FIRST QUARTER PROFITS OFF AT IHC, CASE

Both International Harvester and Case say their first-quarter business had rough going. IH said its first quarter business showed \$551 million in sales and profits of \$8.2 million compared to \$554 million in sales

and \$18.7 million profit in the same quarter last year. Case showed a loss of \$1.2 million compared to a \$287,500 profit last year for the first quarter. Sales were about the same, at \$68.9 million. The first quarter is seasonally the slowest for implement companies.

Hog Producers Work To Finish Cholera Effort

EMPORIA - Kansas pork producers in state convention last week voted to move into the final stages of cholera eradication in Kansas.

They will seek state funds for indemnity payments to breeders losing animals in cholera outbreaks. Payment will be made on the difference between slaughter value and the appraised value of hogs being killed because of cholera.

More than 250 producers attended the annual meeting.

Also meeting in annual convention were the Kansas Porkettes, the women's auxiliary of the pork producers organiza-

The Kansas Swine Improvement Association — the pork producers - voted to complete affiliation with the National Pork Producers Council.

Under constitutional changes adopted, the Kansas association will be divided into eight districts, each headed by a board member.

In other business the group asked that more research into swine and swine diseases be made at Kansas State University, Manhattan.

They announced the annual tested boar sale at Weber Hall, KSU, March 4. About 50 purebred boars will be offered at auction.

Fred Delano, former county agent of Neosho County, now a farm management field man for K-State, received the KSIA award for outstanding aid to the pork industry in 1967.

Carol Sauerwein, Kansas Pork Queen and runner-up for the national honor, and Frank Wilson, Kansas' representative in the World Pork Cook-out King contest, were accorded special honor during the day.

New officers elected are Duane Van Horn, Lyons, president, succeeding Jasper DeVore, Arkansas City; Don Sailors, Erie, vice-president; Dr. Berl Koch, KSU, secretary, and Wenel Moyer, KSU, field secretary and treasurer.

New board members are Wayne Gattshall, Goodland; James Dunsford, Dodge City; James Henry, Longford; Dick Strohl, Cunningham; Shannon Nickolson, Sabetha; Roy Stroup, Fontana Van Horn, and Sailors.

Cow Herd Gains Jumble Livestock Estimates

The need for further selfdiscipline in managing the size of the nation's beef cattle herd was emphasized to officials of the American National Cattlemen's Association in reviewing the official estimates of annual livestock inventories.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture, in its estimate of livestock numbers across the country as of January 1, indicated that total cattle numbers had risen only two-tenths of a per cent during 1967, but that beef cow inventories had risen 1.8 per cent, continuing an increase begun in 1958.

'Although this boost in beef cow numbers is statistically small, it is more than twice that experienced during 1965 and 1966," the ANCA officials said. The beef cow herd expansion more than offset the decreases in the dairy herd."

USDA's estimates placed all cattle numbers at 108,813,000, up from the 108,645,000 on hand Jan. 1, 1967, but down from 1966's 108,862,000 and 1965's 109,-000,000. The beef cattle herd rose one per cent to 86,582,000, the highest on record. Swine numbers were up two per cent, to 54,263,000, although substantially below inventories of earlier years. Meanwhile, the sheep and lamb inventory at 22,122,000 head, was at the lowest level since USDA began keeping records 101 years ago.

"These statistics encourage us to greater self-discipline and concerted effort to balance supply with effective demand," AN-CA officials declared. "The job is not done by any means, and current economic facts and indicators just emphasize that we can never again afford to let the cow herd expand so rapid-

Beef heifers, numbered at 9,-312,000 at the start of this year, also showed a small gain over 1967's 9,121,000 but were well below, numerically and percentagewise, previous one-year

Caves on hand Jan. 1 - 27,-507,000 head — were up around one per cent from 1967's 27,-294,000 while steers, at 12,568,-000 head, were down from 1967's 12,752,000. Steer numbers seemingly have "stabilized" at around 121/2 million head since 1963. Bull numbers, at 1,895,000, also seem to have leveled off in this bracket, inasmuch as they had reached almost identical figures in 1953.

Major increases in all cattle numbers - beef and dairy were noted during 1967 for Texas (215,000), Kentucky (178,-000), Montana (115,000), Nebraska (98,000), Missouri (93,-000), Arkansas (66,000), Wyoming (55,000), California (44,000), Oklahoma (43,000), and Alabama (38,000).

However similar major "adjustments" downwards came in Iowa (222,000), North Dakota (160,000), Illinois (142,000), Indiana (101,000), Florida (89,-000), Minnesota (83,000), Michigan (76,000), Kansas (56,000), Wisconsin (42,000) and Louisiana (35,000).

The obvious "offsetting" by these leading cattle states, some close neighbors, can be construed as statistical "tidying up" in some cases as USDA tightens up on its livestock inventory procedures. Some of the states which underwent major revisions in last year's controversial inventory estimates, showed up with little or no revisions of 1967's numbers or changes during the year.

More pronounced differences appeared in analysis of the total beef cattle category. There Texas led the increases with 237,000 head, followed by Kentucky, 187,000; Montana, 118,-000;; Nebraska, 116,000; Mis-

souri, 100,000; Arkansas, 80,-000; Alabama, 56,000; Wyoming, 55,000; Mississippi, 49,000; and Georgia and California, both 45,000 head.

Reductions, such as Iowa's 169,000 head, could not offset the increases. Other states showing lesser numbers were North Dakota, down 130,000; Illinois 96,000; Florida, 89,000; Indiana, 52,000; Kansas, 38,000; Michigan, 15,000 and Oregon, 9,000.

Increases or decreases in beef cow numbers showed no pronounced pattern except that Kentucky continues its lateblooming growth pattern. Leading the states with increases were Missouri (80,000), Kentucky (71,000), Kansas (67,000), Texas (53,000), Mississippi (51,-000), Montana (44,000), Alabama and Georgia (33,000), Minnesota (31,000), Illinois (29, 000) and Iowa and Wyoming

Significant decreases in beef cow numbers came only in Florida (54,000), California (30,000), Louisiana (27,000), North Dakota (20,000), Oklahoma (19,-000) and Arizona (14,000).

Beef heifers assumed to be on feed showed up strong in the increased numbers in Texas (79,000), Oklahoma (46,000) and Kansas (31,000). But the same factor would not hold true for Kentucky's increase of 38,000 head. Mississippi's 25,000 or Missouri's 21,000 as among the leading gainers. The top three reductions in heifer numbers came in Iowa (46,000 head), Minnesota (34,000) and North Dakota (20,000).

Attempting to relate steer numbers to those "on feed" is similarly futile. The seven states showing major reductions in steer numbers all are important steer feeding states: Iowa, down 149,000; Kansas, down 74,-000; Illinois, 69,000; Missouri,

49,000; Nebraska, 40,000; North Dakota, 32,000; and Indiana, 26,-000. The only significant increases in steer numbers showed up in Kentucky (44,000), Texas (32,000), Montana (21,000), New Mexico and Pennsylvania (18,000), California (17,000) and Colorado and Arizona (16,000).

Although total beef calf figures read higher, the pattern of increases and decreases showed only that there are a few more on the Central and Southern Great Plains. Increases came in Texas, 60,000; California, 59,000; Nebraska, 57,000; Missouri, 46,000; Montana, 44,000;

Kentucky, 33,000; Wyoming, 29,-000; Arkansas, 27,000; and Oklahoma, 26,000. Reductions were in Illinois, 68,000; North Dakota, 57,000; Indiana, 49,000; Colorado, 32,000; Florida, 23,000; and Oregon, 15,000.

The estimate of the 1967 calf crop, due Feb. 21, may show further adjustment in calf numbers due to the upward revision of 90,000 head for beef and dairy cows tabulated on Jan. 1,

Outside of 13,000 extra bulls in Texas, state-by-state changes in this category during 1967 were relatively insignificant.

Included are five toms and eight hens. They were captured in South-Central Kansas and


transported here.

No Bonanza In Lotteries

New York, accustomed to financial busts after the 1964-65 Worlds Fair, is having another one in its statewide lottery.

Passed by the legislature last year to raise more money for education, the lottery was expected to have taken in \$30

million by now. The take has been less than \$10 million.

There is talk aready of abandoning the lottery, altho most of the present talk is aimed at making it more productive. First move appears to be to make the \$1 tickets more available. Presently they can be bought only in hotels, motels, government offices and banks, and the banks won't be able to sell them after April 1, follow-

ing a ban from the U.S. Congress. There is a proposal to make the tickets available in supermarkets, newstands, shopping centers, and railroad and bus terminals.

There wasn't a single legal lottery in the U.S. for 70 years, until New Hampshire launched one in 1964. It has been no bonanza to the state treasury there. It was hoped to raise \$7 million but thus far it has produced only a little more than \$2 million a year.

There has been some sniping by critics who claim the New Hampshire lottery has failed to yield sufficient revenue to justify itself. But the voters have continued to approve it at local option elections, the legislative leaders and the governor like it, and there are presently no moves afoot to abandon

Some Stability In Hog Prices

After increasing rapidly for about two years, the production of pork seems to have stabilized. Hog prices, which dropped sharply during the two years while supplies increased, have

worked upward during this winter. We expect only normal seasonal changes in market supplies and the price of hogs during the remainder of 1968.

The turning point, or stabili-

zation date, in the hog market seems to have been about December 1. Before that date, market receipts regularly exceeded year-before figures. During the 11 months (January to November), pork output was 13 percent more than a year earlier. But since November, pork output has been 1 or 2 percent less than it was 12 months before.

The stabilization of market receipts allowed the price of hogs to make small gains almost every week. Price gains during December and January totaled about \$1.50 a hundred pounds. A year earlier, prices had trended downward.

What's Ahead? Our best guides as to what is ahead are the Pig Crop Reports of the USDA and a study of trends in prices, profits, and production.

The latest government Pig Crop Report was issued in December, based on responses from farmers on December 1. It has proven to be unusually accurate — so far.

It showed that the 1967 summer pig crop was practically the same as that of 1966. Market receipts of hogs in December and January were just 1 percent less than one year be-

The fall pig crop (farrowed in August, September & October)

was reported to be slightly larger (1 or 2 percent) than that of the previous year.

From these figures, we would expect the market receipts of hogs to be about the same (or maybe slightly larger) during March, April, and May as they were last year.

We would expect prices to be more nearly steady than they were last spring, because production has stabilized. A year ago, pork output was increasing rapidly, and new price levels were needed to get consumers to buy more of the product.

It seems reasonable to believe that farmers have stabilized hog production - for the present. Prices and profits apparently have been good enough to keep most hog men in the business, but not high enough to encourage a lot of producers to expand their hog enterprise.

There is another favorable factor in the outlook for hog prices: Supplies of competitive meats (beef and chicken) are not increasing as much as usual this year.

Market receipts of hogs usually hold at high levels through March and April, then drop off in May and June. If other conditions are favorable at that time, prices should rise - probably into the \$20 to \$22 range.

Iowa Packers To Open Emporia Plant By Fall

EMPORIA - Iowa Beef Pack ers Inc. hopes to have its Emporia plant in operation by fall issue of G&G a company executive has an nounced.

Arven Walker said the facil writes, "Hi, G ity formerly owned and opera. ted by Armour & Co. is being remodeled and expanded in a schedule aimed at a fall opening.

He said the plant hopes to handle 8000 carcasses a week, in contrast to 2500 handled by Armour when it operated the plant.

Walker said 10 per cent of the work force at the start must be skilled men brought in from elsewhere but the company's aim is to build its work force from the Emporia area.

Walker also implied bad la-bor relations was the important fac tor in Armour's sudden decision to close the Emporia plant which, he said, had lost money from the day it opened.

msurance terms Definea For Easier Understanding

To make understanding easier, here in simple language are definitions of insurance terms you'll hear.

Remodeling a cluttered garge into a comfortable apartment sounds like a major project. But, with a little handyman know-how and the right materials, one homeowner did the job in his spare time, with minimal expense and professional-looking results.

ble-duty furniture, such as a couch that opens into a bed, a lavatory with countertop space and a built-in cabinet and end tables with drawer space.

When completed, the garage becomes a comfortable separate apartment that kept the relative close to the family while maintaining her privacy and independence.





ENTER KANS.

Study Relates Age of Farm Operators To Potential of Rural Youth

Only 17,000 Kansas farms will be available to the 47,000 rural youth who will choose an occupation during the next 13 years. This conclusion was reached by Charles Kellogg, Jamestown, graduate student in agricultural economics at Kansas State University, in a study of the impact of retirement and death of older farmers in the

Kellogg bases his findings on ag census data and projections of farm consolidation by 1980. Kansas farm operators numhered 92,440 in 1964. About half these farmers will have died or retired by 1980. If the rate of farm consolidation continues as

in the past, 29,000 of these farm units will be absorbed by existing farms.

This will leave only 17,000 farms available for beginning

Kellogg estimates that roughly 47,000 farm youth will enter the work force during this period. Most of these youngsters will leave the farm either voluntarily or involuntarily due to lack of farming opportunities, he concludes.

Kellogg's study also shows that Kansas farm operators averaged 51.3 years of age in 1964, and that almost 18 percent were 65 or older.

Scott County had the young-

est farmers, averaging 46.8 years. At the other extreme, Elk County farmers were the oldest, averaging 54.2 years.

Farmers in eastern Kansas were older, on the average, than those in the western part of the state, he says.

The K-State graduate student believes that irrigation will help reduce some pressure for farm consolidation by allowing some farmers to contnue operation on smaller units.

He predicts that Kansas will have approximately 2.5 million acres under irrigation in 1980, assuming ground water reserves are not depleted. This compares with about 1.5 million irrigated acres in 1967.


"Work will continue on the project until well into 1970," said Gail Achterberg, Bureau official, "but the conservation depth of water could be in the reservoir by that time," he continued.



Veterinary Lead In Dental Care

NEW YORK - Tooth decay can be prevented in animals by putting a harmless chemical in their food and water, dental researchers reported yesterday.

The discovery "may well be a major breakthrough in the control of dental caries (decay)," an editorial in the Journal of the American Dental Association declares.

The chemical is an enzyme, dextranase, that breaks down dextran. And dextran is a main ingredient in sticky "plaques," containing bacteria, that form on teeth to initiate the process

The plaques in turn can harden into calculus or tartar, setting the stage for destructive gum disease that causes enormous loss of teeth and gums and bone.

The new findings therefore hold promise of combatting

both tooth decay and peridontal or gum disease. Human tests of the new approach are planned, the research team said, to try to find whether dextranase can be a useful and safe agent to fight tooth decay and gum dis-

A Cutback In Car Guarantee

Auto makers are considering reducing guarantees on new cars.

The Wall Street Journal has reported that executives are heeding complaints from dealers and may cut back warranties at the start of the 1969 model year.

Likely the guarantee would be cut back to 24,000 miles or two years, whichever comes first.

Consideration of the warranty cutbacks comes at a time when auto profits are under growing pressure because of mounting costs, and the fact that the industry faces possible Federal legislation that would require it to spell out terms of warranties more clearly; in addition, the industry would have to submit to Federal warranty standards and even to arbitration of some unhappy customers' warranty claims.

Current warranties cover practically the whole car against defects in materials or workmanship for two years or 24,-000 miles, whichever comes first, and they cover the car's power train parts for five years, or 50,000 miles.

This 5/50 coverage on the power train parts appears most threatened, according to highly placed industry executives.

Last fall all of the auto makers sharply cut back their warranty coverage. Ford Motor Co. and General Motors Corp. did this by initiating fees of up to \$25 for second and subsequent owners who want the original warranty coverage continued.

Ford also requires second owners to pay the first \$25 of

warranty repair bills. Chrysler Corp. and American Motors Corp. didn't require additional fees but limited warranty coverage to two owners.

To curb warranty costs, auto makers have been bearing down on their quality control prob-

The preliminary estimates for 1967 indicate an increase in the production of creamery butter and ice cream in Kansas but a decrease in American cheese production from the previous year.

Manufactured dairy products normally absorb somewhat less than half of the State's milk production.

Creamery butter production was estimated at 20.6 million pounds in 1967, 24 percent above 1966. American cheese production totaled 19.6 million pounds, a decrease of 11 percent from 1966.Ice Cream production in 1967 increased slightly to 5.7 million gallons compared to 5.4







management tool," Carlson said. Myth No. 1 is that computers don't make mistakes, he said. "Mistakes are made, but almost always a human is responsible, not the computer.

. "Any of a dozen things can go wrong. Errors may be made in coding mail-in farm records, filling out the forms, or the key-punch operator may mistake a 4 for a 9."

Another myth is that farmers want a complete EDP management accounting program, the speaker said. "So far, more of these complex programs have flopped, by commercial standards, than have caught on.

"The fastest-growing services are the least sophisticated ones."

Carlson disspelled the myth that farmers will buy computer services as fast as they are available, noting that farmers are rather careful buyers of EDP services.

"We often hear the complaint that computers reduce you to a number," Carlson said. "But quite the reverse is true. In the future, data systems will force you to become more of an individual thinker and less of a mechanical man.

"Computers will take over the dull, repetitive work, such as replacing bookkeepers, but not the skilled accountants who apply human judgment."

Another speaker, Dr. Norman Whitehair, state leader for extension economics at K-State, outlined the university's role in EDP.

Whitehair said that K-State has hired a staff member, Dr. Larry Langemeier, to develop an electronic data processing system for the university and commercial interests.

K-State is starting a development project designed to wed the vast volume of computer science knowledge to that of a practical educational program in farm management, Whitehair said.

He explained that the program would have four purposes:

- Enhancing K-State's re-

search program. Developing ways to apply

computer services to farm management record keeping. - Providing more graduates

with knowledge of computer operations to prepare them for eventual employment with firms and agencies.

 Developing an extension program to promote electronic date processing in Kansas.





May Quit Sales of Live Buffalo

Until brucellosis has been officially cleared from all herds, the sale of live buffalo in the state may be halted. Biologists with the sale of live buffalo in the state may be halted. Biologists with the Kansas Fish & Game Commission say the state is cooperating with a federal program to eliminate brucellosis. Federal regulations require that any herd of animals containing the disease be quarantined until all traces of it are gone.

The Game Commission sold about 175 head of buffalo in 1967. About 90 percent of them were slaughtered and sold to service organizations. Selling slaughtered animals is acceptable, but live sales will likely be non-existent for several years.

However, the chart shows that after adjust-ment for the depreciation of the dollar, the gain in real disposable income per capita has been 58 percent over the last 20 years or an average growth rate of 2.3 percent.

The bill also exempts working and royalty interests on oil and gas holdings, but the bill's sponsors said this exemption was not intended.

In 1967, personal property relating to farming totaled \$313.3 million in assessed tangible valuation. Total assessed tangbile valuation for all classes of property was \$5.3 billion for the same year.

Here's K-State Field Day Spring Schedule

What is Kansas State University doing to support agriculture, the No. 1 industry in the state?

Come to the spring and fall field day events at the K-State agricultural research sites and see for yourself, suggests Dr. Floyd W. Smith, director of the Agricultural Experiment Station.

Because of the state's size, K-State has developed an extensive network of agronomy research locations to check local growing conditions. This allows University researchers to test and make recommendations on new crop varieties, date and rate of planting, fertilizer application, tillage practices, and cultivation methods.

A great variety of research projects with crops and livestock are carried out at the Experiment Station, Manhattan, and at the five branch experiment stations at Colby, Garden City, Hays, Mound Valley (with fields at Columbus and Parsons), and Tribune.

Agronomy experiment fields, operated by the K-State agronomy department under the direction of Dr. R. V. Olson, are located at Belleville, Hutchinson, Mankato, Minneola, Newton, Ottawa, Powhattan, Scandia, and St. John (both dryland and irrigation)

The K-State horticulture department, under the guidance of Dr. R. W. Campbell, conducts fruit and vegetable research at Manhattan and the Wathena Experiment Field, and nut crop research at the Southeast Experiment Field, Chetopa.

"For more than 50 years, Kansas people have visited our research facilities to get a firsthand look at what we are doing," Dr. Smith notes. "And our annual field days give them an opportunity to get acquainted with our K-State research faculty, Extension specalists, and field personnel."



The program faces tough going because President Johnson has recommended to a Congress insistent on budget-cutting that funds for it be limited to \$100 million for the 1969 crop year. For many years Congress has provided upward of \$250 million for annual payments.

Ever since its enactment in 1936, after the Supreme Court knocked out the precedent-making Agricultural Adjustment Act crop controls, the ACP program has enjoyed a high degree of support in Congress. In the beginning and for many years, \$500 million annually was voted for the program.

Three presidents have sought unsuccessfully to reduce the ACP fund - Dwight D. Eisenhower, John F. Kennedy and Johnson.

One of the most powerful lobbyists for the program is the National Limestone Institute Inc., an organization of lime processors. A considerable portion of the ACP funds spent over the years has been for putting lime on acid soils.

The rate of government costsharing averages about 50 per per cent.

Some critics contend that practices farmers are assisted in carrying out under this program are things any prudent farmer should do without compensation from the government. But supporters argue that because of low farm income many worthwhile projects would not have been carried out without federal payments.

Projects under the program between 1936 and 1966 include the construction of 1,958,000 cover crops on 465,679,000 acres of land to protect them from erosion by wind and water. An-





On January 1, 1968, the number of Kansas cattle and calves on grain feed for the slaughter market was 610,000, up 4 percent from a year earlier and a new high for the State, according to the Kansas Crop and Livestock Reporting Service.

This was up seasonally from the 468,000 on feed on October 1, 1967 and was about one-third greater than average for January 1 in the 1962-66 period.

The cattle and calves on feed in Kansas included 338,000 on feed in commercial sized lots with 1000 head or more capacity. The 338,000 was a new high for commercial lots.

Farm type feeding operations accounted for 272,000 of the cattle and calves on feed, about 1 percent less than a year ear-

Marketings of grain fed cattle for slaughter during the October-December quarter totaled 285,000, up 10 percent from a year earlier. Cattle and calves placed on feed during the October-December quarter totaled 427,000 compared with 370,000 a year earlier.

Of the cattle on feed January 1, 1968, 447,000 were steers and steer calves and 163,000 heifers and heifer calves compared with 437,000 and 149,000, respectively, a year earlier.

Classification of cattle on feed by weight groups included 12,000 of less than 500 pounds in weight, 120,000 in the 500-699 pound group, 273,000 in the 700. 899 pound group, 177,000 in the 900-1099 pound group and 28,000 weighing 1100 pounds or more.

By length of time on feed 69 percent of the total on feed, or 421,000, had been on feed less than 3 months compared with 61 percent a year earlier. Some 181,000 had been on feed 3 to 6 months and only 8000 on feed more than 6 months.

Kansas feeders intentions to market indicated that about 372,000 grain fed cattle would be marketed in the January-March quarter, not greatly different from the 370,000 marketed in the same quarter of 1967.

Major Feeding States In the 32 major feeding states there were 11.297,000 cattle and calves on grain feed for the slaughter market on January 1, 1968, up 2 percent from the number a year earlier. Iowa, Illinois and California all had

less cattle on feed than a year eariier but most other major states showed moderate to substantial increases.

Weight, Kind and Time On Feed

In the 32 major feeding states, 70 percent of the cattle and calves on feed were steers or steer calves and 30 percent heifers and heifer calves.

By weight groups, 16 percent were under 500 pounds; 27 percent, 500-699 pounds; 32 percent, 700-899 pounds; 22 percent, 900-1099 pounds and 3 percent, 1100 pounds and over. Some 68 percent of the cattle had been on feed less than 3 months, 27 percent from 3 to 6 months and 5 percent more than 6 months.

Marketings and Placements

In the 32 major feeding states, 7,943,00 head of cattle were placed on feed during the fourth quarter of 1967, 3 percent more than a year earlier.

India Leads Crop Surge

An Agriculture department survey indicates world agricultural production set a new record last year, with India, long plagued by bad weather, leading the underdeveloped nations.

The survey said world production last year was 127 percent of the 1957-59 average, compared with 122 per cent in 1966.

Production in developed countries rose from 123 percent of the base average in 1966 to 126 percent last year, which production in the less developed countries increased from 120 percent to 130 percent the study said.

In India, production rose about one-filth.

On a per capita supply basis, world production was 107 per cent of the 1957-59 average in 1967, compared with 104 per cent the year before. Per capita supply in the developed countries increased from 112 to 113 percent, but in the less developed countries, per capita production increased from 98 per cent of the 1957-59 average to 104 percent.

India's per capita supply went up from 89 percent in 1966 to 104 percent last year.

The department said it is too early to estimate 1968 food production.



Twice As Much Wheat Under Loan

The Agriculture Department says that the cumulative total of wheat from the 1967 crop stored under government price support loans through January 31 was nearly double that of a year ago. Corn stored under loan was up two-thirds from last year's figures.

Orville L. Freeman, secretary of Agriculture, has been urging farmers to place more grain from last year's record large crop under loans to help bolster market prices.

Wheat from last year's crop placed under loan to January 31 totaled 238 million bushels compared with 122 million a year

earlier.

A total of 347 million bushels of corn were put under loan through January 31 compared with 193 million a year earlier.

The department also reported that 183 million bushels of soybeans from last year's crop had been stored under support loans through January 31 compared with 136 million a year earlier.


