



sumers for more beef and from officials and environmentalists for animal waste control, some Kansas feedlot owners have the feeling they are being pushed one way and pulled another.

The number of Kansas feedlots capable of feeding 10,000 or more head is increasing as much as 25 percent annually, and has passed the 50 mark. In a recent 12-month period the number of cattle on feed for the slaughter market jumped 35 percent.

Obviously, with all this going on, and with the per capita consumption of beef at 117 pounds per year and Because of pressure from con-rising, feedlot owners' waste disposal problems are not getting easier to solve.

But, as a group of university and government agency personnel noted following a weeklong tour of Kansas feedlots, most owners want to be good neighbors and are putting extra dollars into pollution abatement facilities to prove it.

Stops were made at feedlots in Barton, Butler, Crawford, Ellis, Ellsworth, Ford, Labette, Lyon, Pottawatomie, Pratt, Washington, and Woodson counties.

Dr. Keith Huston, associate director of the Kansas Agricultural Experiment Station, believes Kansas is "clearly the nation's leader in developing and using effective and practical plans for disposing of liquid wastes from feedlots which prevent wastes from entering streams."

He said following the tour that "most owners of both commercial and private feedlots expressed interest in and concern for their home state's efforts to keep Kansas a good place to live by preventing pollution.

"Many feedlot owners have installed liquid waste control facilities that far surpass the stringent state guidelines established by the Environmental Health Services, Kansas State Department of

Huston added that the director of the Environmental Health Services and his staff have developed effective relationships with feedlot owners. Consequently, the Kansas program is progressing speedily even though the agency is not adequately staffed to rapidly meet all requests for assistance from prospective feedlot operators.


The other tour participants included Russell Herpich, Ralph Lipper, Harry Manges, and William H. Johnson of Kansas State University; Lynn Shuyler, Douglas Kreis, and David Farmer of the Environmental Protection Agency; and H. Y. Cott, Charles Stewart, and Carl Anderson of the Soil Conservation Service. They were mainly interested in observing the methods employed by feedlots in disposing of liquid waste.

Generally, a Kansas feedlot disposes of liquid runoff in one of two ways: allows it to evaporate in a holding pond, or pumps it from the pit to crop or grassland in an irrigation program.

There is one other method, but allowing the liquid runoff to flow into a stream or onto a neighbor's property is not only unneighborly but illegal.

A typical Kansas feedlot pollution abatement system consists of a settling basin and at least one holding pond. Liquid is pumped from the basin to the collection pit, with the solids remaining in the basin.

Reservoir size requirements are based on a formula established by state health authorities and involve the number of acres in the drainage

The reservoirs must be large enough to collect runoff from the maximum rainfall expected in a 24hour period once in 10 years.

Cost of these management systems may run into the tens of thousands of dollars for the larger feedlots. Some owners said they had already invested more than \$100,000 in establishing waste management facilities, and expected to spend more as their lots expanded.

to use for irrigation purposes," stated one western Kansas feedlot manager. "We collect the runoff in two lagoons, pump it up a long hill and into another basin. We don't have any alternative but to let it evaporate. Fortunately, this is possible in our low rainfall area."

Almost without exception, owners of the older feedlots said they would purchase extra land to utilize for irrigation if they could select a new site and start over. They also stated they would not build close to a community.

"If we started over, we would purchase additional land, on which to dispose of liquids, but it is difficult enough running a feedlot without worrying about getting into a farming operation," one manager observed.

Said another:

"We saw the need for disposal facilities early..... back in 1964, and have increased our storage capacity as our lot has increased in size. We are now far beyond minimum standards, but you can bet it is costly.

"We're relying on evaporation, but do have outlets for pumping onto. grassland." He added that putting runoff on native western Kansas grass is not profitable.

One southeast Kansas lot manager said his firm had invested \$70,000 in a waste retention system, and \$50,000 in irrigation equipment.

Two sprinkler systems are used for applying water on 240 acres of corn. Even in a 38-40 inch rainfall facilities? area, the manager believes the

The manager of a 35,000-head capacity lot in west central Kansas said he welcomed the chance to irrigate with runoff because he's had to drill 11 wells a mile or so away from his feedyard.





DES Banned In Feed, Implant Use Still

The Food and Drug Ad- with 5 per cent last year. ministration ordered an immediate halt last week to further production of the controversial livestock growth hormone DES for use in animal feeds and an end to such feeding programs by Jan. 1.

The FDA said it was acting on the withdrawal. basis of new scientific evidence demonstrating that there is no feasible way to prevent, as required by law, diethylstibestrol-DESresidues from showing up in beef liver.

Consumer groups, government cancer specialists and some congressmen have been pressuring for a ban because the drug has been shown to cause cancer in laboratory animals. It has been linked to vaginal cancer among young women whose mothers took it during pregnancy to avoid miscarriages. 'No human harm has been demonstrated in over 17 years of use," of DES in livestock feeds, the FDA said. "Under the law, however, this continued use of the drug may no longer be permitted.

The order left open the use of DES implants in cattle and sheep, which the FDA said is equally effective in producing meat faster and cheaper with smaller amounts of the synthetic estrogen.

Implants are small capsules, inserted through the skin of a heifer's ear by use of a special gun, which contains smaller amounts of DES than are normally added to feed. The drug enters the animal gradually because there are few veins in the ear.

The cattle industry predicted that producers will switch to implants, but at the expense of higher meat prices.

"When the cost of production goes up, somebody's got to pay for it and it's unquestionably going to be the consumer," said a spokesman for the American National Cattlemen's Association, representing 250,000 producers.

A total ban on DES would have boosted meat prices \$3.85 a year for the average consumer, according to the Agriculture Department, or \$50 annually for a family of three, according to DES manufactures.

The FDA's action renewed calls in Congress and industry for amendment of the so-called Delaney clause in the Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act, which prohibits the use of cancer-causing chemicals in animal feed if they are detected in edible tissue:

Using admittedly more refined techniques, the Agriculture Department has found DES residues in 2.2 per cent of the livers of 2,745 samples tested this year, compared





For several years fat steer shows at most of the major live stock shows in the nation, including the American Royal, have been troubled by the showing of animals by socalled "steer jockeys."

A steer jockey is defined roughly as a professional who makes a good part of his living by showing the same string of steers throughout the show season, beginning at county and state fairs and ending up at one of the major shows, among them those in Kansas City, Denver,

The problem has many facets. But chief among them is the fact that under generally-accepted procedures of the past, the show animal was not slaughtered to confirm or refute the judge's placings by a subsequent evaluation of the carcass. Discontent among many stockmen crystalized in Denver early this year when the top prize was awarded to what was entered as an Angus crossbred steer. The animal, Big Mac, subsequently was found to have been dyed black and was in reality a Charolais crossbreed.



Kansas Rainmaking Still Up In Air

The state's \$100,000 rainmaking project should come down out of the clouds sometime soon but the start of actual cloud seeding remains up in the air.

W. E. Steps, assistant chief engineer for planning in the Kansas Water Resources Board, said there are still some loose ends to be tied but officials should be at the Colby site this week.

In the Water Resources Board release, Keith S. Krause, executive director of the board, said, "The weather modification experiment authorized by the 1972 Legislature and funded by the finance council is about to get underway in Western Kansas.

The release said notice of final approval of the language, objectives of the study and the financial arrangement between the Water

Resources Board and the division of atmospheric water resources management, U.S. Bureau of Reclamation, has been received from the Kansas Attorney General's

The center of operations will be Colby, with the portable cloud radar equipment set up at Oakley.

The 75-mile range of this radar will permit an evaluation of the rainfall resulting from the seeding operation from the north state line to as far south as the northern part of Finney County.

The release said selection of clouds to be seeded can be extended considerably beyond the 75-mile

Steps said the decision of the first seeding will be made in the field after the equipment and contractor are on the job. It also will depend on availability of suitable clouds.

Beck, vice president for agriculture at Kansas State University, told members of the 10state Council that U.S. agricultural producers and environmentalists can work together harmoniously and effectively in providing the future food and development needs of the world's "burgeoning" population

Beck presented a plan which he indicated could be an important step in removing much of the conflict and misunderstanding which now exists between the agriculture industry and those who fear modern agricultural production methods are endangering the environment.



One was recaptured six months later by a hunter 20 miles from the spot where it had been tagged. One was taken by a hunter eight miles away, and a third was retrapped at the same location where it had been caught and tagged three weeks earlier. Dr. James Greig, a Kansas State University researcher, compared fresh corn grown out of state with some produced in Kansas. He didn't do it by the taste-test method, either. He did it in the laboratory.

The Kansas corn was grown near the K-State campus. He froze it for five months and compared it with commercial fresh and frozen corn grown elsewhere, checking all samples for sugar congent.

He also tested four methods of processing - fresh harvested, fresh frozen, blanched frozen, and blanched only - to determine their effects on sugar content.

Greig found that fresh corn produced in Kansas (Golden Monarch and Royal Gold varieties) had 25 percent more sugar content than that grown in other states. Greig's conclusion is obvious: If you live in Kansas and want real quality sweet corn, buy corn that was grown

Greig, professor of horticulture and forestry at K-State, has been concerned with the quality of commercially grown fresh corn and processed frozen corn for several years. "Perhaps,"

says, "technology has developed so fast that quality hasn't been as good as it once was."

To maintain sugar content, says Greig, more attention will have to be given the development of uniform ear maturity and on ways to "move processing more quickly" following harvest.

Greig says the corn he purchased for the research project probably was mechanically harvested and the ears were in different stages of maturity. The corn grown near Manhattan was handpicked and had. more uniform maturity.

The researcher believes the problems in harvesting and processing must be solved if the consumption level of fresh and frozen corn is maintained or increased.

While no figures are available on Kansas sweet corn production, Greig says that one grower near DeSota has 800 acres of successive

corn plantings for the fresh market. He crates, ices and ships the corn to Canada, New York and other markets in the north and to Texas and Louisiana to the south.

Other fresh corn growers in Kansas sell locally to wholsalers and retailers. In addition to DeSota, large sweet corn acreages are also Concordio 4-H located at Wichita, Topeka, and Manhattan.

While Greig is not predicting that Kansas will become a big sweet corn producing state, he says it does have excellent weather conditions for

In research project completed two years ago, he found that Kansas had a greater number of days for growing and harvesting corn than any other state in the Great Plains, from Texas to North Dakota.

Noting that sugar content decreases during freezer storage if the enzymes are not inactivated during blanching, he offers these tips for housewives:

A minimum of five minutes blanching time is needed for corn on the cob. Cool immediately with tap water, and cut the kernels off the cob for whole kernel or cream-style servings.

If you want to freeze and store corn on the cob, double the blanching time so the enzymes in the cob Valley 4-H club, cashed in his anhydrous ammonia, are inactivated. Otherwise, off flavors will result.





Smoky Valley Feedlot Loses One Full Silo

MARQUETTE — "The leaning tower of Marquette," a 70-foot silo at th Smoky Valley Feedlot five miles northeast of here, fell with a dull thud at 11:30 a.m. last Wednesday. It crushed about 10 feet of an office building under its shadow.

The silo, filled with 37,000 bushels of high-moisture content ground milo, was a total loss. Capacity of the silo was 40,000 bushels.

Leroy Dauer of Falun, feedlot manager, estimated the value of the silo at \$20,000 and the grain at \$45,000. No estimate of damage to the office was given.

Numerous spectators at the scene broke into cheers and applause when the collapse occured.

Cause of the collapse was still being investigated by feedlot officials, insurance men and representatives of Salina Concrete Products, the firm that built the silo in January of 1971.

"We guarantee our structures for one year to be free from defects in material and workmanship," said Bob Riffel, Salina Concrete Products official. "This is the first silo we built that has fallen down."

Some at the scene speculated that the soil might have shifted, since the silo is on a slight hill.

Riffel said his company "didn't to my knowledge make a site study before building the silo to see if the land was solid enough for the silo."

The feedlot is owned jointly by manager Dauer and Wilbur Wilhelm, Salina. Neither had checked as of Wednesday afternoon to see if their insurance would

provide any coverage for the loss. "I think we should be able to save about half of the grain if we get to it before it rains," said Mrs. Dauer.

Five employes of the feedlot and about 45 volunteers were working to load the ground milo into trucks for transfer to a trench silo one mile south of the feedlot.

Wilhelm, surveying the damage, said, "You have to admit, somedays things just don't work out right."

Wilhelm noticed the silo was leaning early last week. "I knew the time was approaching. It was moving about an inch and a half at the top each hour," said Wilhelm.
"I'm surprised it didn't go a little sooner." Office equipment was

Efforts were made to change the

direction of the fall of the silo. "It originally would have fallen on top of the office building, but employes put jacks under the silo and made it fall to the southwest, only hitting about one-half of the office," said Mrs.

In addition to crushing part of the lot. No plans have been released by office, the falling silo and its contents may have damaged the truck

Another silo 75 percent full of milo stands beside the fallen structure to feed the 7,000 head of cattle in the the owners to replace the silo.

A representative of Salina Concrete Products said it would take at least two to three weeks to build a new silo after the grain and debris was cleared away

Newer Wheat Varieties Top N.C.K. Field Test

Newer varieties again took top honors in 1972 wheat yields on the N.C.K. Experiment Fields, according to Lowell Burchett, field superintendent.

Eagle and Centurk tied for top yield at the Belleville field with 46-1 bushels per acre, followed by Danne 45.3; Gage 43.8; Pronto 43.5; KS 7016 (experimental) 43.2; Parker 43.0 and Scout 42.3.

At the Mankato field, Danne was high yielder with a 47.9 bushel yield followed by Centurk 45.6; Eagle 44.1; KS 7016 (exp.) 42.5; Parker 41.8; KS 6623 (exp.) 41.4; Pronto 41.0 and Shawnee 38.7.

Yields were lowered by several factors this year, according to Burchett. Streak mosaic lowered yields and test weights of all varities, especially at the Mankato field. Danne has more tolerance to streak mosaic, as seen by its relatively good yield performance.

Freeze damage caused all varities to lodge at Belleville. The warm weather in February and March caused the wheat to start growing rapidly, and the below freezing weather in early April injured the nodes (joints) which were just being formed. As the stalk lengthened and the head filled, the weak joints gave

Some leaf rust, hessian fly and take-all root rot was present in most fields checked this year.

Stem rust, or black rust, was also very severe on the Turkey wheat at Belleville, limiting yields to 22 bushels at Belleville, and 30 bushels at Mankato.

Irrigation Field Day Set Aug. 16

Irrigators or farmers interested in launching an irrigation project will have a chance to get in on a "first" Wednesday, August 16.

Scheduled is the first field day at the new Kansas River Valley! Irrigation Experiment Field near Rossville.

In a few months the Kansas State University project has grown into an important irrigation research effort. In just eight months, for example, 85 acres of land were leveled, two irrigation wells were drilled and fitted with pumps, and underground water delivery and drainage systems were installed.

"The developmental aspects of this project might interest the farmer as much as the research projects," commented Dr. Neil Humburg, superintendent.



Fertilizer Supplies Third Of Ag Output

Use of fertilizers and farm chemicals by the nation's farmers can be credited with 30 to 35 per cent of America's agricultural output, according to the head of the nation's fertilizer industry association.

Edwin M. Wheeler, president, The Fertilizer Institute, said this meant that of the current \$8 billion received for U.S. farm exports, between \$2 and \$3 billion of that dollar value could be attributed to use of fertilizers and other farm chemicals.

If use of farm fertilizers and chemicals were restricted or curtailed, not only would the U.S. lose its enviable farm export capability, implied Wheeler, but would also face a crisis of reduced domestic food

Play It Safe: Horse Owners Urged To Vaccinate humans, resulting flu-like condition.

Venezuelan cephalomyelitis (VEE) is back in the news, but a Kansas State University Extension veterinarian semmon strain sees no cause for alarm in Kansas.

Dr. Lowell Breeden says the disease has been showing up some 600 miles deep into Mexico, and an extensive vaccination program is underway in U.S. border states.

However, because VEE characteristically jumps long distances, he urges vaccination of Kansas horses "just to be on the safe side."

"Horse owners should contact their local veterinarians for the VEE vaccine," says Breeden. "There is some controversy over the

need for vaccinating horses that received the vaccine last year."

VEE infected 1,250 horses in the U.S. in 1971 — none in Kansas. The disease was contracted by 67 humans, resulting in a temporary in 1971, 875 died.

While not playing down the severity of VEE, Breeden emphasizes the necessity in Kansas of vaccinating against the more of cephalomyelitis, known as sleeping sickness. Like VEE, it is thought to be transmitted by mosquitoes, and from horse to horse and to man.

There were several cases of sleeping sickness in horses reported in Kansas last year.

Sleeping sickness was contracted by 1,627 horses in the U.S. in 1968, with 317 fatalities. In 1969, the disease hit 1,767 horses, killing 681. "These deaths could have been avoided by vaccination," Breeden

Of the 1,205 VEE-infected horses

Sleeping sickness is more dangerous to humans than VEE, Breeden reports. More than 1,500 humans in the U.S. contracted the sickness in 1970, and another 473 were hit through June 1971. Effects of sleeping sickness are usually more severe and longer lasting.

"All horses should have been vaccinated against both strains of encephalomyelitis in April," says Breeden, "since the seasonal disease occurs from spring until the first frost."

Kansas horse owners should contact their local veterinarians for vaccinations against VEE and sleeping sickness. Breeden warns vaccination for one strain of the disease will not protect a horse against the other.

Red Meat Production Up Slightly

Red meat production in Kansas slaughter plants during June 1972 totaled 161 million pounds, up 6 percent from June 1971, according to the Kansas Crop and Livestock Reporting service.

Cumulative production for the first half of 1972 totaled 949 million pounds, up 6 percent from the same period in 1971.

Beef production in Kansas during June 1972 was 134 million pounds, up 9 percent from June last year. The number of cattle slaughtered totaled 217,000 head, an increase of 8 percent from June a year ago.

Average live weight per head, at 1,044 pounds, was up slightly from June 1971. Beef production during the January-June period of 1972 was 777 million pounds compared with 709 million pounds a year earlier.

The production of veal during June 1972 totaled 21,000 pounds.



Congress Rescinds Order To Curb Hide Exports

Kansas' beef industry gained a majer victory in Congress last week wher the House voted 177-158 to rescind a restraint order on export of cowhides.

Th: House concurred on the Curtis Amendment to the Export Control Act. The bill introduced by Sen. Carl Curtis, D-Neb., was passed by the Senate earlier, 52-35.

An order to limit the number of hides for export to 16 million annually beginning Sept. 1 had been on file by the secretary of commerce acting under the Export Control Act.

Result of the law change could help maintain both hide prices and cattle prices amounting to millions of dollars for Kansas cattlemen. One

Kansas in export markets are valued at about \$5 million.

The secretary of commerce in 1966 put a limitation on export of hides, and the cattle market dropped to loss levels while packers and hide shippers claimed they were unable to sell the hides in the United States.

Cattlemen who were told this would protect the inclining prices of shoes both in 1966 and recently claim there is only 99 cent worth of leather in a pair of shoes anyway, but prices continue to climb whether cattle prices are going up or down.

Under the Curtis Amendment, which becomes effective on passage of the bill, the power to control export of agricultural products such as hides, oils and other materials is taken from the Department of Commerce and placed under control of the secretary of agriculture.

Under the new law, the secretary of commerce may propose curtailment of hide shipments, but the

necessity for such restriction.

There were other amendments passed by the House which will affect other aspects of the Export Control Act in addition to the perience in the late 1960's when agricultural export question. Because of changes in language between the House passed bills and the Senate bills, a conference committee must be named to work out final details.

Rep. Keith Sebelius, R-Kan., one of the backers of the Curtis Amendment in the House, said language was unchanged in the Curtis Amendment. He expects the House-Senate conference to act on the measures prior to the recess for the Republican National Convention Aug. 18.

The entire Kansas delegation favored the Curtis Amendment, officials said.

The Kansas Livestock Association appearances

estimate indicates cowhides from secretary of agriculture has the congressional committee hearings responsibility to determine public in Washington earlier this year to protest the restraint on hide exports.

Price and salability of hides is of primary concern in price and sale of slaughter cattle, they said. Excattle prices dropped after export quotas were enforced made cattlemen fear the loss of revenue in the situation which would begin Sept. 1.
