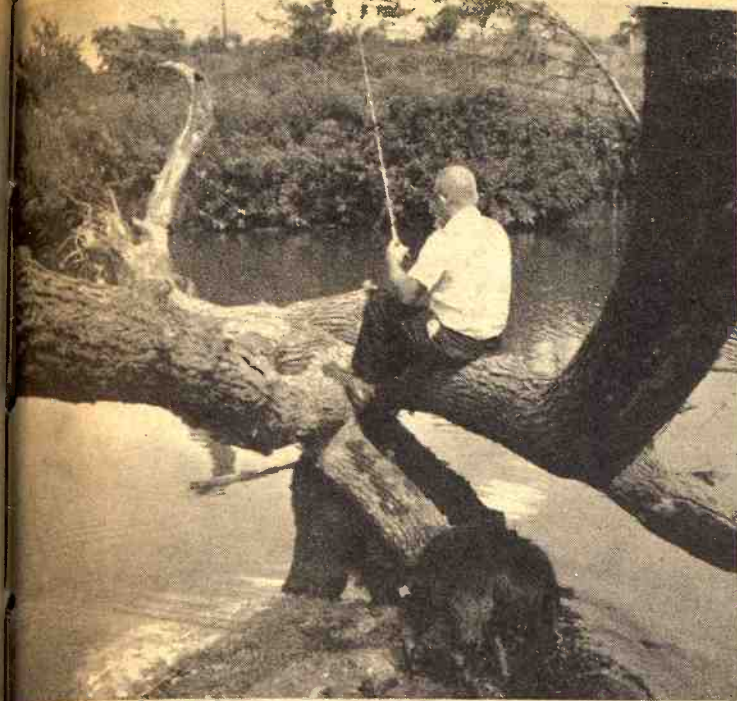

## Shift By Tax Board On Utilities' Values

Appeals for reduction in the assessed valuations on 15 public utilities companies, totaling almost 10 million dollars, have been denied in an order by the Kansas Board of Tax Appeals.

In effect, the ruling means that the tax valuations will have to be carried by the utilities and the burden will not be shifted to individual property owners through increases in tax levies to make up the difference.

The announcement was made by Charles B. Joseph of Potwin, formerly a Democratic state senator from Butler County and recently named chairman of the new board by Gov. Robert Docking. The last Legislature increased the board from three to five members, limiting it to no more than three from the same political party.

The board's action created a marked contrast with the policies of previous boards, which tradi-

tionally have given the utilities some tax relief and in many cases, substantial cuts in assessed valuations from figures set by the state property valuation department.

The impact of the ruling will be felt in many counties, since the utilities operate on a statewide basis and taxes are paid in the counties in which they have property.

The board also refused to enter the tax appeal findings on four other utilities. The cases were heard in the closing days of the old board and cuts were approved. This will mean that the valuations will stand as originally set by the Property Valuation department.

Governor Docking has said earlier that he would ask that any action by the "lame duck" board be reviewed by the new board.

Some of the decisions mean a bigger tax base on state-assessed properties and others reduce the base. The board let stand reductions totaling millions of dollars in assessed valuations for the National Gas Pipeline company, Twin Valley Telephone company, Cunningham Telephone company and Kansas State Telephone company.

In its order the new board held that there was no showing that the director of property valuation had acted arbitrarily, or in an oppressive or discriminatory manner in arriving at the valuation figures on the utilities.

The largest case involved the Natural Gas Pipeline Company of America, with headquarters in Chicago, which had received a cut of \$6,400,000 in assessed valuation.

Others included the Kansas State Telephone company, Baxter Springs, which had been given a cut of \$120,000; Twin Valley Telephone company, Miltonvale, a cut of \$55,500, and Cunningham Telephone company, Glen Elder, a cut of \$17,000.

These reductions had been made by the old board, but will not be effective since the new board refused to enter the findings as part of the department's records.

It also denied appeals by the Kansas Telephone company; Wilson Telephone company, Wamego Telephone company; J. B. N. Telephone company, Wetmore; Madison Telephone company; Kaw Valley Electric co-operative, Topeka; Caney Valley Electric co-operative, Cedar Vale, and Central Kansas Electric co-operative, Great Bend.

## Price Cuts Moving Export Wheat

A jump in world trade in wheat overnight strengthened the futures market in both Chicago and Kansas City last week.

The export sales followed the announcement by the Department of Agriculture of a cut in the U. S. export price from 2 to 10 cents a bushel. Canada and Australia had previously revealed reductions.

It was revealed that Cargill, Inc., had sold 65,000 tons of wheat to Argentina and 40,000 tons to Colombia (P.L. 480 deal). Continental Grain company sold 50,000 tons to Brazil. Mexico also sold 50,000 tons to Brazil through a Continental office.

Japan bought 3,816,000 bushels from the United States, 544,000 bushels from Canada and 1,800,000 bushels from Australia. Japan also bought 60,842 tons of feed grains from Australia.

Total sales of U.S. wheat apparently amounted to about 9,551,000 bushels.

The fact the U.S. domestic market strengthened in the face of a cut in export prices might suggest a puzzling situation to those not versed in the grain trade. What's happened can be explained by the curious operations under the International

Grains Arrangement.

The United States and other major exporting nations are members of an agreement which deliberately sets out to raise the world price on wheat. In order for the United States to abide by the agreement it had to raise its export price higher than domestic prices. It did this through an export subsidy which, on July 1, was as high as 29 cents a bushel on ordinary hard winter wheat at the Gulf. The inverse subsidy has to be paid by the exporter. This has the effect of raising the export price.

All the exporting countries, including the United States, have cut their prices under those in the agreement. The U.S. made its last cut yesterday. The inverse subsidy today is only 1 cent a bushel on ordinary wheat at the Gulf.

Apparently importers feel world prices are at a level at which they are willing to buy. Last night's business was a good indication.

The very fact this country is beginning to sell wheat helps the domestic market, thus the strengthening in the market in face of lower export prices.

## Senior Drivers Get A Boost

A researcher says senior citizens may not be the highway hazards everyone from younger drivers to insurance companies claims they are.

A Denver jurist reported that a study of automobile driving records of persons who are 65 and over has disclosed "the senior driver is not the universal risk he has been assumed to be."

"And," added the report by Judge Sherman G. Finesilver, "he may be among the best drivers on the highway."

"This should raise a beacon of hope for senior drivers whose abilities have been demeaned, licenses jeopardized and insurance threatened or surcharged."

## AREA COUNTRY BANKER JACK BERKLEY DEAD

**TESCOTT** — A leading country banker in the G&G area for 45 years, H. J. "Jack" Berkley is dead at the age of 70. Berkley was chairman of the board of banks at Tescott, Stockton, Downs, Bennington and Talmage. Once in the feed business at Quinter and Bunker Hill, Berkley came to Tescott in 1924. The Berkley-controlled banks are located in small towns, they have had unusual deposit and loan activity, larger than that in banks in larger towns nearby.

# Long And Short Of It- Numbers Detail State Rank

That Kansas is relatively law-abiding, agricultural, and healthy seems to be verified in a recent booklet of numbers called "Kansas in Perspective" by Joe B. Williams of Elmwood, Nebr.

Williams has gleaned statistics from 1966-67 federal government published reports and printed a book that can drown one in numbers.

The numbers say that Kansas is a great state to live in — if you want to collect old-age assistance, escape crime, receive government farm payments or travel by railroad.

But stay away from clean-air country if you want to collect war-on-poverty funds, swim in a lake, have a baby or fail the mental tests on your draft physical.

The book shows how Kansas ranks in 150 areas, from agriculture to social welfare to law enforcement.

Kansas ranks fifth among the 50 states in average monthly payments for old-age assistance. The state is 14th in average monthly payment per family in the Aid to Dependent Children program.

A Kansan has less chance of being robbed, assaulted, raped or murdered than many other Americans. Only 29.6 persons per 100,000 population are robbed in Kansas, compared with the national average of 78.3. About 69.9 Kansans per 100,000 are assaulted, compared with the national average of 118.4. And 3.5 Kansans per 100,000 are murdered, compared to 5.6 persons per 100,000 nationally.

agriculture. The state ranked seventh in the total value of crops and livestock marketed — \$1.499 billion.

The state is second in amount of government farm payments, receiving \$212 million, nearly 7% of all farm payments the government makes.

And — you would never doubt it — Kansas is number 1 when it comes to raising wheat. Kansas is number 2 in sorghum and 14th in corn.

Cattle raisers 4th among the states; hogs and pigs, 10th; sheep and lambs, 15th; and milk cows, 17th.

The state is threaded with highways, ranking 3rd in total mileage. But in expenditures for state highways, the state ranks 32nd.

Kansas is 7th in railroad mileage and 8th in the number of private airports.

One very surprising note: Kansas ranks the lowest of 50 states in birth rate — 14.7 per 1000.

The Kansas per capita income is about average — the state ranks 24th, with \$3,009 per person per year, compared to the national average of \$3,137.

The state is below average in expenditures by the state for public welfare. We're 30th in that category, 37th in services to crippled children, and 38th in maternal and child health services.

Federal war-on-poverty funds went to other states. We were

42nd among the states in funds allocated.

Kansas' in'and water area 1208 square miles, which puts state below 42 other states.

While Kansas is not noted for a proliferation of those long-haired, sandaled young men wearing peace buttons, there are a few young pacifists on the campuses.

They should go to another state if they want to avoid draft. The chances are better elsewhere.

Only three per cent of drunks fail mental requirements here, compared to the U. S. average of 8.7 per cent. The state ranks 40th in this category.

And 64.8 per cent of all drunks are found acceptable, compared with the national average of 59.7 per cent. Kansas is 10th among the states.

But the young recruit can't see sole himself with the fact that the possibility of his death is exactly the same as for the mythical "average American." The death rate for Kansans is 94.1,000 per year — precisely the national average.

## Accreditation Lack Could Close Ark City Juco

ARKANSAS CITY — The of Cowley County Community Junior College here is in danger unless it is accredited soon by the North Central Assn. of Colleges and Secondary Schools.

College President Dr. Gwyn Nelson told the college trustees recently that unless the school is accredited soon, "We may as well close our doors."

He said accreditation was being delayed because the college had no campus and an election has not been called to provide a campus site.

Nelson also told trustees that some young people who have applied for early discharge from the armed forces to attend college have been denied an early release because the school is not sanctioned by the national association.

Trustees earlier this year discussed calling a bond election to provide the required campus but Cowley County Clerk Marjorie Williams has set up two new voting precincts in the city, and under state law election cannot be held within 60 days of such action.

Area farmers bring in their dead stock and animals killed on the highways are picked up by zoo personnel to be used in feeding carnivores.

The zoo has five species of bears, five species of cats, foxes, skunks, badgers and other meat eating animals. Meat must be fed to them in captivity to insure good health, according to Jerry Tillery, zoo director.

"We could not afford to feed commercial feeds to our animals. The cost is simply too high," Tillery said. "We use about 75 pounds of meat each day."

The commercial meat fed to animals is not government inspected or approved for human consumption. It costs 10 cents per pound. When dead livestock or road kills are available, the only cost is the expense of getting the animal.

"We've had to buy very little meat lately," said Tillery. "We have an eight by 10 foot walk in freezer and have been getting so much meat this year we have been turning it away lately."

Farmers and Kansas Forestry, Fish and Game commission personnel call the zoo immediately

when livestock die or there is a highway kill. "We are only too happy to pick up the meat. I suppose it saves the farmer some money because we don't charge to haul the animal away," Tillery said.

Diseased animals are not fed to the bears or cats. If a cow dies of age or in calf-birth, there is little danger the zoo animals could be contaminated and the meat is used for all species. The same is true of animals killed on highways.

Tillery said zoo crews generally get to the scene of road kills minutes after they happen and try to pick up farm animals before the carcass has begun to decay.

Slaughter houses in the area occasionally offer the zoo meat which fails to pass federal inspection. They usually ask 10 cents per pound. Some commercial food is marketed for carnivorous animals but Tillery said the Great Bend zoo doesn't rely on that any more than necessary because of the cost.

Some of the bigger zoos in the country feed commercial feeds only, but have a budget to allow it, according to Tillery.

A dietitian prepares meals for zoo animals but Tillery goes a great deal by the type of foods the animal would get in its natural state.

The owls are fed chicken necks obtained from Great Bend restaurants because there are dietary requirements in the bones which the birds would get in the wild. Occasionally they are fed rabbit parts for the same reason.

## A '68 Truck — Going On '70

Chrysler Corp. says it is trying practice to change the year identifications of trucks carried over by dealers at the end of a model year and sell as current models.

General Motors Corp. says it does so with heavy duty trucks.

Ford Motor Co. said it is attempting to obtain clarification of the problem discussed by the Federal Trade Commission, which reported that at least ten manufacturers change year identification on unsold vehicles.

In some instances, after date change, the FTC said vehicles are sold as new, even though they were manufactured two more years previously.

The FTC said its investigation was initiated because of complaints from consumers concerning five domestic manufacturers and two subsidiaries of foreign manufacturers. It declined to name the companies.

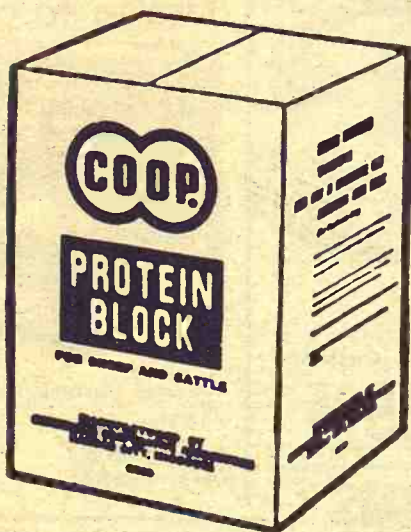

# '51 - '69 Comparison Puts Question To Beef Prices

Ray Frisbie, president of Kansas Farm Bureau, has asked Secretary of Agriculture Clifford M. Hardin to "use the power of his office" to tell consumers the true facts about the current retail price of beef and live cattle prices.

In a telegram to the Secretary, Frisbie referred to a wire service news story about the housewife's beef boycott in Long Island, New York. The story included a Bureau of Labor of Statistics table showing price increases in retail beef cuts from January to June; "the inference being," Frisbie said, "that this was due to the recent rise in live cattle prices, which is far from fact."

The facts, according to Frisbie's telegram are these: The live cattle price for January 1969 in Kansas was \$26.50 per hundredweight while on the same date \$1.05 per pound. The live cattle price for June 1969, again in Kansas, was \$31.89 per hundred pounds while on the same date the price of round steak was \$1.20 per pound.

He then referred to the Kansas prices for live cattle and round steak on comparable months in 1951. The live cattle price in January, 1951 was \$31.50 per hundred and round steak was 91 cents per pound. In June 1951 the live cattle price was \$32.80 per hundredweight and round steak was 97 cents per pound.

"The significance of these figures is that we had a drop in live cattle prices from January 1951 to January 1969 of 16 per cent while the price of round steak for this same period increased 15 per cent," Frisbie said.

"Likewise, live cattle prices on June 1951 and June 1969 were almost identical yet for this same period we had an increase in round steak prices of 23 per cent.

"I'm sure, Mr. Secretary, you are familiar with this information, but I respectfully request that you will use the power of your office to get this information widely distributed. I think it most imperative that you do this, because the livestock industry is the one hope we have to

get us out of our grain production problems in this country. Therefore, any misinformation that gets the wide distribution this most recent news story received, needs to be corrected or irreparable harm will result," he concluded.

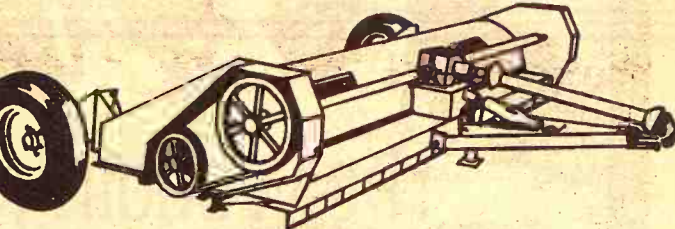

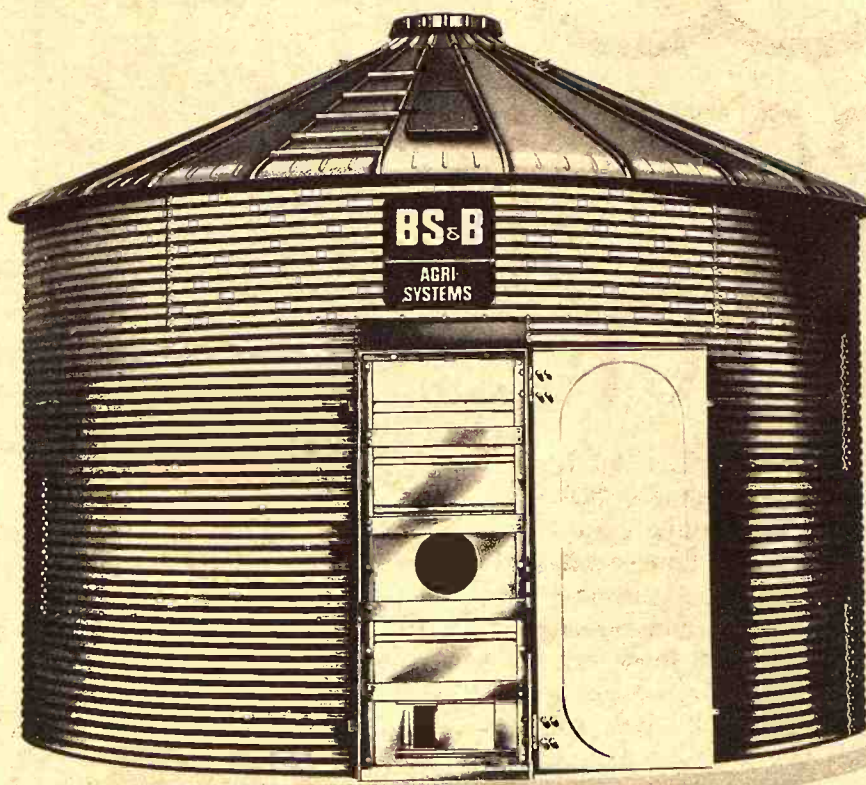

Put 1 cup chopped dates over crumbs and sprinkle ½ cup chopped English or black walnuts (whichever you desire) over the dates. Make a custard of the following:

½ cup sugar  
2 tablespoons cornstarch  
¼ teaspoon salt  
3 egg yolks  
2 cups milk  
1 teaspoon vanilla  
Cool till thickened and cool.

Spread cooled custard over mixture in pan. Cover custard with meringue made of 3 egg whites, ¼ teaspoon cream tartar and 6 tablespoons sugar. Beat egg whites till frothy. Add cream tartar and beat until stiff. Add sugar, 1 tablespoon at a time. Beat until standing in peaks. Spread over custard. Sprinkle ½ cup graham cracker crumbs over meringue. Bake in slow oven (325 degrees) for 30 minutes. Chill and cut into squares. Serve plain or with whipped cream.

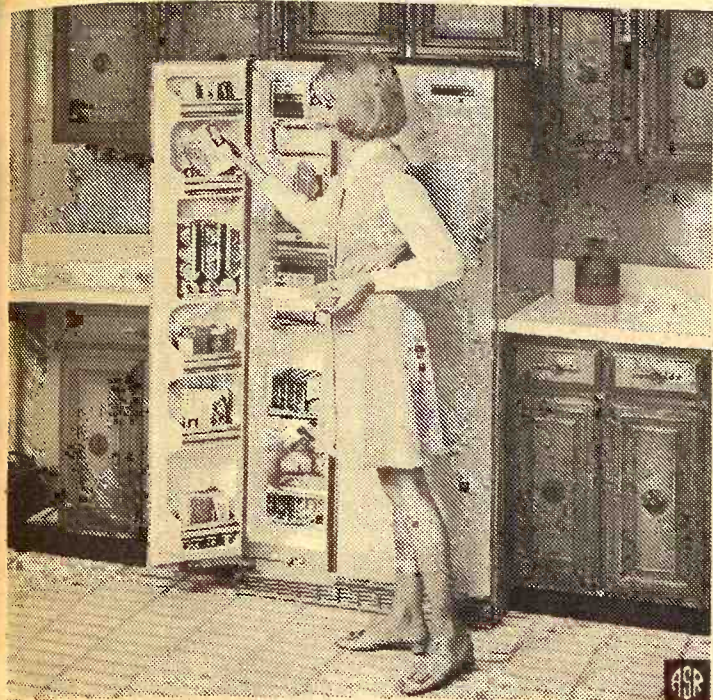

## Double Glass Discourages Condensation

Time was when homeowners thought a certain amount of condensation "came" with the house. It arrived periodically at windows and doors with glass panes and was simply "expected" — like the monthly mortgage bill.

Today, however, it's possible to have a virtually condensation-free home. Insulating glass in weatherstripped wood sash is the answer. Here's how it works:

Condensation is moisture which forms on window sash and glass when warm inside air strikes a window surface chilled by cold air outside air. (Or, conversely, when warm outside air strikes a window surface chilled by cold, air-conditioned inside air.) The moisture condenses, resulting in foggy panes, wet sash and sills and possible water damage to walls and floors on the inside; siding on the outside.

Insulating glass, also known as double-glazing, is two panes of

glass sealed together at the edges to form a dry layer of insulating air between. Heat transmission through the insulating layer is greatly reduced, so the "inside" and "outside" glass panes remain

at temperatures that correspond to the air that touches them.

Once a custom feature insulating glass is now readily available to the average homeowner at local lumber dealers.

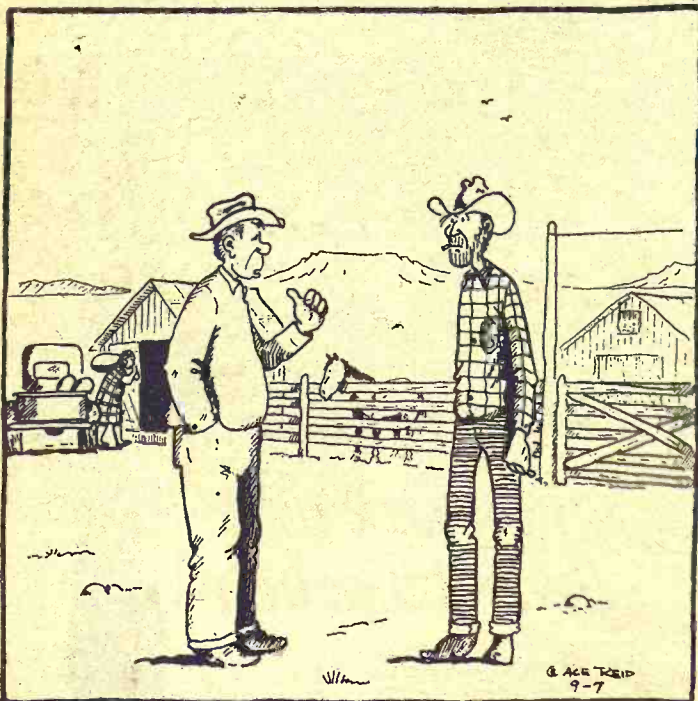

## Sandyland Fall Field Day Is Tomorrow

A morning look at the Pratt feedlot and an afternoon visit to the Sandyland Experiment Field south of St. John will highlight the Kansas State University Sandyland Fall Field Day, September 3.

The tour begins at 9 a.m. at the Pratt Feedlot and manager Frank Smith will discuss the lot's operations. Melville Gray, engineer for the State Board of Health in Topeka, and George Chandler, president of the Pratt feedlot, will describe the lot's pollution control facilities.

Dr. Harry Manges, KSU agricultural engineer, will update visitors on latest feedlot waste management research and Lynn Schuyler, KSU Extension engineer, will discuss irrigation with feedlot waste water.

A beef barbeque lunch will be served at the Sandyland Experiment Field located one-half mile west and a bit north of the intersection of Highways 281 and

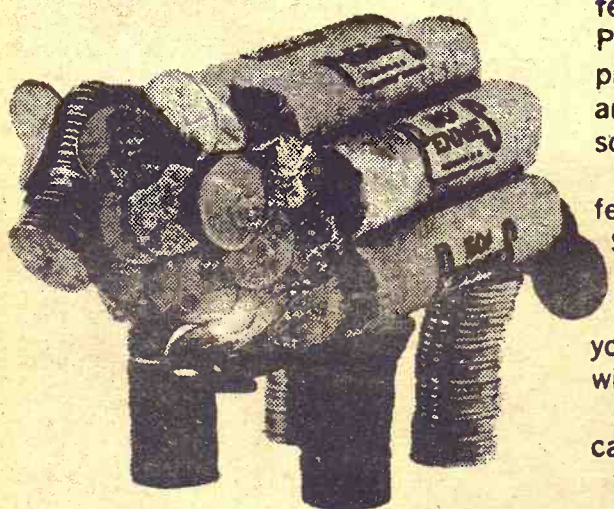
50 south of St. John in Stafford county.

Danny Trayer, Extension economist in farm management, will outline the economics of irrigation farming at the first afternoon stop. Oliver Russ, KSU research agronomist in agricultural chemicals, will show plots of weed control with herbicides and K-State research horticulturists Drs. Jim Greig and Charles Hall will show research plots of horticultural crops.

Another KSU agricultural engineer Carl Anderson will discuss recharging groundwater and KSU soil chemist Dr. R. Ellis will summarize latest information concerning fertilized irrigated crops.

Superintendent of the land Experiment Field is C. TenEyck. Agronomist Mark Lundquist and agricultural engineer Alan McMillan assist research on the farm.

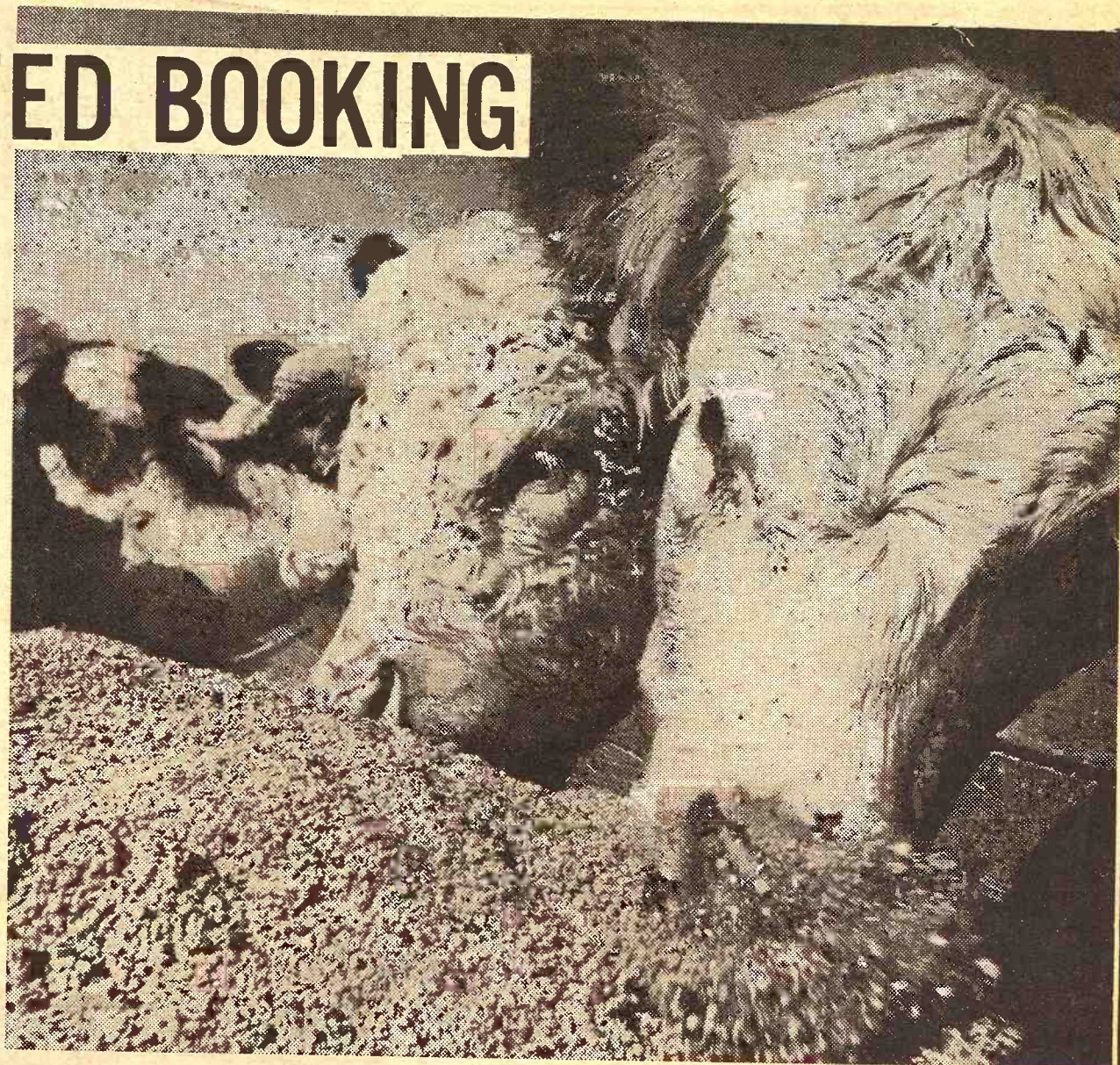

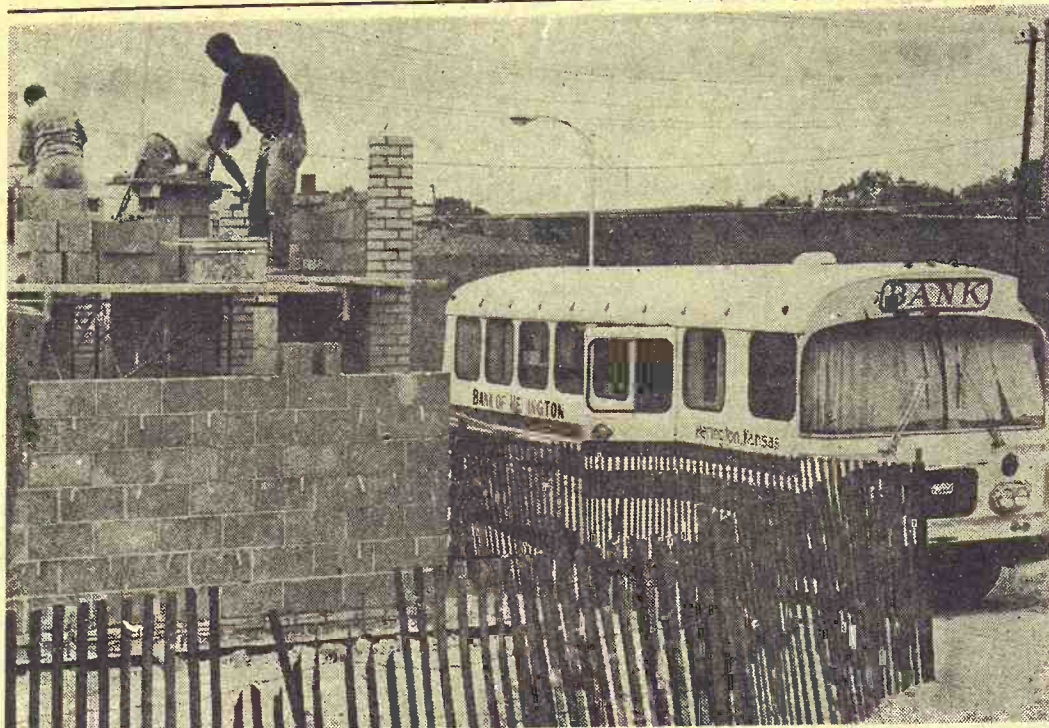

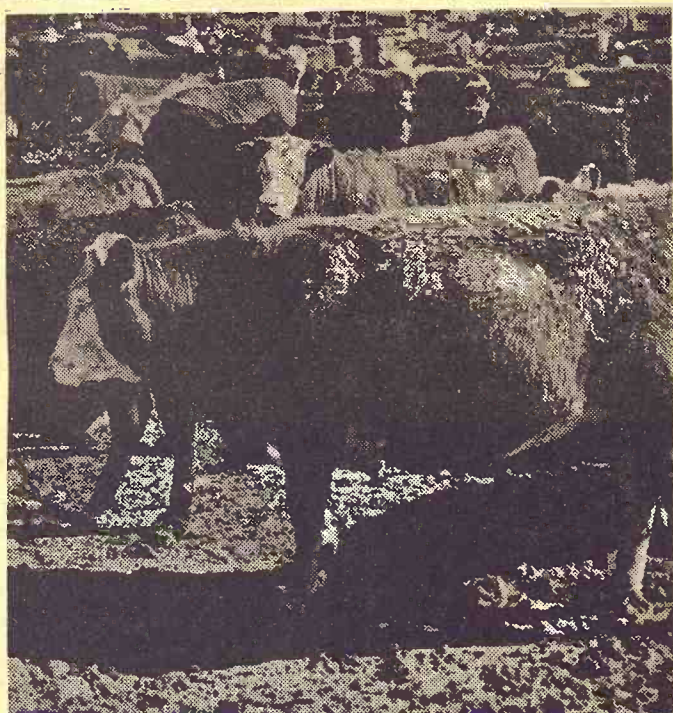
A new \$200,000 bank facility should be ready by November. Here, construction crews work on the new building while the Bank of Herington's motor bank is open for business.

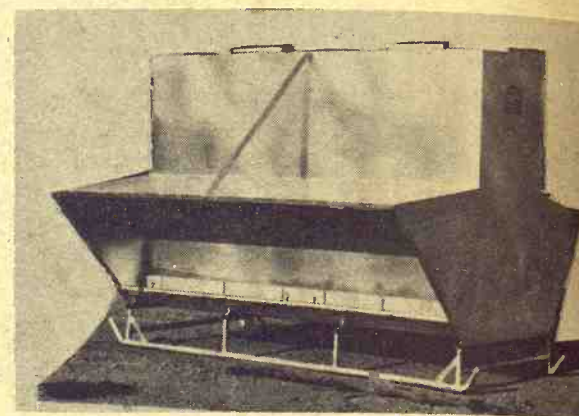

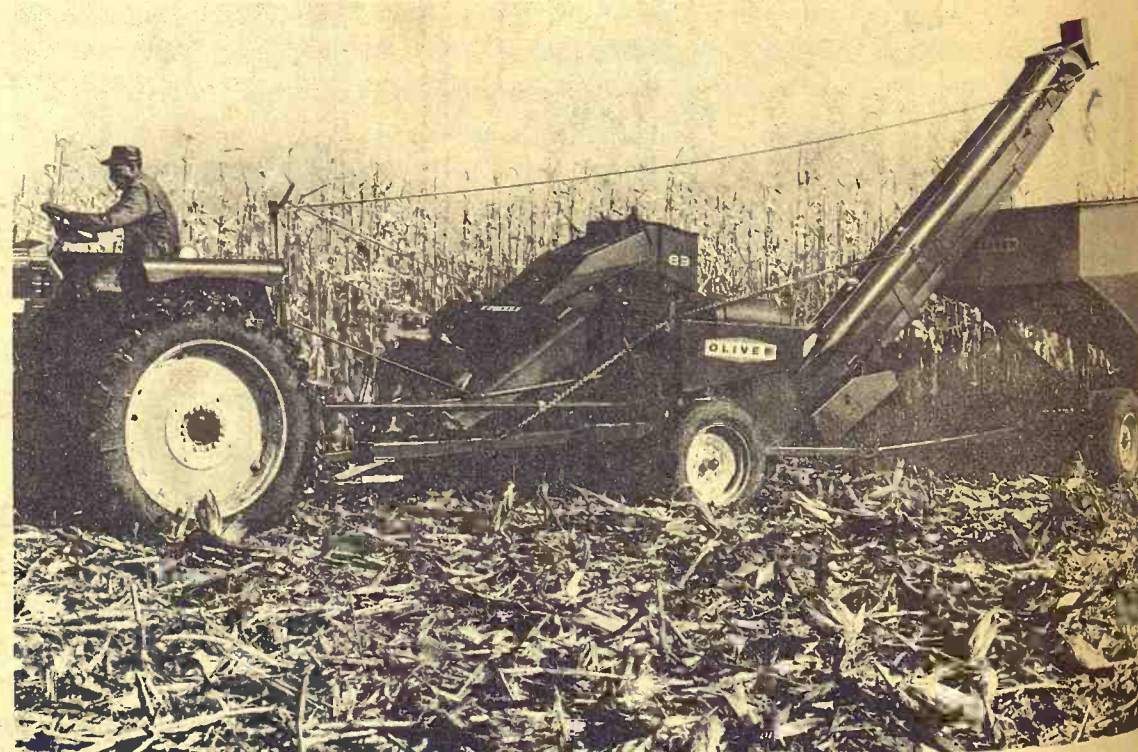

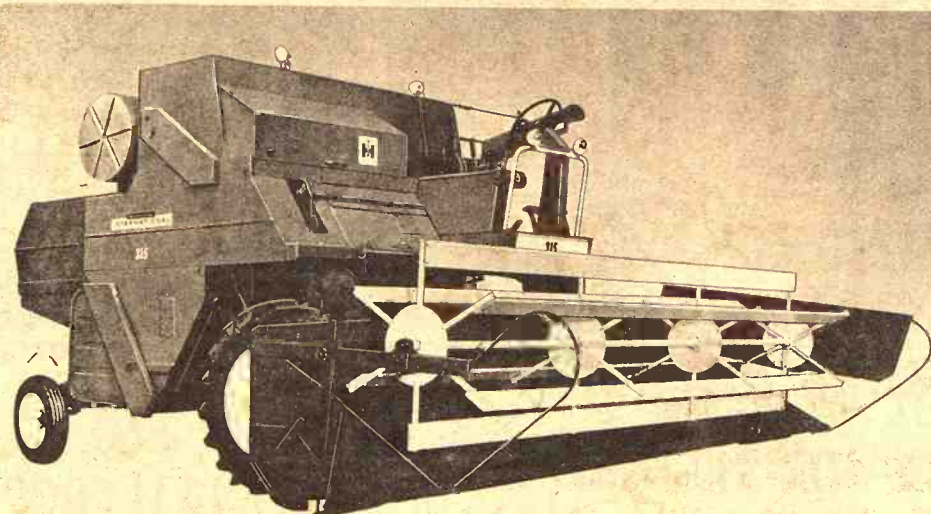

# See More Feed Grain Exports

Exports of U. S. livestock feed grains are expected to improve in the 1969-70 marketing year after the sharp dip of the last season, says the Agriculture department.

Total feed grain exports in 1968-69 were estimated at 17 million tons, about one-fourth less than the 23,300,000 shipped overseas a year earlier.

Officials said in a report on the feed situation that exports

of corn are expected to be "somewhat larger" than the 500 million bushels estimated for 1968-69, and that some improvement was indicated for sorghum grain exports which slumped to 100 million bushels last year from 166 million in 1967-68.

"Not much improvement is in prospect for exports of oats and barley," the report said.

The 500 million bushels of corn exported in 1968-69 represented a big drop from the 634 million shipped a year earlier. The decrease was caused primarily by larger crops in other exporting countries and last winter's U.S. dock strike, officials said.

Sorghum grain shipments have declined in recent years as less was shipped under Food for Peace contracts. Reduced foreign demand and the dock strike also contributed to 1968-69 exports

dipping to 100 million bushels, less than half the peaks of the mid-1960s.

The report also noted that total domestic use of all feed grains is expected to be strong in 1969-70 and may equal the 151 million tons used in the United States the past year.

Domestic use of corn was estimated at nearly 4 billion bushels for the current marketing year ending September 30, a record high and about 5 per cent more than last year.

In addition, officials said, wheat has been more competitive as a livestock feed and may total 200 million bushels by September 30. This would be the largest feed use of wheat since large government stocks were sold after World War II to supplement feed supplies, the department said.

## Wheat Stocks 50% Over A Year Earlier

U.S. stocks of wheat were a hefty 811 million bushels at the July 1 start of the new marketing year, 50% above a year earlier and the largest wheat carry-over since 1965, the Agriculture Department reported.

Soybean stocks on July 1, at a record 448 million bushels, were up 57% from last year's 284.9 million bushels, the department said.

Corn stocks dropped 6% below last year to two billion bushels but were still 18% above the 1967 hoard.

Rye stocks totaled 15.9 million bushels, down 12% from 1968 and 15% below 1967.

Wheat supplies exceeded the 780 million bushels the department predicted last January, but were 300 million bushels below its 1.1-billion-bushel April 1 expectation. Last year's carry-over of 539.3 million bushels reversed 1967's 14-year low inventory of 425 million bushels.

Feed-grain stocks rose slightly to 79 million tons, from 78.2 million tons in 1968, the department reported, despite the decline in corn stocks, which normally account for about 80% of feed-grain supplies.

The wheat-stock increase includes a 69% rise in durum

wheat supplies for a July 1 carry-over of 41.1 million bushels, up from last year's 24.3 million bushels and the largest since July 1966.

Department analysts said the rise in wheat was due largely to an export decline of about 200 million bushels, to about 535 million bushels, in the year ended June 30.

Durum wheat exports were good, however, and a large crop contributed to the substantial carry-over stock for that grain,

a department analyst said. Corn consumption in the June quarter showed a definite "slow-down" at 958 million bushels, a department official said, compared with 1.03 billion bushels, in the 1968 quarter. Higher corn prices, ranging from \$1.15 to \$1.20 per bushel, were causing farmers to turn to other feed grains and even wheat, he said.

### Greenbug Threat At Planting Too

Wheat growers in Kansas face the same threat of greenbug infestation at planting time as last year.

That's the warning from H. LeRoy Brooks, Kansas State University Extension entomologist.

Brooks points out that newly planted wheat fields would be highly susceptible to greenbug attack and urged farmers to

avoid extremely early planting where feasible.

He added that in some areas the use of granular systemic insecticides such as Di-Syston and Thimet applied at planting time will be useful in providing seedling protection against greenbug attack.

These materials should be applied by drilling, broadcasting or banding each side of the seed furrow at time of planting, Brooks advised.

The insecticide should not

come in direct contact with the seed. Farmers should remember that Thimet treated field cannot be grazed.

Fields not treated at planting time should be watched closely at the time plants begin to emerge, Brooks cautioned, and a number of foliar sprays may be used where infestations reach economic proportions.

# Bostwick, Scandia Station Tours Set Next Week

MANHATTAN — A choice of tours, latest production research on corn and soybeans, and an address by 1st district Congressman Keith Sebelius are all in store for visitors to the Kansas Bostwick Irrigation District and Scandia Irrigation Experiment Station Field Day, September 8

in Republic county.

Visitors can choose between two concurrent tours, both beginning at 9:30 a.m. Assembly for the south tour of field corn production, canal system pump-lifts, surface and sub-surface drainage systems is the Bostwick Irrigation District Office.

The north tour assembly point is on the blacktop county road three and one-half miles west of Republic, Kansas. Included on this tour will be visits to a shattercane control field and to surface and sub-surface drainage systems and a look at corn furrowing methods.

Lunch will be served at the Scandia Irrigation Experiment Field. Congressman Sebelius will speak at 1:30.

Kansas State University specialists will discuss latest research results during five afternoon stops.

Dr. Richard Vanderlip, crop ecologist, will talk about corn populations and hybrid maturity relationships. Don Bonne, Scandia agronomist, will show production practices on irrigated soybeans.

George TenEyck, superintendent of the Sandyland Experiment Field, will discuss irrigation water management practices.

Dr. Larry Murphy, soil fertility specialist, will describe the necessity for nutrient balance in corn production and entomologist Dr. Gerald Wilde will outline control measures for insects injurious to corn.

## See Higher Auto Prices

Ford Motor Co. and Chrysler Corp. are reported shipping 1970 model cars to dealers with tentative price increases as high as \$275.

The Detroit News said that average Ford car prices tentatively will be up \$68 or about two per cent.

Chrysler Chairman Lynn Townsend has refused to disclose an average tentative price hike but said the 1970 prices would be higher than last year.

These prices represent only notification on invoices to dealers who arrange preintroduction sales. Final prices may be either higher or lower than these tentative estimates.

Ford prices will be set before the cars go on sale officially Sept. 19. Final Chrysler prices will be decided shortly before their sale opening Sept. 23.

The real tipoff on 1970 prices will come when General Motors announces its prices sometime before its cars go on sale Sept. 18. The other automakers may juggle their prices after seeing GM price tags.

American Motors Corp. is expected to send out tentative prices shortly. The News said AMC prices will show an increase of more than \$100 but will not be as high as the Chrysler prices.

## Ease Rules On Poultry Meat On Hot Dogs

The Agriculture department decided to relax federal meat regulations requiring that hot dogs containing poultry meat say so on the main package labels.

Beginning in November manufacturers of federally inspected cooked sausages will be permitted to add up to 15 per cent poultry meat without telling consumers so in the main label.

Poultry meat is permitted now only if the main package labels specifically indicate the contents, such as "frankfurters, chicken added."

Under the new regulation packages may be labeled simply "frankfurters" as long as poultry meat content does not exceed 15 per cent.

Officials, however, retained the present labeling for sausages containing more than 15 per cent poultry.

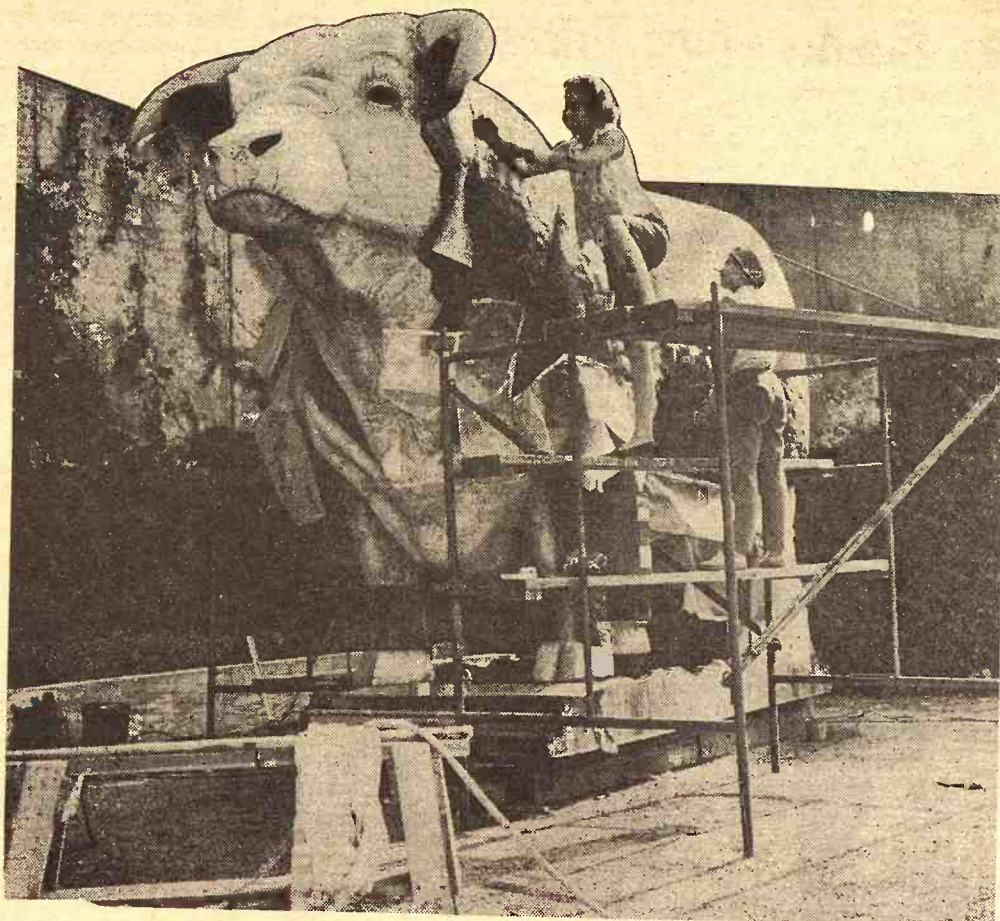

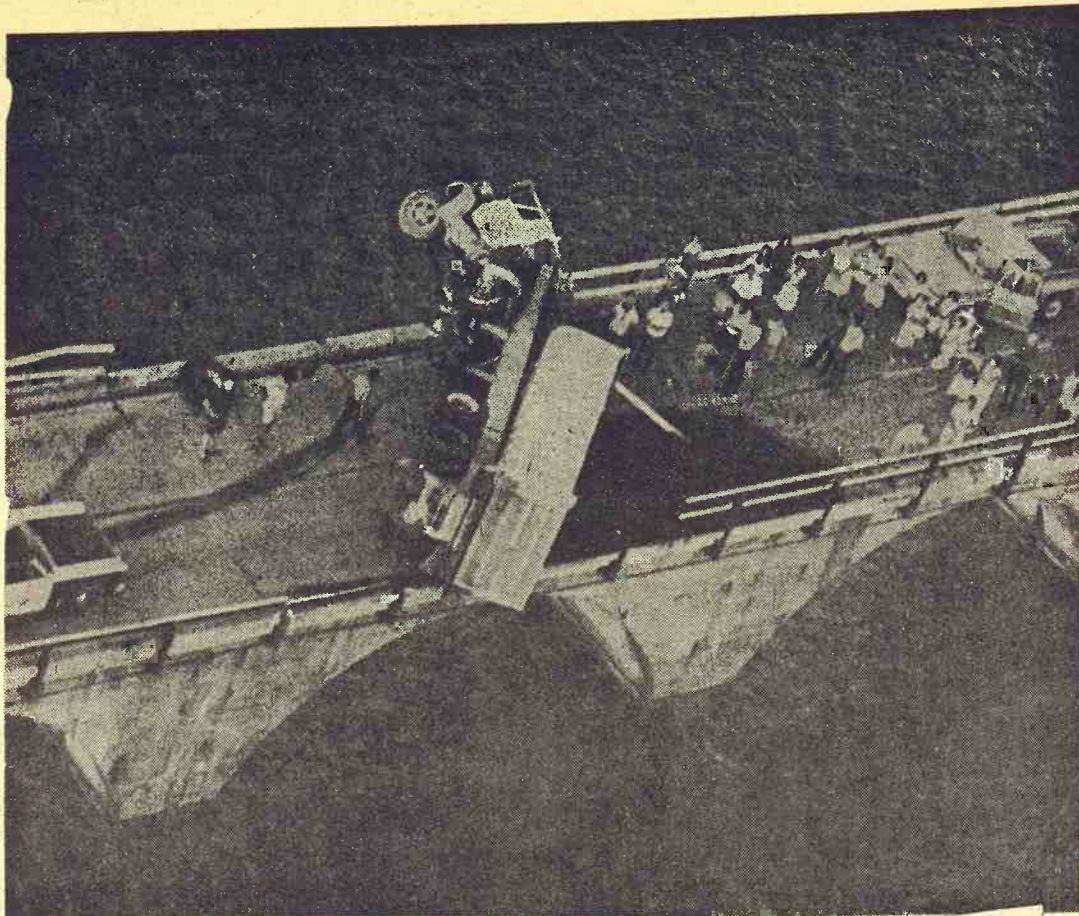

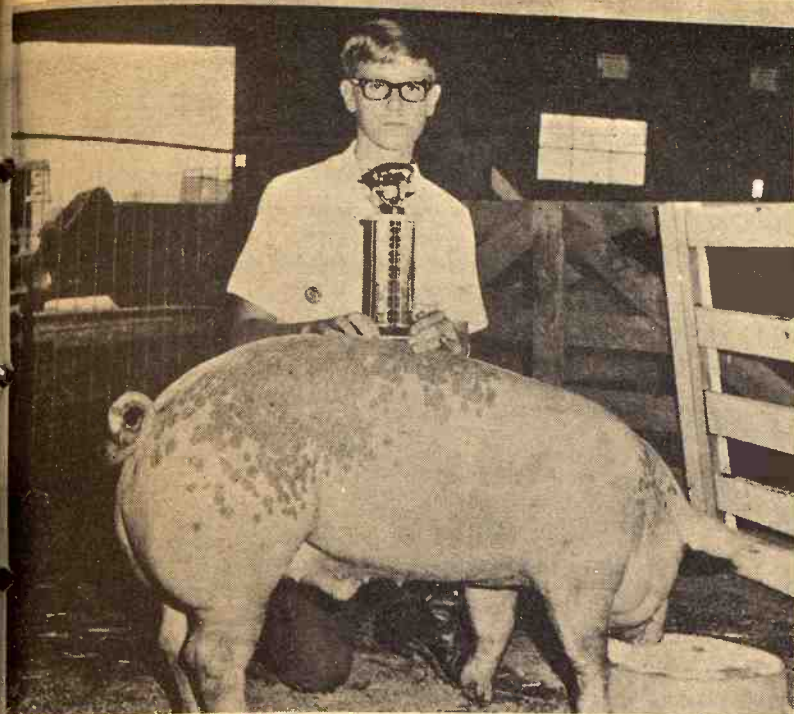

### See More, Not Less Welfare Demand

A Kansas legislative committee has been informed that the 1970 Kansas Legislature will be faced with providing millions of dollars in additional funds for welfare as a result of rocketing costs.

Dr. Robert Harder, newly-named director of social welfare for Kansas, told representatives of the House and Senate ways and means committees today that current estimates indicate costs of medical care alone for welfare recipients may be up between 6 and 8 million dollars.

Dr. Harder also said the preparation of budget figures for the 1970 Legislature for welfare, expected to be completed by September 15, may be further complicated by the threat of a lawsuit against the state to recover additional funds welfare recipients claim have been due them since 1965.

Dr. Harder told the legislators that the welfare clients, members of the National Welfare Rights organization, claim that Kansas payments have not kept pace with increases in the cost of living shown by Department of Labor statistics as required by federal welfare organizations.

A variety of reasons were given for the need or additional millions for the need of additional millions of dollars in welfare funds by Dr. Harder in his testimony. They included:

- Recruiting of persons to welfare roles through active campaigns by representatives of the Office of Economic Opportunity in local areas and by the National Welfare Rights organization.

- Growing number of marriages by much younger persons and an accompanying high rate of divorce with resulting increases

es in the number of Aid to Dependent Children recipients.

- Increasing rate of illegitimacy in births among Kansans.
- Increase in vendor costs for medical payments and other services
