

THE STRAY LIST.

BY AN ACT of the Legislature, approved Feb. 27, 1867, section 1, which the appraiser, value of a stray or strays exceeding tendollars, the County Clerk is required, within ten days after receiving a certified description and appraisal, to publish a notice containing a complete description of said strays, the day at which they were taken up, their appraised value, and the name and residence of the taker up to the Kansas Farmer, together with the sum of fifty cents for each animal contained in said notice.
