

Co-curricular events have a huge impact on student learning and community building. Students often note that they remember these out of the classroom experiences as the time when they were most able to bond with their peers and connect what they were learning inside the classroom to their lives.

General Guidelines:

For our K-State First CAT Communities and First-Year Seminars, our program requires a **minimum of three** outside of the classroom co-curricular events. These can range from short field trips to local businesses, theatre performances, lectures, athletic games, or exhibits and tours.

One of these events should **connect to the K-State Book Network (KSBN) common book** of the year. Often KSBN will bring the author and provide a large campus-wide event for all of our classes, but there is also typically a series of faculty/staff lectures and other events related to the book that could be used as well.

One of these events should have a **focus on diversity/inclusion** as a way to enhance students'
understanding of their identities and to prepare
them to work with a diverse group of peers at the
university and in their future careers. This will help to
build students' cultural competency skills and further
engage with the intercultural learning initiatives
happening across the university. Depending on the
common read for the year, that event might also
overlap with this category as well.

We also recommend that one event have a more specific **focus on building the community within your class**. Hiking the Konza, escape room puzzling, Challenge Course adventures, attending athletic events, or even something simple like a bowling night gives students the chance to get to know each other better and build up their communication and collaboration skills.

Funding:

K-State First is typically able to fund one co-curricular event per class at about \$10 per student. Our funds are limited, so this funding is offered on a first come, first served basis. If you plan on taking your class to an event that costs money, we recommend you fill out our **field trip funding form** at the beginning of the semester. Also, please keep in mind that food is not an allowable expense.

K-State First is often able to leverage our campus and community connections to find discounts and expedite reservations. We will need at least two weeks notice before the event as this will allow us to do things like buy a packet of tickets for an event, reserve a van for travel, or schedule a tour or visit at a facility. Scheduling:

To make sure the majority of your students are able to attend all three events and to provide us the necessary time for scheduling and reservations, we recommend that you plan your co-curricular events as you prep your course and include them in your syllabus. This gives your students the chance to get the events scheduled into their calendars right away, and if there is a time conflict you can work together to plan a make-up activity with them. On the next few pages you will find a list of events that have already been scheduled that you can use to easily incorporate into your existing syllabus and schedule.

Co-Curricular Reflection:

One of the most powerful learning components of the co-curricular events happens when students are given the opportunity to reflect on the experience together. You can create an assignment with 3-4 reflection questions to gauge the impact on each student individually, and also set aside some class time to discuss their thoughts about the event and connect it more fully to your class outcomes and goals. This integration of the co-curricular event outcomes will help students build a bridge between their academics and lived experiences.

K-State 360*:

Our program sponsored events all count towards the K-State First and KSBN K-State 360 badges. Please indicate this to your students so they can earn those badges. Other events that connect to the work we do and are promoted by our program will have the connect to them. Some events listed that are not specifically planned or sponsored by our program might also count for K-State 360 credit, so please encourage your students to explore those options as well.

*K-State 360 is a program designed to provide students with a well-rounded experience of co-curricular programs with the ultimate goal of helping students stand out to future employers or graduate and professional schools. K-State 360 helps navigate involvement while tracking progress. Activities are placed into a series of categories (teamwork, diversity, leadership, problem solving, communication, and career development), guiding students toward an inclusive K-State experience and a developed skillset that will give students an edge. Once students complete all the category requirements, they will gain the K-State 360 designation to share with potential employers and graduate schools.

Some things to keep in mind:

- While the museum is open 10-5 Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday and 10-8 on Thursday, they do open early for guided tours, and will try to make special arrangements to assist you if you have a class that meets outside of those hours.
- Please try to give them a four week lead time this will increase
 your chances of their staff being available for your desired time
 and time to tailor your tour/program.
- If you do plan to bring a class on your own, they do ask that you let them know the date and time so they may manage the number of larger groups trying to use the space at one time. Priority will be given to tours/classes that are on their schedule.

Academic Achievement Center
