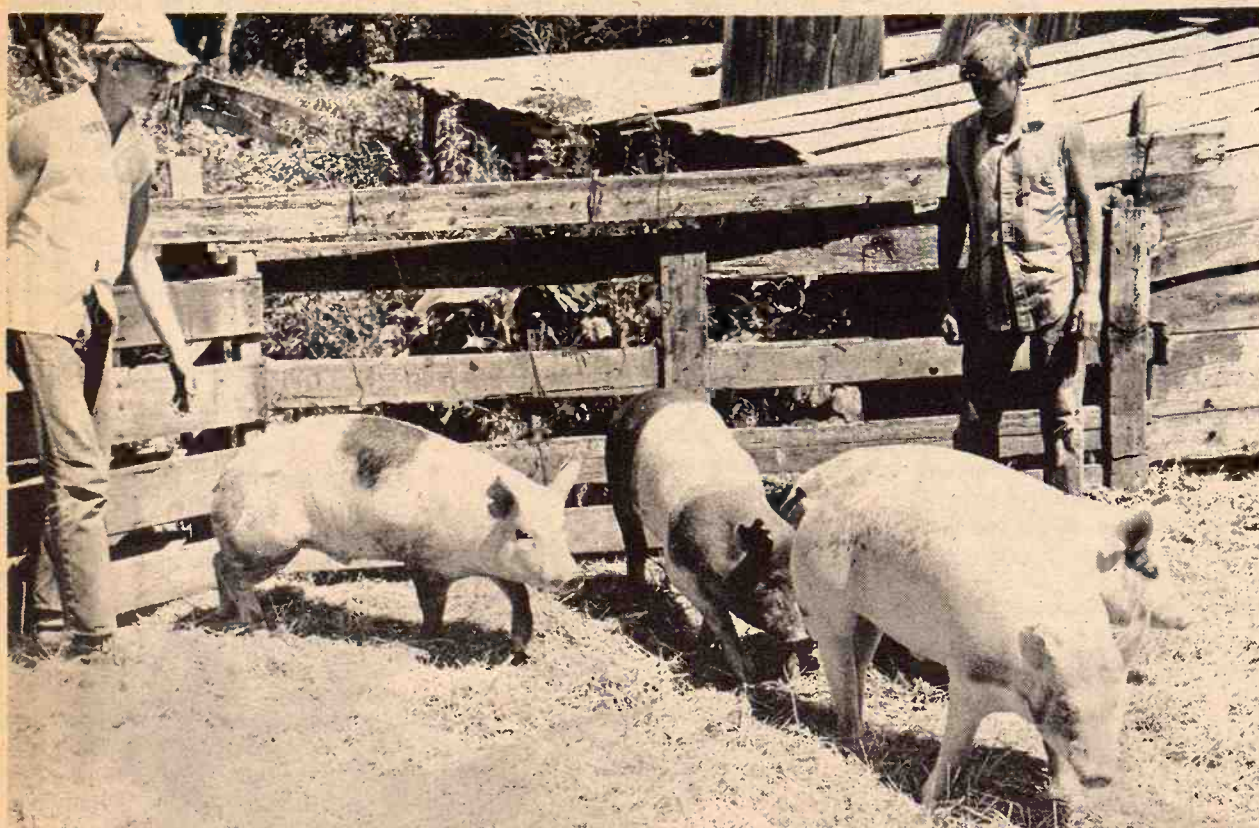

#### Dutch Elm Disease Claims Over 500 McPherson Elms

McPHERSON—Two hundred Park Superintendent Bob White

and sixteen of McPherson's stately American elm trees have been marked for destruction.

Since 1966, McPherson has lost more than 500 elms because of Dutch elm disease and the plague is worse than ever.

said the 216 trees marked for felling are double the number eradicated last year and said he has seen a steady increase in infected trees.

The disease is spread by an infected elm bark beetle and has been crossing the United States from East to West since the years following World War I. Communities have been denuded of elms and infected trees invariably die.

The only practical defense, say experts, is removal of the dead and dying trees and burning them.

Even this runs into problems. In McPherson, John Shaw, commercial tree trimmer who removes the trees for the city, first was told by the Kansas air pollution emission control authorities he could not burn the trees on a plot of 20 acres he bought for the purpose near McPherson.

The authorities since informed Shaw, who has removed about 100 trees so far this year, he could apply for a license to continue burning at least until 1975 when the federal clean air act takes full effect.

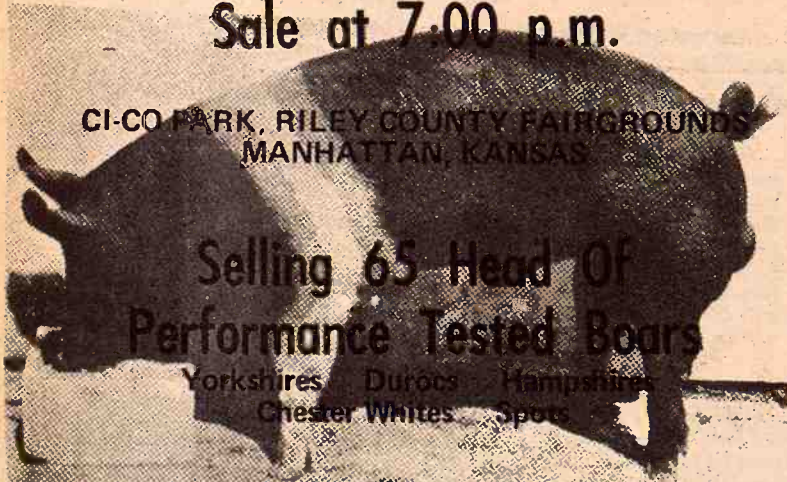
#### SEDGWICK COUNTY PLANS \$5 MILLION AG COLISEUM

# Corn Borers Claim 320 Million Worth of Grain In '71

Farmers lost a record \$319.8 million worth of grain to European corn borers last year before they had a chance to harvest it, and the loss is continuing active again this season, says the Agriculture Department.

However, a spokesman for the Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service in USDA said, 1972 corn losses will not be determined until harvest is made in the fall.

Eggs for the second generation of borers, the group that does the most damage, are just now being laid in the Corn Belt," the official said. Those will hatch and then probably active about Aug. 21-25."

The department published recently a breakdown of 1971 losses. It showed farmers lost more than 305.5 million bushels last year despite harvesting a record crop of 5.5 billion.

At compared with 195.9 million bushels lost in 1970, valued at \$250.2 million. The previous high for losses in terms of value was \$261.4 million in 1954 when borers destroyed 191.6 million bushels.

According to USDA records, European corn borers are cyclical, building up for several years and then receding. The current cycle has been since 1968 when farmers lost 15 million bushels worth \$161.3 million, compared with 59.6 million bushels worth \$63.8 million the year before. The 1971 corn borer report covered states, with Iowa showing the greatest loss of nearly 138.9 million bushels valued at more than \$143 million.

In other states, the estimated bushels of corn destroyed last year by borers and the dollar value, included: Delaware 1,299,000 bushels \$1,533,000; Illinois 38,712,000 and \$4,035,000; Indiana 17,619,000 and \$1,796,000; Kansas 1,489,000 and \$1,653,000; Kentucky 70,000 and

\$76,000; Maryland 1,022,000 and \$1,196,000; Michigan 3,688,000 and \$3,688,000; Minnesota 17,944,000 and \$17,585,000; Missouri 11,761,000 and \$12,820,000; Nebraska 52,297,000 and \$57,527,000; North Dakota 364,000 and \$368,000; Ohio 7,199,000 and \$7,487,000; South Dakota 9,794,000 and \$10,186,000; and Wisconsin 3,425,000 and \$3,802,000.

In determining dollar losses, the department said season average prices for corn were used for individual states. Those varied from 98 cents per bushel in Minnesota to \$1.18 in Delaware.

Over-all, the USDA said, 1971 corn losses to borers represented more than 5.5 per cent of the nation's production. In the 15 states themselves the loss was 6.12 per cent of production last year.

The Agriculture Department says the price picture for potato farmers is brightening and "substantially stronger" markets appear likely when the big crop is harvested.

Production of summer potatoes is down sharply from last year and farmers say they will have 7 per cent fewer acres for fall production, which provides the bulk of the

nation's potatoes. The outlook was in a "vegetable situation" report issued Tuesday. Potato prices declined as the result of large supplies last year. Now, with average cutbacks in the major producing areas, prospects are improved.

"Prices are expected to be much higher than at harvest time last year, and there should be continued strength through the next storage season, provided orderly marketing procedures are followed," the report said.

# US Wheat Exports Could Hit Billion Bushel Mark

A spokesman for a farmer-sponsored trade promotion group says wheat exports could rise to one billion bushels for the year ending next June 30.

Joseph Halow, executive vice president of Great Plains Wheat, Inc., said in a statement issued here

that sales to the Soviet Union "could easily push" exports to 900 million and as much as one billion bushels this season.

The record wheat-export year was in 1965-66 when more than 867 million bushels were shipped overseas.

Even with a record year in prospect, Halow said, the U.S. stockpile would still be between 600 million and 700 million bushels next

July 1, the beginning of another marketing year.

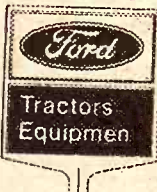

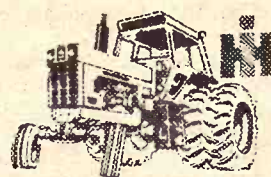

though the state's population has been increasing slowly because of an excess of births over deaths, net migration out-of-state during the 20-year period 1950-1970 totaled 158,827 persons or a \$1.5 billion drain on the state's economy, the Kansas State University economics study shows. That rather startling total requires a bit of explanation and Sjo's report has it.

Many of these 158,827 migrants were young working-age adults educated at the expense of Kansas taxpayers. Hardest hit were the rural areas, which have lost many of their youth to the big city, with its promise of employment and a better tomorrow.

Kansas ranked 10th in the nation with an average of 11.7 years of schooling per capita in 1960, Dr. Sjo said. The cost of obtaining this education at 1960 prices was \$8,029 a person. This includes a \$5,997 cost to the public and \$2,032 in lost earnings while attending school.

Assuming that the average person who moved away from Kansas between 1950 and 1970 had 11.7 years of education, the lost human capital investment from education would be about \$75 million a year, or about \$1.5 billion for the 20-year-period.

Outmigration takes a double bite out of the taxpayer's pocketbook. First, he pays most of the bills for the school system in his community. Sjo calculated that communities provided approximately 65 per cent of the public school revenue in 1970. State government contributed 30 per cent and federal government 5 per cent. The community's tax base is reduced when young persons move out. This leaves remaining citizens to foot the bill for additional community facilities and services.

Average per-student cost for educating a male student in Kansas

in 1960 was \$3,152 for eight years, \$6,228 for 12 years and \$11,420 for 16 years. Dr. Sjo's figures showed that returns in the individual's earning power were 18.6 per cent for an elementary education, 12.2 per cent for a high school education and 10.3 per cent for a college education.

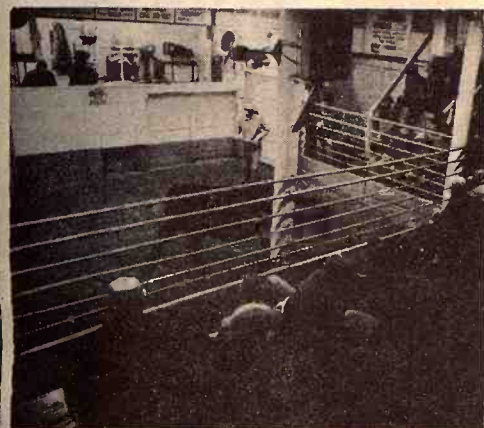

Why is membership in the national  
organization important to soybean

The main reason is the soybean  
marketing development program  
conducted by the ASA. Expanding  
markets overseas is vital to the

Dicken, Manson, and Albert

countries buying U.S. beans.

Dicken, who was in England,  
Holland, Germany, and Spain, said  
European extractor plants are being

expanded and new ones are being  
built there.

"I was asked at one stop if the U.S.  
could produce the beans to justify  
stepped up plant expansion there,  
and I replied 'yes,'" says Dicken.

The national organization has cut  
a wide swath since 1955. Con-  
centrating on finding new overseas  
markets, ASA claims every \$1 of  
farmer money invested in market  
development in Japan has resulted  
in a 1,000 bushel increase in sales.

Affiliated with more than 20 state  
soybean organizations, ASA uses \$6  
of each \$10 membership fee for  
research and promotion. The  
remaining \$4 reverts to the state  
association from which it came.

Peterson believes soybean  
growers are "learning from other  
producer organizations that there is  
strength in unity and are doing  
something about it."

## Kansas Ice Cream Production Down, Butter, Cheese Up

Butter production in Kansas during June totaled 965,000 pounds, compared with 963,000 pounds in June 1971, according to the Kansas Crop and Livestock Reporting Service.

Cumulative production in the first six months of this year was 6,900,000 pounds, compared with 6,674,000 pounds a year ago.

Kansas American cheese production in June was 4,490,000 pounds, up considerably from the 3,028,000 pounds produced during the same month last year.

In the first six months of 1972, production totaled 22,720,000 pounds, compared with 14,515,000 pounds during the same period in 1971.

Ice cream production in Kansas during June totaled 670,000 gallons,

compared with 836,000 gallons in June 1971.

From January through June this year, production totaled 3,520,000 gallons, down moderately from the 3,908,000 gallons produced during the same period a year ago.

Butter production in the United States during June 1972 is estimated at 111,146,000 pounds. This was a decline of 1 percent from June 1971.

In comparison with a year earlier in the four leading butter-producing states, June production was down 7 percent in Minnesota, but up 4 percent in Wisconsin, 16 percent in California, and 2 percent in Iowa.

The Nation's June production of American cheese totaled 176,361,000 pounds, the largest output for June or any other month on record. June production was 8 percent more than a year earlier.

Production of ice cream in the United States during June is estimated at 80,090,000 gallons—a new record high for the month. Production was up 4 percent from

June last year.

In the three leading ice cream-producing states, output was above a year ago by 2 percent in Pennsylvania, and 6 percent in California, but down 3 percent in New York.

## Rising Costs Eat Into Farm Budget

This summer a farmer had to pay \$6.43 for a pair of overalls which a year ago cost him \$6.02, he climbed on a \$19,300 combine which in 1971 cost \$17,820 and harvested wheat worth \$1.32 per bushel, two cents less than a year ago.

The figures, published by the Agriculture Department, illustrate a basic problem for most farmers today: Even if they produce more and prices for some commodities are better — notably livestock — rising costs are eating into family budgets.

Department economists, however, say higher prices for cattle and hogs this year have generated a trend of improvement and that net farm income is expected to rise by about \$2 billion over last year.

But costs of production have risen steadily for several years. In July, the USDA said, the average prices farmers paid out for operating expenses, including goods, services, taxes and wages, rose by one percent — pushing it to 27 percent more than five years ago.

The monthly price report included price samples for items commonly needed and purchased by farmers, from men's overalls and combines to bricks and fertilizer.

Looking at older records shows even a greater disparity. Overalls in 1969, for example, cost \$5.17 at a time wheat sold for \$1.22 per bushel. A comparable grain combine in 1969 averaged about \$11,000.

Corn in June 1969 brought \$1.18 per bushel, five cents more than in the month this year. Cattle averaged \$28 per 100 pounds in June 1969; about \$28.50 last summer, then rose to a record \$34.60 last month.
