## K-State Scientists Claim Urea Breakthru As Low-Cost Feed

Urea—long a highly potential but controversial livestock feed chemical—may have the breakthru its proponents have long predicted.

Scientists at Kansas State University last week announced that they had produced a urea and grain mixture which can be used as a cattle feed at savings of \$5 to \$14 a ton compared to other protein supplements such as soybean or cottensed meal.

K-State thought its research achievement was important enough that it called a press conference last Wednesday to announce it.

Dr. Erle Bartley, a dairy scientist who two years ago won international recognition for discovery of a drug preventing legume bloat in cattle, headed the team that developed the new feed.

Sharing in the development

were Dr. Charles Deyoe and Dr. Harry Pfost, both in the grain science and industry department.

The new feed is a starch-controlled urea and grain product which they have named Starea. The name was chosen because it combines starch and urea.

Experimentation has been continuing for more than five years. It was supported by W. R. Grace and Co. of New York.

The KSU Research Foundation which handles all inventions made on campus has a patent pending for the product.

Dr. H. B. Geurin, director of feed research for W. R. Grace Agricultural Products Division, St. Louis, said the product would be marketed immediately and would be sub-licensed to other manufacturers.

About 8 million tons of such products will be consumed by cattle by 1970, USDA economists have predicted.

Urea is made at plants where synthetic nitrogen is produced and is in fact a nitrogenous product, used for several years with unprocessed grains as a cattle feed. However, despite the fact it is cheaper than the oil meals, it has had several limitations.

Dr. Bartley explained that urea-grain mixtures had been broken down in the rumen of cattle to ammonia at a rapid rate, too fast to be fully utilized. Thus much of it was wasted.

This caused a protein deficiency, decreased milk production and toxicity. In addition, he said, cattle didn't like the feed containing urea.

Bartley and the other two scientists said they had solved these problems with their new product.

Their secret, they said, lies in mixing finely ground grain such

as corn or milo or other economical starch sources with urea.

This material then is processed by passing it thru high pressure, cooker-extruder equipment which causes the starch in the grain to become jelly-like. Then it is dried and granularized. The final product can be mixed with complete rations.

When the product is fed, Bartley said, ammonia is released more slowly (than with urea alone) and large quantities are converted to microbial protein which is the major source of protein for the cow.

It is not a feed for chickens or hogs.

In summarizing the findings from feeding the new mixture to dairy cattle and one lot of beef cattle, the three researchers said:

- That feeding Starea to cattle lowered the free ammonia in the rumen more than did feeding urea and unprocessed grain, allowing better nitrogen conservation and providing an increase in microbial protein synthesis.


- Starea was more palatable than mixtures of untreated grain and urea.

- Starea was less toxic than equivalent quantities of grain and urea.

- Starea equalled soybean oil meal as a protein supplement for lactating cows.

- For cows fed high grain-low roughage rations, Starea supplements did not depress grain intake or milk production as did similar quantities of urea and unprocessed grain.

- Preliminary studies showed Starea superior to urea as a protein supplement to cattle on fattening rations and approximately equal to soybean meal as a wintering ration for beef cattle.

## Cutback In Feedlots

On April 1, 1968 the number of Kansas cattle and calves on grain feed for the slaughter market was 507,000 head, 3 percent less than the record high number on feed a year ago, according to the Kansas Crop and Livestock Reporting Service.

This was a seasonal decrease from the 610,000 head on feed January 1, 1968 but was about one-third greater than the average for April 1 for the 1962-66 period.

The cattle and calves on feed in Kansas included 293,000 on feed in commercial sized lots with 1000 head or more capacity. The 923,000 was a record high number for this date for commercial lots.

Farm-type feeding operations accounted for 214,000 of the cattle and calves on feed, about 14 percent less than a year ago.

Grain-fed cattle and calves marketed for slaughter during the January-March quarter totaled 386,000, up 4 percent from a year earlier.

Cattle and calves placed on feed during the January-March quarter totaled 283,000 head, about 7 percent less than placements during this quarter last year.

Of the cattle on feed April 1, 1968, 344,000 were steers and steer calves and 163,000 heifers and heifer calves compared with 366,000 and 155,000, respectively, a year earlier.

Classification of cattle on feed by weight groups included 15,000 of less than 500 pounds in weight, 122,000 in the 500-699 pound group, 203,000 in the 700-899 pound group, 145,000 in the 900-1099 pound group and 22,000 weighing 1100 pounds or more.

By length of time on feed, 55 percent or 279,000 head had been

on feed less than 3 months compared with 296,000 head or 57 percent a year ago. Some 221,000 head had been on feed 3 to 6 months and only 7000 head on feed for more than 6 months.

Kansas feeders' intentions to market indicated that about 320,000 grain-fed cattle would be marketed in the April-June quarter, about 10 percent less than the 356,000 marketed in the same quarter of 1967.

### Major Feeding States

Cattle and calves on feed for slaughter market in the 32 major feeding states on April 1, 1968 are estimated at 10,671,000 head, an increase of 2 percent from a year earlier.

The increase in numbers on feed from a year ago was in the cattle and calves weighing less than 900 pounds. An increase of 10 percent over last year in heifers and heifer calves on feed accounted for the large number of cattle on feed.

The number on feed decreased 5 percent from January 1 to April 1 compared with a 6 percent decrease during the same quarter last year.

### Weight, Kind And Time On Feed

A breakdown of the cattle and calves on feed in 32 states on April 1, 1968 by weight groups shows the greatest percentage increase over a year earlier in the number weighing under 500 pounds.

The number in each weight group is as follows: under 500 pounds, 801,000 head; 500-699 pounds, 3,708,000 head; 700-899 pounds, 3,364,000 head; 900-1099 pounds, 2,345,000 head; 1100 pounds and over, 453,000 head. Steers and steer calves on feed in the 32 states totaled 7,375,000 head on April 1, a 1 percent de-

crease from a year earlier.

There were 3,264,000 heifers and heifer calves on feed April 1, 1968, a 10 percent increase from a year earlier while cows and others on feed totaled 32,000 head, a decrease of 24 percent.

Cattle and calves on feed less than 3 months on April 1 totaled 4,783,000 head, up 5 percent from a year earlier. Those on feed 3-6 months accounted for 5,201,000 head, down 2 percent, and the over 6 months group, at 687,000 head, was up 5 percent.

### Marketings and Placements

There were 5,059,000 cattle and calves placed on feed in January through March in the 32 states, an increase of 7 percent from 1967.


Placements were up 12 percent in the North Central states, but were down 2 percent in the Western States.

Marketings of fed cattle for slaughter during the first quarter totaled 5,661,000 head in the 32 states, 5 percent higher than in the same period in 1967. North Central region marketings were up 7 percent from last year, while marketings in the Western region were up 4 percent.


## Horse Sale Tops At \$700

They Want Contract Which Deducts Chilling 'Shrink' First

## Packers Wince Over Grade - Yield Contract

Fifteen meatpackers have challenged in court a new regulation of the Department of Agriculture which would limit the purchase of slaughter livestock to a grade-and-yield basis which would outlaw shrinkage

based on loss of weight when carcasses are chilled.

The regulation in question was scheduled to be effective April 16, and it specifies the buying of livestock on the basis of "hot" carcass weights, less

adjustments for weights of hooks, rollers, gambrels and other slaughter equipment.

The meatpackers, which included most of the majors and a couple of local packers in the G&G area, say they want the right to buy on the basis of any contract entered into willingly by buyer and seller.

The suit maintains that contracts other than one designed by USDA are not unfair trade practices as defined by the Packers and Stockyards Act.

Spokesmen for the American Meat Institute — to which all the complainants in the suit belong — emphasized that the companies were not protesting livestock producers knowing that carcass weights deducted chilling "shrinkage" or their right to sell in any manner that might seem most advantageous to them.

But the Meat Institute point of view, they said, was that USDA should not have the authority to set the sole terms of carcass buying and selling.

Complainants included Swift, Wilson, Hormel and Morrell among the major packers, and two G&G area firms, Excel Packing of Wichita and Winchester Packing of Hutchinson.

Others in the suit are Field

Packing, Owensboro, Ky.; Earl Gibbs Inc., Cleveland Ohio; Hygrade Food Products, Detroit; Krey Packing, St. Louis; Lundy Packing, Clinton, N.C.; Marks Meat, Woodland, Calif.; Nebraska Beef, Omaha; San Jose Meat, San Jose, Calif.; and Tennessee Packers, Uniontown, Tenn.



## Record Low For March Hatch

During March commercial hatcheries in Kansas hatched 990,000 chicks, according to the Kansas Crop and livestock reporting Service.

March hatchings were seasonally above February but only 82 percent of the March 1967 hatch and the smallest hatch for March in 30 years of record.

Egg-type chicks hatched during the month totaled 850,000 compared with 550,000 a month earlier and 1,031,000 a year earlier.

Broiler-type chicks hatched during March totaled 140,000 compared with 17,000 hatched in February and 173,000 hatched in March 1967.

On March 1, Kansas hatcheries were receiving an average price of \$31.40 per 100 for egg-type, purebred and crossbred pullets, \$47.00 per 100 for egg-type, hybrid pullets and \$16.50 per 100 for broiler type, straight run chicks.

## Lowest Wheat Price Since 1942

Wheat prices hit their lowest point since 1942 at the Chicago market last week, with May 1968 contracts selling at \$1.37½ a bushel. Since the start of April prices at the Chicago Board of Trade have fallen 10½ cents.

For other wheat contracts at Chicago, as well as those for all deliveries at Kansas City and Minneapolis, quotations dropped to seasonal lows.

Weakness in wheat mainly was responsible for selling of corn, rye, and soybeans also at lower prices.

Prospects of large crops for wheat, soybeans and corn have cut grain prices even beyond normal seasonal declines.



**Western Kansas Crop Chances Are 50-50**

It may be of little comfort to western Kansas farmers this year, but a Kansas State University economist at Manhattan says the odds are in their favor regarding the chances for enough annual rainfall to produce an average wheat crop.

Assuming wheat requires 17 inches of moisture a year, Donald B. Erickson says there is better than a 50-50 chance this much rain will occur in the western fourth of the state. The odds are even higher in central and eastern Kansas.

Erickson bases his findings on statistical probability of expected annual rainfall calculated from recorded precipitation at various stations throughout the state.

Specifically, there is 50 percent chance for 20 inches of annual rainfall in western Kansas, 28 inches in central Kansas and 40 inches in extreme south-east Kansas.

So the odds for producing an average grain sorghum crop, which requires 22 to 23 inches of rain a year, are slightly less than 50-50 in the western part of the state, Erickson says.

The economist says there is a 90 percent chance that at least 12 inches of rain will occur in western Kansas, but only a 10 percent chance for 28 inches or more.

He concludes that western Kansas farmers could grow barley and oats, which require only 14.4 inches of moisture a year, in nine out of ten years. But soybeans, which require 28 inches, could be grown only one year out of ten.

In central Kansas, a maximum of 20 inches of rain will occur 90 percent of the time, and a minimum of 36 inches only 10 percent of the time.

In extreme southeast Kansas, there is 90 percent chance for 28 inches of rain or more and a 10 percent chance for at least 52 inches.

**Polled Hereford Papers OK'd For World Transfer**

The question had been raised about APHA registration following the termination of a dual-registry agreement with the American Hereford Association at the end of 1967.

#### BROWNIES

Mix well:

- 1 stick soft oleo (½ cup)
- 1 cup sugar
- 4 eggs
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1 can (1 pound) chocolate syrup

Mix in:

- 1 cup plus 1 tablespoon flour
- ½ teaspoon baking powder
- ½ cup nuts (optional)

Bake in a 10x15-inch pan at 350 degrees for 20-30 minutes.

#### FROSTING

- 6 tablespoons oleo
- 6 tablespoons milk
- 1½ cups sugar

Bring to boiling and boil for 30 seconds. Remove from heat and add ½ cup chocolate chips. Spread on while hot.

### Veal Flavor Responds Well To Herbs, Sauce

Veal rump is the meat for an imaginative cook. The delicate flavor of the meat responds well to a pinch of herbs, a savory sauce and slow cooking.

A chunky cut from the rump of veal may be oven roasted or cooked by moist heat as a pot roast. Because veal is young beef, it has very little fat and less moisture than most meats. Place strips of bacon or salt pork over the top of an oven roast to prevent the meat from drying during cooking.

If the roast is braised or pot roasted, fat can be added in the

browning process and flavorful seasonings added along with the braising liquid.

### Almonds Stay Fresh

Almonds will retain their delicate flavor and freshness if they are stored in a tightly covered container and kept in the refrigerator. For cooking convenience chop some ahead of time to use in baking cookies and cakes. It eliminates a time-consuming chore.

### Miter Definition

A miter is a diagonal seam made in the hem or the facing in finishing a corner.

## Guard Against Mildew

### During Warm, Damp Weather

Warm, damp weather is the season for one of a housewife's worst enemies, mildew. A musty odor is fair warning that it is about to attack. Spores are always present in the air, but they need the right conditions to grow. They flourish in poorly lighted, poorly ventilated places.

Mildew develops most often on cotton, linen, rayon, silk, wool, leather, wood and paper. If unchecked, it can rot fabrics and decay wood. The best way to deal with it is to prevent it.

Air conditioning is naturally a good preventive. It reduces the humidity. But you can take other steps to keep rooms dried and aired.

When the air outside the house is drier than inside, use a window fan to circulate it. In an especially damp room a mechanical dehumidifier might be used or the heat could be turned on to dry it out.

Closet doors and dresser drawers may be left open. Burning a small electric light bulb or hanging a container of chemical drying agent (silica gel, activated alumina or calcium chloride) in a closed closet or bookcase can prevent mildew. If you want to go to the trouble, you can see chemical treatment to prevent mildew. Sponge on to leather articles a one percent solution of dichlorophene in denatured or rubbing alcohol. Use a wood preservative on lumber and millwork. For book covers, apply a shellac or thin varnish to which two or three percent of salicylanilide or dichlorophene has been added.

### To Store Cast Iron Utensil

To store a cast iron utensil, coat with unsalted fat, wrap in paper and put in a dry place. But if the storage is to be for a long time, coat the utensil with melted paraffin.

### Thread Buttons For Future Use

When removing buttons from a dress, string them together on a thread and tie the thread ends together. You'll find this helpful when you want to use the buttons on another dress.





## Engineers Agree Close School At Dwight

DWIGHT — Dwight High School in the northwestern corner of Morris county and just southeast of Junction City has been closed.

The state Fire Marshal declared the building structurally unsafe, and when engineers hired by the school board agreed with that conclusion, the board closed the building last week.

School classes have been moved to the grade school in Council Grove.

Dwight won state basketball championships in 1966 and 1967, and there has been resistance to

proposals that the school be closed and students bused to Council Grove high school. Last month patrons of the school voted down such a proposal. Unification laws require a favorable vote before a school can be closed.

The future of the school will be discussed in a May 6 meeting.

The building at Dwight was built in 1920. Otis Henderson, superintendent of US417, said there was a wide crack at the top of the structure, about four inches wide. The southeast corner is settling, he said, and plaster was coming loose on ceilings.


The school has 69 students. Having just rejected a proposal that the school be discontinued and students bused to Coun-

cil Grove, patrons may have to change their minds and accept that solution. Otherwise they will have to issue bonds to build a new school, renovate the old structure if that's feasible, continue using the grade school facility in Council Grove, or secure mobile classrooms.

## Farm Storage Capacity Down

The agriculture department reported grain storage capacity on the nation's farms declined 50 million bushels during 1967. At the beginning of the year, it totaled 5,446,000,000 bushels.

Texas led with 881 million bushels followed by Kansas with 760 million, Nebraska with 466 million and Illinois with 442 million.

## Set Summer Repair Work On Turnpike

The Kansas Turnpike will open over 200 miles of asphaltic overlay work done this summer. The improvements include 40 miles of 2-lane overlay which Turnpike officials describe as "heavy," and 164 miles where the existing surface is in fair condition.

Major attention will be in the Lawrence—Kansas City section where work is scheduled for mid-May or earlier. The rest of the work is set to be done between July and September.

Other heavy work is scheduled for 14 miles between Cassoday and Eldorado.

Sealing coat programs include all four lanes for six miles near Admire, 18 miles near Emporia and 17 miles between Eldorado and Wichita.







## Higher Prices For Eggs

Higher prices are in the offing for the egg producer — at least temporarily, reports a Kansas State University Extension economist.

M. E. Jackson bases this forecast on predicted hatch of egg type chicks. Hatch will be down 12 percent from year earlier levels during January-June 1968, he says. This means fewer laying hens, fewer eggs, and con-

sequently somewhat higher prices in July or August.

Looking to the last half of the year, however, Jackson sees hatch running 8 percent higher than the same period a year earlier. This could mean another period of lower egg prices later on.

Big reason for the lower hatch this year, he says, is a drop in chick orders from small flock owners. So it appears that the small operator is continuing to drop out of the egg business.

Larger producers may have delayed replacing their flocks

a few months. But Jackson believes that higher egg prices will draw the big operators back into business.

As people want to get into the egg production business, someone will be willing to sell them pullets or contract with them for egg production. A 5-cent raise in the market could set the stage for another period of extremely low egg prices, the economist says.

He feels the egg industry can stand an expansion of 5 to 7 million laying hens a year. This would keep the increase in egg products in step with population gains. But greater increases in hen numbers would have a depressing effect on egg prices.

## Seed Applications Due May 15

Kansas farmers who plan to grow certified wheat, oats, barley, rye, sweetclover, and smooth brome must submit applications for field inspections at the Kansas Crop Improvement Association office by May 15.

Howard D. Wilkins, secretary of the KCIA, reminds the growers that application forms are available in all county Extension offices, or can be secured directly from the Association Office, 148 Waters Hall, Kansas State University, Manhattan, Kansas 66502.

The three-page application form should be submitted to the KCIA office along with the tag and seal from the seed planted or bulk sale card for proof of the seed source, Wilkins points out. Field inspections will start in late May or early June, usually a week to 10 days before harvest.

Crops that qualify for certification must be isolated from other crops to insure purity of seed, must be free of noxious and objectionable weeds, and must not be mixed with other varieties or other crops.

Since certified seed insures high germination, purity of variety, and clean seed, growers can usually sell their certified seed for enough premium to more than cover the cost and management effort required to produce it, Wilkins notes.

The KCIA does not handle the sale of this seed, he adds, but merely provides a blue tag which attests that this is certified seed, and an analysis tag which gives the laboratory report on the seeds germination, purity, and weed content percentages.

Is there a demand for certified seed? Emphatically yes, replies Wilkins. For example, if all the certified wheat seed grown in Kansas last year — approximately 15,000 acres — were planted this year, less than 4 percent of the available acreage would have been planted with certified seed.



**Use Farm Animals For Drug Study**

Columbia, Mo. — Animals on a certain farm north of Columbia don't act like ordinary barnyard critters.

Ponies come to the barn gate every day at the same time, but they're not hungry. Dogs start whining at regular intervals, but they want neither food nor water.

They're hooked on drugs.

The farm is a research laboratory for the University of Missouri and is being used to test reactions of domestic animals to certain drugs. Last year is was

aspirin, and this year it's pentobarbital, a barbiturate.

Operating with a \$40,000 annual federal grant, Drs. Lloyd E. Davis and B. A. Westfall hope to find a series of animals whose metabolic reaction to drugs is similar to that of man. The objective is to learn more about drugs and their effects before the medicines are placed on the market.

Dr. Davis explained ordinary laboratory animals do not always react to drugs like humans. He cited Thalidomide which when taken by pregnant women resulted in deformed babies because the drug affected humans differently than it did the animals on which it had been tested.

The research farm, believed to be the only one of its kind in the world, uses about 200 animals including ponies, swine, goats, dogs, cats, rats and mice.

Later the scientists plan to study tranquilizers Demerol, an analgesic; chloramphenicol, an antibiotic, and phenylbutazone, an anti-rheumatic drug.

**Slacken Test Requirement On Wheat Loans**

A modification in the price-support program for 1968-crop wheat has been announced by the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

This year a farmer may get a loan on wheat delivered to country warehouses without first obtaining official grade and protein determinations.

Current price-support regulations provide that when wheat is stored in or delivered to approved warehouses, official grade and protein (hard wheat) determinations are required.

The revised price-support regulations will eliminate the requirements pertaining to such determinations of grade and protein for 1968-crop wheat delivered to country warehouses

for loans, for loan settlements, and for purchases. However, any producer who wishes may request and get the official grade and protein determinations.

The change is intended to reduce marketing costs as well as simplify and speed up the loan-making and settlements.

The Uniform Grain Storage Agreement (UGSA) is being re-

vised, to become effective July 1, 1968, so that its provisions will conform to the changes being made in the price-support regulations.




## Better Livestock Day

## 'Tornado' Movie Available

The movie demonstrates the need for and effectiveness of a good warning system. It instructs people what to do and where to take shelter from a tornado. It also helps explain what causes tornados and the function of the Weather Bureau in keeping people informed of threatening weather.

It's a shocker showing people taking last minute precautions and scrambling for cover as a destructive storm rolls in. "You feel as though you are experiencing a tornado when you see the movie," Jepsen continued.

This is the beginning of tornado season in Kansas, the specialist reminded. May and June are months of greatest tornado activity.






# The Grassland Greens Up




A half dozen or more major field days are held in the G&G area, most of them after pastures are green.




**CALCULATED BEEF CALF CROP 1967**

**Boy Farm Workers Can Certify Thru Program**

According to the New Labor Law, 14-15 year old boys can't be employed for farm work by anyone other than their parents.

"This means that farmers won't be able to fill their labor needs by hiring the neighbors boys or even their grandchildren as the case might be," said Charlie White, Riley County Extension Agricultural Agent.

Under provisions by the labor law, boys can be certified for this program. The means of certification are: the 4-H Tractor Program, and the Work Experience Study offered through Vocational Agriculture in the high school.

The County Extension staff is working in cooperation with County TAP, and the Vocational Agriculture instructors to certify these eligible boys.

The first meeting will be Wednesday, April 24, 7:30 p.m., at Pottorf Hall. It is important that boys wanting to work on farms be there, White said.

"We encourage all boys who want to work and farmers that are hiring these boys, to see that they are present," White said.

The second meeting will be planned following the first meeting. All meetings must be attended, the County Agent said, if one wants to be certified.

# Less For Wheat, More Signup For Feed Plan

Some of the nation's wheat growers apparently are passing up government payments that would total more than 100 million dollars by not signing up for the government's 1968 wheat-control program.

Total payments under all major crop control programs this year may approach 3 billion dollars.

Farmers signed to put 50 million acres of their total wheat planting allotments of

slightly more than 59 million under the program. This meant signers would plant no more than their individual farm allotments.

But farms with slightly more than 9 million acres did not sign up. As a consequence, they will not be eligible for program payments which for the 1967 crop averaged 48 cents a bushel. The ineligible 9 million acres would be expected to produce more than 200 million

bushels of wheat.

Much of the unsigned acreage was in minor wheat-producing states east of the Mississippi river, but there were sizable parts in the Great Plains commercial states.

In terms of farms, only 842,134 of the 1,691,516 wheat farms are enrolled in the control program.

A big increase of signup of feed grain farms in a similar program over last year was reported by the Agriculture department. A total of 1,500,359 of the estimated 3,171,000 corn and sorghum grain farms were enrolled. They agreed to idle 34,300,000 of the 115 million normally available for these two grains.

Last year, only 1,308,000 feed grain farms signed up to idle about 21 million acres. But in-

creases this year took place in the Eastern corn belt, especially Illinois, Indiana and Ohio. In the case of cotton, 463,800 of the 563,000 cotton farms enrolled in the cotton control program. They agreed to idle 3,284,000 acres of allotments totaling 16,200,000 acres.

## Farm Debts Compare Low

Despite increases in recent years, the farm debt is smaller relative to assets than in manufacturing industries, reports the USDA.

Last year the farm debt was 16.9 per cent of agricultural assets compared with 10.9 per cent for 10 years ago.

But the farm industry is still in relatively good shape because the debts of all manufacturing industries were estimated at 41.2 per cent of total assets. This compared with 36.1 in 1957.

The debt percentage of assets in other parts of the nation's industrial complex in 1967 and 1957, respectively, were reported as follows: transportation

equipment 46.9 per cent in 1967 and 46.7 in 1957; motor vehicles and equipment, 48.5 & 38.9; primary iron and steel, 38.6 & 32.9;

lumber and wood, except furniture, 46.3 and 35.5; food and kindred products, 44.2 and 37.7; textile products, 24.6 and 31.8;

paper and allied products, 40.4 and 32; chemical and allied products, 40 and 31.8, and petroleum refining, 31.2 and 28.





For some months Agriculture Secretary Freeman has linked the continuance of the present farm program with the reelection of President Johnson.

"You can't have the present program with its heavy government expenditures without reelecting Johnson to guide it thru an urban-dominated Congress," he said in effect.

Now that President Johnson has declared himself out of the race, what then of the 1965 agricultural act which is due to expire after the 1969 crop harvest? Is it renewed, replaced, or simply allowed to die without replacement?

Farm experts seem to agree that it is not likely that there will be no farm act at all after the expiration of the 1965 act, but they admit that it is strictly wild guessing as to what will happen.

But many farm writers now conclude that American Farm Bureau will at least get a hearing again, after several years of being out-of-step with the administration and with almost no sentiment from USDA in its favor.

The Farm Bureau, of course, has for years contended that market prices are a more effective guide to farm production

than acreage controls. They argue that the less actual government control, the better.

The other side — the USDA career men, the National Farmers Union, Grange and many co-ops — say farmers cannot be effective as individuals and that there must be government control over acreages.

They say the Farm Bureau has no program at all.

Whatever they say, there are bills which have been introduced in Congress which embody most of the Farm Bureau principles.

Essentially, Farm Bureau policy calls for less government control over agriculture. But it does include production control to the extent that the government would pay farmers to take land out of crops, preferably whole farms, for long government terms.

The Farm Bureau would also continue to have commodity loans, but they would make them "recourse" loans from banks, with the government guaranteeing them.

Presently, of course, the loan comes from the government directly. It is for a guaranteed price. If the market goes up, the farmer can pay off his loan, sell at the higher price and realize an extra gain. But very often the farmer takes out the loan without any intention of paying off the loan.

Under present circumstances, when this happens, the government takes title to the grain and stores it. This may accumulate into a surplus, altho the government may dispose of it by moving it into the private market or selling or giving it away overseas. It is this possibility, and the weight it holds over the market, that give Farm Bureau leadership and others nervous moments and counter talking points.

The Farm Bureau's recourse loan, its leaders say, would provide for orderly marketing and everything produced would be for the market, not for a government bin.

One other area at which AFB is at odds with USDA brains, Farmers Union, Grange, and most wheat organizations, is approval of the International Grains Arrangement.

This is still in the proposal stage, but it would set a mini-

mum price on wheat in world trade 23 cents a bushel higher than the old wheat agreement, now expired.

In this case, the Farm Bureau is joined by much of the grain trade, and they say that higher prices will lead other nations to grow more wheat but that only the U.S. will cut back on acreage.

As a result, there will be smaller export markets, less place for U.S. wheat to go, and more pressure on domestic price.


Despite the fact that Farm Bureau has more membership than all other major groups put together, it will find it difficult to win over the folks who

will be most influential in future farm policy.

One thing Farm Bureau will be quick to point out: under existing programs the farmer appears to have more to complain about than ever. Perhaps in relation to the rest of the economy he is no better off than he was in the depression 30s. At least there will be many who will say that.

"If the program is so good, why are things so bad?" The Farm Bureau will ask. The organization may not have the right answers, but they'll certainly have tough questions like that one when a 1969 farm act is under discussion.



### FFA Honors To 13 Supporters





After two-thirds of the fiscal year, Kansas had a few more bucks in its jeans than it expected.

Tax revenues for the first

eight months were up by 3.6% — some \$5.7 million more than the budget anticipated. The budget estimated income for the first eight months at \$160.2 million. Instead \$166 million has come in.

Income tax collections were running \$2.1 million over anticipated figures and refunds on

income tax withholding were \$700,000 less than expected.

The figures do not count heavy income tax payments in March and April, and of course these payments will bear heavily on the state's improved cash position as it goes into a new fiscal year in July.

### Study Mandatory Car Inspection

Kansans may have to undergo periodic inspection of their motor vehicles for safety purposes as a result of a legislative council study authorized by the council's roads and highways committee.

The committee, headed by Sen. William Ward (R-Marion), voted for a study to determine whether Kansas needs a vehicle inspection law to comply with the federal highway safety act.

The committee was told by the legislative research depart-

ment that Kansas is one of only eight states which do not yet require vehicle inspections.

Jerry Muth, Kansas highway safety co-ordinator under the federal program, and Claude McCamment, director of highway safety, said two previous studies by the legislative council failed to produce a Kansas law.

McCamment said Kansas law prohibits the operation of a vehicle in unsafe condition and includes reference to official stations for inspection and random inspection of motor vehicles but that comparatively little is done about it.



### Instant Lake

The largest dam ever built by the Army Corps of Engineers, the John Day Dam across the Columbia river near The Dalles, Oregon, formed an almost instant lake after the gates were shut off. Water level rose more than a foot when the flow of the mighty Columbia was stopped, forming a lake 76 miles long in five days. The dam stretches over a mile between Oregon and Columbia and is the 10th dam across the Columbia below Grand Coulee. The new lake level is 80 feet above the old river, and electric output will be on one of the world's greatest, nearly 3 million kilowatts, even more than Grand Coulee. Cost \$450 million, about a third of it to move people out of the new Lake Umatilla.

## 'Hold Cow Herds Til 1972'

DENVER — A four-year moratorium on increases in the nation's beef cow herd is being urged by the market development committee of the American National Cattlemen's Assn. In a special report issued here this week, the group said producers should "hold the line" until 1972 "so that demand can catch up with supply." It also advised marketing cull cows for slaughter only.

Feeders were advised that average slaughter weights, while significantly under a year earlier, needed further reduction, "perhaps as much as 75 pounds." Holding or over-finishing cattle because of relatively cheap feed grains was proved to

be economically unsound, the report observed.

The committee, chaired by J. W. Entz, Glendale, Ariz., & Girdner Crofoot, Strong City, Kans., warned against continued expansion beyond a maximum one-half of one percent per year by emphasizing that the productive capacity to increase cattle numbers is available now, but that such an increase would result in economic self-destruction for a major part of the industry.

Recognizing a general shift in the industry to straight cow-calf operations in recent years, the committee strongly recommended that many operators consider cow-yearling or

straight yearling operations.

Considering relatively fixed amounts of grass and forage available, the committee suggested that such shifts could improve management flexibility and alternatives while cutting operating costs for many operations. Meanwhile, it could help cut the number of cows, or at least hold the line in total numbers.

The cow-yearling and stocker-feeder operators were warned, however, that carrying animals to two and three years of age is "generally inefficient and unprofitable and/or a liability for today's market."

Suggested was running "more younger instead of fewer aged-type animals," more frequent topping-out to spread marketings and minimize in-weights to feedlots, thus helping reduce overall tonnage and improve prices.





## Stall Funds For Kansas Watersheds

The curb on spending ordered by the administration last October has stalled two watershed projects in Kansas, and 12 other projects are awaiting funds.

Testimony given a House Appropriations subcommittee in closed session early this year indicated that if funds are made available, the 12 projects could be ready for approval June 30.

D. A. Williams, administrator of the Soil Conservation Service, said the Agriculture Dept. was forced to stop signing construction contracts for watershed projects because of the spending freeze ordered by the administration.

Among the projects affected were the \$64,000 Little Walnut-Hickory project and the \$193,000 Timber Creek project in Kansas.

Williams gave the committee records indicating these projects could be ready for approval June 30 if funds were made available by Congress:

Little Delaware-Mission, \$81,000; Upper Verdigris, \$415,000; Fall River, \$200,000; Middle Caney, \$335,000; Twin Caney, \$331,000; Big Caney, \$85,000; Little Walnut-Hickory, \$45,000; Rock Creek, \$370,000; Lakin watershed, \$85,000; Irish Creek, \$82,000; North Black Vermillion, \$5,000; and Upper Black Vermillion, \$6,000.

# Seek To Organize ASC Committeemen

A new farm organization has come forward to plug for continued federal farm-aid programs. It suggests it has a better right to speak for farmers than most of its older rivals.

It is the National Association of Farmer Elected Committeemen. Its president is a feed grain producer, Robert J. Hoffman of Hardin County, Iowa.

## Heard By Congress


The association has made its initial lobbying plea before the Senate agriculture committee, urging that the controversial farm programs be retained.

The association's membership is limited to farmers who are now serving or who have

served on committees elected by farmers in their communities and counties to help administer the Agriculture department's multi-billion-dollar crop-control, price-support, farm payment, land retirement, conservation and related programs.

Hoffman told the Senate committee his organization has 30,000 members and is active in 22 states, mainly those in the Mid-West, West and South where farm programs play important roles.

But it has a potential membership many times that size. There are at present slightly more than 90,000 community and county farmer-elected com-



## Brucellosis Program On Schedule

The target date of 1975 to make the U.S. a brucellosis-free nation appears to be on schedule from this map which shows that 92.8% of all counties in the country have reached one stage of certification in the program.

With only seven states not having all counties at the modified-certified stage, nearly all on-farm testing of herds has been completed. The seven states, which still show open areas in the map above, are Louisiana, Texas, Nebraska, South Dakota, Oklahoma, Florida and Mississippi.

Last year 4.6 million market cattle were identified with their herd of origin and blood tested. There were about 41,000 positive reactors, revealing 4200 infected herds, which identified 22,600 more infected cattle.

Under the program, market cattle testing is first done to achieve a modified certified status by reducing incidence in the cow population to less than one percent.

After a county gets modified-certified status (dotted on the map), it aims for brucellosis-free status, which has tougher requirements.

Last year 95 counties were added to the modified-certified list, and 184 to the "free" list.

mitteemen who help carry out the farm programs. And there are an undetermined number of former committeemen.

"Our membership," Hoffman said, "is composed entirely of farmers. Our association and the Congress are only elected groups that speak for farmers."

The Agriculture department sees no objection to its farmer committeemen becoming lobbyists. It holds that while they are paid by the federal government, they are not federal employees and hence are not subject to political limitations placed on federal workers.

These committeemen work on farm programs only part of the time, usually an average of less than 25 days a year.

Hoffman said his organization will work to "promote" strengthen and improve the farmer-elected committee system for local administration of farm programs" as well as for the maintenance of "effective farm programs which will increase and improve farm income."

## Big Decline In Hog Market

Hog prices had their sharpest fall in nearly a year last week, as the Chicago market fell \$1.35 in one day. Heavy marketings at both country and terminal markets caused the decline. While the Chicago market dropped \$1.35 to \$20 a hundred, the decline at country locations was generally less, from 25 cents to \$1.

Marketers generally declined to speculate as to the importance of the relaxation of the NFO holding action on the market.




