

### **Extra Feedlot** Weights Attract **Meat Imports**

DES MOINES, Iowa - Every pound of excess weight added to a steer in a feedlot attracts another pound of imported lean beef, a livestock industry leader declared here.

John H. Guthrie, president of the American National Cattlemen's Assn., in a talk prepared for the annual convention of the Iowa Beef Producers Assn., said:

"For months we have urged feeders to avoid piling on extra pounds in hopes the market will turn upwards shortly. Meanwhile our excessive tonnage gives an excuse for U.S. importers to argue that they must bring in additional lean meat to blend with our extra trimmings."

Guthrie, a feeder and rancher near Porterville, Calif., told the Iowa stockmen that "overfinishing any place in the country creates imbalances in the total beef supply, some of which the modern feeding industry can correct by its own selfdiscipline in finishing and orderly marketing."

Guthrie warned that the feeding industry might be creating a "monster" because "any animal capable of being fed is being bought for feeding. Instead of allowing it to go directly to

slaughter as lean beef to fill our big hamburger and processingmeat demand."

He pointed out, however, that increasing labor costs in American packing plants meant a decreasing demand for processing beef here. "Our packers simply cannot pay the high labor costs for boning and compete with the low labor inputs of imported products.

"We could literally give the packers a lean animal and they still could not compete," Guthrie said. "The only way they could be competitive in the markets for lean animals would be for the entire cattle price level to rise, but this does not look likely if feeders continue to overfeed their cattle."

# Here's April Price Forecast

Kansas livestock men have the best price prospects for April, according to the Market Forecast report issued this week by Kansas State University agricultural economists.

Wheat is another product that should enjoy a good month price-wise.

The situation by commodities is as follows:

LAMBS - Steady to Slightly Higher. Some seasonal increase as quality improves

FEEDER CATTLE - Steady to Slightly Higher. Slight seasonal increase as grass season approaches.

HOGS — Steady to Slightly Higher. Good demand, higher quality, and declining receipts may bring some help.

WHEAT - Steady to Slightly Higher.

Continued dry weather and increased foreign food needs spur price prospects.

FED CATTLE - Steady. Large receipts and heavy weights will prevent much upward trend.

CORN, GRAIN SORGHUMS, AND SOYBEANS - Steady. Weather is critical factor. Greater acreage to be seeded in 1967.

SOYBEAN MEAL - Steady to Slightly Lower. Weather is critical factor.

EGGS - Slightly Lower. Continued high production during the next several weeks.

ALFALFA HAY --- Slightly Lower. Weather is critical factor.

GRADE A AND MANUFACTURING MILK - Slightly Lower. Normal seasonal price drop as production increases.



# Half Million To Surface Quarter Of Turnpike

The Kansas Turnpike has received low bids of \$485,085 for resurfacing more than onefourth of the 236-mile turnpike. A major part of the turnpike southward from Topeka will be involved in the work. In addition plans call for several miles of overlay and spot work on the 60 miles between Topeka and Kansas City, Kansas.

# First Hog, Then Beef Improvement

In recent months, hog prices have been lower than we expected. The principal reason: Farmers sent far more hogs to market than they reported on government surveys. Let's look at the record — as shown in the quarterly Pig Crop Reports, and hog slaughter:

In June of last year, reports from farmers to the USDA showed a spring pig crop of 47 million head, 10 percent more than in 1965; in ten Corn-Belt states, farmers had 45 million hogs and pigs on hand, only 7 percent more than a year earlier.

In September, farmers in the ten Corn Belt states reported 46 million hogs and pigs on hand — again, only 7 percent more than a year before.

The December Pig Crop Report showed a fall pig-crop total of 39.8 million head, 9 percent more than a year before. And it showed an inventory of hogs and pigs on hand December 1 totaling 55.1 million, also 9 percent more than a year earlier.

Slaughter Rates Up. Now, check slaughter. The August kill was 9 percent more than in 1965; September, up 8 percent; October, up 12 percent; and November, up.7 percent. Up to that time, slaughter was in line with expectations, based on the Pig Crop Reports.

But a big change appeared in December. That month, commercial hog slaughter was 28 percent greater than the year

before. January slaughter was up even more — 33 percent. February was about 22 percent over the level of the year before.

Other Factors Helped Depress Prices. During the last 5 months of 1966, beef output was up about 6 percent from the previous year. January output topped the previous-year figure by 8 percent; February was up about 13 percent.

The production of poultry meat during the last 5 months of 1966 topped the level of the previous year by 11 percent. January production was up about 9 percent.


Imports of meats also increased during 1966 — up about 26 percent from the previous 12 months. (They totaled 1273 million pounds for the year. At the same time, poultry output was 8811 million pounds and red meats — beef, pork, veal, lamb and mutton — totaled 32,095 million pounds.)


Housewives March. Last fall a small number of housewives staged protests about what they called "the high prices of meats and other foods." Their actions and the resulting publicity undoubtedly made many women overly sensitive about meat prices. When they trimmed their purchases, prices had to be marked down in order to move the meat farmers were bringing to market each week.

More recently, some factory workers have been laid off, and there has been some talk of a possible business recession. Families have cut their spending and increased their saving. Some business firms have been having economy drives — tightening up on such things as expense accounts for officials and salesmen.

In summary — all major livestock price-making factors have been unfavorable in recent months. At least some of them (notably beef output) should become less bearish during the remainder of this year. We expect moderate price improvement — first for hogs, later for cattle.



# Farm Debt Pacing Income Gains

PRATT — At a Pratt County Farmers Union meeting last week, Republican Rep. Bob Dole, a member of the House Committee on Agriculture, said. "What is especially alarming in agriculture is the increase which occurred in farm debt.

According to the President's economic report, combined real estate and other debt of farmers increased \$4.2 billion during 1966 (from \$41.6 to \$45.8). This works out to an average of \$1220 increased indebtedness per farm, whereas the real dollar increase in net income per farm amounted to only \$323.

Naturally some farmers would be willing to endure additional indebtedness when incurred under a program of investment calculated to improve future net income from expanded or more efficient farm operations. However, the record over the past six years does not reveal improvement in net income commensurate with increased indebtedness.


"The accumulated net income per farm improvement over 1960 for the past six years amounted to \$5290. At the same time, net indebtedness per farm increased \$4540, leaving a net income excess of only \$750 for the six-year period," Dole said.

"It is recognized that while farm debt has been going up, farm equity has been going up even more. But most of this increased equity represents inflated farm land values. Although these may offer a source of comfort to farm land owners, the fact remains that the farmers must still pay off indebtedness. Without adequate net income to do so, he is left with no choice except to liquidate some of his equity or go out of business.

"Looking at the farm economy as a whole, net farm income (in terms of inflated dollars rather than real dollars) increased by \$900 million. At the same time, total farm debt increased by \$4.2 billion. And almost all (\$820 million) of the \$900 million increase came from increased federal government payments to farmers — not farm improvement in the market prices of their products.

Congressman Dole also added, "Under the Administration's inflationary policies, costs of farm production increased \$2.5 billion during 1966; farm land prices went up an average 8 per cent.



> In an open letter to the secretary of agriculture, Robert C. Liebenow called for a corn crop of 5 billion bushels. He demanded that cooperating farmers be required to reduce their base acreage of corn no more than 10 per cent, instead of the 20 per cent now called for to qualify for price support loans. Immediate action to increase corn acreage is imperative, Liebenow said, "to avert what threatens to disastrous shortages and a resultant catastrophe." He accused the Department of Agriculture of using "legerdemain"

in estimating this year's corn crop at 4.6 billion bushels.

"To predict a corn yield of 4.6 billion bushels in 1967 the department had to assume an average yield of 77 bushels an acre," Liebenow said. "Amazingly enough, this is 3.2 bushels per acre above the highest yield on record which was 73.8 bushels per acre in 1965." In 1966 the yield per acre was only 72.1 bushels.

The Department of Agriculture has eliminated payments to farmers for voluntary diversion of acreage in feed grains but the 20 per cent cut of base acreage remains. Policy makers for the department apparently fear the depressing effect on prices that returning presently idle acres to cultivation might have.

Liebenow was not the first to warn against the consequences of a short corn crop this year. Herbert J. Waters, assistant administrator of the Agency for International Development who heads its office of war on hunger, said earlier this month that "it is evident that there must be a marked increase in production of feed grains."

Aside from the need for feed grains in U.S. foreign aid programs, he said, commercial demands at home and a raising export requirement indicate a significant increase in production. "Otherwise, rather drastic cuts will have to be made in utilization rather than for foreign assistance," Waters told the American Meat Institute earlier this month.

In his letter, Liebenow said, "The department is gambling on the most favorable set of circumstances possible in estimat-



The "Pigs for Peace" committee at Downs was notified by the U.S. Air Force that it couldn't furnish transportation as agreed.

Dan Vander Giesen, chairman, said the government explained that escalation of the war has taken all priority on Air Force aircraft.

So the 108 white hogs were sold last week at auction at the Vander Giesen farm near Downs. Included were purebred Yorkshire and other good breeding stock.

Instead of sending the pigs, the committee will send the money from the sale to Vietnam to buy pigs there and give them to needy farmers. The pigs — 98 of them are

bred gilts expected to farrow in May - represented approximately a \$7000-\$8000 investment, said Jim Finley, son of the former Downs minister who started the idea.

Finley thought it possible the sale of the pigs would bring in more money than the \$7000-\$8000 estimated value because "those pigs were picked as the best out of about 10 different herds of hogs, and the owners had lowered the price for the People-to-People project.

#### He Can't Spill Anyone's Milk

PAOLA - An NFO member can hold milk from his own farm from the market but he can't spill someone else's.

So said a Miami County judge last week to F. Gordon Miller, 29, of Stilwell, Ks. Miller was accused of dumping 1500 gallons milk from a truck and was convicted of maliciously destroying the property of another. He was fined \$116.75 and sentenced to 60 days in jail, then released on six months parole.

Miller was arrested after Olin Crotchett, driver of the truck, complained his path on a country road was blocked by a pickup truck and that 1500 gallons of milk were dumped from the truck he was driving. The milk truck was owned by the Greater Kansas City Pure Milk Producers Association.

force, but its own 200 million population, 60 million in India and 100 million in other parts of the world.

The fantastic food production record in this country is dramatized by the observation that the American farmer can now produce more before breakfast than he could in an entire day 30 years ago.

The political leverage inherent in this situation is focused on two surces - the underdeveloped countries which because of their population explosions, look to this country for help, and the Communist nations which are woefully inept in agriculture despite all their boastings that their system is the wave of the future.

For example, well-informed quarters in Washington believe that one of the greatest deterrents to Red China intervening in the war in Vietnam is its severe food crisis.

Fod shortages are developing on Mainland China following another poor crop year.

China already has purchased more than 4 million tons of wheat for delivery in 1966 and 1967 and it appears likely that total imports for this period will at least equal the 6 million ton level of recent years.

In addition, Red China spends about 40 percent of its foreign exchange on imports of fertilizer which it gets mostly from Japan and Western Europe.

Thus if Peking becomes involved in a major war, Japan and Western Europe as American allies certainly would cut off the supply of fertilizer to the Chinese mainland which would precipitate a major domestic crisis.

The pinch on China is evident by the fact that it must feed 750 million persons with production from about the same amount of land that this country uses.

The sharpest challenge to this country is what to do about feeding India where demands for food continue to grow.

It is no secret that the United States is disenchanted with the poor job India has done in procuring fertilizer, a key element in the production of food.

Several American companies have been asked to build fertilizer plants in India but they all turned down the request with the explanation that they got burned badly on previous ventures there.

It is estimates there will be another billion people in the world by 1980 or 1982.

It is obvious that the United States alone can't meet this challenge on supplying food.

One big reason for the soaring exports is an income explosion in Europe and Japan, says L. Orlo Sorenson, associate professor of economics at Kansas State University. More than 70 percent of our dollar exports and approximately 54 percent of total exports of agricultural commodities in 1965-66 went to these areas.

Per capita income in Japan and Europe has risen sharply during the post 10 years, he says. The result has been a growing demand for food products. Dietary shifts to more animal products require an increase in food grain imports. The growth in commercial exports of feed grains and oilseed products from the U.S. reflects an increase in this kind of demand. USDA figures provide numerous examples of expanded agricultural imports by countries with rising per capita income. In 1960, Spain imported about \$65 million worth of U.S. farm products, almost entirely under food-for-peace programs. By 1965, Spanish imports had doubled. Virtually all these sales were through commercial channels. Per capita income in the country increased from \$290 to \$517 during the period. The USDA points out that foreign countries increased their imports of U.S. agricultural products about 11 percent for each 10 percent increase in per capita income between 1938 and 1961. While commercial exports have skyrocketed, yearly sales under government financed programs, particularly Public Law 480, have hovered near the \$1.6 billion figure since 1956. In fact, shipments under aid programs in 1965-66 were down almost \$40 million from a year earlier. A new trend in U.S. agricultural exports during recent


years has been the shift in the destination of aid shipments. Half of our food-for-peace ex ports went to Europe in 1955, for example, compared to only 10 percent in 1965. Japan, an important recipient of PL-480 shipments in 1955, is now entirely a cash importer of U.S. farm products.

Countries in the Near East and Asia received less than 20 percent of our food-for-peace shipments in 1955. These nations accounted for more than 60 percent of total aid shipments 10 years later.

The veterinarians have been at their tedious task two and one half years. So far they have confirmed that an abnormally high white blood cell count is one reason to suspect leukemia. But methods must be found to. discover the disease earlier.

For example, the research has shown that cattle with normal blood count can have hidden leukemia which doesn't show up until too late.

Recently we slaughtered nine cattle believed to be negative in signs of leukemia" Dr. Coles says. "Postmortem examination revealed five had cancers in their kidneys. We are missing something. So we are now working on other methods of identifying leukemic animals."

Some of the new research approaches:

 Leukemic cells from animals' blood or lymph fluids are examined under electron microscopes for identification of virus-like particles.

Attention was first called to the leukemic herd in 1964 following complaints by its Southeast Kansas owner that the cows lacked appetite. Investigation revealed no nutritional deficiencies. Then it was discovered the animals had a high incidence of leukemia. About 20 of the original herd of 50 was infected.

Here was a research "gold mine" that Dr. Coles and his colleagues immediately recognized. The university purchased the herd and isolated it for study.

The herd has other unusual advantages. It has been a closed herd for 18 years. Complete breeding and production records since 1949 are available. Artificial insemination has been used exclusively since 1959 with the herd.





# Wrong Figures **Cool Cattle Prospect**

months. **USDA's Statistical Reporting** Service originally estimated total cattle on farms on January 1, 1967, at 104.5 million. The revised estimate placed the number at approximately 108.5 million

The revision was made on the basis of data obtained from the 1964 Census of Agriculture and other data which have become available since the original estimates were made.



In short, there were more cattle than previously estimated.

Thus, anticipated price increases are unlikely during the

next 60 to 90 days. The effect of the new estimate will dampen any undue optimism that may have existed earlier in the year. With more beef cows on farms this year, we can expect a larger calf crop. Thus, feeder cattle prices will not reach previously predicted levels.

There were 7 percent more cattle on feed January 1, 1967, than a year earlier. Thus, farmers can look for fed cattle prices to continue weak for the next 60 to 90 days before showing improvement. Prices of feeder cattle and calves may show some strength this spring, but no great rise is expected.

Calf Crop Alters Spring Cow Care

ing about the 1968 spring calf crop, says Herman Westmeyer. Extension livestock specialist at Kansas State University.

The 60 to 90 day period after a cow calves in the most critical period during the year for the cow.

During this period, the cow must maintain her body, provide milk for the calf she is nursing, repair her reproductive system, and become safely incalf for another year. Proper nutrition is extremely important during this period, Westmeyer says.

A 1000-pound cow nursing a calf requires 28 pounds of feed daily. supplying 16.8 pounds of total digestible nutrients, 2.3 pounds total protein, 30 grams calcium, 23 grams phosphorus, and 42,000 international units of Vitamin A.

Factors such as the cow's condition after calving, her age, the severity of the weather, and the available shelter make it desirable to feed more or less than these suggested amounts, West-

after calving, conception rate is lower and the calves will come later in the season. This cuts profits because late calves weigh less when they are sold

cows do not get enough feed

for feeders. It is not desirable to keep beef cows fat, but they should be kept in vigorous condition, West meyer says. Following calving, they should be fed enough to start gaining weight.

First calf heifers and young cows should be fed more than mature cows because they require feed for growth in addition to maintenance.

Cowmen should be sure their bull power is good enough to insure a profitable breeding season. A good rule of thumb for mating stock is one mature bull for 25 to 30 cows. Yearling and 2-year old bulls should have no more than 15 and 25 cows, respectively.

Subject the bulls to a semen check prior to turnout, Westmeyer says.







### Debate On **Crossbreed** Gain

A debate on purebred cattle vs. crossbreeds sparked the fifth anual convention of the Oklahoma Hereford Breeders' Association at Tulsa.

Charles E Ball, editor of Farm Journal, said Texas cattlemen have been realizing 5 per cent heavier gains from crossing Herefords and Angus and cited one example of calves from a Charolais-Angus strain averaging an extra 72 pounds at weaning time.

"Beef people are passing up a chance for a 20 to 25 per cent increase in pounds of gain," Ball said.

Dr. Rufus Cox of the Animal Husbandry Department at Kansas State University took sharp issue with the advocates of crossbreeding.

Any gains' made from crossbreeding, Cox said, fade out after one generation.

"This is nothing new," Cox said. "We've had cycles or waves of enthusiasm for crossbreeding for the last 125 years. The crossbreeder needs a 17 or 18 per cent premium on his cattle just to break even."

Cox said crossing purebreds might produce a short term gain, but after the second or third generation it would destroy years of progress made in the beef industry.


