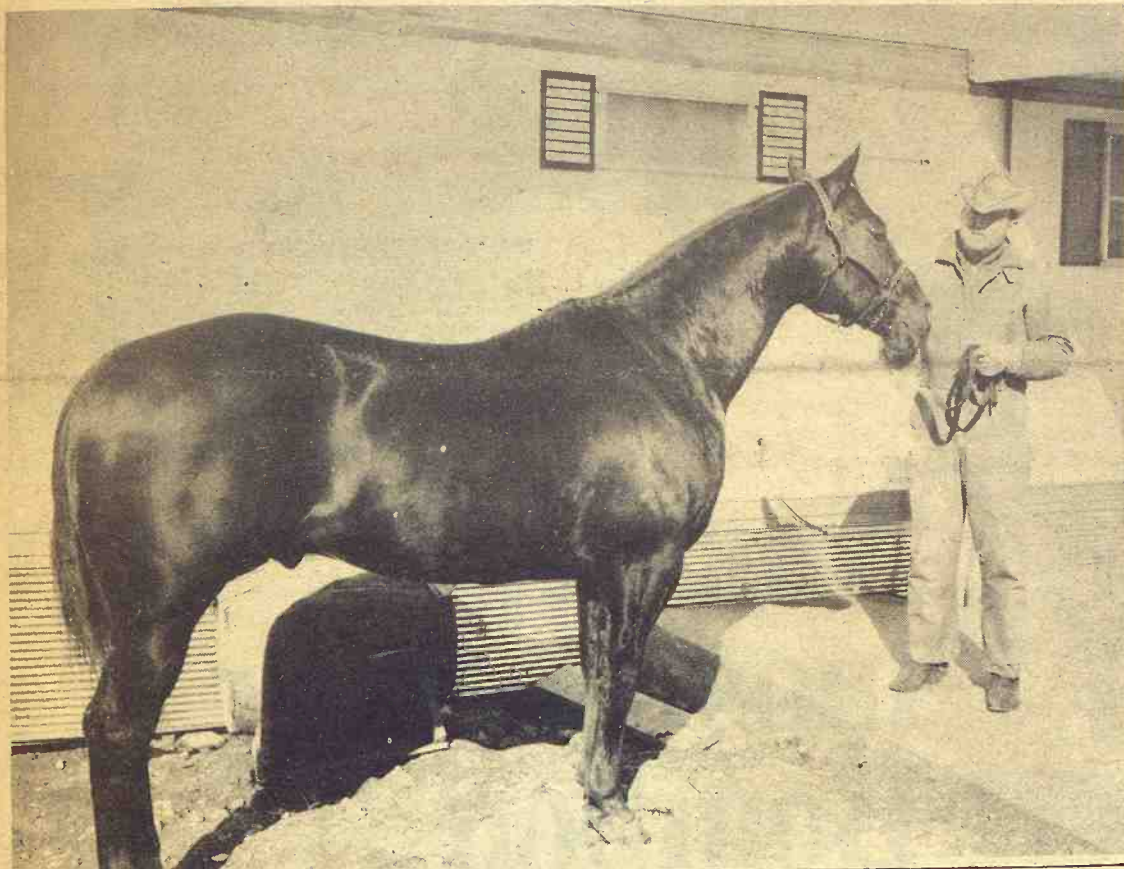

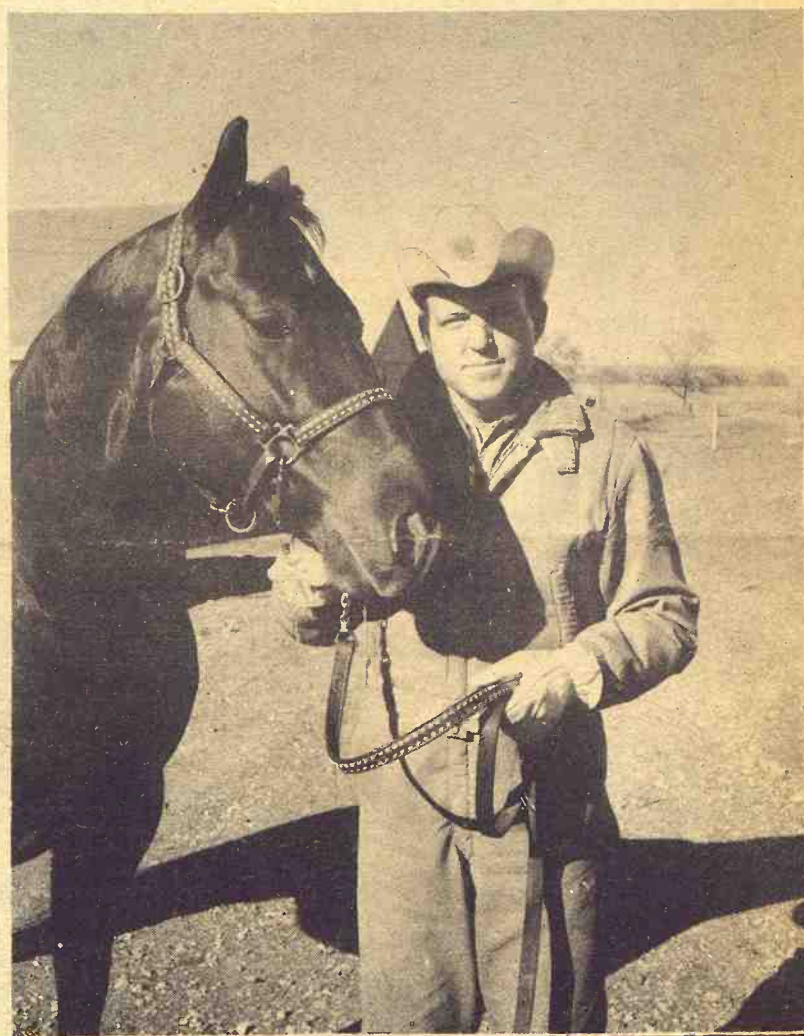

Quarter Horses are an enjoyable hobby and a sometimes profitable sideline for many livestockmen in the G & G area, but one man who makes his living from his knowledge of horses is Dean Smith of Morris county.

## Steady Feedlot Gain By Packers, Grocers

The number of cattle fed by packers and retail food chains has increased sharply in recent years, according to latest data available on annual reports filed by these firms with the Packers and Stockyards Administration.

During 1966 some 189 firms reported a total of 1,384,100 head as compared with 1961 when 203 firms said they fed 865,500 head. Since that year the number has increased almost steadily and passed the million mark in 1963. However, the volume fed in 1964 was down slightly from the previous year but has jumped sharply since then.

Of the 10 major packers, eight reported feeding 294,500 head in 1961. By 1966 the volume grew to 410,000 with eight of them sending in data to the government.

Among other packers, 178 in 1961 fed 922,200 head, a sharp increase over the 532,000 head fed by 191 firms five years earlier.

Three retail food chains reported 51,800 head in 1966 as compared with 39,900 by four

chains in 1961.

Sheep and lamb feeding by packers during the five-year period also jumped sharply. A total of 17 packers reported feeding 1,295,500 head in 1966 as compared with only 605,700 by 27 packers and retailers in 1961. Of the 10 largest packers, six reported feeding 1,136,600 head in 1966 as against only 524,200 in 1961 and 676,900 in 1965, also by six firms.

Lamb feeding by retailers has been practically nil. One food chain reported feeding 1100 head in 1961 but no food chains reported feeding operations in 1965 and 1966.

In 1966, a total of 42 packers reported slaughtering 89,600 head of calves from their own feedlots as compared with only 34,600 by 40 packers in 1961. Only one of the major packers sent in data for 1966 and reported 26,100 head. In 1961, two of the major packers handled 19,000 head of their own calves.

While cattle and calf (as well as sheep and lamb) feeding by packers showed sharp increases in recent years, packer feeding of hogs declined. In 1966, a to-

tal of 32,800 hogs was fed by 19 packers, as against 37,500 in 1961 by 42 slaughterers.

In 1961, three major packers

reported 4,100 head of hogs but in 1966 the number dropped to 900 as reported by one packer.

Data used in the report in-

cluded livestock fed by or for meat packers and removed from feedlot for slaughter or sale during the reporting period.

## Senators Continue Parry Over Livestock Association

Should the Kansas Livestock Association be given authority under the law to make recommendations for appointments of state officers?

Sen. Joe Warren, D-Maple City, was asked that question last week by Sen. Norman E. Gaar, R-Westwood, during a Senate Federal and State Affairs committee hearing on Warren's bill to consolidate the offices of brand commissioner and livestock sanitary commissioner.

Warren's bill, which was recommended by Democratic Gov. Robert Docking, would change the livestock commission from an advisory to a regulatory body. The commission would appoint a chief executive who would perform both the functions of the present livestock

sanitary commissioner and the brand commissioner.

But the livestock association still would have the right to recommend the names of three persons who are ready and willing to serve for each appointment to the seven-member commission.

Why should the authority for a private organization to make these recommendations be written into law, Gaar asked. Could the organization not just write a letter to the governor.

Warren replied the association serves the interest of the livestock association. Gaar said he understands the association serves its own interest and not necessarily the public interest.

Warren said, "There might be some politics get into this."

Gaar replied that the bill stip-

ulates that a maximum of four members of the same political party may serve on the commission.

"Most people in the industry feel that the association represents the public interest," Warren said. To which Gaar answered: "As long as it doesn't gore their ox."

Gaar asked Warren and Sen. Charles B. Joseph, D-Potwin, if they could vote for the bill if the committee struck out the provision giving the association authority to make recommendations.

Warren said he could not. Joseph said he would rather the legislature do something than nothing at all.

"I compliment you, sir, on your eloquent evasion," Gaar said.

Raulston was appointed to head the activity for the Wheat Growers by John Becker, Sylvan Grove, association vice-president.

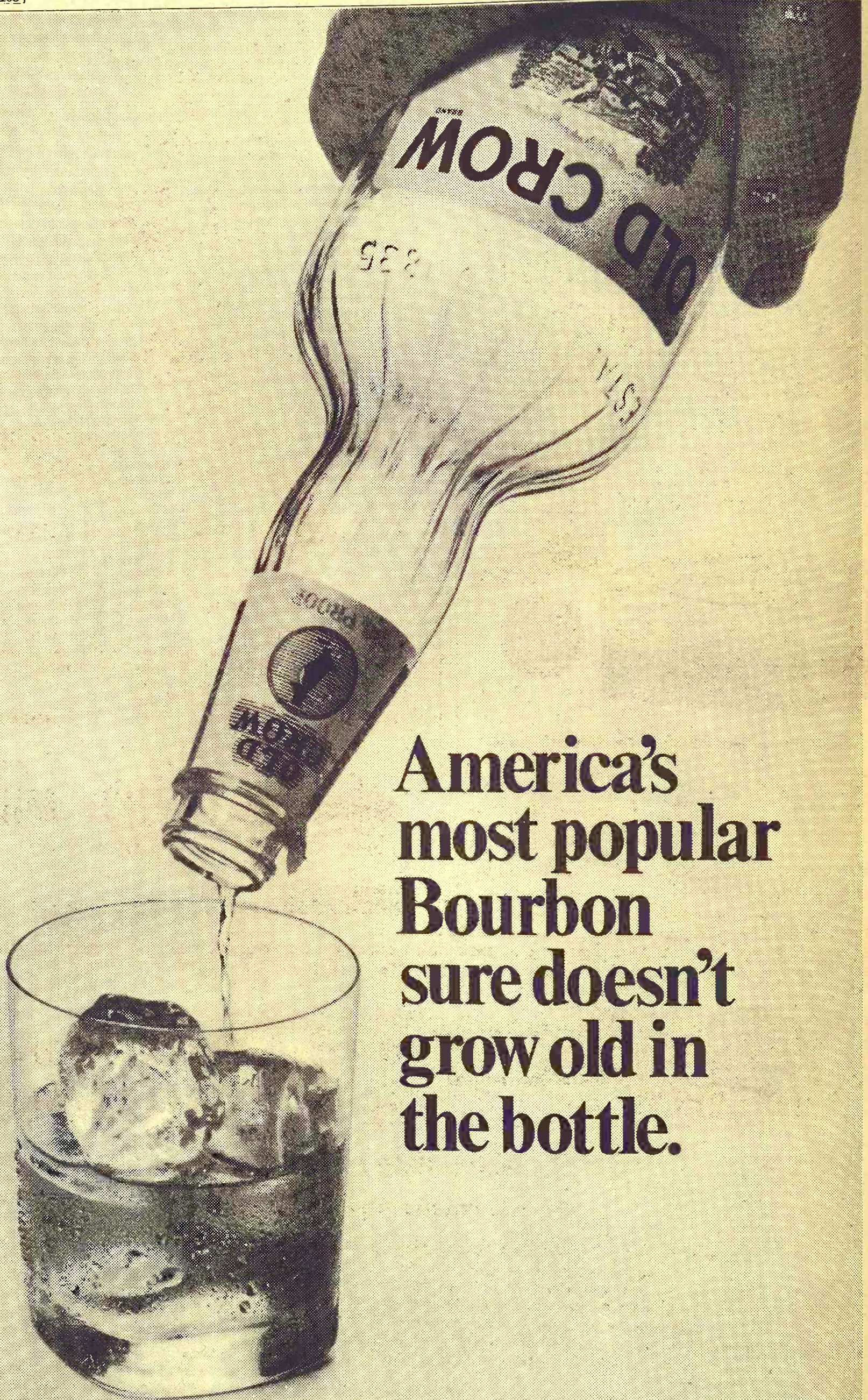
"Farmers who planted barley and no other feed grains in 1959 and 1960 were barred from the federal feed grain program when crop bases were computed on those years," Raulston said.

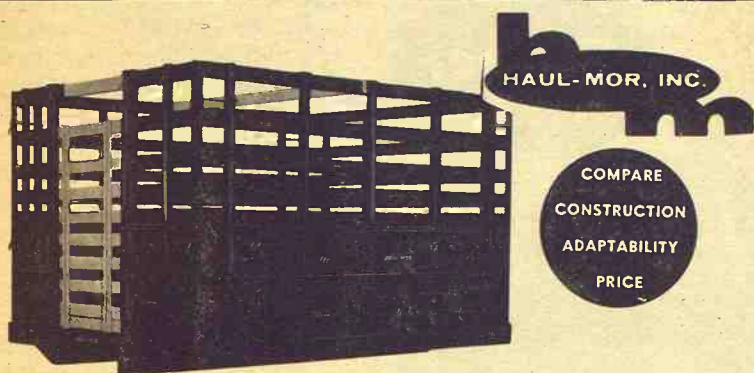

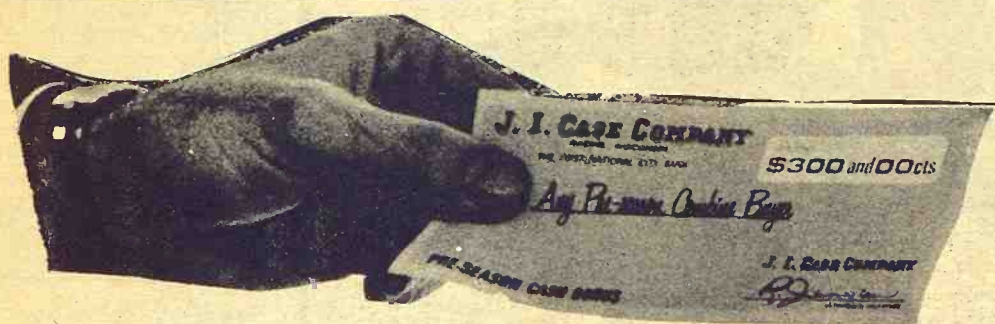

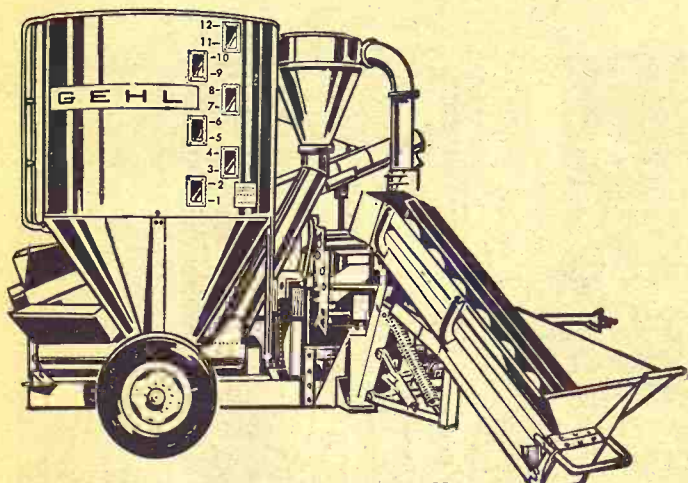

## Where The Corn And Beans Are

Some farmers have asked for information about supplies held by processors and dealers. Information of that kind is regularly published in many government and private reports. Figures for grains, for example, are collected and published four times a year — in January, April, July, and October. The report for January 1 of this year was released on the 24th of the month.

Corn. The January 1 stock of corn stored off farms was reported at 862 million bushels — up 11 per cent from a year before. An earlier report listed farm stocks of corn at 3,353 million bushels — 16 per cent more than one year before. Thus, the total supply of corn on hand would be 4,215 million bushels — up 15 per cent from last year.

We should note, however, that some of the reported increase in farm stocks consisted of corn that had not yet been harvested. It was still standing in the fields (or frozen on the ground) on the January 1 re-

porting date.

We can make an estimate of the amount of corn used from October 1 to January 1 by comparing the supplies listed for each date. The comparison points to use, loss, and exports for the quarter at 1,330 million bushels, 50 million bushels (4 per cent) more than a year before.

Most of the increased disappearance during the quarter could be accounted for by larger exports. We estimate exports at around 175 million bushels — 40 million more than a year before.

Industrial uses for corn — such as starch and syrup, corn meal, and alcohol — remain about the same each year. They probably took about 90 million bushels during the October-December quarter.

Other disappearance (mostly as grain fed to livestock and poultry) was about 1,060 million bushels — practically the same as a year before.

Farmers have been putting large amounts of corn under

price support. During the first 15 days of January, they put 102 million bushels under loan. This brought the total of 1967 crop corn under loan to 296 million bushels — about twice as much as farmers put under loan in the same time last year.

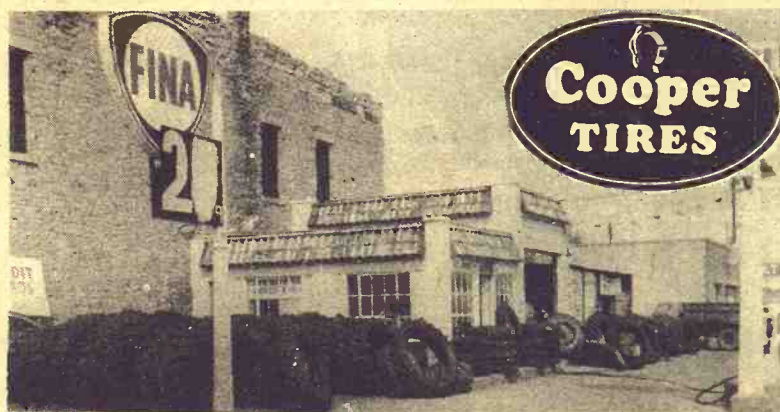
Soybeans. The January 1 stock of soybeans stored off farms was reported at 432 million bushels — 14 per cent more than a year earlier. At the same time, farm stocks were listed at 350 million bushels — just 2 per cent more than the year before. Farm and off-farm stocks combined totaled 782 million bushels — 8 per cent more than last year.

Exports of soybeans during the four months September-December totaled about 107 million bushels — 3 per cent more than a year before. But the increase came early. Inspections of beans for export from December 1 to mid-January were about 2 per cent less than last year.

The amount of soybeans used by processors during the four-month period was 189 million bushels — 6 per cent more than a year earlier. Here again, the increase was recorded in the early months. Soybeans reported used in December totaled 48 million bushels — 1 per cent less than 12 months before.

By the first of the year, farmers had put 158 million bushels of soybeans under price-support loans — 36 per cent more than by that same date a year before. Farmers also have 23 million bushels of old beans (1966 crop) under price support, compared with none last year.

## U.S. Steel Lead Shrinks

The United States kept its lead in world steel production last year, the Common Market has reported.

World steel output for the year was 484 million tons, an all-time record, 21.6 million tons or 4.7 per cent above the previous all-time record of 1966.

The U.S. output was 118.3 billion tons compared to 124.7 in 1966 and 122.5 in 1965. Al-

though the U.S. share in world production shrank from 27 to 24.4 per cent last year, the United States remained the world's largest steel producer.

The Soviet Union passed for the first time the 100 million tons mark. Its production shot up by 5.5 per cent last year to 102.2 million tons, double the production of 10 years ago.

But the most spectacular yearly jump was recorded by Japan, which put out 62.2 million tons last year — 30.1 per cent, or 14.4 million tons, above

1966. Japan has increased its output fivefold in 10 years.

## HOG DISEASE HITS IN NORTHWEST KANSAS

OBERLIN — A hog disease, TGE (transmissible gastro enteritis) has claimed at least 450 head of young pigs in Decatur County. A local veterinarian, Robert Phillips, said it was the worst outbreak of a livestock disease in the 15 years he has lived in Decatur County. Decatur County is in the northwest corner of the state.

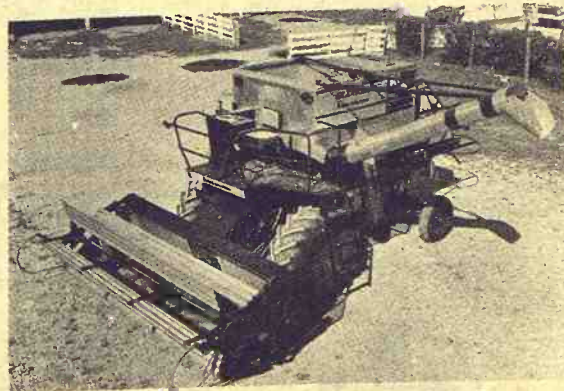

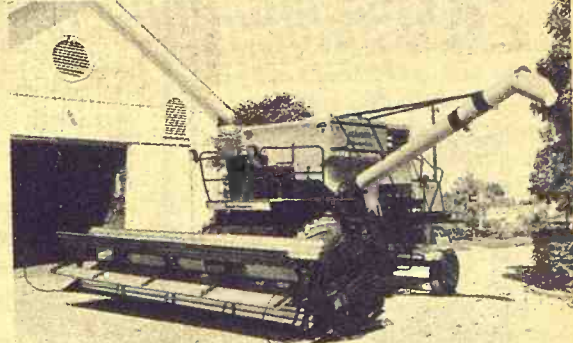

To 1 pound ground beef add the following:

- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon ground sage
- 1/4 teaspoon black pepper
- 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg
- 1/4 teaspoon sugar

Form into patties and fry as always.

### FRUIT TURNOVERS

- 2 cups flour, sifted
- 3/4 cup shortening
- 3/4 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon nutmeg (sifted into flour)
- ice cold water (just enough to mix together)

Mix as you would a pie crust only save 1/2 of shortening and crumb the rest up. Now cut up the rest of shortening into bigger pieces and mix in. This will make it flakier. Now mix in ice cold water, enough so one can roll out. Place in refrigerator and chill well. Roll out real thin. Cut in 4 or 5-inch squares. Moist edges with water and place a fruit filling such as apple, cherry, raisin, blackberry, etc. Fold into triangles and pinch sides shut. Dot with butter and prick top. Bake at 350 degrees for 20 minutes then spread with powdered sugar icing. "We like the cherry or the blackberry kind. You can make 2-inch squares also and make quite a few more. Each one of 4-inch takes about a tablespoon of filling; a 2-inch square takes about a teaspoon of filling."

Mrs. Mel Pio, Bushong: "The secret of the Sad Cake is that it will fall before it is taken from the oven. It is a good, gooey-chewy cake."

### SAD CAKE

- 4 eggs, beaten until foamy
- 1 box light brown sugar
- 2 cups Bicquick

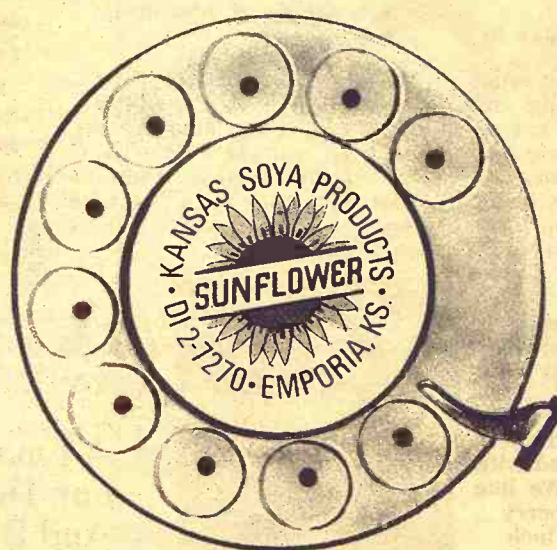

## Add Three To Management Assn

Three new fieldmen have been named by the Farm Management Association to base in Garden City, El Dorado and Concordia.

Ross Olson, former assistant county agent in Reno County, will work 18 counties out of Concordia.

Based at El Dorado will be Fredrick Delano, former Neosho County Agent, who will serve 20 counties.

Ralph Germann, former Hodgeman County agent, will work 22 counties out of Garden City.

There are 20 fieldmen working in the Farm Management Association, which has about 3500 members.

The program provides on-the-farm advice, marketing information and farm business analysis. In return, these families provide current information on capital requirements, farm production, income operating costs and trends in agriculture which are valuable to K-State's future research in farm management.

## State Backtalk On Farm Bureau Wheat Policy

LARNED — The Pawnee Co. Farm Bureau has gone on record opposing the stand of the State and National Farm Bureau regarding wheat subsidies.

Charles Tombaugh, Burdett, president of the board, said it feels a subsidy is necessary as long as the price of wheat remains at the present level.

"If wheat goes up to \$2.75 a bushel we won't ask for a subsidy," Tombaugh said.

The present price of wheat in Larned is about half that figure.

Tombaugh asked members of the Farm Bureau to express their feelings on this subject in letters to the Senators and Representative.

## Form A Feeder Association In Northeast Kansas

LAWRENCE — Representatives from 19 Northeast Kansas counties have formed the Sunflower Feeder Livestock Assn.

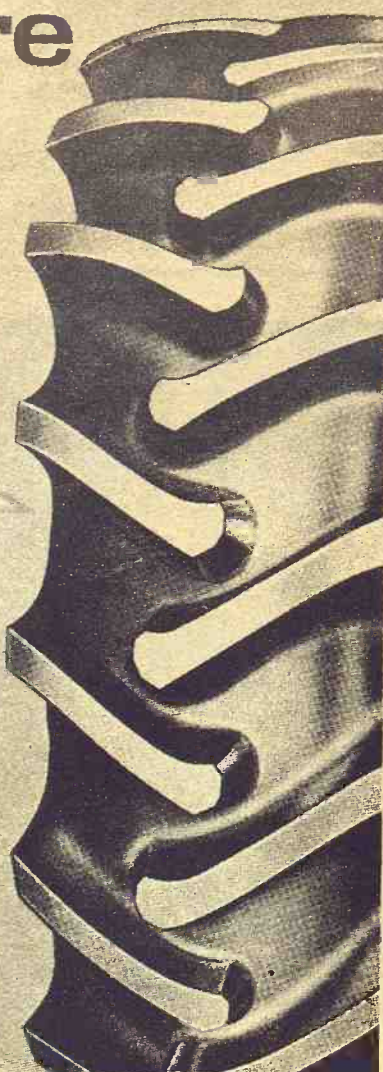

# Price Pressure From Larger Meat Supplies

A Kansas State University economist says rapidly expanding meat supplies are a major reason for the downward pressure on livestock and poultry prices the past few years.

Meat supplies in the U.S. have increased faster than the population, says John H. McCoy. And population is a prime element in demand for meat, he adds.

So, even though meat consumption — production plus imports — reached an alltime high of 223 pounds per capita in 1967, large meat supplies worked as a drag on prices.

Meat consumption was up an average of 1.8 per cent between 1960 and 1967. Average population gain during the period was 1.4 per cent.

The trend is even more evident the past 2 years. Consumption soared 3.4 per cent a year, while the population rise lagged at only 1 per cent a year.

Beef accounted for a lion's share of the increase in meat consumption during the period, the K-State economist says.

Poultry rated a strong second. Big reasons behind the increase in beef consumption last year: expanded domestic production and higher imports. U.S. production was up 3 per cent, and imports climbed 11 per cent above 1966 levels.

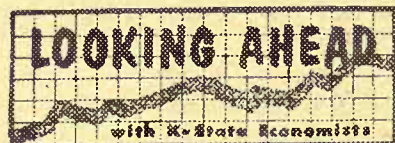
However, pork was the big gainer in consumption during 1967. McCoy thinks this reflects hog producers' response to relatively favorable prices in late

1965 and 1966.

Poultry consumption has increased a little more than 4 per cent per year between 1960 and 1967. Beef consumption was up 3 per cent a year during the period.

What about prospects for 1968? McCoy looks for meat production to continue at a high rate, again keeping pace with population growth.

Number of cattle and calves on feed January 1 was 2 per cent higher than a year earlier.



But heifers accounted for all the increase. This may point to a future reduction in breeding stock, and subsequent decline or leveling off in cattle numbers.

Number of cattle available for slaughter in 1968 will remain relatively high. However, McCoy believes that production may not exceed 1967 levels if average weights are held down.

Number of sheep and lambs on feed January 1 was down 9 per cent from a year earlier. This may partly reflect the declining numbers of recent years as well as a diversion of some ewe lambs from feeding for flock maintenance.

Latest estimates show December 1, 1967, to May 31, 1968, show farrowings down 1 per cent from the high earlier levels.

Most pigs farrowed this

spring will be furnished for slaughter during the latter half of 1968. Slaughter the first half of the year will come largely from fall 1967 pig crop which was estimated at 2 per cent larger than the previous year. So it appears that pork production will continue at a substantial level in 1968.

Broiler production is expected to increase, but turkey numbers may decline as a result of the low returns last year.

## One Year For NFO Hog Experiment

Started a year ago, NFO hog-buying points in the G&G area have reached anniversary points with increasing volume, say area National Farmers Organization leaders.

There are four hog-buying stations operated by the NFO in Kansas, at Wamego, Erie, Concordia, and Atchison. Another NFO station, at Nevada, Mo., also buys G&G area hogs. Located in the heart of major hog production, the Atchison point has been the leader for the organization.

The pictures here were taken at the Wamego center, which recently marked its first year in operation with a sale on February 2 in which 1351 head were sold for a gross of \$49,000.

NFO stations have been selling hogs to Cudahy at Wichita at a price based on a formula which the organization says is calculated to be 75 cents a hundred under the "practical top" at Kansas City and St. Joseph markets. Marketing costs are 15 cents a hundred, which is apportioned 10 cents to the operator and 5 cents to the NFO.

# Orville Beats Drums For Same Program

Secretary of Agriculture Orville Freeman beat the drums last week for renewal of the Food and Agriculture Act of 1965, strategic reserves of food and feed grains and urged a broad participation in federal farm programs.

He spoke before several hundred farmers at the annual Farm Leader's Conference of the Midcontinent Farmers Association at Kansas City.

He warned the farmers that they face what amounts to a "national referendum on farm programs" to be held "just 272 days from now."

"On that day, Nov. 5, 1968, American voters will elect a president and Congress that will either expand or kill the Food and Agriculture Act of 1965 if the act is not extended by the present Congress."

He urged farmers to participate in the feed grain program for 1968 to give Congress a guide as to renewal of the 1965 act.

The 1968 program is designed to underproduce demand by two or three per cent, offsetting a two to three per cent overproduction in 1967.

The program seeks to divert about 30 million acres from production.

Farmers, by the extend of their participation in wheat, cotton and feed grain programs, will indicate to Congress how they feel about current programs, said Freeman.

Extent of the sign up also will influence supplies and prices of feed grains in the coming year and will affect the livestock industry, Freeman said.

He also warned that farmers and farm organizations through support, opposition or neutrality, will have an impact on proposals for the strategic reserve of grain and soybeans now before Congress.

He told the farmers the fate of farm legislation is "in their own hands."

In a press conference later, Freeman said that if the Food and Agriculture Act of 1965 is allowed to die, all programs — wheat, feed grain, corn, cotton, rice and tobacco — would "go down the drain."

Noting that 1967 was an over-supply year with accompanying weakened prices, the secretary said that markets both in 1966 — a short supply year — and 1967 were a case of overaction.

"What we are witnessing now is a waiting game played on a nationwide chess board between

the trade and farmers. With a good sign-up, with passage of the strategic reserve legislation, and if farmers take advantage of all the tools at their command to hold grain until prices strengthen, I believe we can look for better feed grain prices later in the year," Freeman said.

He noted that if farmers cut back production modestly, prices should rally in 1968.

"But if they yield to the temptation of feeding cheap corn in great amounts, broiler, turkey, hog and cattle prices will suffer."

Freeman described the proposed law for a strategic reserve, saying that it is a principle extending back to the early 1930s. He called the enactment "essential at this time."

He said the reserve would be in the hands of both the government and farmer, with farmers

holding half of 200 million bushels of wheat, 15 million tons of feed grain and 30 million bushels of soybeans at the end of each marketing year.

Reserves would not be released into marketing channels at less than or prices lower than 100 per cent of parity, less the wheat certificates.

## Boom In Dairy Programs

Enrollment of Kansas dairy cows in production testing programs hit a record high of 44,000 this week, according to Ralph Bonewitz, Extension dairy specialist at Kansas State University.

During the last 3 weeks, 3,000 cows from 25 herds were enrolled in Dairy Herd Improvement Association and Owner-Sampler

programs, representing the biggest boom in interest in recent years. More than 6,000 cows were enrolled in the programs in 1967, a good increase compared to previous years, Bonewitz noted.

Increasing interest in production testing comes at a time of decreasing cow numbers. The Kansas dairy industry is losing 1,000 cows a month. In the last 25 years, the number of milk cows in the state has dropped from about 700,000 to 210,000.

Although cow numbers are going down, Kansas dairymen continue to supply more than enough milk to supply the state's needs. Export milk moves mainly to markets in states south of Kansas.

The present goal for production testing programs enrollment is 50,000 cows, Bonewitz said.

## Is Westinghouse Looking Back On Plant Site?

A Westinghouse official put in a hitch to Kansas to swing away from property taxes to other forms of state financing if it was serious about industrial development.

At the Governor's Economic Conference at Topeka last week, Andrew Evans of Pittsburgh, Pa., a director of real estate for Westinghouse, said his firm might not make the same decision today that it did several years ago when it decided to locate a fluorescent lamp plant at Salina.

Evans said Westinghouse had hopes when it located the plant at Salina that there would be changes in the law that would exempt industrial machinery from sales tax and perhaps plant inventories from property taxes.

He admitted there are counterbalancing factors in the state which were favorable to plants locators. One is a partial tax exemption on finished goods inventory to be sold in interstate commerce. There has been some talk in the legislature of removing this exemption, and Evans said he was "bewildered" by this talk.

Evans did say that he did not look for preferential tax treatment in choosing a plant site.

"We don't look with favor on free sites, free buildings, extreme tax concessions or other gimmicks that some states and communities offer to induce corporations to settle in their area."



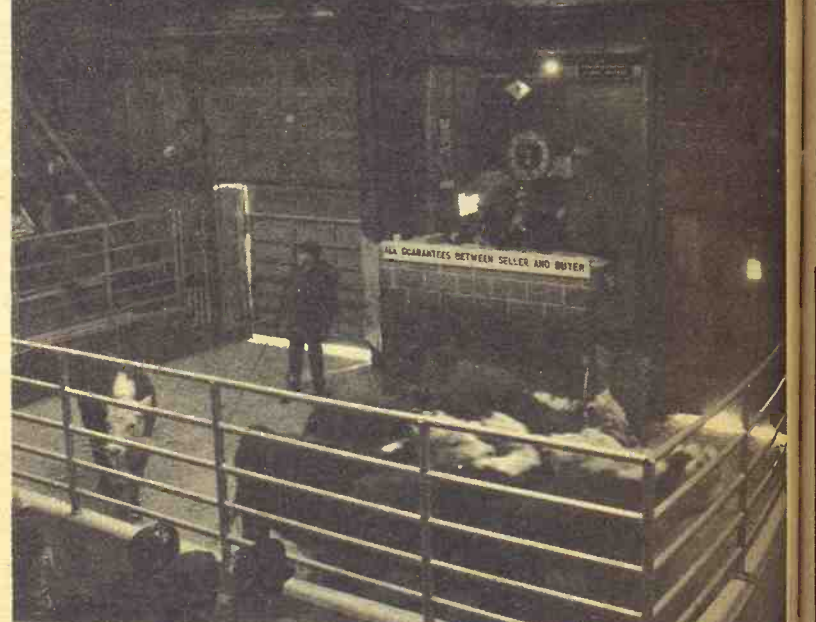

## Another Expert With All Answers — Only He Doesn't Say How

KANSAS CITY — Rep. Mark Andrews, R-N.D., said last week the farmer can get a good price only through a market in short supply.

But he suggested that crop

holdbacks are not the way to do it.

"Once the grain is produced, individual holding back doesn't work too well since generally the middleman can wait," Andrews said.

"He knows the load is on the farmer, or if it's in a government stockpile without firm release criteria, he knows politics can be applied to get it out."

Andrews made the remarks in a speech prepared for delivery at the conference of national farm leaders.

The congressman made no reference to a National Farmers Organization attempt to boost grain prices by holding grains off the market.

The way to short the market, Andrews said, is through more aggressive sales, production cutbacks, collective farmer bargaining or a workable combination of all three.

The first need, he said is for farm organizations to stop fighting among themselves and with nonfarm groups, and to "sit down and try to work out a solution."

More aggressive farm sales, Andrews said, should include expanded food shipments to underdeveloped nations.

He said production cutbacks can come through federal crop regulating programs and collective bargaining. He said he hopes Congress will create some type of collective bargaining soon.

Industry thrives on efficiency, makes profits on efficiency, and pays dividends on efficiency," Andrews said. "Agriculture, on the other hand, creates surplus conditions with efficiency, which drives prices down."

# Cattlemen Hear Control Plan

Don Ostensoe, executive vice-president of the Oregon Cattlemen's Association, cited the record made already in a similar battle in his state to show how the fight can be won.

The new move for better prices through control of supplies of beef on the market came during the annual one-day Feeders Conference of the Kansas Livestock Association in Wichita.

The cattle feeders studied their industry from several angles in an effort to learn more about how to develop the cattle business in modern times.

They discussed buying better feeder cattle, banking problems, controlling disease in feedlots and heard industry reports from both Washington and Colorado areas.

High point of the day was the kickoff in this section of the country of the American National Cattlemen's Association (ANCA) plan to control supplies of beef on the domestic market.

February 13, 1968

Ostensoe, representing the ANCA, told of experiences in a 9-month period in Oregon and explained how the ANCA "guideline" plan works.

He noted that the increase in beef production has been five times faster than the increase in population during the past 16 years.

Since 1950, beef tonnage has increased 110 per cent. Costs of supplies and equipment have increased 73 per cent. Population has increased only 23 per cent. Meanwhile, the price of beef has gone down 10 per cent, Ostensoe said.

About 600 feeders in Oregon and Washington have gone bankrupt the past year, the speaker said. Cattlemen operating on a less-than-cost basis will continue to go broke.

The cattle industry in Kansas is vulnerable too, Ostensoe said. He noted that, as of Jan. 1, 1967, Kansas had 5 per cent of all the beef in the United States, an increase of 36 per cent in six years.

Kansas also has 5 per cent of all the beef cattle on feed for slaughter, an increase of 113 per cent since 1960.

He said a 1 per cent decrease in beef tonnage ordinarily produces a 3 to 6 per cent gain in market prices. But a 1 per cent increase in tonnage causes a price decline of about 1 percent.

In Oregon, cattle feeders began last April to cut the weights of fed beef going to market. By Jan. 1, 1968, the average weights of slaughter beef in Oregon was down 40 pounds per head. The price was up about 2 1/2 cents a pound.

Ostensoe said this is "just following a businesslike procedure in our industry." About 95 per cent of the feeders in Oregon are participants in the program, financed through a 10 cents a head check off as beef is sold.

Bankers of Oregon now tell the cattle feeders to market their beef lighter so that the price will stay higher.

"It's up to you — only you can do the job," Ostensoe told his listeners Friday.

To enable cattlemen to keep abreast of the market and control supply, Grinder Crofoot, past president of KLA and market committee co-chairman of ANCA, told the group of a new market news service being made available soon.

# 'Let The Damn Government Find Their Own Black Cow'

CORYDON, Iowa — An Iowa farmer was in no mood to be milked of \$182.50 by a bossy federal government for a big black cow he had never seen. And therein lies a story of a cow the United States of America has lost.

The government contends that Jack N. Moore bought the cow. This displeased the government because it has a lien on the animal as the result of a farm loan.

So the government, acting through J. Everett Jose of the Farmers Home Administration in Columbia, Mo., sent Moore a letter.

It warned Moore that he had no right to buy a cow owned by the United States. The letter told Moore either to return the cow or pay for it.

Moore says he doesn't have the cow, never has seen it, doesn't want it and won't pay for it. Furthermore, he demands an apology from the government "for being so damned rude and acting before they found out what the hell the score was."

Moore, 34, who farms 240 acres near here in Southern Iowa, first heard of the cow on Jan. 16 when he received a letter from Jose. "It was official, you could tell by the formal stationery and the neat type-writing those government offices use," Moore said. "And you could tell that this Jose fella thought he knew what he was talking about the way he signed his letter. His signature was full of flourishes."

The government made its position clear: "We have been advised," the letter said, "that on or about April 15, 1967, you purchased from Dennis R. Starnes, Unionville, Mo., through the community sale at Center-ville Iowa, one black cow for \$182.50.

"This is to advise you that this property was under lien to the United States of America... this property was sold without the knowledge or consent of the government.

"Demand is hereby made upon you for the return of the property described above or \$182.50, which represents the fair market value of the property... on or before Feb. 1, 1968."

So Moore paid the county attorney \$2 to write a letter answering the government. He de-

nied having purchased "said black cow."

The payment deadline has come and gone and Moore has heard nothing more from the United States government.

"We probably got the wrong man," Jose said in a telephone interview from his home near Jefferson City, Mo. He thinks the sale barn gave his office the wrong information.

Moore says he knows who has the cow. It's another farmer in the area named Moore, but his first name isn't Jack. Will Jack Moore tell the government who has it?

"It'll be a cold day in hell before I'll tell those government people. After treating me like an IBM card, I figure it's up to them to find their cow on their own."

## K-State Poultry Conference Set For February 29

MANHATTAN — Kansas poultrymen might want to "leap" into a year of better profits, and Kansas State University specialists plan to help with a Poultry Industry Conference February 29.

Theme of the 1-day meeting on the KSU campus is "Meet Your Partners," according to Dr. Al Adams, Extension poultry specialist. Partners in research will get the limelight in

morning sessions following registration at 9 a.m. in the K-State Union.

Nutrition, genetics, marketing, and management will be the topics by KSU scientists. Following a luncheon program, poultrymen will hear from their commercial partners.

Subjects of "Your Banking Partner," "Your Legal Partner," and "Your Accounting Partner" will be discussed by a banker, attorney, and accountant. Luncheon program will include comments from Dr. Chester Peters, vice-president for student affairs at KSU.

The Conference is sponsored by KSU and the Kansas Poultry Association.

## Polled Hereford Registrations By Computer

A new data processing system has been installed by the American Polled Hereford Association in Kansas City to handle registration certificates on purebred animals, transfers of ownership records and accounting.

Present for the "printing off" of the first registration certificates earlier this month were company officials and a 6-week-old Polled Hereford calf whose registration card was among the first to be worked by the computer.

The computer, an IBM 360, soon will contain all the vital statistics of the calf's 2.5 million ancestors and cousins. The calf did not appear to be much interested in the "data" during the button-pushing ceremony here. All he wanted was "ma-ma."

Genetic simulation, a means by which estimates of the inheritance probabilities can be made of certain traits in the calf's makeup, is expected to be a benefit of the computer.

The American Polled Hereford association resumed issuing its own registration certificates this month after termination of a 5-year joint agreement with the American Hereford Association. Contract negotiations between the two associations

were stalemated last April.

Association officials present for the ceremony here were Walter M. Lewis, Larned, Ks., president; Orville K. Sweet, executive secretary, and James Gill, Coleman, Tex., and R. E. Connolly, Oakland, Calif., past presidents.

## Another Lake In G&G Area

About three decades ago, Kansas could find so few bodies of water that it called a drainage basin near Inman in southern McPherson County "a lake." Since then the Army Engineers and the Department of Interior have put in so many dams that even the experts have to stop to count them, and the big, man-made lakes are often only 30 miles or so away from one another.

The latest of the big federal projects to take on lake proportions is the Marion Reservoir on the Cottonwood River 1 1/2 miles northwest of Marion. Floodgates are expected to be closed on the \$13.3 million project March 1, completing the third of four projects in the Neosho River basin. Already completed are the Council Grove dam and the John Redmond dam near Burlington. The Cottonwood empties into the latter lake between Emporia and Burlington, forming the Greater Neosho, which later converges with the Verdigris, Cimarron, and Canadian rivers into the Arkansas River between Tulsa and Fort Smith.

Army Engineer officials say there's a good chance that there June, when the dedication ceremonies are scheduled.

When the water hits the 1350-foot conservation level, there will be a 6000-acre lake and a 60-mile shoreline which will extend to within a quarter-mile of Durham.

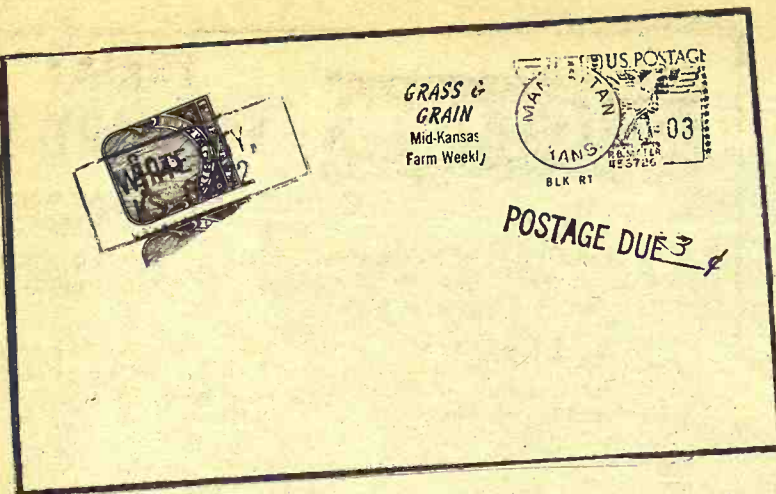

## About That Three Cents

About that three cents. If your subscription to Grass & Grain expired this month, you should have received a notice in the mail from us. We do that routinely each month, mailing notices to subscribers who have paid for their Grass & Grain only to the current month. The plates which are used to address the papers are keyed, and subscription expirations are selected automatically by machine.

The cards are then inserted with a postage-paid return envelope, and bundled according to postal regulations for bulk rate mailing.

We pay the postage. Both ways. Obviously.

But this month, we have indications that several subscribers have had to pay postage on their renewal notices. Three cents in some cases, altho there is no way this side of the Holy Postal Manual that any postmaster can figure that a plainly posted bulk rate mailing can cost six cents each.

The exact postage on this sort of mailing, as of the recent postal increase, is 3.6 cents. Meters, which are regulated by the postal department, have no means, presently, of marking postage in tenths of a cent, altho Congress, in its wisdom, set the rate in such a deci-

mal. The Department, however, has means of handling such a situation, collecting the right amount of postage at its mailing origin. The Department sends directives to local offices, pointing out that acceptance at the post-office of mailing origin indicates that the proper postage has been made.

So we get this foul up. Believe us, we anticipated this possible problem. We checked it out beforehand. Could this happen?, we asked. Not a chance, the P.O. people told us. We send out directives about such things, they said.

But the foul ups occur anyway. If any of our subscribers have had to pay for any mail from Grass & Grain, it is an error. And while this company makes a good number of errors, we'll give the Postal Department all the credit for this one.

In recent years, rates on mailing newspapers have risen about 400 percent. Fair enough; the rates were too low before. New regulations have been applied, broadly increasing the bundling and sorting that the mailer must do. Fair enough again. In the meantime, service has deteriorated to points beyond anger. One can only laugh or cry. Some of our deadlines for mailing Grass & Grain for next morning delivery

have been advanced by more than eight hours. These deadlines are pinched ever tighter, and when met there is little certainty that the newspapers won't be delayed and/or swallowed up in some mysterious way that seems to defy locating responsibility.

Frankly, most of the postal people we deal with are conscientious and reasonable. They are as embarrassed about the system as we are unhappy. But they don't know anymore about how to stop the buck from passing than we do.

I doubt that there are well designed plans or painful protests that postal officials and congressmen haven't heard before, more eloquent or profane than we can summon. I'm thinking of sending in a bucket of tears. Postage paid, of course.

Bill House, Cedar Vale, Kans., rancher, in a talk prepared for the annual meeting of the Virginia Beef Cattlemen's Association, declared:

"Not only must stockmen make greater concerted efforts

to balance supply with demand, but they will face 'election-year' efforts to further erode their positions as primary producers of the nation's basic wealth."

House, elected Jan. 24 to head the organization composed of 42 affiliated state cattlemen's associations and thousands of individual members, said:

"We know farmers and ranchers in every state inadvertently increased production too fast for their own future wellbeing and for the stability of our nation's future beef supply. A prosperous agriculture is our only insurance against short-ages in the years ahead."

House explained that most stockmen had increased production to overcome rising costs, but that they'd found that the increased supply of beef had lowered their "unit prices" to ruinous levels.

"We need only hold the line on supply, or reduce production only slightly to bring our financial house in order so we will be ready to face any demands the future may hold," House said.

He outlined steps ANCA and its affiliates are taking to achieve balanced production to stabilize prices at reasonable levels.

House warned that stockmen faced a second "gigantic chore" during 1968:

"We must tell the public that continued promises of low prices by politicians during 1968 campaigns cannot assure prices below the cost of production in 1969 and beyond. A consumer and farmer are not in conflict — they both want reasonable prices, not 'cheap' or 'high'. Our benefits are intertwined; we cannot allow a short-range promise to interfere with the long-range wellbeing of our nation!"

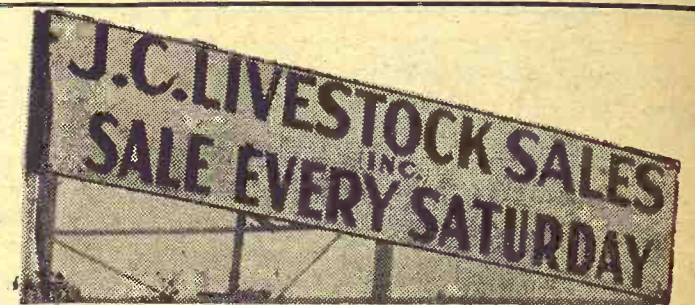

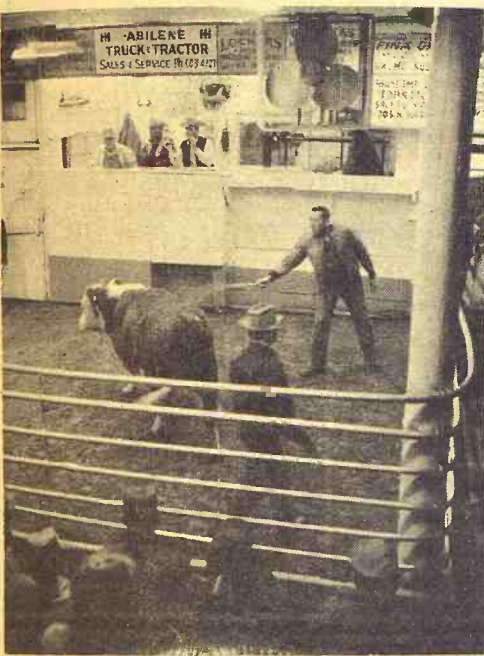

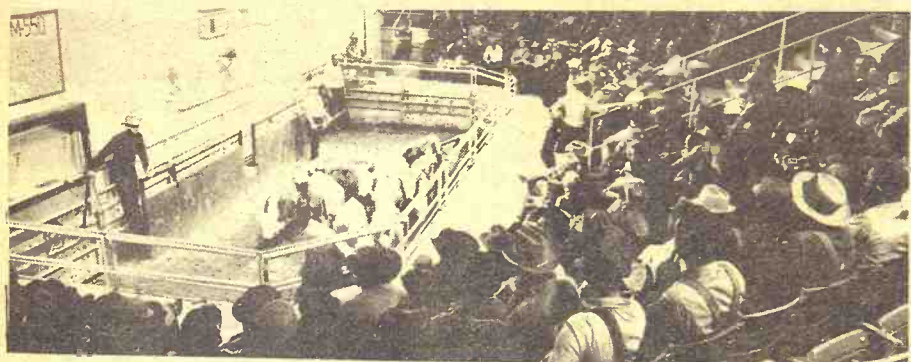
