Votaw says growth has widened the gap between America and underdeveloped nations and has provided much of the "pollution, crowding and other environmental degradation we see around us." He warns that continuation along present lines would bring difficult problems and might even lead to

destruction.

No growth is a necessary element to achieving solution to these problems, he adds. "We need a redirection or altering of priorities, a slowing down of growth. There should not be so much stopping as converting some of our drive towards growth for these underdeveloped countries and solving our environmental problems. Instead of striving for 2-billion or 3billion-dollar growth, we should devote 10 to 20 times that amount to bring these other countries closer to us.'

#### **Junction City Closes Extended Care Facility**

JUNCTION CITY - Closing of the 20-bed extended care facility (ECF) at Geary Community Hospital, effective May 1, has been approved by the Geary County Commission. Harold Sarowski, hospital administrator, said with only three patients in the facility it is no longer economically feasible to care for such patients in the hospital.

They will be placed in skilled care nursing homes.

The 20 extended care beds will be made available for use by regular hospital patients when needed. During periods of low occupancy, the section will be closed. A portion of the \$1.1 million in federal Hill-Burton funds used to

construct the 92-bed hospital was earmarked for the ECF. Sadowski said there was no requirement that the facility be retained.

ECF patients are charged \$19 per day, and the hospital must provide a separate nursing staff for the facility. Regular patients are charged \$40 per day for a private room and \$36 for a semi-private room.

Sadowski said at one time the facility had 15 to 17 patients per day, which enabled the hospital to meet expenses. In recent months, the average has been about 7 patients per day, which has resulted in a loss in revenue.

County commissioners said Junction City's one skilled care nursing home is full, so ECF patients will be encouraged to find facilities in the area.

The three were accused of threatening to reveal an incident in Estes' life if he did not pay them \$25,000. Woolf and Clemence were arrested April 15.





# Hippie Clan Backs Off From Tilling Tough Tennessee Soil

A group of hippies from California, after a week on a 600-acre farm noth of Nashville, Tenn., has learned the meaning of the hill country expression, "a hard row to hoe."

The land, in fact, was so untillable that the group packed up its 63vehicle caravan and were looking for another farm.

"We figured we had less than 40 acres of tillable land," said Stephen Gaskin, the 35-year-old leader of the 250 member group. The property was heavily wooded and very hilly. He blamed the group's selection of the farm on its inexperience in such matters.

"You've got to realize most of us have lived in apartments," Gaskin said. "Anything bigger than nine-bynine seemed tremendous.'

He also said that the group's departure had nothing to do with the way they were treated in Ashland City because the people there were friendly, loaning them tools and giving instruction on farming.

Gaskin said he brought the group to Tennessee where they could live in a clean, wholesome environment and practice his religious teachings, which he says are a composite of the world's religions.

Gaskin and his followers, longhaired and plainly dressed, have set up housekeeping near Old Hickory lake on the outskirts of Nashville while looking for another farm.

Gaskin said the group lost only time, a small amount of money a and a few green onions on the Ashland City farm.

The owner of the property returned the group's \$2,000 deposit on the farm except for a small amount kept as reimbursement for "legal fees.



anticipation. Think how much fun you're going to have picking and choosing the perfect flowers and vegetables, the perfect color schemes and taste ticklers.

Packets of flower seeds usually are at the top of the display rack, those of vegetable seeds lower down. The alphabet starts at the left of the top row of packets and continues, first to the right, then down to the left of the next row.

This makes it easy for you to find the packet of seeds you wish to grow.

When you reach the vegetable seeds, the alphabet starts over again. But in this part of the rack you'll find that some seeds are in packets while others are in small boxes. The seeds in boxes are those that are large, like corn, peas and beans. A packet wouldn't accommodate enough of these to make planting worthwhile.

Usually a box full of these large seeds is sufficient for 50 feet of row. But look on the backs of the boxes







# Soviets Ready To Unload Wheat On Export Market?

piles in the Soviet Union is being watched carefully by Agriculture department trade experts for signs again be headed for trouble.

The huge world wheat supply that hit export markets two years ago has been reduced to fairly workable levels, mainly because of severe production cutbacks in some of the big competing countries, including Canada and the United States.

But now, according to recent estimates, the Soviet Union could be on the verge of using some of its near-record 1970 wheat crop for stepping up exports. The Soviet wheat crop last year is estimated at 80 million metric tons. That would be about 2.96 billion bushels or about

A sharp buildup of wheat stock- double the size of a bumper wheat crop in the United States. It also meant a 28 per cent boost from Soviet wheat output in 1969 and was the world grain market might once second only to the record 85 million tons produced in 1966.

The 1970 Soviet wheat crop was part of a bumper output of all grains last year, according to a Foreign Agricultural service report. "Although the actual output has been shrouded in mysterious silences and conflicting pronouncements," the FAS said, "it is evident that the Soviet Union's 1970 grain crop including rye and feed grains was the largest ever."

The big wheat crop has enabled the Soviet Union to meet domestic requirements and build up reserves. "With these larger wheat stocks on hand," the FAS said, "the Soviet Union is expecting a better export year than in 1970. In addition to shipping to grain-deficit areas of Eastern Europe, the Soviets probably will be more aggressive this season in Western European markets, particularly Great Britain and West Germany.

Even a modest incursion into the market could spell stiffer competition for the United States and the other Big Five wheat exporters, Canada, Australia, France, the Common Market and Argentina. Current U.S. wheat exports, rebounding from the low levels of two years ago, are running almost one-fifth ahead of year-ago rates. For the fiscal year ending June 30, officials expect up to about 750 million bushels for export, the most since 1967-68. The outlook for next fiscal year, beginning July 1, still is promising for U.S. wheat

The money will come from a pool of about \$2 million left over from socalled "inverse subsidy" fees paid by exporters to the government for refunding to wheat farmers.

Congress last year authorized spending some of the funds on approved projects aimed at increasing the use of wheat.

announced Wednesday it will accept applications through May 6 from wheat growers or farm groups who want to sponsor specific projects.

Officials said that before any funds are allocated a review will be made to determine an applicant's membership, the scope of its research and promotion activities and its ability to carry out the proposed project.

Congress also authorized last year the establishment of a National Wheat Institute designed to conduct research and promotion work.

The finliasts are Marty Kellogg, Overland Park; Sandy Humphrey, Topeka; and Linda Wittmer, Cleveland, Ohio.





new crop spraying system developed here by Electro-Gas Dynamics company will begin to sweep over farms in the Southwest states in late spring. The system involves the same technique used in spraying paint on

automobiles where paint molecules are given an electric charge which attracts them to the nearest uncharged object.

In electrostatic crop spraying, droplets of pesticide or insecticide receive a strong negative electrostatic charge as they spew out spray from tanks mounted on airplanes. To use the systems to spray from the air formerly required a dangerous ground wire trailing from the plane to complete the electrical circuit. Electro-Gas-Dynamics has eliminated the ground wire by charging the entire plane instead of just the cargo. The electrostatic device weighs only 20 pounds.

When the droplets fall on the foliage to be protected, they will induce a positive charge on the surfaces of the plants. They zero in on the target area rather than drift in the atmosphere and coat not only the tops of leaves but the underside, lower leaves and stalks.

The idea is to cut down on waste and pollution.

"By charging the spray droplets we can cause two or three times as much pesticide to land on target," said David Malcolm, vice-president. "This means that pests can be controlled just as effectively as spreading 50 per cent or less of the pesticide liquid that would normally be used."

Agriculture experts estimate that 750 million dollars worth of chemicals are sprayed each year in the United States over 90 million

The first production models of a acres. Some 6,000 planes fan out over the countryside. Antipollution experts estimate that up to 75 per cent of conventional sprays contaminate the environment by either landing on soil or drifting in the air.

To get its system off the ground, EGD acquired what is believed to be the largest agricultural aviation company in the nation, Aerial Application Technology Inc. It has 90 planes and operates in the Southwestern states and California.

George Wilenius, president of EGD, contends that farmers will realize 30 per cent to 40 per cent savings from the new system. He believes his small, high-



Biswell, who oversees the rural fire district program in Kansas, said that while the number of fires increased the average loss declined.

Biswell said the number of fires and acreage burned are related to weather conditions. February with 847 fires - was the high month for fire occurrence. That month was characterized by dry, windy weather conditions.

Debris burning remains the major cause of rural fires in Kansas, accounting for 1,269 fires (33 per cent of the total) and 63,454 acres burned (47 per cent) during the year.

The rural fire program was made possible by the Clarke-McNary Act of 1924 and the Federal Property and Administration Act of 1969.


In 1963 State and Extension Forestry at Kansas State University entered into a cooperative agreement with the U.S. Department of Agriculture to provide information and technical assistance to rural fire districts in fire prevention and control on forested and watershed lands.

The number of fire districts has reached 275, including six additions in 1970. Biswell pointed out that the districts are providing rural fire protection for more than 40.6 million acres of rural lands in the state. This is 81 per cent of the total rural land area.

The districts are formed by local citizens through resolution or petition. They obtain much of their equipment through State and Extension Forestry, which requisitions excess military vehicles for conversion through a unique arrangement with the U.S. Forest Service and General Services Administration.

The equipment is made available to local districts at no cot. Biswell said the value of equipment issue to rural districts thus far is \$9 million.

# **European Farmers Losing Subsidies**

Barbed wire encircled the hall where Common Market agricultural ministers met recently to vote on a new farm aid program. In front of the building, a small army of police with water cannons kept a crowd of protesting farmers at bay.

Inside the hall, the ministers approved a controversial new program for a dramatic reshaping of the European Communities. Observers say the reforms will reduce the number of Western European farmers drastically and

will modernize the area's farming farmers, whose exports face stiff competition from Common Market products in world trade. Previous EC policy was to prop farm prices at artifically high levels, which encouraged farmers to overproduce. The resulting surpluses have been dumped on world markets, to the detriment of U.S. exports.

"If one of the consequences of the farm reforms is to resolve the EC surplus problems, the dumping of such surpluses on world markets would be reduced and eventually eliminated," says one Common Market official.

"As a result, U.S. exporters of farm produce would face less competition in world markets." Moreover, the official points out, there would be less political pressure in Common Market lands for protection against imports, which also "would be good for U.S. exporters."

To be sure, the Ec hasn't abandoned price supports completely. The ministers rejected farmers' demands for an across-the-board increase of 15 per cent in farm prices but approved 4 per cent to 6 per cent boosts in the prices for most commodities, effective last Thursday, and a whopping 10 per cent over the next two years to beef producers. Common Market officials assert that these latest increases actually strengthen their new farm program by encouraging a switch from production, for which there is more demand.

It's unclear whether these increases, the first in three years, will be enough to satisfy Europe's militant farmers, mobs of whom

have been demonstrating violently in Brussels recently.

There are about 10 million farmers in the Common Market nations. Their average age is 57. according to one EC report, and onethird are over 60. Millions of these older farmers will be encouraged to retire under the new program, which includes a pension plan costing \$1.5 billion over the next four years. For instance, farmers leaving the land at age 55 will receive payments equivalent to \$636 a year for 10 years.

Other provisions of the new program:

o Low-interest loans for farm modernization, scholarships for farm children and inducements to create producer organizations with membership throughout the six nations.

o Industrial training and job placement of younger farm dwellers.

o Encouragement of industry to locate in remote areas to provide alternate sources of employment. o Incentives to reduce the amount of land under cullivation.

Western Europe's biggest agricultural problem is inefficiency. The traditional small family farms often employ outdated farming methods and rely heavily on the EC's subsidies to stay in business. This problem is especially acute in Italy, where 18 per cent of the working population is engaged in farming, compared with 12 per cent in the EC as a whole.

A leading backer of the modersurplus dairy production to beef nization program is Sicco Mansholt, vice president of the EC commission. Two years ago, Mansholt produced his "Mansholt Plan" for overhauling the EC's agricultural program, which has been the subject of bitter controversy among the six

Tenneco formerly listed as Kern County Land company, Bakersfield, Calif., \$1,317,051; Bakersfield, Calif., \$1,317,051; Hawaiian Commercial & Sugar Co., Puunene, Hawaii, \$1,232,166; Waialua Sugar company, Ltd., Haialua, Hawaii, \$1,111,060; Vista del Llano Farms Firebaugh, Calif., \$1,105,762, and U.S. Sugar corporation, Clewsiton, Fla., \$1,073,980. In addition 14 farms were listed as having received between \$500,000 and one million dollars last year.

# Anhydrous

You can't be too cautious when handling anhydrous ammonia, warns an Extension agronomist at Kansas State University.

Dr. Leslie W. Tobin points out that numerous Kansas farmers apply anhydrous amonia for fertilizer and that death or serious injury can result from gas inhalation or skin burn.

Anhydrous ammonia contact with eyes can cause permanent injury or even blindness if the eyes aren't washed out immediately after contact.

"Wear goggles and rubber gloves and have plenty of water avalable when working with anhydrous — especially when transferring it from one tank to another," cautions Tobin.

"Don't apply salve to an ammonia burn. You can prevent a serious burn by pouring water on clothing and skin that have come in contact with ammonia." Injury caused by





tith corn planting time just ind the corner, Kansas should attention to soil temperatures. WGoetsch-Irvine Announces Their

Dr. Harold E. Jones, Extension agronomist at Kansas State University, suggests that early corn plantings be made according to soil temperatures - later in the planting season, the calendar is the best guide.

He points out that University of Illinois research proves corn will hardly germinate at 50 degrees and only slowly at 55 degrees.


Soil temperatures will rise rapidly on a clear day, even at a depth of four inches, if the soil moisture content is sufficient.

During mid-April tests, Illinois scientists found the soil temperature to be 43 degrees at both two and fourinch depths. Three and one-half hours later - with bright sunshine - the temperature had risen to 60 degrees at a depth of two inches.

The K-State specialist offers these planting guides for Kansas corn growers:

• Plant when the temperature at 7 a.m. reaches 50 degrees at the twoinch soil depth. This will assure a temperature favorable for growth during most of a 24-hour period, providing considerable sunshine is available.

• Plant when the temperature at 1 p.m. reaches 55 degrees at the fourinch soil depth. The four-inch level is suggested for the 1 p.m. measurement because a single day of bright sunshine doesn't affect this level as much as the two-inch level.

• After May 1 in southern Kansas or May 10 in northern counties, plant corn if the soil is dry enough, even though the temperature is below suggested levels. Until corn plants are at least four to six inches tall the growing point of the plant is below the soil surface.

Frost may kill the leaves while the growing point is buried, but it will seldom kill the plant. Even when frost kills back the leaves, leaving the growing point unaffected, yields are usually as good or better than yields of corn planted 10 to 15 days later but not frosted, Jones says.

Soil temperatures reported by the weather bureau are usually taken under sod where the midday temperature at two to four inches is often 8 to 12 degrees lower than the temperature under bare ground.

Jones cautions farmers who use soil temperatures as early-planting guides to take them under the same kind of surface soil conditions that will be present at planting time.

#### **New Cutler** Soybean Seed **Resists Root Rot**

A Cutler soybean variety, called Cutler 71, that resists root rot is being released to certified seed growers in eight states, Dr. Floyd W. Smith, director of the Kansas Agricultural Experiment Station, has announced at Kansas State University.

The other seven states releasing seed are Delaware, Illinois, Indiana, Kentucky, Maryland, Missouri, and Nebraska.

Except for resisting phytophthora root rot, Cutler 71 is like Cutler. Cutler 71 is the result of backcrossing phytophthora root-rot resistance into Cutler at Purdue University and evaluated as C1481 in 27 regional tests by workers of the U.S. Regional Soybean Labaoratory and cooperating states.

Like Cutler, Cutler 71 resists frogeye leaf spot, race 2, as well as root rot.

Cutler 71 should do well wherever Cutler has done well, plus areas where Cutler (or other group IV maturity varieties) have been attacked by root rot.

More than 1,000 bushels are being distributed to Kansas certified seed growers this year, so seed of Cutler 71 should be generally available after the 1971 harvest.

# **Rootworm Problem** In Some Corn Fields


Among the factors to be con-Kansas is the type of insect control program to be followed.

"For most corn growers this means a planting time insecticidal application for corn rootworm control on continuous corn and in fields with a recent history of rootworm damage," says Leroy Brooks, Extension entomologist at Kansas State University.

Insecticides recommended by include Bux, Dasanit Dyfonate, rootworm control results are Carbofuran, or phorate (Thimet).

Farmers in parts of western Kansas should be concerned about rootworms in view of infestations that occurred there last year, says Brooks.

In some of these areas rootworms are relatively new and farmers have had less experience in combating





the recommended insecticides should give good control of light to moderate rootworm infestations.

Since this method is -somewhat more risky and since most producers do not have separatelymounted granular applicators, it has not been widely practiced in Kansas, Brooks says.

Brooks feels that aldrin and heptachlor - widely used for rootworm control in previous years - are no longer successful because the insect has become resistant to them.

In first-year corn following sod, aldrin and heptachlor are often used as a broadcast application about two weeks prior to planting. This gives control of wireworms and grubs, which are often present in these situations.

In a few cases producers may want to use both aldrin and heptachlor along with a rootworm in-

secticide, says Brooks. These would be used in fields that have long histories of cutworm infestation or of wireworm injury. In most instances, however, application of both materials is a waste of money, be believes.

# **Cows Survived Black Watch Debacle** --But Investors Didn't

since the Black Watch Farms went broke.

And the survivors came out better than expected. While some nearly starved and bounced around the country looking for a new home, most survived the crisis, perhaps by charity, likely at values on the open market one-tenth of what they had previously commanded.

The survivors mentioned in the paragraph above are the cows.

But the investors didn't do that well.

The big money people who put their investments in Black Watch were dealing with a reputable firm. The investors figure to get tax savings and some day sell their animals for a fat profit.

The hitch that developed was bankruptcy of Black Watch, a New York state firm. Sales slumped when tax revisions in 1969 limited the tax write-offs available to a cowman. The same law that limited the write-off also prompted some investors to quit making payments.

When Black Watch declared bankruptcy, the investors were stuck with the responsibility of caring for the cattle. The investors

The basis of the move goes back to a 1963 law which required reappraisals of taxable property in the state. The goal was uniform assessment-so that taxes on one property would be fair in relation to others.

For eight years counties have been carrying out these re-evaluaThe reason only 96 of the state's 105 counties were included in Dwyer's directive is that the other nine are in the midst of reassessments, and they will be required to be within the district averages after their work is completed.

While the reevaluations in each county brought not unexpected protests, most finally came about with grievances assuaged and land being valued fairly with similar land.

That's within a county. When the land crossed county lines, however, there were some remarkable inequities that didn't escape the eye of any taxpayer who owned land across county borders. They didn't escape Dwyer's eye either, and he was charged by law to see that the assessed values were equalized

The problems of the equalization by decree are myriad. Miller's petition to the court contends that the statutes on which Dwyer's directive are based are unconstitutional.

County commissioners are reluctant to implement the change. They not only dread the controversy but have some understand able sympathy for the farmer who finds his tax values increased.

The problems are no less if valuations are decreased. Then there are budget problems and increases in mill levies. If the values are increased, there is the 105 percent limit on a budget - the tax lid imposed five years ago as part of the foundation school aid - 3 percent sales tax package.

In short, county commissioners. think they have neither the time, money, or nerve to back Dwyer's directive, even tho it seems dictated by law.

Equalizing taxes within a county was tough enough. Equalizing them across county lines seems more formidable. Moreover, ask some of the commissioners, how is Dwyer going to equalize valuations of land that cross the borders of his arbitrary districts?

Tansy mustard is an annual or winter annual that has finely divided fern-like leaves. Treacle mustard, an annual or winter annual with lance-shaped leaves, is another frequent unwelcomed weed in wheat fields.

Fortunately, wild mustard can be controlled. Says Nilson:

"I recently talked with a northcentral Kansas farmer who sprayed 2, 4-D on some mustard-infested fields last year but used nothing on similar fields that also were infested with mustard.

"He reported there was no yield in the field that was not sprayed but 25 to 35 bushels of wheat per acre were produced on fields sprayed with 2, 4-D.'

The K-State specialist says least injury will result if 2, 4-D is applied from the time wheat is in full tiller or fully stooled to the early boot stage. If most of the wheat is not fully tillered, 2,4-D, can have some effect if sprayed at this time.

'However, a delay in spraying could result in more damage from the mustard to the wheat," warns Nilson. A delay would also lessen the chances of effectively controlling the weed.

Nilson suggests these recommendations for control of mustard and other annual broadleaf weeds in wheat:

Apply one-half pound acid equivalent of 2, 4-D amine or onethird pound acid equivalent of 2,4-D low volatile ester per acre under calm or nearly calm conditions.

For ground application, use 15 to 20 gallons of spray per acre and apply at low pressure (20-30) pounds per square inch. Fields should be not grazed for two weeks after treat-

Farmers troubled by wild mustard and other broadleaf weeds may obtain a copy of K-State bulletin 540 entitled "Chemical Weed Control in Field Crops."

They are doing it also on an experimental basis in the San Juan Mountains of Colorado, in the Dakotas, and in the Lake Tahoe region of California and Nevada.

The prediction of "operational capability" in another three years is confined to the western areas where the Reclamation Bureau and its contracts have been working.

Knowledge of rainmaking, so far, is confined largely to cold weather storm clouds and to precipitation in the form of snow.

James L. Kerr, specialist in the Reclamation Bureau's atmospheric water resources management program, estimated it will be 1990 before rainmakers will be able to perform reliably in any part of the

country.

Congress directed the Reclamation Bureau in 1961 to explore the potential of weather modification to increase water supply and allotted \$100,000 to start the research. Current expenditures are running about \$6.5 million a vear.

Research to date indicates that about 20 billion tons of water flow daily across the United States, with only about 10 per cent of it falling as rain or snow.

"Nature is a very inefficient rainmaker," Kerr said in an in-terview. "What we are trying to do is make nature more efficient.'

Depending on the nature of the clouds and the temperature, rainmakers estimated they are able to increase precipitation from a given cloud by 10 to 30 per cent, averaging about 16 per cent.







From county clerks and other licensed data collected more than half of the landowners contacted wished to have the quail and pheasant season opened together. About two-thirds of the hunters also favored some type of concurrent opening.

Original recommendation for concurrent openers was made in belief such a season would distribute the hunting pressure on opening day over a wider area and reduce the number of hunters that a landowner would have to contend with on any given day.

The archery deer hunters will have a split season, opening Oct. 16 and run through Nov. 25. The second segment will open Dec. 11 and run through Dec. 31. Deer of either sex may be taken by archers during the first segment but bucks only will be legal targets during the second.

Two firearms seasons will be featured this year, one in the High Plains, Smoky Hill, West Arkansas and Cimarron units and one for the remainder of the state. The western deer season will be Dec. 4 through Dec. 8. The eastern season will be Nov. 27-Dec. 5.

A total of 8,665 firearms deer permits will be issued in the 18 deer management units. There will be no
