

Starship Fly On... Sail Away... is the official theme song for the program dedicated to educating children and rebuilding the space shuttle in memory of those who were lost.

Starship Fly On is a combined effort of Charlie Whitaker and Jerry Dycke. Whitaker wrote the lyrics and Dycke is the composer and vocalist of the song.

Dycke is a former Kansas 4-H'er from Shawnee County and was the winner of the Kansas State Fair 4-H talent contest when he was 17. The following year he again won the contest and competed in the national competition in Chicago. He placed fourth in the competition and was asked to be a guest on the nationally televised "Don McNeil's Breakfast Club" show.

Merle Eyestone, field representative for the Kansas 4-H Foundation was the Shawnee County agent while Dycke was in 4-H. He took Dyke to his first talent show.

Jerry Dycke begins his promo by stating his singing careers began with the opportunities provided while he was an Auburn 4-H member in the mid-1950s. Eyestone has kept in touch with Dycke over the years and watched his career develop. He recently visited Dycke at The Hut in Ft. Myers, Florida where he has been working full time since 1984. Dycke found the lyrics to "Starship Fly On" one day when he went to work. Whitaker wrote the song and put it on Dycke's piano.

"The explosion of the Challenger was really a major shock to me. I saw so many people trying to express themselves ... trying to put into words the same things I was feeling. And although

I don't make my living as a song writer, I've written enough to recognize the feeling I get inside when I'm going to write something down. It was one week to the day, and I'd been listening to friends all evening, and about three in the morning I knew it was coming. It was on the page in just a couple of hours," Whitaker, a chef at The Hut restaurant said.

Dycke felt the same way about the Challenger accident. "When I went into work that Tuesday night, I found the words on the piano. I knew Charlie had left them there. We have written three songs together, so I knew at once where these lyrics came from. And just reading them through, I started hearing the melody. It came so easily ... it was like someone ... something ... outside myself was helping me write the music. The two parts just came together," Dycke said.

The song has received airplay across the U.S. and Europe. It has also been woven into a four-minute video which was broadcast on the ABC Morning News.

All proceeds from the airplay and sales will go to the U.S. Space Foundation in Colorado Springs. The monies received will be used for education of children and to replace the shuttle.

"We all feel that we would not be comfortable making money from a tragedy that is shared by all of us ... by the whole world. Of course, we hope to gain recognition from the song, but each of us was inspired by something outside ourselves to write this song," Dycke said.

Starship Fly On is not the only song for which Dycke has received public recognition.

Recently, the Florida Country Music Association named Dycke Entertainer of the Year and Songwriter of the Year. His "Keys to the Highway" won Song of the Year and Dycke and his partner, Tony Cianci, named Duo of the Year.

After his graduation from the College of Emporia with a degree in Biology and Education, he worked for the Social Security Administration for four years. He then enrolled at the Holiday Inn University and studied hotel management.

From there, he went to manager of a Topeka Holiday Inn. While working in Topeka, he attended a Holiday Inn Convention in Memphis and met Sam Phillips. Phillips is the man who discovered Elvis Presley, Johnny Cash, Jerry Lee Lewis and other stars of Sun Records.

Phillips asked Dycke to Memphis to record. "Just being on the Sun label at that time would open doors for you," Dycke said.

His two biggest Sun Recordings were "Things" and "Will the Circle be Unbroken."

Blue Sky

Proceeds from Starship Fly On will benefit programs like Blue Sky Below My Feet. The program is designed to educate children about space technology.

The Blue Sky program is dedicated to the memory of the Space Shuttle "Challenger" crew who lost their lives in the exlosion of January 28, 1986. It was created by the Extension Service, National Aeronautics and Space Administration, Arthur Young and the National 4-H Council.

U.S. Air Force Lieutenant Colonel Ellison S. Onizuka of the Challenger crew was a former 4-H'er and the first Japanese-American and native Hawaiian to fly in space. His first mission was in January, 1985. During that mission, he carried with him three 4-H flags. He credited 4-H programs with giving him opportunities to develop self-confidence, the ability to achieve and a spirit of expoloration and challenge. LTC Onizuka was assisting in the production of Blue Sky before his death and is featured in the television pro-

Blue Sky explores adventures in space technology in the areas of forces, fibers and foods.

K-State Collegiate 4-H ...

Sixty Years of Service


The 60th year of Collegiate 4-H on the K-State campus marks many years of service and fun for college-age 4-H members.

Collegiate 4-H was organized in 1927 at the annual 4-H Roundup. A group of former 4-H members organized themselves to continue the friendships begun in county 4-H groups.

Starting with a membership of 60, the club's roster swelled to nearly 600 by 1932.

During the years around World War II, Collegiate 4-H was involved in a large number of activities. While many of these events were social gatherings, including four parties each semester, service activities continued the themes of 4-H.

One main activity of the members each year was to help with the 4-H club Roundup. Cecil Eyestone, a member during the 1940s and later an extension agent, said of helping with roundup, "We even ran a laundry service for the youngsters because at the time the boys wore white uniforms and the girls had green ones. Since some of them didn't have enough uniforms for the while time we found a lady down on Yuma to do them. We'd lug those uniforms down to that woman to get them cleaned. One year it rained and we had a tough time getting those uniforms back to the youngsters in time for the next event.'

"Who's Whoot," the annual yearbook published by members, listed other activities for 1945 to include helping furnish Rock Springs Camp, donating \$4,500 in war bonds to the construction of the student union, and broadcasting a half-hour radio program on Saturdays.

"I was really thankful for the radio program. I did 10 years of radio work when I started a job as an extension agent. I felt a lot more comfortable doing that because I had my first experience right here on campus," Eyestone said.

The highlight of the fall semester was a dinner-dance while a semi-formal gathered enthusiasm in the spring.

Milton Eisenhower, while president of K-State, was quoted in the *Kansas Industrialist* (October 19, 1944) as saying, "This club is a vital part of K-State life. It brings together students from all parts of the state."

In 1947, a Collegian article stated that "It (Collegiate 4-H) provides social events for its members, helps the 4-H program over the state, and serves the interests of Kansas State."

The 475 members were kept busy in 1950 with a box supper to support International Foreign Youth Exchange, placing a new bulletin board near Danforth Chapel, raising funds for Danforth Chapel and the student union, in addition to their usual activities. These included helping with 4-H club Roundup, publishing Who's Whoot, and writing and performing the Saturday radio program.

Eyestone, who also served as adviser for Collegiate 4-H from 1962-1977, said the large size of the group in those days didn't deter students from getting involved.

"We just accepted it — the high number of members. I was in two or three others but we felt Collegiate 4-H was an outstanding organization on campus and were proud to be part of it. We did a variety of things to get young people to feel at home. If

Steve Fisher, current faculty adviser, remembers when he was a member in 1967.

"We met in Williams Auditorium (Umberger Hall) and had a dance beforehand in the basement of Umberger — there weren't any offices down there then — and by the time the meeting started there were usually 150-200 people there."

Although current membership has dropped to about 30 active members, Collegiate 4-H remains active on campus. This year the members will attend the National 4-H Conference in Columbus, Ohio, hold officer's training for various county clubs, and serve as judges for 4-H Days in area counties.

They also hosted the regional Collegiate 4-H meeting in November with clubs from Nebraska, South Dakota, Minnesota and Missouri in attendance.

Sponsoring the food stand at the Kansas State Fair is the main fund raiser for the organization.

On campus, the Collegiate 4-H remains busy helping with the bloodmobile, the College of Agriculture telefund, All-University Open House and Ag Science Day.

A former Edwards County 4-H member will join the Kansas 4-H Foundation staff as a development officer effective June 1.

Jim Ploger assumes the duties of working with county fund raising and alumni events for the 4-H Foundation.

Ploger was a member of the Executive Board of the Edwards County Extension Council, a community club leader and 4-H member elected to all offices. In 1967, he was a delegate to India in the 4-H International Farm Youth Exchange, IFYE.

A graduate of Kansas State University in business administration, he has served as assistant to Governor Carlin since 1984 in the areas of economic development and agriculture.

"Jim's experience in political fund raising gives him the background to provide leadership in the Foundation's county fund raising and alumni efforts," said Bill Riley, Executive Director of the Kansas 4-H Foundation.

Ploger has also served as a representative of the Kansas Department of Economic Development working throughout the state in the areas of business and tourism surveys and as the lead staff member of the Pride program. He has also served as: executive director of the Kansas Democratic Party, director of member and public relations for FAR-MAR-CO in Hutchinson and executive secretary of the Kansas Farmers Union.





Have you ever been to a "Lock-In?" Well, this was my first such experience and let me tell you, I enjoyed it tremendously!




By now we were all hungry. Doesn't everyone get a craving for pizza at 12:30 in the morning.
