KTI - The hope for Tomorrow

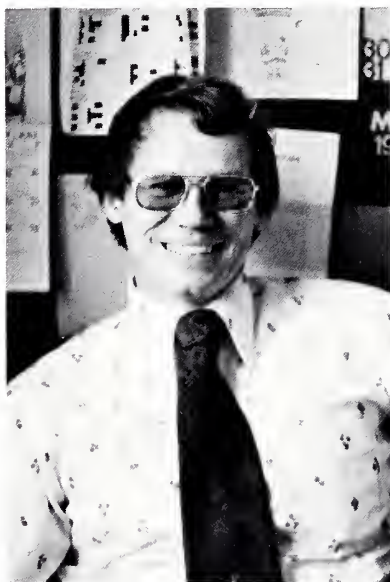

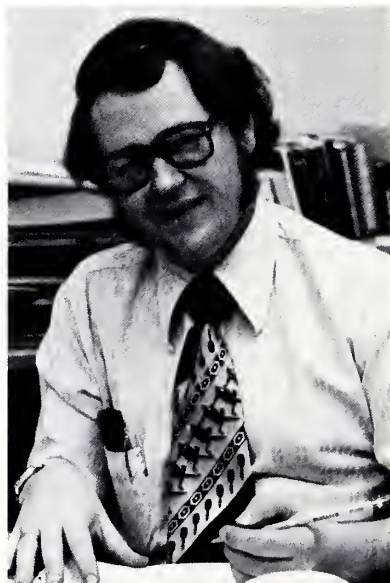

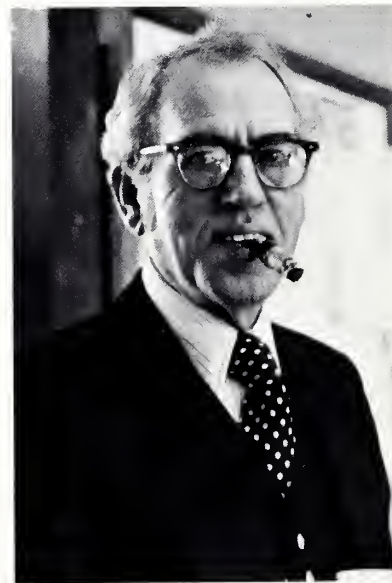

James O. Thompson, Jr. became the second President of Kansas Technical Institute on October 4, 1971. He resigned, as President, on June 30, 1976 because of his declining health. His progressive illness brought about his death on February 13, 1977.

During his tenure as President of the Institute he was successful in preserving the school through many a political struggle which threatened to close or relocate the Institution.

The last year of his administrative duties was marked by legislative action which transferred control of the Institute from the State Board of Education to the State Board of Regents. Although retired, he lived to see the fulfillment of long years of hard work by the faculty and administration in the action of E.C.P.D. accreditation of the programs at KTI.

It is only fitting to pay tribute to Mr. Thompson's contribution to KTI's development during its early years of survival.

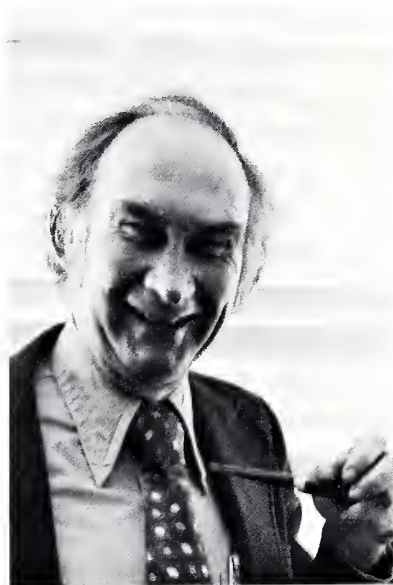

The rapid improvement of aeronautical technology is providing a stable and rewarding future for millions of persons who want to work in the field of aviation.

After successfully completing the two-year aircraft maintenance program at KTI, the student will receive a Certificate of Completion which will authorize him to take the FAA licensing examination. After passing the exam, the graduate will be a licensed A & P Maintenance Technician.

The graduate of the Aeronautical Technology program may receive the Associate of Technology degree and would be qualified to assist production supervisors in the production, quality and manufacture of aircraft and aircraft components.

The Aviation Maintenance Management option at KTI is designed to provide management education to persons who have already attained an intense Aeronautical Technology background.
