## Release Male - Sterile Hybrid Wheat Strains

Another step toward hybrid wheats for the Great Plains states was announced by Dr. Floyd W. Smith, director of the Kansas Agricultural experiment station at Kansas State university.

The Kansas station and the Crops Research division of the Agricultural Research Service, USDA, are releasing six male-sterile hard red winter wheat varieties to be used in producing hybrid wheats.

The male-sterile strains originated at the Fort Hays branch of the Experiment station; three were increased at other Kansas experiment station locations.

The male-sterile varieties being released are Scout, Tascona, Shawnee, Aztec, Kaw 61 and Concho. All possess cytoplasm from *Triticum timopheirii*, a cereal that seems to increase

protein content of hybrid wheat.

The Kansas station is releasing 25 grams of germ plasm of each male-sterile variety, along with the propagator strain necessary for increase and possible use in developing hybrid wheats.

Missing from the release are fertility-restoring varieties, called "R-lines," required for commercial hybrid seed production. However, such lines are being developed by the Joint USDA-Kansas station arrangement.

Any commercial seed company, plant breeder or qualified person may request seed of the paired male-sterile and propagator wheat strains being released. Requests go to Dr. R. W. Livers, Branch Experiment Station, Hays 67601.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture has no seed for distribution.

## Tax Surcharge Not Doing Job In Cooling Economy, Slowing Inflation

The Commerce Department officially admitted for the first time that a 10 per cent tax surcharge imposed in July is having an unexpectedly small impact on economic growth.

Commerce Secretary C. R. Smith followed up the announcement by warning that creeping inflation could turn the U.S. into a second class trading power and undermine the nation's security.

The department predicted that the gross national product (GNP) — the total value of the country's goods and services — would show a substantial increase in the third quarter of 1968.

The economy continues to surge ahead because Americans apparently would rather cut back in their saving than reduce their spending, a commerce official said.

The personal savings rate, which grew throughout 1967 and early 1968, was believed to have dropped back to its 1964-66 level of about six per cent of disposable income.

Officials said they expected the current quarter would show a rise of about \$15 billion in the GNP. This would be less than gains registered in the first half of the year but still about \$5 billion more than earlier forecasts.

The International Monetary Fund this month urged the U.S. to bring its growth rate to a point well below four per cent in order to restrain expansion.

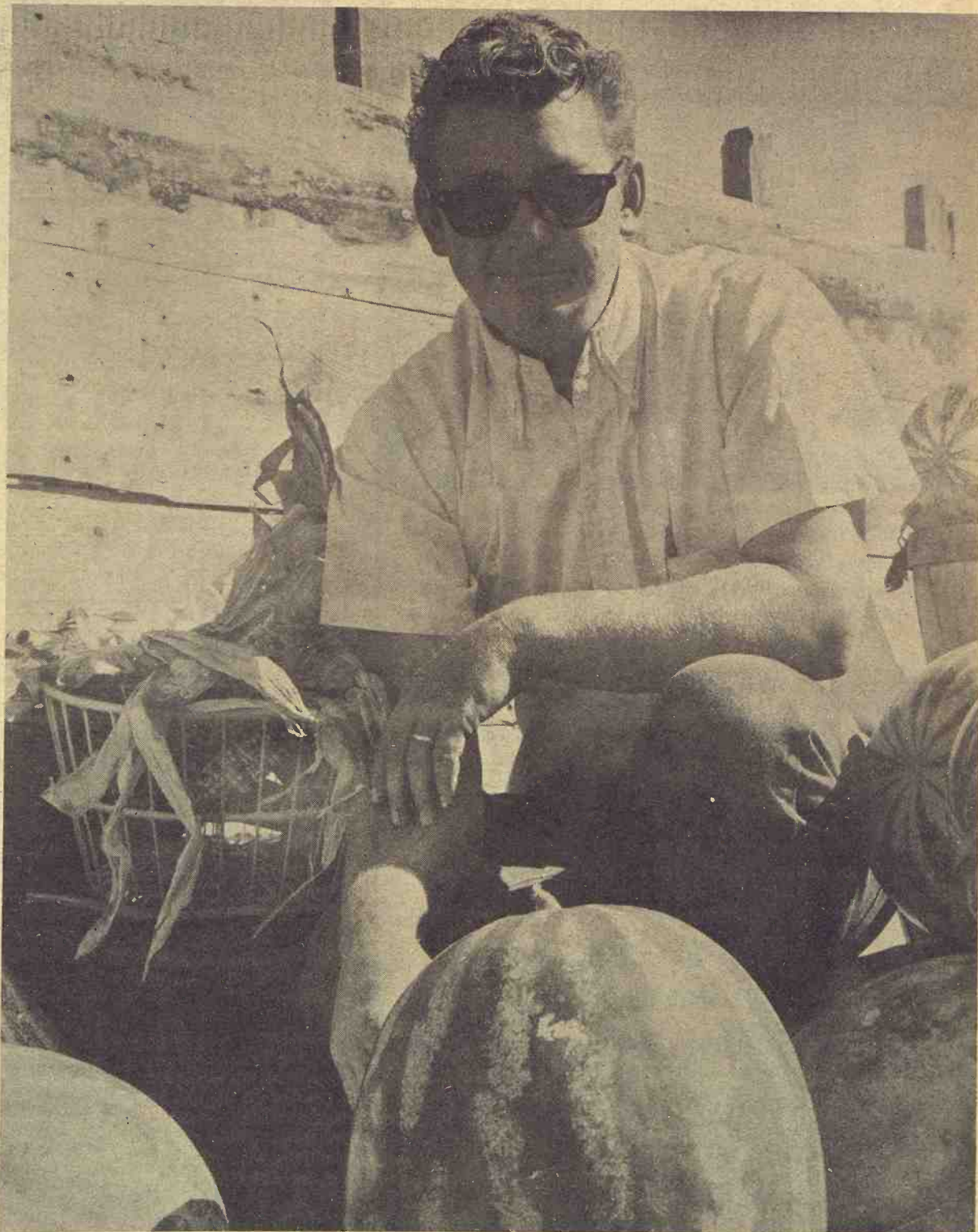
Smith said America could lose its pre-eminence in world trade by pricing its goods and services out of world markets.

"A nation left prostrate by uncontrolled inflation is in no position to defend itself against attack, whatever form it may take," the Commerce secretary said.

He told the U.S. Air Force Association convention that failure to achieve a healthy economic base would mean that U.S. prestige and influence in world councils diminishes.

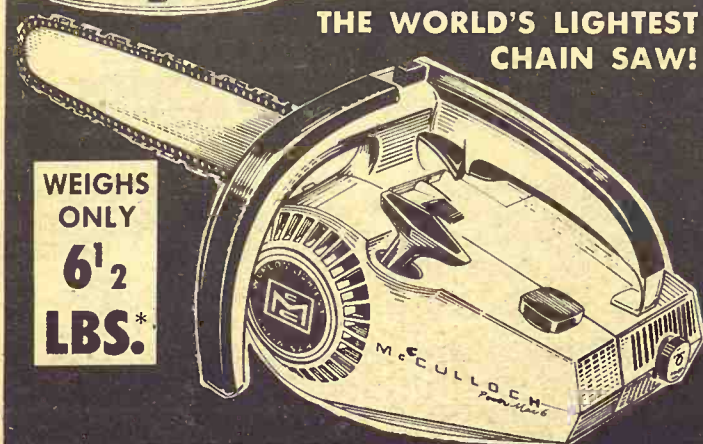

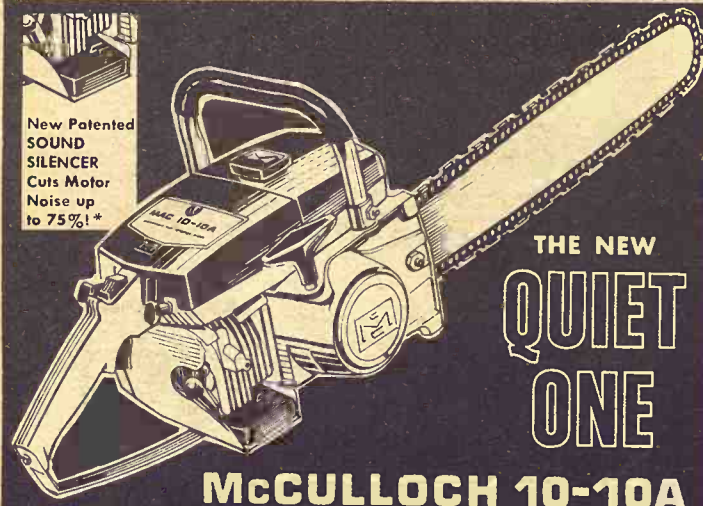

## Two New Soybean Varieties OK'd

Two new soybean varieties, Cutler and Calland, have been released by the USDA, the Kansas Agricultural Experiment Station, and stations in several other states.

Chief advantage of Cutler variety is that it yields more than Clark 63 and somewhat more than Kent. It also matures about five days earlier than Kent. It outyielded Clark 63 two bushels an acre in 29 Kansas tests at eight locations in the soybean area of the state.

Cutler resists frog-eye leaf spot (race 2) but is moderately susceptible to phytophthora root rot. It is more likely than Kent to be damaged by downy mildew but less likely than Clark 63. Otherwise, Cutler is quite similar to Clark 63 and Kent. It

was selected at Purdue Agricultural Experiment Station from a cross of (Lincoln x Ogden) x Clark.

Calland's chief advantages are that it yields more than Wayne and distinctly more than Shelby, and it resists phytophthora root rot and is moderately resistant to downy mildew. Unlike Wayne it has not shown iron deficiency in high pH soils, nor do its stems remain green after its pods mature. It lodges less than Shelby or Wayne.

It is from a selection, (Blackhawk x Harosoy) x Kent, also made by the Purdue Agricultural Experiment Station.

It has been tested in California, Delaware, Illinois, Indiana, Kansas, Kentucky, Maryland, Missouri, Nebraska, New Jersey and Ohio.

Cutler was tested in those same states plus Iowa and South Dakota and Ontario, Canada, and minus Kentucky and Maryland.

In Kansas Cutler seed will be available to be planted only by certified seed growers in 1969.

Ted Walter, chairman of the Kansas State University seed distribution committee, said even certified seed growers should

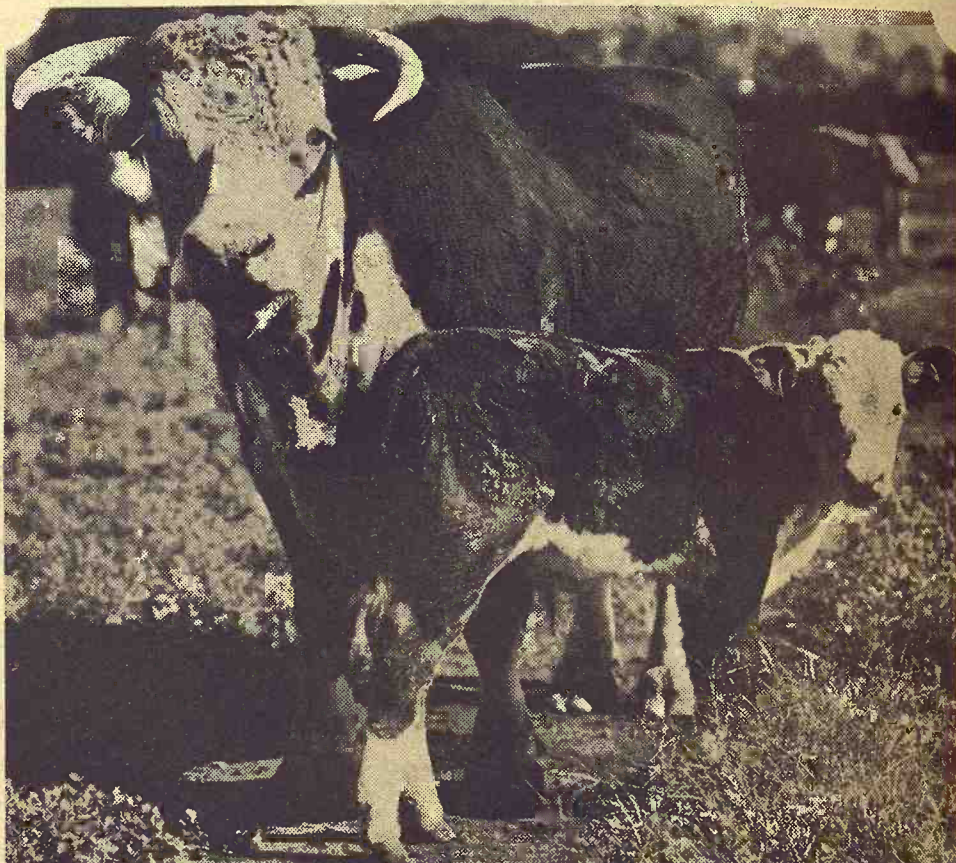
not apply for seed through the county agents until after February 1, 1969. He said Calland seed will be available under similar rules in Kansas in 1970.

## Much More Grain Under Support Loan

Farmers are placing considerably more of their new-crop grain under government price-support loans than they did last year, the Agriculture department says.

New crop wheat under loans

August 31 totaled 199,200,000 bushels, the most for the period since 1960, the department said.

In addition almost 1,800,000 bushels of the 1968 crop wheat were purchased directly by the government in areas where farmers did not have sufficient storage.

The August 31 total compares with 75,700,000 bushels of a year earlier and 51,400,000 on that date in 1966, the department

said.

Of this year's total wheat under loan about 162,600,000 bushels were stored in commercial warehouses and about 36,700,000 on farms.

Total bushels of other 1968 crops placed under loan through August, compared with totals of a year earlier, included: barley, 31,200,000 this year and 4 million in 1967; corn 26,249 and 1.043; flaxseed 704,547 and 56,503; oats 19,100,000 and 4,300,000 and rye 1,500,000 and 311,213.

Sorghum grain under loan so far this year totaled about 2,800,000 hundredweight, compared with about 1,600,000 hundredweight a year earlier.

Individual loans on all 1968 crops through August totaled 113,466 compared with 34,334 a year earlier, the department said.

## Co-ops Ask For Major Marketing Study By K-State

Kansas State University has been asked by the Kansas Co-operative Council to study farm marketing in all its aspects.

Especially sought are ways and means of applying to agriculture the basic economic principles long used by other business and industry.

Request for the study was in a letter to Dr. James A. McCain, KSU president, from Hal Hellebrust, executive secretary of the council.

"The low and unstable price situation prevalent in agriculture today has brought farmers and the agribusiness complex which serves them to the brink

of financial disaster," Hellebrust said.

Specifically, the council president suggested the study center on changes and adjustments needed in the present system so traditional marketing agencies, whether cooperative or independent, can assume price responsibility for producers in the market place, and procedures producers would have to accept if marketing agencies are to perform the price function in their behalf.

"Farmers desperately need such a study," Hellebrust said. "A sincere and impartial study by a leading land-grant college would, we believe, eliminate much of the present confusion and outline a clear course to follow."

## Dairy Pasture Best In Decade

Dairy pastures on September

1 were in the best condition on that date in a decade, the Agriculture Department reports.

The average condition was 82 per cent of normal, three points above a year earlier, the department said.

Milk production nationally totaled 9,567,000,000 pounds during August, 1 per cent less than a year earlier and 5 per cent less than average, the department said, reflecting a general decrease in cow numbers.

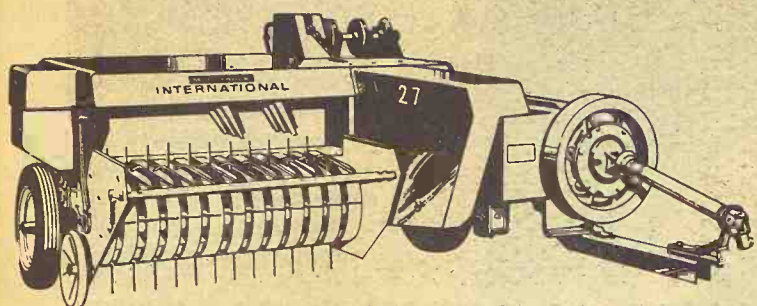

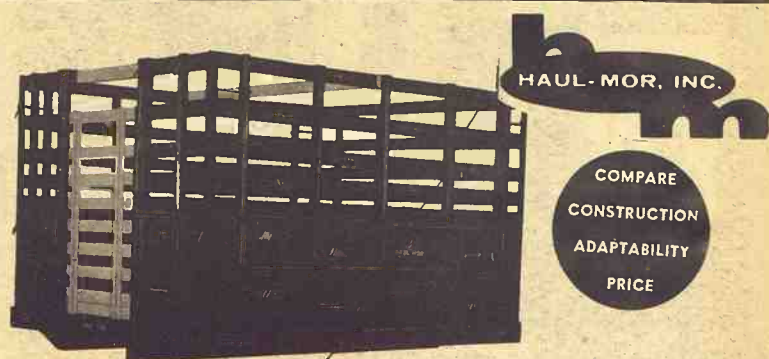

STATE OF KANSAS  
Notice of Submission of Proposed Constitutional Amendment at November 5, 1968 General Election  
Pursuant to Article 14, Section 1 of the Constitution and in compliance with House Concurrent Resolution No. 1063, adopted by the legislature on March 7, 1968, a proposition will be submitted to the voters at the November 5, 1968, General Election for their approval or rejection to amend Section 2 of Article 4 of the Constitution as follows:

"Sec. 2. General elections and township elections shall be held biennially on the Tuesday succeeding the first Monday in November in the years bearing even numbers. All county and township officers shall hold their offices for a term of two years and until their successors are qualified. Provided, One county commissioner shall be elected from each of three districts, numbered 1, 2, and 3, by the voters of the district, and the legislature shall fix the time of office of such commissioners; such election to be at a general election, and no term of office to exceed six years."

I hereby certify that the foregoing is a true copy of the proposed amendment to the Constitution of the State of Kansas contained in House Concurrent Resolution No. 1063 adopted by the 1968 Session of the legislature, the original of which is on file in my office.

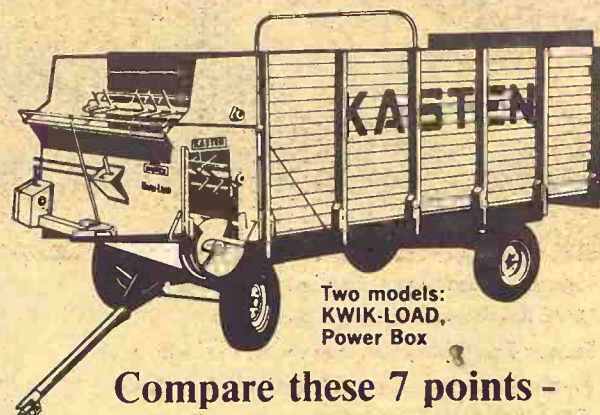

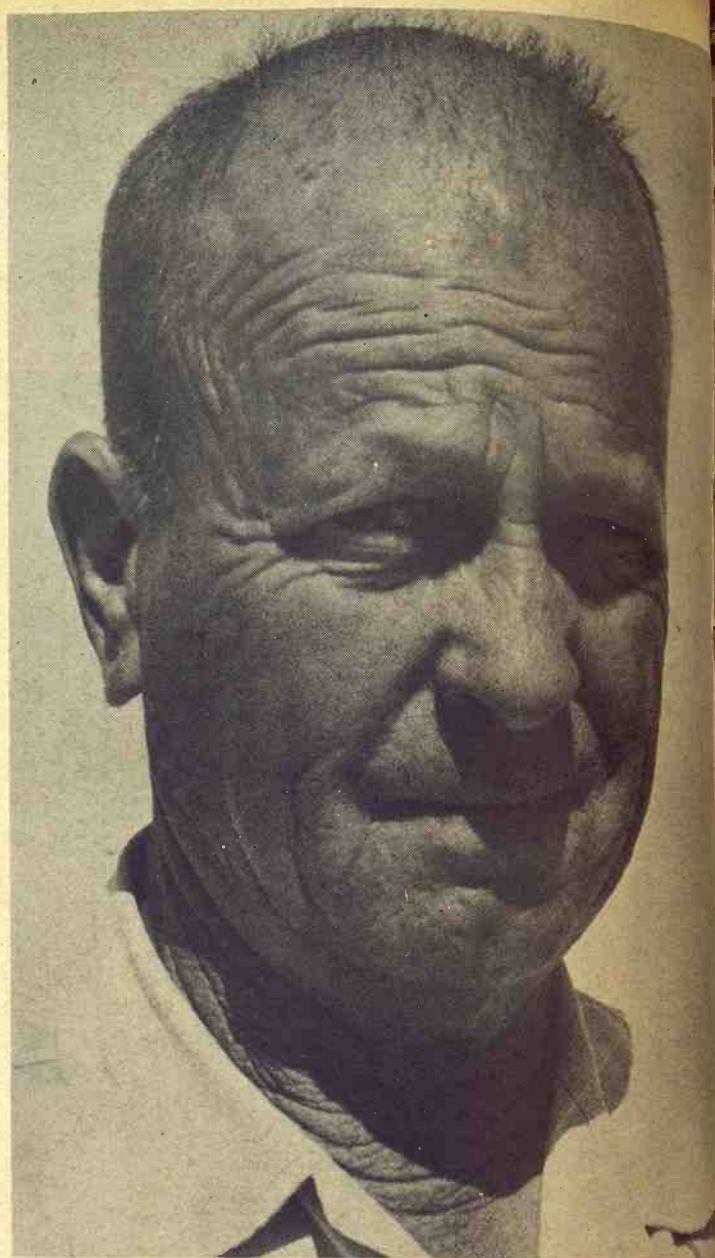

## USDA Budget At \$5.54 Billion

The USDA appropriations bill for fiscal 1969 — ending June

30, 1969 — is \$1.4 billion below the amount requested by the president in January and \$1.1 billion below the comparable figure for fiscal 1968.

The appropriations measure provides \$5.54 billion for the Department of Agriculture and related agencies during fiscal year 1969, which began July 1 this year.

House and Senate Conference Committee just prior to Congress' August adjournment, has been signed by the President.

The final figure for 1969 is below earlier estimates and below the prior year's figure primarily because of (1) Congress failure once again to fully reimburse the Commodity Credit Corporation for past losses incurred in carrying out price support and adjustment programs and (2) its refusal to make full appropriation in advance for programs carried out under PL 480.

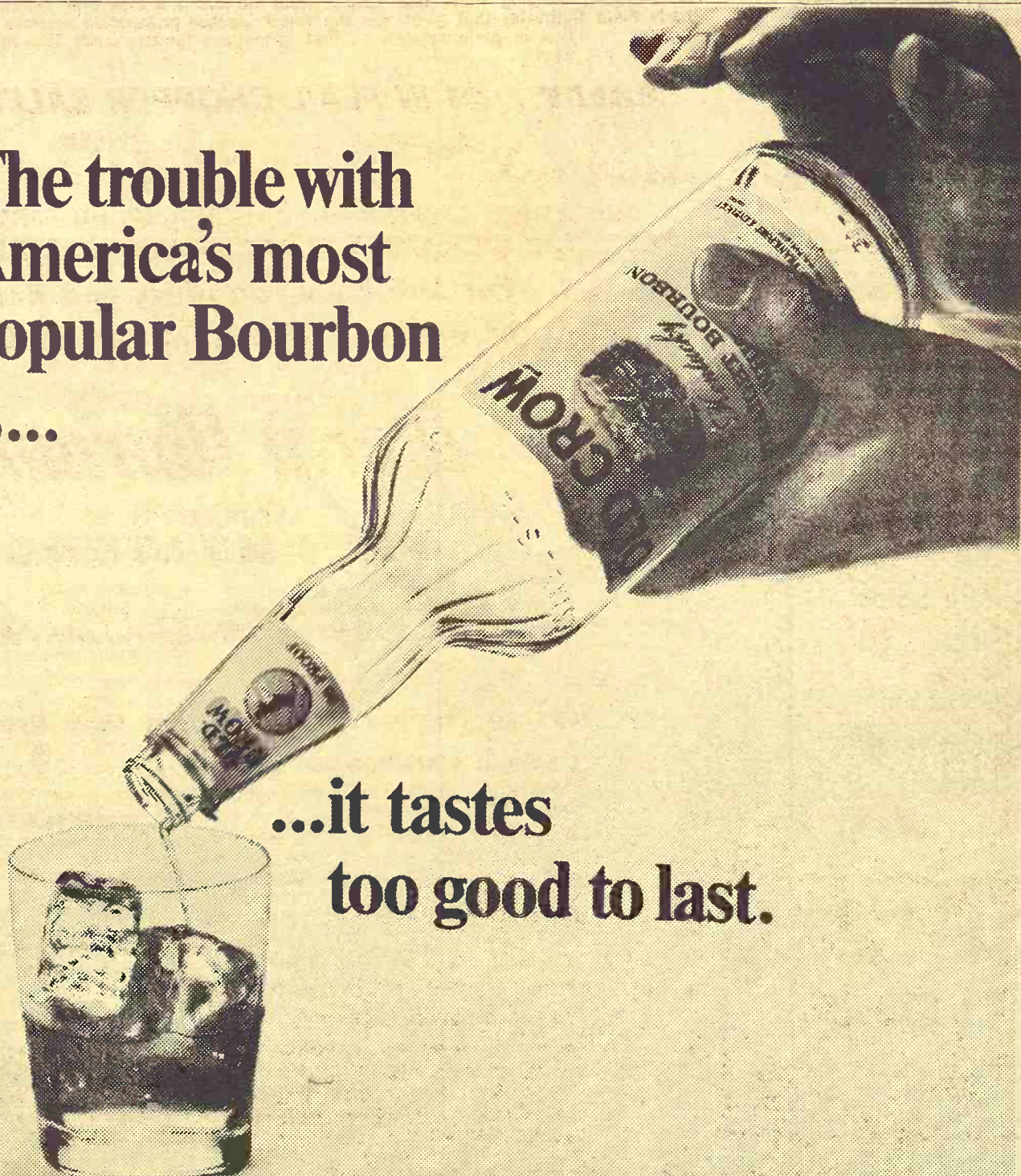
CCC's ability to borrow up to \$145 billion and its unlimited authorization to make contracts in advance of Congressional appropriation gives wide latitude to Congress in making allocations of new spending authority.

Most agencies of USDA received appropriations in line with 1968 levels. The two major areas of increase came in salaries and expenses for the Consumer and Marketing Service (for meat and poultry inspection programs) and in the Food Stamp Program. Major decreases came in the Soil Conservation Service and the Agricultural Conservation Payments program (ACP).

## Eggmen Expect Better Prices

Producers can expect egg prices to be "significantly higher" this fall and early winter because there will be fewer hens, the Agriculture department predicts.

The number of chicks hatched for layer replacements in the first half of this year was down about 14 per cent. This reduction will be reflected in fewer pullets going into egg production the remainder of 1968, the USDA said.

Egg production in the last quarter may be 2 to 4 per cent below a year earlier, the department said.

Prices paid to egg producers the first half of 1968 averaged 29 cents a dozen, about two cents below a year earlier. But as production decreased prices rose sharply, from 30.3 cents in June to 35.1 cents in August, the department said.

But the more favorable price situation may not persist long, the USDA indicated.

Laying flocks are expected to increase in size early next year as producers prepare more pullets for production. The department said pullet starts the last half of 1968 are expected to increase about 12 per cent from a year earlier.

The production of poultry broiler meat dropped one per cent during the first half of 1968 from a year earlier. But production the rest of the year is expected to be two to four per cent higher, the department said.

Wholesale prices of broiler meat in nine sample cities averaged 27.4 cents a pound the first half, up 1.6 cents from a year earlier. The department said an increase in demand for both red meat and poultry contributed to the rise.

The broiler price outlook for the rest of this year is "moderately above" the 24.4 cents a pound average the second half of 1967.

## Another Shift At Fort Riley?

FT. RILEY — Men of the 24th Infantry Division, just settling in here after redeploying from Germany, could be moving out again soon.

A statement by Secretary of Defense Clark M. Clifford that Nato maneuvers will be held sooner than expected next year is certain to affect more than 10,000 Riley soldiers.

Clifford said 20,000 to 40,000 additional American troops will be sent to Europe early in 1969, ready to take part in extensive field maneuvers with forces of other Allied nations. However, he added the troop hike would be temporary only and did not represent an increase in U.S. European force levels.

The Department of Defense, in announcing the return of 24,000 men from Europe early this year, said it was with the understanding they would re-

turn for exercises, but no movement had been expected until perhaps next fall. The speed-up was an obvious response to the Czechoslovak crisis.

The 24th Division still retains

one of its three brigades in Germany. Nearly 14,000 Ft. Riley men could be involved in the European shift if four non-divisional support units go with the two Riley infantry brigades.

Mix flour, oleo and sugar into crumbs. Lay the biscuits on a greased pan. Heat the apple pie filling mix till hot and then lay on biscuits. Next sprinkle gelatin over apple mixture, then sprinkle flour mixture on top. Bake at 350 degrees for 20 minutes. Need not be brown on top and may be served warm or cold.

The following recipe is from Mrs. L. Joseph Wedel of Langdon, Mo.:

#### CUPCAKE CHEATERS

2 1/2 cups puffed rice  
2 tablespoons oleo  
1 cup marshmallow creme  
2 tablespoons chocolate-flavored malted milk powder  
1/2 cup chocolate chips  
12 milk chocolate squares  
12 walnut halves  
Cook oleo, marshmallow creme, malted milk powder and

chips over low heat, stirring until well-blended. Pour over rice until coated. Pack into 12 well-greased muffin cups. Place a chocolate square on top of each and press a nut on top of each cupcake. Remove from cups. Makes twelve.

#### PICNIC BEANS

1 large can pork & beans

1 can tomato soup  
1 pound ground chuck  
1/2 onion, chopped fine  
1 teaspoon dry mustard  
2 tablespoons brown sugar  
Brown beef and onion, adding salt and pepper to taste. Place part of meat in casserole, top with beans, then remaining meat. Pour soup over this. Sprinkle mustard and brown sugar on top. Bake two hours at 300 degrees.

1/2 teaspoon nutmeg  
1/2 teaspoon ginger

While this is cooking till thick, dissolve 1 envelope gelatin in 1/4 cup cold water. Beat the egg whites stiff and fold in 1/2 cup sugar, 1 teaspoon lemon or vanilla flavoring. Add the gelatin to the pumpkin mixture and fold this into the egg whites. Pour into a baked pie shell and top with Dream Whip.

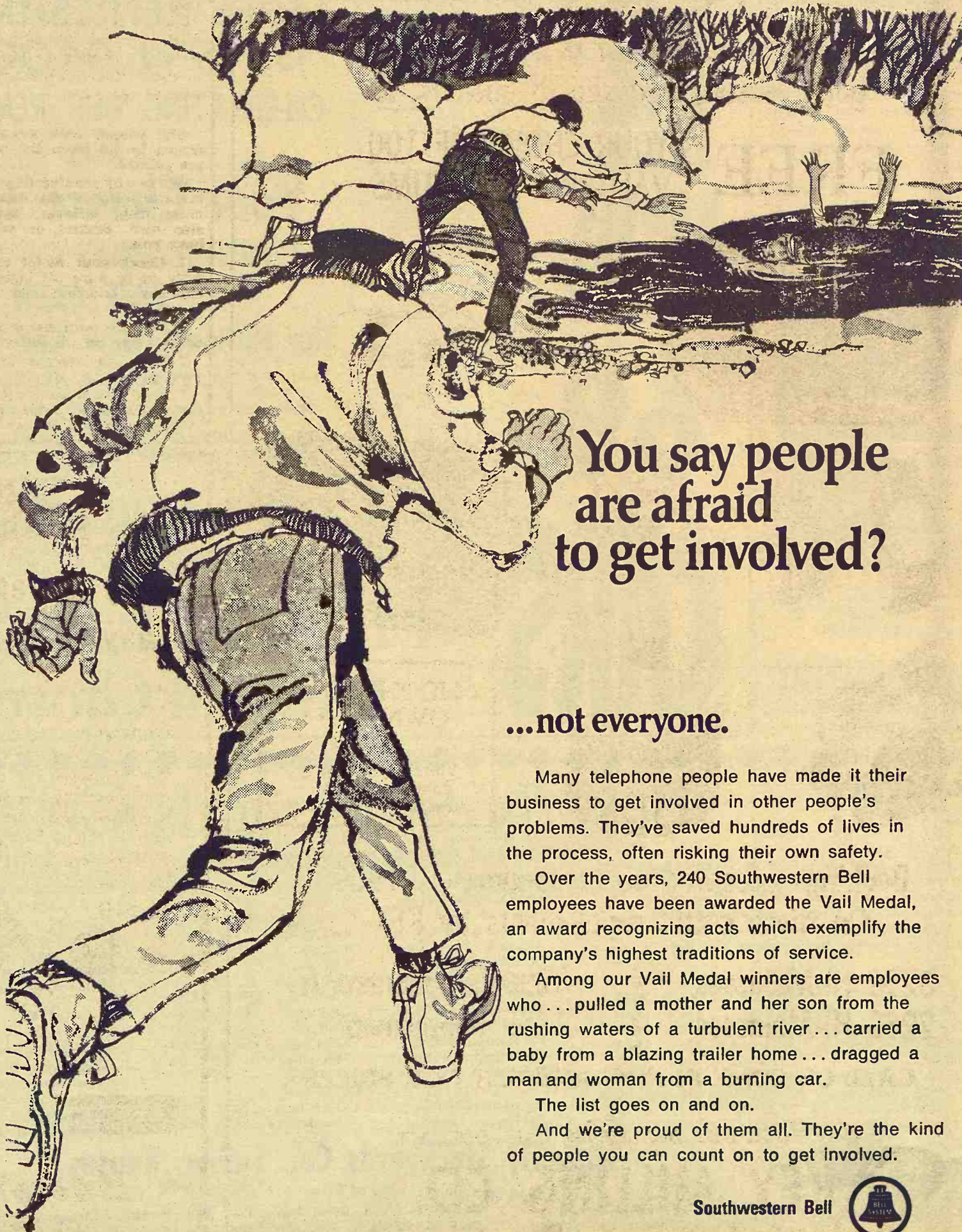

## Grub Control Cut-Off Nears For Kansas

Kansas cattlemen should take a good hard look at what grubs are costing them. Best estimates of veterinarians and county Extension agents in the state put a total value of \$5 million on the loss to these parasites.

Compare this expense to the economics of treatment — each dollar spent for grub control will return \$8 in savings, Dr. Homer Caley, Extension veterinarian at Kansas State University, points out.

The real and costly effects of grubs can go undetected by stockmen, and escape from being labeled as a legitimate cost. In most instances, the loss may not be detected until the warble is noticeable on the animal's back. In addition to causing direct damage to the meat of the animal, grubs also retard milk and meat production.

Some of the meat from expensive cuts damaged by grubs must be trimmed and discarded in the packing plant. This often results in lower carcass value, and a reluctance on the part of the buyer to take grubby cattle. Loss on infested carcasses normally will range from \$5 to \$7 per head, and the value of a perforated hide is also reduced.

The fall cut-off date to end the recommended period of treatment is fast approaching. The time of application of a grub killing chemical is important. In general, the recommended treatment period is from June 1 to October 1 for Kansas, or at least before bumps appear on the skin. Some products can be used until October 31.

Dr. Caley urges that cattlemen observe the cut-off date on the product package, but also keep in mind that the origin of the cattle should be considered. Southern cattle should be treated

in the early part of the recommended period.

Most experts agree that early control, late summer, is important, and is the most effective with less danger of side effects. But it isn't too late now to do something about these costly parasites for native cattle.

Control of grubs is not difficult or expensive. Prior to use of systematic drugs, rotenone was the principal drug of choice. This has largely been abandoned

in favor of the newer, more effective systemics except for dairy cows. Rotenone is the only approved compound for use on dairy cows for grub control.

Late application of an organic phosphate grub killer can have ill effects on the cattle. In the case of a heavy infestation that is treated late in the season, the grubs will be killed, but harmful side effects are caused by a foreign protein released by the parasites.

Cattle may have intense swelling of the esophagus, excessive salivation and bloat, or shock may result in cases where a heavy grub infestation is killed late in the year.

If an organic phosphate is being used to kill grubs, don't use other products with it, Caley cautions. Also, don't administer phenothiazine at the same time organic compounds are being applied.

Follow the product manufacturer's directions exactly, and do not overdose the animals, Caley's advice. He also cautions against treating sick or weak cattle.

No Toy Guns In  
Sears Catalog

The Christmas catalogue of Sears Roebuck & Co. contains no firearms or toy guns for children.

Sears and Montgomery Ward and Co., the nation's two largest mail order houses, announced in June changes in policy governing the sale and advertising of firearms.

A Sears spokesman said the Christmas catalogue, mailed to subscribers last week, contains no "toys of violence" in keeping with that policy.

Sears banned all mail order sale of firearms in June and Wards, while allowing mail orders, stipulated that all such orders must be picked up in person at stores or catalogue order outlets.

The new policies of both companies were announced shortly after the murder of Sen. Robert F. Kennedy.

The Sears Christmas catalogue contains no firearms, but does advertise gun cabinets and racks. It shows no toy guns, but does advertise rubber-tipped archery sets.

The spokesman said that some Sears stores will continue to sell toy guns but that there will be no advertising or promotion of them.

# High-Protein Corn Ahead Of Schedule

A new type of corn, which promises both to help reduce malnutrition in impoverished lands and to cause widespread, — and possibly unsettling — changes in the U.S. farm economy, will be commercially available for planting next spring.

This is two or three years ahead of schedule for the new high-protein strain, on which agricultural scientists have been working for years. Eventually, the grain, which has much of the food quality of skim milk, could sharply cut the costs of raising pork and poultry in the U.S. It could, however, drastically cut into the business of mixed-feed manufacturers, a multi-million-dollar industry.

The first inkling that the new corn was ready for farmers to try out came yesterday when Trojan Seed Co., headquartered 100 miles west of Minneapolis, Minn., announced that it has successfully bred into commercial hybrid corn varieties a gene, called Opaque-2. The effect is to boost the protein content of the standard corn by 50% and to double the amount of two essential amino acids.

Amino acids are commonly called the "building blocks" of protein. More than 25 of them have been identified, and about 10 of these are considered essential to good human and animal nutrition.

Trojan is the first major hybrid seed corn company (it ranks sixth among about 400 concerns) to put its high-quality protein hybrids on the market. Most other seed companies of any size are conducting extensive research to breed their own Opaque-2 varieties.

If Opaque-2 lives up to the attributes that plant scientists have claimed, it will bring dramatic changes to agriculture throughout the world.

In addition to becoming powerful artillery in the war on

hunger, the new corn will cut feed costs of swine and poultry raisers, possibly cut into soybean production, cause revamping of present corn-storage facilities and marketing channels and perhaps become the new darling of the diet set.

"With the development of Opaque-2 hybrids the world is actually gaining a new basic food," Says Keith Keltgen, Trojan's vice president for research.

Opaque-2 is important not so much for its 50% higher protein level, but for its greater amounts of the essential amino acids lysine and tryptophan, and for the better balance among all the amino acids. In the past, corn has ranked relatively low on the protein-efficiency scale because it contains limited amounts of lysine and tryptophan.

The Opaque-2 gene is mutant and recessive, and was first discovered in corn in 1935. But it wasn't until 1963 that two Purdue University professors, Edwin T. Mertz and Oliver E. Nelson, discovered and reported that this gene could increase the lysine and tryptophan content of corn.

The problem was that high-lysine corn was very low-yielding, and thus wasn't economically feasible to grow. (High-yielding hybrids were introduced in the early 1930's by Henry A. Wallace of Iowa, and some farmers currently harvest more than 200 bushels an acre.)

So the process began at universities and at major seed companies to marry the Opaque-2 gene with high-yielding hybrids. In 1966, Nelson predicted Opaque-2 hybrids would be available by 1971 or so.

After four years of research by Mr. Keltgen and Thomas Mack, research director, Trojan claims to have beaten this timetable with Opaque-2 varieties of its TXS102 and TX99 hybrids.

Mr. Keltgen says yields of these high-lysine varieties are 90 to 95% of the same hybrids without the Opaque-2 gene. The yield measurement is by weight, based on 56 pounds a bushel. Trojan is working to increase the yield to that of normal corn, and also will breed Opaque-2 into several more varieties with different maturity dates, but not its entire line of 38 hybrids.

D. E. Alexander, professor of plant genetics in the University of Illinois agronomy department, says that although Trojan may be the first seed company to announce Opaque-2 hybrids, other seed companies aren't far behind.

In fact, Cargill Inc., Minneapolis, will supply several hundred bushels of its Opaque-2 hybrid seed to farmers for test planting next spring. And Alexander himself is growing several test plots for the university; last year his Opaque-hybrids yielded 92% of normal.

Other seed companies, however, either aren't as far along in their development or are being ultraconservative in describing their progress. For example, De Kalb Agricultural Association Inc., De Kalb, Ill., considered to be the nation's largest seed-corn concern, says, "We feel it will be a couple of years before there will be a commercially acceptable (Opaque-2) hybrid."

The protein content of Trojan's normal hybrids is about

8% compared with 12% for the Opaque-2 hybrids. The difference is due to the higher lysine and tryptophan content, Keltgen says. Opaque-2 corn contains around 0.49% lysine, compared with 0.24% in normal corn, and 0.15% tryptophan, compared with 0.09%.

Even though Opaque-2 isn't "loaded" with protein, as compared with soybean meal, for example, "it will do a lot to bridge the hunger and nutritional gap around the world," says Robert C. Liebenow, president of Corn Refiners Association Inc., which sponsored part of the original research at Purdue. "Researchers have found that Opaque-2, ground up and used to make cornbread or tortillas, has the same nutritional value as skim milk. But the fact is, a kid in Guatemala isn't going to get skim milk, where he will get corn."

In the U.S., high-lysine corn will be used mainly as a feed

for simple-stomach livestock, particularly hogs and poultry. (Double-stomach animals, such as cattle, sheep and goats, don't require high-protein feed. Tests conducted thus far show that hogs gain weight 50% faster on Opaque-2 corn than on normal corn. Research will continue on hog-feeding by Trojan and other companies. In fact, Cargill's test planting last year will be done by farmers who will be asked to feed some of their hogs Opaque-2 and compare weight gains with those fed normal feed rations.

Feed men say Opaque-2's success as hog feed depends on relative costs. Though Opaque-2 is expected to sell at a premium above normal corn, it would still be less expensive than soybean meal.

On the other hand, progress is being made in Japan, Europe and the U.S. in developing low-cost synthetic amino acids, which can be used to supplement normal corn rations. "Instead of a race among seed companies," says one researcher, "now we'll have a race between boosting yields of Opaque-2 and chemists making

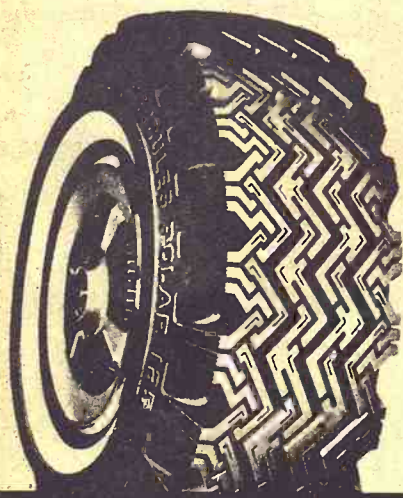

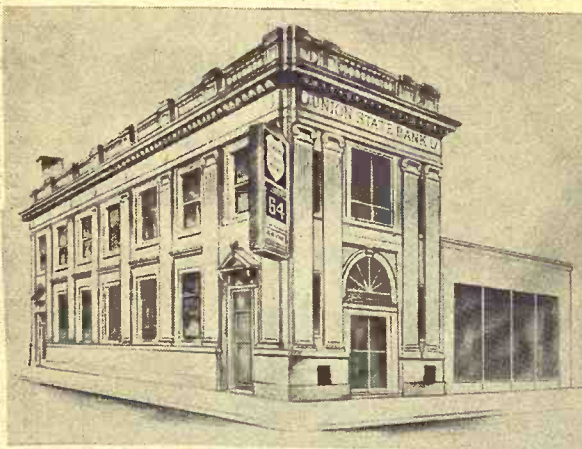

cheaper amino acid synthetics." Elevator concerns and grain dealers may have to alter their operations drastically to accommodate the new commodity if it gains favor as a feed. Other areas of agribusiness could be seriously affected too. Mr. Rauenhorst of Trojan, for example, predicts Opaque-2 eventually will cut deep into the need for soybean meal and thus reduce soybean acreage. The research executive for a major soybean processor says he "can't feel it would have a profound effect" in the immediate future, but concedes certain animal feeds will require less soybeans. Using high-lysine corn as livestock feed would hurt the nation's feed-mixing companies, too, especially the smaller concerns. John T. Scott Jr., profes-

sor of farm management at the University of Illinois, predicts that if Opaque-2 becomes a major hog feed, "many feed companies would lose 50% or more of their business." Says a top spokesman for Ralston Purina Co., St. Louis, the nation's top feed maker: "We're going to take a close look at it, because we would be selling a lot less supplements." Food companies are experimenting with Opaque-2 to find what uses it might have in the U.S. market. They decline to speak for attribution, but they privately say they're working with high-lysine corn starch in puddings, and in the sauce of cream-style sweet corn, among other things. Trojan thinks corn flakes made from Opaque-2 would be a hit with people trying to diet.

Even with the technical development announced by Trojan, some practical problems remain to be worked out before Opaque-2 becomes a major factor in the feed-grain market. For example, Opaque-2 has to be grown in fields isolated from normal corn. If the wind carries pollen from normal corn into an Opaque-2 field, it would result in another hybrid much lower in lysine and tryptophan. Trojan is confident such obstacles can be overcome. Rauenhorst says Trojan expects to harvest 500 bushels of its new Opaque-2 hybrids this fall, and should have enough seed to plant 4000 acres next spring. "After that," says Keltgen, "we can increase our seed production very rapidly. It's just a matter of how much the farmers will want."

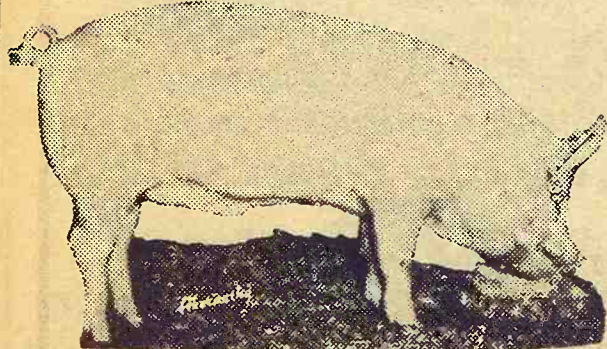

# Seven 'Special' ACP Projects In State

MANHATTAN — A total of seven special conservation projects have been approved in 1968 in Kansas under the Agricultural Conservation Program, according to Lawrence E. Brennan, chairman, Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation state committee. Two have been completed, four are under construction, and one ready to start. These are located in Barton, Cloud, Finney, Marshall, Leavenworth, Rooks and Saline counties. About 90 farmers have pooled their resources and ef-

forts to help carry out these projects.

These special projects, the chairman explained, provide a means of meeting conservation problems which involve more than one farmer or rancher in a community. Since low and moderate incomes of farmers and ranchers in such areas sometimes limit their ability to undertake expensive conservation work, extra program funds are often allocated and in some cases higher rates of cost-sharing are made available under the

program to help farmers carry out the practices needed in solving the specific problem.

The first step is to get the whole community to recognize a well-defined conservation program, and then to have farmers, bankers, businessmen, farm and civic associations, and others — including federal and local agencies of government — join in a concerted effort to solve it. Emphasis under ACP special projects is on improving the economic condition of farmers and the environmental quality of the community in which they live.

For example, 10 farmers in Leavenworth County, with some assistance from the Kickapoo Township Board and County Commissioners, are taking part in the Kickapoo Bottoms Project. This project is to control runoff from 750 acres of steep hill land by use of detention dams and to install a drainage system to permit productive use of 1500 acres of Missouri River bottom land.

Chairman Brennan said that a recent nationwide review of ACP special projects indicates that this method of attacking mutual conservation problems is finding increasing acceptance among farm communities. When the ACP special projects were started in 1964, about 5600 farmers in 44 states joined in a total of 128 projects, receiving about \$1.8 million of ACP assistance to help carry out the conservation work.

In 1967, more than 26,000 farmers participated in 595 projects in 49 states, receiving \$8.3 million in assistance. (Farmers themselves contribute a substantial part of the cost of these projects.) And, up to mid-1968, a total of 567 special projects were under way this year by 25,000 farmers in 50 states, with ACP assistance of \$7.9 million.

Participants in ACP special projects through the years have included such groups as operators of small farms, low-income farmers, 4-H and FFA students, farmers who have been doing little or no conservation work, and frequently, all the eligible farmers within a project area.

Projects generally have been directed toward solving soil and water problems by installing conservation systems of farming, thus resulting in a more stable farm economy. Other important objectives have included the establishment of major erosion control projects, reducing siltation of streams, road ditches, and water supply impoundments, thus benefiting both the farmer and the community.

Besides the needed soil and water conservation, the ACP special projects frequently yield additional benefits in helping provide community recreation opportunities such as fishing, hunting, boating, and other water sports.

ACP special projects will continue to be emphasized in 1969, the chairman pointed out. Where the efforts of a whole community are united in working toward one purpose, he said, conservation objectives become much easier to accomplish.

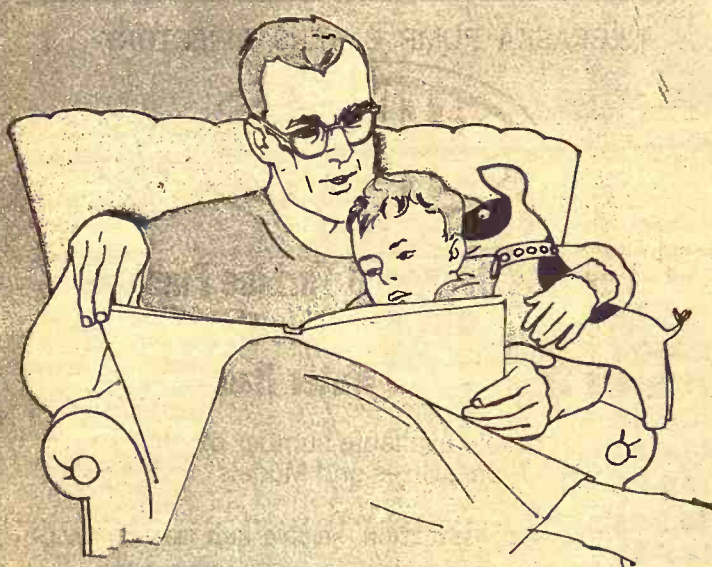

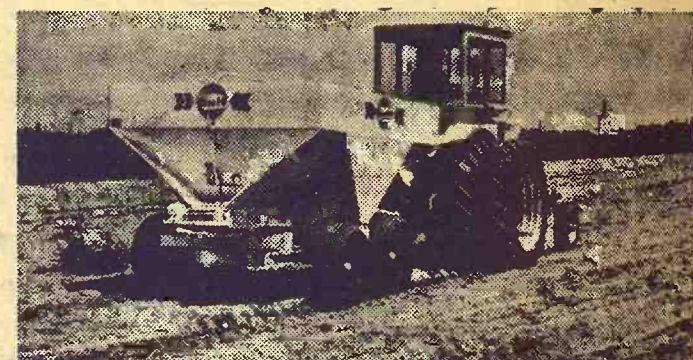

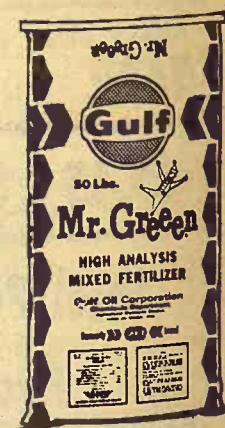

## Wheat Agreement Needs Propping

SYDNEY, Australia — World wheat exporting nations have announced steps they will take to try to prevent the International Grains arrangement from collapsing after only three months of operation.

After a 3-day meeting in Canberra, they said they would

seek the inclusion of more grades of wheat in the pricing agreement and better procedures for reviewing freight rates used in calculating minimum prices.

In London next month the proposal will be put before the price review committee set up under the arrangement, which includes representatives of wheat importing countries as well as exporters.

Represented at the Canberra meeting were the United States, Canada, Australia, Argentina and the Common Market nations.

The arrangement, formulated during the Kennedy Round meetings in May 1967, came into operation July 1.

It sets a minimum rate at which various grades of wheat can be sold by its members.

The major cause of its weakness was that it was formulated at a time when demand was outstripping supply, but in the 14 months during which it came into operation supply caught up and passed demand.

At a press conference after the meeting, the U.S. delegation leader, John A. Schnittker, undersecretary of agriculture, said that despite the tight market outlook, exporters would not lower prices and the arrangement would hold together. He said exporters had achieved a united front, although the meeting was not free of some argument about individual pricing policies.

He said the U.S. was surprised about low prices at which French wheat had been offered in Japan, but added that the U.S. also had problems with some of its merchants who sold below the minimum.

## Medicare Clients Must Pay More

The secretary of health, education and welfare has announced a 10 per cent increase in the amount patients will pay for hospitalization under Medicare.

HEW Secretary Wilbur J. Cohen said that patients, effective Jan. 1, would pay the first \$44 of their hospital bill instead of the present \$40.

Cohen told the national convention of the American Hospital Association that the increase was necessary because of rising hospital costs.

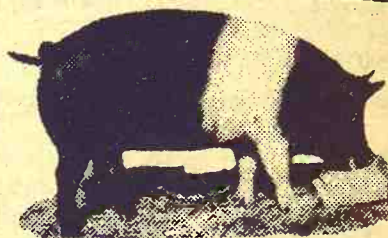

## Banks Are Major Farm Lenders

Kansas banks pushed their farm loan totals to an all-time high last year, the Kansas Bankers Assn. says.

A total of \$632,095,000 was loaned to Kansas farmers at the close of 1967, an increase of more than 8 per cent over the previous year.

Banks were providing farmers with more credit than any

others lenders at the beginning of the year, the association said. All but 13 of the 600 insured commercial banks in Kansas were making loans to farmers, the report showed.

The total included \$558,586,000 in production loans, an increase of 8 per cent over 1966, and \$73,509,000 in farm mortgages, up 11 per cent from the previous year.

"Bankers in Kansas are conscious of the large capital investments required in agriculture today and are making a

concerted effort to meet the changing demands of the state's farmers," Max Dickerson, Kansas City, chairman of the KBA Agricultural Committee, said.

## Cholera Showing In Nebraska

LINCOLN, Nebr. — The state veterinarian, Dr. S. H. Flora, has announced that Nebraska's long period of freedom from hog cholera outbreaks has been terminated by the confirmation of five cases, which have occurred this week in the Superior and York areas.

Flora stated that more than six hundred and thirty hogs were involved in the five herds.

Details with regard to the possible source of infection are being investigated by the federal and state officials.

There is no evidence to date, according to Flora, that any imported swine are involved. Infected herds have been depopulated, and increased surveillance has been instituted in the areas to prevent further spread of the infection.

Farmers in the area are urged to report any sickness in their herds to their local veterinarians.

## No To MoPac Request For Mobile Agencies

Kansas Corporation Commission (KCC) said recently it had denied a Missouri Pacific Railroad Co. application for authority to establish mobile agencies in Kansas.

Dale Saffels, KCC chairman,

said the railroad failed to prove that the mobile agency plan would provide reasonably efficient and sufficient service to the public.

Under the mobile agency plan, traveling trucks or railroad cars would serve as freight agencies for the railroad.

He also said the public convenience and necessity would not be served by establishment of mobile agencies in the state.

In denying the application,

Saffels said, KCC adopted the report of Judge Perry Owsley, special examiner for the 12 area hearings which include 20 routes and involved 110 towns and communities in the state.

Local agents conduct business of the railroad at convenience

of shippers. Under the mobile agency plan, business of the railroad would be conducted at convenience of the Missouri Pacific, Saffels said.

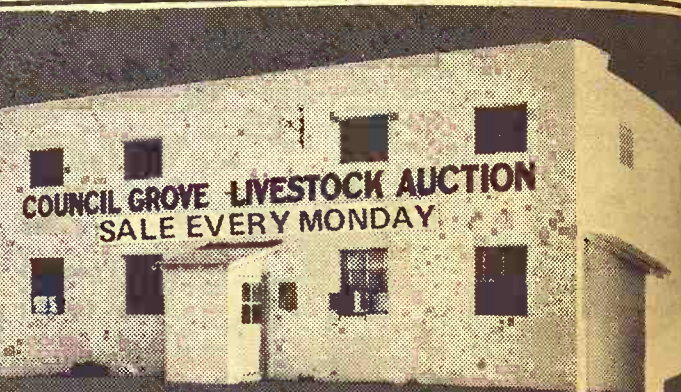

# Bigger Yields Offsetting Acreage Controls

Agriculture department statistics show larger yields per acre for some crops are offsetting tighter government programs.

Average yields of corn, wheat, oats, rye, rice and soybeans are expected to set records this year, while those of sorghum

grain and barley are estimated at near-records.

But, the USDA says, total corn output is expected to be down only 2 per cent from last year despite an acreage reduction of 7.5 per cent.

Wheat production is forecast up 5 per cent, with acreage

down 5 per cent; sorghum grain up 3 per cent, with acreage down 6 per cent; rye up fractionally, with acreage down 5 per cent; oats up 20 per cent,

acreage up only 11; soybeans up 11 per cent, acreage up 3; barley up 15 per cent; acreage up only 9; and rice up 23 per cent, with acreage up 20 per cent.

The USDA has announced a cut in the national allotment for wheat acreage under the 1969 program from 59,300,000 acres this year to 51,600,000.

Details of the feed grains program haven't been announced, but the USDA indicated last week that farmers participating in the 1969 program probably will be asked to take a higher percentage of their feed-base acreage from production, possibly as much as 25 per cent compared with 20 per cent this year.

## Scotts Get Their Pasture Road

JUNCTION CITY — A 5-year dispute between a Geary County farm couple and the Kansas Highway Commission over their landlocked pasture caused by construction of I-70 has been settled.

Mr. and Mrs. Melvin Scott signed an agreement requesting the Shawnee County District Court, Topeka, to dismiss a \$90,000 suit against the state.

The highway commission has agreed to build a one-mile, all-weather access road from the McDowell Creek interchange of I-70 to the Scott's pasture. It will also serve pasture of three other landowners, who were not a party to the suit.

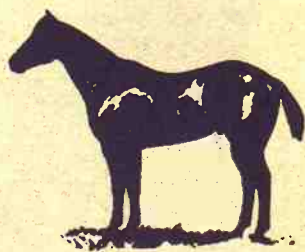
Geary County will construct the road and will be reimbursed by the state for construction, right-of-way and other costs.

# 'Both Sides Get Hurt By Current Laws'

Present U.S. beef import laws now are hurting both domestic producers and exporters from other countries, said Bill House of Cedar Vale, Ks., president of American National Cattlemen's Association. He commented on the action of New Zealand in curtailing shipments to the United States.

His comments came in a statement issued from the association's headquarters in Denver. House said that cattlemen of New Zealand and Australia were faced with at least two months without a major export market which undoubtedly would affect their prices. His sympathy, however, was not entirely with the foreign cattlemen.

"Their painful position," House said, "parallels the problem faced in earlier months of this year by U.S. cattlemen when excessive imports were being dumped on our shores." The United States has a quota law that limits total beef imports for any one year. The cattlemen's association long has been insisting that the limits should be by the month or seasons.

Particularly, the U.S. cattlemen complain about imports which are "bunched" in any one period and thus become an unusual bearish factor in American markets.

The cattlemen's association had word that both New Zealand and Australia had determined to halt all beef shipments to the United States for the rest of this year — except those already on the seas. Beef imports this year have been running, to date, at a record rate.

"Self-imposed reduction of domestic beef tonnage during this period of extra-heavy imports was the only factor that saved domestic producers from disaster," House asserted.

The association president cited the fact that shipments of beef now on the way by ship will likely keep market channels full through October, and probably into November. This, historically, is a period of heavy cow

marketings by domestic cattlemen which will give an adequate supply of the same type beef at a competitive price, he added.

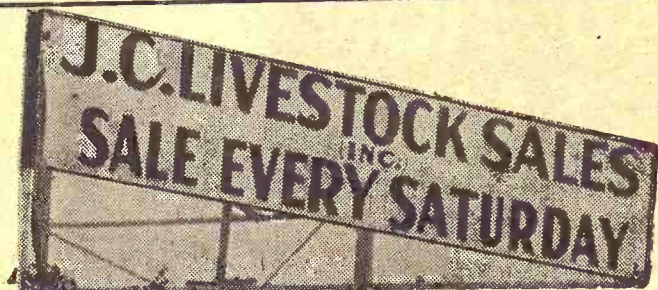

# Aussies, New Zealand Cut Beef Exports Into U.S.

New Zealand and Australia intend to reduce exports of beef during the balance of the year, taking some of the pressure off the U.S. cattle market this fall.

The restriction was voluntary on the part of the two main exporters of beef to the United States.

Cattlemen had been complain-

ing about the rising volume of beef imports because of the adverse effect on their operations.

The estimate in June was that 935 million pounds would be imported this year, still below the 1045 million pounds that would automatically trigger import quotas. The next estimate is due to be made later this month.

However, actual imports of beef for the first seven months of this year amounted to 543 million pounds — 16 percent more than for the same period last year.

Cattlemen, never satisfied with the compromise Congress made in August 1964, in setting a world-wide quota, are now insisting that changes be made. They are against imports alto-

gether, saying the U.S. can feed its own and that foreign countries ought to be sending their beef elsewhere — where the needs are greater.

They talk of a month-by-month

quota, rather than an annual one. However, there has been little talk in Congress about the problem.
