### Aust All Milk Be Grade By Roger H. Wilkowske

Milk is nature's most nearly perfect food. It's one of the four basic food groups necessary for balanced nutrition. It's particularly important in building strong bones and muscles for growing children.

Thus, it's vitally important that milk be pure and wholesome. Milk is often consumed as a fluid beverage without being cooked. If contaminated or unsanitary, it could cause illness or disease.

There's a long history of measures and regulations to assure pure and safe milk. But it's still possible to buy uninspected and unpasteurized milk in Kansas

Many Kansas cities and counties have ordinances that require pasteurization, and farm and factory inspection. But there are still some communities that do not.

In the past, production, processing, and distribution of fluid milk was a local business and thus a local concern. Cities and counties adopted the health ordinances they felt were necessary to assure safe and wholesome milk. There was wide variation in the stringency and enforcement of local milk ordinances.

Recent years have seen dramatic changes in the dairy industry. Milk is assembled from wide production areas, processed in large plants, and packaged in single service containers.

It's distributed through stores their effectiveness. Would they and routes over wide consumption areas. There's no way of knowing where the milk from a specific dairy farm will eventually be sold or where the milk sold in any community originated.

The system of local option on milk inspection and ordinances was not well adapted for the large scale assembly, processing and distribution practices. It resulted in overlapping and duplication which increased costs for farmers, processors, and consumers.

A free flow bill was enacted in Kansas to permit free movement of Grade A milk within the state without subsequent complete reinspection. This helped reduce duplication. But increased use of authorized inspection fees have prevented substantial reduction in inspection costs.

A twofold question will face Kansans in the near future. First, should we consolidate milk inspection into a single agency? Secondly, should we require all fluid milk sold in the state to be Grade A quality and pastuerized.

The dairy industry and associated agencies are currently studying these questions. It is anticipated that they will make recommendations soon.

Kansans have a vital interest in these questions because the issues affect public health as well as the cost of milk. Any proposed modification of our milk inspection system and requirements deserves thoughtful consideration.

Proposed changes should be examined closely to determine

assure a pure, wholesome, safe milk supply? Are they adapted to the present dairy industry? Is this the best way to do the job at the lowest cost?

Any proposal which can accomplish all these things deserves the support of all Kansans. Anything less would short change us and our children.

#### Foldaway Spare Tire Into Use

B. F. Goodrich Co's Spacesaver spare tire will be introduced to motorists as standard equipment on Pontiac's new Firebird sports car.

Imports of lower priced Japanese color sets are also on the increase. In Chicago, Sears Roeb''ck has been offering a 16inch Japanese-made color set for \$268.

While Zenith and others have experimented with laser beams to reproduce color TV pictures, such a method—which would do away with picture tubes entirelv—is years away from full development. No other basic changes in the design of color tubes is in sight, manufacturers say, so lower prices will come from manufacturing simplicities, economies in purchases, and lower margins.

When sales of black-andwhite tv leaped in the early 1950s, about 100 companies leaped into competition, which presently became overproduced, leading to price-cutting and blood-letting among the competitors. About 25 companies survived.

The companies remaining do not think a similar situation will build up in the fight for color televsion sales.







Kansas mineral production for 1966 reached an all-time high of \$584.2 million, nearly 3 percent greater than the former record high of \$568 million, as estimated by the State Geological Survey of The University of Kansas in its year-end review of the mineral industry.

The value of minerals produced in the past year tops an eleven-year period in which annual mineral production values exceeded one-half billion dollars. The total value, 5.35 billion dollars for the decade 1957-1966, is an increase of 32 percent over the value for the decade





In contrast to crude oil, other raw products of the petrolegains. Total value of natural gas. production increased as a result of greater production and greater unit price at the well-head, both factors being in part a reflection of increased energy demand from industry.


Helium extraction has been steadily increasing during the past three years as a result of the government conservation program and increasing demand from the private sector of industry. The increase in helium extraction can be attributed to four relatively new plants, one of which, Kansas Refined Helium Company's plant at Otis, went on stream in 1966. The Bureau of Mines plant at Otis for many years had been the only helium producer in Kansas. Phillips Petroleum Company's new Alamo plant near Elkhart is nearing completion and will probably go on stream in 1967.

Coal production was down somewhat in 1966, although the outlook appears to be brighter with costs for power generation from coal becoming more and more competitive with natural gas and with the advent of mine-mouth power plants to further improve the competitive position in favorable localities.

Gains in the non-metallics, and particularly in those mineral commodities vital to the construction industry - stone, sand and gravel, cement, gypsum, and volcanic ash - have through the last 20 or more years been significant though gradual. The long range characteristic of these raw materials is stability, but their importance to the general economic well-being of the industry cannot be over-emphasized.


Important gains in 1966 were posted by clay and shale products, up nearly 20 percent from 1965, by salt with a 10.7 percent increase, and by cement with a 3.5 percent increase.

Considering the cutbacks in certain sectors of the construction industry in the last half

of 1966 and to higher interest rates and tight money; it is significant that over-all production in the mineral industry continued to gain - indicating a definite measure of strength.

In summary, Dr. Frank C. Foley, State Geologist and Director of the Survey states: "The rather sizable increase in value of raw minerals in 1966, despite weaknesses in certain sectors of the economy, is good reason for optimism in the industry. The import of the mineral industry to the total economy cannot be overemphasized. It is supplying a continually greater part of the raw materials that clothe us, that help produce more food to feed us, that house us, and that even transport us. Thus, as we consider the dependency of the economic wellbeing of our community on the mineral industry, we become even more aware of the geological Survey's responsibilities in directing research to realize the greatest value from each unit of every mineral commodity and at the same time conserve a portion for future generations."


# **Effective Rainmaking** An Aim By 1972

A vastly increased federal program aimed at achieving practical means by 1972 for pulling more rain from the atmosphere has been proposed by Secretary of the Interior Stewart L. Udall.

Udall made public a departmental report outlining recommendations for stepped-up research and development programs with a goal of increasing controlled yields of water from the atmosphere to help meet existing and anticipated future needs in water-short areas throughout the nation

The report does not give a total dollar cost estimate and a spokesman said none is available. The outline of plans, however, indicates the cost could be well in excess of \$100 million by 1975. Congress approved \$3.75 million for the department's weather-modification program for the year ending next June 30.

In the outline, some 50 experimental projects are proposed by 1975. The annual cost would be expected to average about \$350,-000 each, with the first cost of \$300,000. There would also be



### **FPC Says It Can't Regulate Electric Co-ops**

The Federal Power Commission made its peace with rural electric cooperatives by deciding it doesn't have authority to regulate them after all.

The action ended a controversial test case involving three coops that dated back to 1963. All five commissioners generally concurred in the basic finding, but the opinion of the threemember majority specifically concluded that Congress never intended the commission to regulate cooperatives under the Federal Power Act.

The FPC action leaves the Agriculture Department's Rural Electrification Administration as the sole government agency supervising electric coonp, which account for about 1% of the nation's generating capacity.

Had the commission reached an opposite conclusion, presumably it could have led to the FPC setting higher or lower rates for co-op power sales accross state lines. Higher rates would benefit competing private utilities, which long have complained of what they termed an unfair competitive advantage enjoyed by co-ops and their ability to obtain federal loans at an interest rate of only 2% annually. The private-utility industry, however, chose not to intervene in the case.

The commission did agree unanimously that FPC jurisdiction over multistate generating and transmission cooperatives "would be in the public inter-

est." It noted that its policies and those of the REA administrator might lead to "incipient conflicts," but that "these could be resolved by the Congress in the most appropriate manner." In a statement issued later, Chairmaman Lee C. White said the commission hopes to "develop some constructive recommendation" to Congress for specific legislation aimed at giving the FPC authorty over cooperatives.

A spokesman for the National Rural Electric Cooperatives Association said he doubted that any FPC Congressional move would win much backing. The spokesman noted that a bill with the opposite intention to exempt co-ops from FPC jurisdiction - passed the Senate in 1965. That measure was defeated in the House.



### End For Allis?

The Allis Hotel in Wichita, the state's newest major city hotel for many years, may be in its last days. The Allis has been sold by the Boss Hotel Co., to Equitable Life Assurance of New York, effective this week. Equitable's intentions are not known, altho there is some possibility the insurance company will remodel the structure with the intention of re-selling it. The Allis was built in 1930, boasting such modern conven-. iences as "radio, ceiling fans, circulating ice water, tub and shower bath."



# Hogs To Vietnam

A shipment of hogs is destined for Vietnam from the George Burkholder farm northeast of Abilene. Burkholder and his son Gary made the donation. Inspecting the porkers are Don Harzman and Dan Vander Giesen of Downs, Burkholder and Oscar Latzke of Junction City.

The Burkholder hogs will be part of 100 pigs from Kansas to Vietnam as part of a project aimed at helping backward ar armed form agricultural countries by giving farmers quality breeding stock.

On the Vietnam end of the project is Rev. Ben Finley, former Methodist pastor at several churches in the G&G area Finley, a former ranch foreman and feed mill operator around Miltonvale, will distribute the pigs to farmers in Vietnam. Each farm must then return a pig from its first litter so that the project will keep going in that country.

Six to 10 boars will also be sent, and two pedigreed boars and two pedigreed sows, which will be used as the beginning of a breeding station in the Vietnamese province where Finley works

The pigs are being brought at 100-pound size and being fed on the VanderGiesen farm near Downs until they reach 200 pounds. The gilts will be vaccinated and bred just before

shipment by air, probably sometime in March. Money for purchase and shipping is being contributed. VanderGiesen said he would like to send a list of 500 names along with the shipment showing the interest of Kansans in Finley's project.



### **Close Gates On** Milford Lake

JUNCTION CITY-Gates of Milford Dam on the nearby Republican River were to have been officially closed Monday for permanent impoundment of water, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers announced last week.

The Corps has been conducting temporary storage of water since December. There was about 13 feet of water in the reservoir.

Conservation pool level will be 1,144.4 feet. It is hoped the level will be reached by July 4, tentative date for dedication ceremonies.

The level last Tuesday was 1,092.75 feet.

Heavy spring rains normally would fill the reservoir to conservation level. If further snow develops, the level could be reached with the spring thaw.



in Kansas about a year ago, includes, besides CMA, regional marketing associations based in Yuma, Colo.; Venango, Nebr.; Columbia, Mo.; St. Paul, Minn.; Des Moines, Ia.; Chicago; and Jackson, Miss.

The company does not yet have a resident office. Kansas City is in contention for the headquarters, as are St. Louis and New Orleans.

The associations had been selling wheat and feed grains to other exporters but have lacked facilities to handle the trade directly.

With more than half of the U.S. wheat produced now being sold abroad and a fast-growing export trade in feed grains and soybeans, it became clear that to become bigger in the business meant actively engaging in the overseas trade, company officials explained.

Heavy movement of grain by barge on the Missouri and Missississippi rivers also was a contributing reason for forming an export company and building the terminal elevator to service ocean-going vessels.
