- 2. **Dr. Jerzy Wiatr:** Former Minister of Education for Poland.
- 3. **Dr. Howard Wiarda:** Professor of Comparative Politics at the University of Connecticut.
- 4. **Dr. Paula Dobriansky:** Former Head of the Washington Office of the Council on Foreign Relations who later served as the Under Secretary for Global Affairs at the US Department of State.
- 5. **Dr. Georgi Arbatov:** Former advisor to Leonid Brezhnev, Mikhail Gorbachev and Boris Yeltsin and Director of the Institute for the Study of the United States and Canada in Moscow, USSR.
- 6. **Dr. Sergei Khrushchev:** Son of the late Soviet leader and Professor of Political Science at Brown University.
- 7. **Admiral Dennis Blair, USN (ret):** Former Commander in Chief of US Forces in the Pacific Region and the 3<sup>rd</sup> Director of National Intelligence (2009-2009).
- 8. **Major General Oleg Kalugin:** Former KGB General in charge of US Affairs who led the Soviet efforts during the Walker Spy Case of the 1980's.
- 9. **Dr. Charles Kupchan:** Associate Professor of Political Science and Assistant Director of the Washington Office of the Council of Foreign Relations, Washington, DC.

- 10. Lieutenant General Mike Short, USAF (ret): Commander of NATO Air Forces during the Kosovo Campaign.
- 11. **Dr. Longin Pastusiak:** Speaker of the Sejm (Polish Parliament) and author of more than 100 books in Polish, English, German, French, and Russian.
- 12. **Lieutenant General Bernard Trainor**, **USMC** (ret): Former Head of Policy Plans Division, US Marine Corps; former head, Military Studies Group, Harvard University; former reporter, New York Times
- 13. **Fritz Ermarth:** Chair of the National Intelligence Council (1988-1993) and Special Assistant to the President under Ronald Reagan.
- 14. **Ambassador Nicolas Salgo (ret):** Former US Ambassador to Hungary, builder of the Watergate Complex in Washington DC and collector of Hungarian art.
- 15. Colonel Hans-Werner Weber: Former officer in the East German Army who was present when the decision was made by East German military headquarters not to close the Berlin Wall once it was opened in 1989.
- 16. **Ambassador John D. Scanlan:** Former US Ambassador to Yugoslavia (1985-89) and expert on Eastern European affairs.
- 17. Simon McDonald: First Secretary, British Embassy, Washington, DC
- 18. **Brigadier General John Reppert, USA (ret):** Executive Director (Research) for the Belfer Center for Science and International Affairs, John F. Kennedy School of Government, Harvard University.
- 19. **Dr. Timothy Colton:** Head of the Davis Center for Russian Studies and Morris and Anna Feldberg Professor of Government and Russian Studies, Harvard University.
