More Spoons In Lyons Creek Stew

No watershed in Kansas seems to be pushed around so much in water plans as does the Lyons Creek area near Woodbine.

Last week a Senate Water Resources committee confounded the reservoir-watershed contorversy a little more.

The committee recommended the Woodbine reservoir to the Kansas State Water Plan.

The federally-financed reservoir had not been included in the water plan by the Kansas Water Resources Board.

If the Woodbine project were included in the state plan, it means the state considers the reservoir necessary to meet the

needs of the state in such areas as flood protection, recreation and irrigation.

The reservoir has been recommended by the Corps of Engineers since 1956 but never have funds been appropriated.

Opposing the federal dam has long been a Lyons Creek Watershed organization which favors a watershed plan of several smaller dams. A work plan for the watershed has been drafted and is now in review within the Soil Conservation Service.

If the reservoir wins approval on the state water plan, an SCS official said, "we'll have to take another look at the work plan."

The official said, however,

that approval of the reservoir would not preclude development of the watershed. "But there probably would be changes."

The watershed involves 179, 776 acres in parts of Dickinson. Geary, Marion and Morris counties. The plan calls for 21 flood retarding structures plus a multiple-purpose reservoir for the city of Herington. This would provide Herington with water, recreation and flood protection.

If approved by SCS, the plan moves thru the machinery to the governor, concerned federal agencies and to the Bureau of the Budget.

Right now, watershed districts must be approved by Congress. The Johnson Administration has offered legislation making executive approval possible.

The proposed Woodbine reservoir would be on Lyons Creek southwest of Junction City. The creek flows into the Smoky Hill river just before the Smoky merges with the Republican to form the Kansas river.

The river has been urged by eastern Kansans as a flood protection measure, but proponents of the watershed opposed it.

Sen. Jack Quinlan, R-Topeka, a member of the committee which recommended inclusion of the reservoir in the state water plan, said it would be instrumental in the Topeka flood protection plan which already utilizes water-holding abilities of Tuttle Creek and Milford reservoirs.

Seek Tax On Blue Cross

Shawnee County officials are seeking repeal of statutes giving Kansas Blue Cross and Blue Shield special exemption from taxation.

Members of the Shawnee County Commission, the county assessor and the county counselor have signed a letter mailed to legislators from Shawnee County.

"The problem of exempt properties is placing more and more of the burden (of taxation) on the non-exempt property owner - the ordinary citizen," the letter said.

It said since a major portion of the property owned by Blue Cross and Blue Shield is located in Shawnee County, "We feel it should be the responsibility of the Shawnee County delegation to introduce legislation to repeal these provisions."

If the special statutes are repealed, Blue Cross and Blue Shield would then have to prove their property is used for charitable and benevolent purposes in order to qualify for exemption granted by the state constitution to property so used.

farm crops been greater," Smith recalled.

Wide use of fertilizers, the development of superior crop varieties, and improved farming practices including the scientific use of agricultural chemicals, were significant factors in switching 1966 from a potential failure to an almost miraculous crop production year, Smith indicated.

"It has to be admitted that the wheat crop was substantially below expectations of early 1966," Smith told the K-State researchers. "But it was better than any wheat crop produced during the good production years of World War II and yield per acre was better than that of the fabulous crop of 1947.

"Considering that some locations had only 50 percent or less of the average annual precipitation, it is remarkable that any

crops were produced," Smith said.

Grain sorghum in Kansas established a new record of 49 bushels per acre, bettering the 1958 record of 22 bushels.

Corn barely missed a new record in 1966 as the average 58 bushels per acre fell one bushel short of the 1965 record of 59.

Five crops - wheat, sorghum, corn, soybeans, and alfalfa accounted for almost \$780 million (97 percent) of the total value of 1966 Kansas crops. Smith noted that the livestock

picture in Kansas is "bright" as the state enters 1967 production. A record number of 586,000 cattle was on feed in January, he observed. That's 22 percent more than a year ago and 41 percent above the 1961-65 aver-

No Fixed Schedule

Even if it did not do so again, the prospective changes built into present laws plus the Johnson proposals would amount to eight variations during our hero's working life.

Assuming all this, assuming he starts out this year at 21 with a salary of \$5,000 and is raised \$1,000 a year until his pay catches up with the maximum Social Security coverage, here are his unofficially calculated prospects:

This year he pays \$195 for basic Social Security and \$25 for Medicare, \$220 total.

For the next few years, his tax bill rises rather steeply. He is getting more pay-and has not yet hit the ceiling for the pay-roll tax-and, besides, there is a rate increase in 1969. In that year he pays \$315 Social Security and \$35 Medicare-\$^50 total. By 1971 the tap totals \$445.

Base to Be \$10,800

In 1974, the tax base goes to \$10,800 and our hero is getting more pay than his. His Social Security bill is \$540 and his Medicare contribution \$59.40, a total of \$599.40.

The Social Security component is now fixed for the rest of his working life, but there are three more fractional increases programmed in the Medicare rate, so that this factor reached \$86.40 in 1987, bringing the total combined bill for the rest of our





Hidden Hope Feeder Report

Cattle feeders got bad news in the Report of Cattle on Feed January 1. The report showed that here were 11.3 million cattle and calves in feedlots on the first of January. That was 7 per cent more than the number being fattened for slaughter a year before.

The report also showed that farmers intended to market 8 percent more fed cattle in this quarter (January-February-March) than they marketed in this quarter a year ago.

This information must have been disheartening to most cattle feeders. They have been losing wads of money for several months, and they had been led to expect that production of beef would decrease this year.

While the outlook is not bright, is may not be so bad as it seems at first thought. A part of the increase in the number of cattle on feed may reflect a lengthening of feeding periods, rather than an actual increase in numbers being put through feedlots. Then, too, the biggest increases in the output of pork and poultry may be past. And we can hope that the nation's housewives will turn their wrath to something other than food prices.

More Days In Feedlots?

It may be that some of the increase in the number of cattle on feed is the result of keeping the cattle a week or two longer than last year. We note that average slaughter weights for steers have been running about 20 pounds heavier than a year earlier. It would take at least 7 extra days to put on that extra 20 pounds.

Feeding periods vary from about 60 days to 7 months and longer. We don't know what the average is, but it may be around 140 days. Adding 7 days

would be adding 5 percent to the average stay in feedlots. One result would be to have 5 percent more cattle in the lots at any one time.

There are some figures in the USDA report to support this view. They concern the number of cattle in various weight groups. In this comparison, we will count heifers with steers that weighed 200 pounds more. This grouping is justified, since heifers are sold at about 200 pounds less than steers.

Big Increase In Heavy Cattle

The heaviest groups (steers weighing over 1100 pounds and heifers over 900 pounds) totaled 788,000 head — 23 percent more than a year before.

The second heaviest (steers 900 to 1100 pounds and heifers 700 to 900 pounds) totaled 3,055,000 — 10 percent more

than last year.

The midweight groups (steers 700 to 900 younds and heifers 500 to 700 pounds) totaled 3,665,600 — 7 percent more than a vear ago.

Those down another notch in weights (steers 500 to 700 pounds and heifers under 500 pounds) numbered 2,498,000 only 2 percent more than a year before.


The number of steer calves weighing under 500 pounds was estimated at 1,069,000 - 2 percent less than last year.

Our final thought: Prices of Choice steers went up more than \$2 a hundred pounds from January to March last year. The average price of Choice steers at Chicago for the three months beginning with February was \$28.33.

We expect a substantial price increase sometime this year. but we do not advise holding finished cattle with the expectation of making a profit. We would rather shift our money to replacement cattle.

4 cup granulated sugar

cup sifted all-purpose flour

teaspoon baking powder

½ teaspoon salt 3 cups shelled Brazil nuts (about 2 pounds unshelled)

1 pound pitted dates

1 cup very well drained maraschino cherries

teaspoon vanilla

Preheat oven to 300 degrees. Grease a 9x5x3-inch loaf pan and line with brown wrapping paper and grease lightly again. Sift flour, sugar, baking powder and salt together. Put the nuts, dates, and well-drained cherries in a separate large bowl. Sift flour mixture over these. Now, using hands, mix until fruit and nuts are well-coated. (You cannot do this with a spoon.) Beat eggs until foamy, add vanilla, pour over fruit mixture making sure egg is well-distributed. Pour into pan and spread so top is even. Bake one hour and 45 minutes at 300 degrees or until it tests done in center. Cool completely before wrapping in foil for storage. Refrigerate or keep in cool place. "Slices beautifully and colors are lovely."

ment Association members shows no direct relationship between size and efficiency, according to Dale A. Knight, associate professor of economics.

Knight rated each farm as efficient or inefficient based on a comparison of gross income and resources. He used gross income also as a measure of farm size

Most of the farms in the study are growing in size, he said. But the more efficient ones are growing faster. More of their growth is supported by increases in net worth.

But some of the larger farms are less efficient than some of the smaller ones. Their net worth has leveled off in recent years, and they have had to rely on increased indebtedness for expansions in capital.

The efficient large farms are not using much more labor than they did 5 years ago. This implies a shift to resources that must be purchased. Annual cash outlays of nearly \$50,000 (including family living costs) are typical on these farms .

High levels of output are necessary to meet these costs. Still higher levels are necessary if growth is to continue, says Knight.

As might be expected, larger farms had a greater potential business than smaller farms. They used considerably more non-real estate capital, such as purchased feed, fertilizer, and machinery. They had relatively more crop production as well as dollar-wise higher livestock inventories. These items had high earning power on all the farms. But the efficient farmers got more out of these resources than the inefficient farmers.



Suicide On The Turnpike

Reckless driving has been termed suicidal by highway experts, and there are increasing indications that the highways are being used for literal suicide. State highway officials have been somewhat reluctant to talk about it, for fear that publicity may give a depressed individual a reason to try such a thing, but they agree that more than a few highway deaths appear

to be suicide. These pictures show no skid marks on the stretch of highway leading into an overpass on an interstate road. But the car slammed head-on into a pillar when all conditions were normal. There were no indications the driver was incapacitated or having difficulty with the car. The impact and resulting fire

Highway troopers make detailed reports on single-car accidents and attempt, as far as the law and dignity will allow, to check into the background of an individual involved in such an killed the driver.

accident.

In some instances there are suicide notes left behind or friends and relatives have foreknowledge that the driver may attempt to take his own life.

In the past six years the Kansas Turnpike has record of 13 single-car pillar accidents with no skid marks and all condi-

tions favorable for driving. There have also been recorded several instances of apparent suicides stepping out behind parked cars in front of an onrushing car. Highway police have limited authority to delve into such accidents and unless they have a suicide note are likely to list the deaths merely as "fatalities."

Prices omplain

It is the farmer's turn again to complain about declining prices.

A year ago consumers began letting out cries about rising food prices. Their protests culminated in buyers' strikes and boycotts of some stores in many parts of the country. Uncle Sam joined in by cutting down on purchases of some priceadvancing food items.

A major factor in last year's higher food prices was an upturn in the cost of many farm products.

But the situation has changed in recent months. Farm prices are on the downgrade again. Many farmers and their leaders are expressing unhappiness. So is Orville L. Freeman, secretary of agriculture.

Farm prices reached recent peaks in February and August last year. The February, 1966 level was 14 percent higher than a year earlier. The August mark - which equalled that of February — was 9 per cent above the level of August 1965.

But since August, farm markets have been losing ground. They closed 1966 down 5 percent from the August level; Freeman said recently that

they now are about 3 percent below the 1966 average. And there is a possibility that there

will be additional declines. Last year's farm price increases - and along with them food price advances - reflected a number of factors, including expanding domestic and foreign demands, a decline in hog production following low prices a year earlier, winter freezes that reduced supplies of some fruits and vegetables, and a retreat of many farmers from the dairy business because of labor shortages and low returns.

The recent downturn in farm prices reflects a rebounding production in hogs with a consequent larger supply and lower prices of pork, a record citrus fruit crop, increased production of some vegetables, and a larger output of broiler chickens and eggs.

Taking notice of this turn about in farm prices, Freeman told a news conference that he was "concerned" because it meant that farmers are again caught "in the old squeeze between prices they receive and the high costs of farming."

The secretary promised to make "full use of a wide range of measures" to strengthen farm prices and to maintain farm income

Yet, there remains little that er consumer goods and servi-

Freeman can do beyond what he already is doing, except to raise supports his department maintains under many farm products. This he is not likely to do - largely because of the possibility such action would aggravate the administration's efforts to bring inflation under control.

Farm prices at the close of the year averaged only 77 percent of the parity price goal of federal farm policies. Last February, when these prices reached the first peak of the year, they reflected only 83 per cent of parity, and in August they showed 81 percent.

One thing that makes it difficult to justify government actions to raise farm prices is the prospect that consumers will not benefit from the recent declines in prices. Freeman said other costs in the processing, transportation and marketing of food are are continuing to edge upward to offset farm price declines.

In this connection, George L. Mehren, assistant secretary of agriculture, told a farm institute at Raleigh, N.C., that "It does not appear reasonable to expect that as a general proposition, food prices are going to return to the former pattern of lagging behind the prices of oth

Tree Program Underway Again

Orders for trees, shrubs, and stratified nuts can now be made at Extension and soil conservation offices in all Kansas coun-

In this Kansas State University tree distribution program,

a million and a half trees were distributed last year, says John Slusher, area Extension forester in charge of the project.

Trees from this source are limited to conservation uses for windbreaks, shelterbelts, woodlots, fencepost or erosion control plantings, wildlife or farm pond plantings, or Christmas tree plantings.

Landowners will receive par-

cel post delivery of the plantings during March, April and May. Orders will be taken until distribution is completed in May, but order now if you want early delivery, explains Slush-

Evergreen species available include Austrian pine, Scotch pine, white pine, ponderosa pine, and eastern red cedar. Colorado blue spruce and Rocky Mountain juniper are still available, but in limited quantities, Slusher says.

Black walnut, burr oak, Chinese elm, cottonwood, green ash, hackberry, honey locust, osage orange, redbud, Russian olive, Russian mulberry, and silver maple are the deciduous species available.




Trees and shrubs are ordered in multiples of 50; stratified walnut and pecan nuts are ordered in multiples of 100.

Canadian Wheat Farmer Gets Less For His Crop

The Canadian board has made its final payment to farmers of that country on their 1965 crop. The total was \$1.83 a bushel, basis Fort William. All Canadian wheat must be sold to the

The board makes an initial payment at harvest time, usually a second payment later and a final payment when the books are closed for the year.

On the 1966 crop, the board made an initial payment of \$1.50 a bushel. It has made a second payment of 491/4 cents, for a total of \$1.994. A typical farm point in Canada is the town of Portal, which is just across the line from Portal, N.D. Freight from Fort William to Portal, Canada, is 11.4 cents a bushel; elevator charges are 4.5 cents a bushel.

Thus the farmer at Portal has received about \$1.831/4 a bushel on his 1966 wheat in in Canadian money. The Canadian dollor now is worth about 93 percent of the US dollar, so the Canadian farmer has received \$1.691/2 in U.S. money for his wheat.

This is on No. 2 Northern spring wheat. Similar wheat last week was bringing \$1.54 a bushel in Portal, N.D. However, the U.S. farmer also gets a certificate worth \$1.32 a bushel on 45 percent of his crop from the government in price support. Thus, his total from his crop averages more than that for his neighbor to the north.

The Canadian farmer still can expect another payment on his 1966 crop, but it probably will not be large. He gets no government price support payment, only what the wheat actually sells for in the market, less marketing charges.



An estimated 733,000 turkeys are to be raised in 1967 compared with 610,000 in 1966 and the 5-year average of 857,000 birds. If realized, this will be the first increase after 2 years of declining turkey numbers.

During the past 10 years, the number of turkeys raised in Kansas has fluctuated considerably ranging from 608,000 last year up to 1,184,000 in 1961. The State's record turkey crop was 1,370,000 birds raised in 1939.

Heavy breed turkeys raised in 1967 are expected to total 704,-000, up 25 percent from the 562,000 raised during 1966. Intentions for light breed turkeys to be raised in 1967 total 29,000 birds compared with 48,000 raised a year earlier.

Expected turkeys raised in 1967 represents growers intentions at the beginning of the year appraised in terms of the extent to which similar intentions have been carred out in the past

The actual number raised during the coming year may vary considerably depending on such factors as growers' reactions to this report, death losses, supply and price of hatching eggs, poult prices during the growing season, the price of market

Assuming growers carry out their intentions, the 1967 turkey crop for the nation would be about 125.2 million, a new record, compared with the revised increase heavy breeds 8 percent estimate of 115.7 million turkeys raised in 1966.






Best At Kaw Valley Show

Feeder Potential For Kansas

By Donald B. Erickson Kansas State University

Only four states led Kansas in cash receipts from cattle production during 1965. Yet the cattle feeding industry is one of this state's most promising areas for future development.

More than 2 million calves were pastured on winter wheat in Kansas during 1964. Almost half these animals were imported from outside the state. Twice as many cattle were pastured on wheat during 1964 than were grain fed.

Kansas farmers produced enough grain in 1964 to fatten 2.7 million head of cattle. And 1964 was a below average year for grain production in the state.

The following year, enough grain was produced in this state to fatten about 3.5 million head. Sorghum production totaled 137 million bushels, up from 98 million a year earlier. Corn production increased from 46 million! to 62 million bushels. But only 13,000 more cattle were grain fed in 1965 than in 1964. Thus,




