



day he entered the hog business. On his eighth birthday, his only pig farrowed a litter of eight. Today the Newton farmer owns one of Kansas' top swine operations.

Because of his contributions to the industry, Gronau has been named Kansas' Pork All American for 1972, his selection coming from a list of nominees submitted to the Kansas Pork Producers Coundil.

The Kansas State University graduate and wife Carol moved their swine operation to a new location on the outskirts of Newton in 1964.

In eight years, they have built an efficient, modern facility revolving around a purebred operation that includes four breeds - Yorkshire, Duroc, Chester White, and Hampshire.

and overhead feed delivery system, it's a streamlined operation. Soon to be completed is a boar testing unit. One hundred twenty sows are

farrowed twice each year on the Gronau farm, with litters averaging 9.1 weaned and 8.8 marketed. An equal number is leased out, supplying the Gronau operation with additional pigs.

Nearly 1,180 acres of land is farmed to supply the grain source for the operation.

The four breeds are used in a crossbreeding program that produces the farm's largest commodity - the crossbred gilt. "Of course, we can also supply customers with the purbred boar," explains Gronau.

Selection of breeding stock is Gronau's No. 1 priority. Records are kept on mothering and milking ability. This information is incorporated with data compiled from Kansas State University's on-farm testing porgram on age, loin eye and back fat.

Gronau (pronounced grow-now) purchases boars from test stations

his boar battery includes an expensive performance tested Yorkshire purchased from the Kansas Pork Producers Council test station at Manhattan. The top indexing boar required only 155 days to reach 220 pounds, and had a loin eye of 5.66 and .72 back fat.

Here is a brief description of some of the Gronau facilities:

Farrowing Unit - Consists of an 18 by 56 foot controlled environment house built over a 70 by 120 foot lagoon for waste handling. It has 22 crates and slatted floors. The insulated structure is ventilated with air-flow fans and magnetically controlled windows. Heat lamps are used on baby pigs. Sows remain in the crates, where feeders and

waterers are mounted on the floor to allow for easy access. Nursery Unit - This 18 by 36 foot aluminum floor structure also sits over lagoon. Nursery is divided into four pens equipped with a feeder and

two waterers. "We refer to the nursery unit as a miracle house," laughs Gronau. "Our pigs, which are kept here until they reach 70 to 80 pounds, really

seem to do good in this building." Finishing Unit - Consists of two buildings, one that is 30 by 120 feet over a 100 by 150 lagoon, and another that is 34 by 80 feet.

The larger building has 10 concrete pens, each with a 12-door

watering system. The pens have a six-foot slatted floor area over lagoon for waste handling.

The smaller building has eight pens built similarly to those in the larger house. Outside 64-foot long dirt pens can be opened up during dry periods for exercise. This unit is used primarily for breeding stock.

Sow Housing Units — These six structures, each with 24-head capacity, are arranged wagon-wheel fashion into individual sow feeding stalls. The sows are fed individually in a central feeding area, although each pen is easily accessible and

"We have experienced feed costs from 9.8 cents per pound to 12.9 cents per pound gain, depending on the season of the year and the price of ingredients," says Gronau.

Gronau's market hogs are sold mainly on a grade and yield basis to a packing company headquartered in Kansas. Most of his hogs are marketed at 210 to 230 pounds, with market age ranging from 150 to 165 days to 200 pounds.

"With farrowings at least every two months, it is possible to ship hogs nearly every week," says Gronau. "More than two of every three hogs we market go as number ones. Participation in barrow shows last year indicated to me that our breeding efforts are paying off."

Prevention of health problems gets a lot of attention on the Gronau farm. Clean, dry quarters with proper ventilation is a must, says Don. In the vaccination program he starts with iron shots for the baby pigs and follows with Erysipelas its attractive new house located on shots.

One reason Gronau is so health conscious is that while in the army he was graduated from the veterinary school at Walter Reed Medical Research Center in Washington, D.C.

Serving in the Veterinary Corps while in the army allowed Gronau to pick up some knowledge about animals that otherwise would have required years to obtain.

The Gronaus have three children - Veronica, Steve, and Melisa. Mrs. Gronau is the former Carol Kater of Newton.

"Melisa was born the day I left for military service in 1968," recalls Gronau. (His National Guard unit was called to active duty for two years.) "That left Carol to take care of three children and the entire hog operations. She did a fantastic job."

Just a few days before Don left for the service, the family moved into the farm.



Roof Water Can **Cause Wet Basements**


Roof water can contribute to wet basement walls in or near the corner basements. Through improper installation or poor maintenance, downspouts attached to gutters can place all of the roof water beside the basement wall.

Approximately 374 gallons of water will fall on a roof area of 1,200 square feet during a half-inch rain. Much of this water can make its way into basements through cracks and joints in the wall after falling from the roof.

Dale Schindler, Extension architect at Kansas State University, points out that if downspouts connected to an underground pipe that takes roof water away from the house become clogged, the water will saturate soil around the basement.

A clogged downspout or underground pipe will also cause gutters to overflow.

Downspouts are usually placed at an outside corner of the house. If



What Vegetable?

"A thistle-like, herbaceous perennial with strong, prickly, deeply-cut leaves and large terminal heads of violet, blue or white flowers." It's the artichoke! This vegetable is harvested before the flower heads bloom. "Fronds d'artichauts" were Catherine de Medici's favorite dish, and gourmets have shared her preference for artichokes ever since. It is permissible to eat this vegetable with the fingers, plucking off each petal and dipping it in a savory sauce such as hollandaise, Bechamel, or melted butter with a dash of fresh lemon juice. The most desirable artichokes are compact, plump, heavy in relation to size, somewhat globular, with large fleshy, tightly clinging green leaf scales. Green color helps show freshness.

Fresh Fruits, Vegetables Are Low In Calories

bins at your supermarket and you'll find them. . . crisp, juicy, appetizing. Fish Farmers See Progress

HUTCHINSON-State legislation passed in 1971 has helped the commercial fish industry of the state, said Vernon Krehbiel, vice president of Kansas Commercial Fish Growers Association.

The law is designed to head off the poaching of fish from the ponds of commercial fish growers, said the Pretty Prairie fish grower, called one of the cofounders of the commercial fishing industry in Kansas. The law states:

"Possession of fish in on or about a private water fishing impoundment shall constitute prima facie evidence that such fish have been removed from such impoundment." "The new law contradicts a

previous belief that the fish belongs to whoever could catch them,' Krehbiel said. "It's a break for the Kansas commercial fish growers. "The commercial fishing industry

is the fastest growing farm enterprise in Kansas. Many new developments in the field are explosive." He referred to selective breeding and hybridization with other species of catfish.

"Things are getting off the ground for fish farming in Kansas," said Walter Clarke, Great Bend, retired president.

"Far-Mar-Co is making studies on the feasibility of putting in a processing plant," said Dr. Wayne E. Henry, research director of Far-Mar-Co Inc. research center, where 57 commercial fish growers from Kansas, Nebraska and Missouri met recently.

The growers heard research reports from Kansas State University faculty members Clifford Pappas, Dr. Jean Caul, Dr. C. W. Deyoe and Pat Murphy.

Pappas said the addition of calcium and phosphorous to the feed gets more efficient feeding levels from the fish and affects the growth rate.

Caul cautioned fish growers to watch fish flavors. The addition of oxygen to the water after harvest would tend to remove the muddy flavor

"Fish will taste like what they eat and where they live," she said.

Murphy cited the problem of fish manure absorbing oxygen in the pond and recommended removing the manure before putting ponds back into production.

Deyoe cited tests to show that 25 per cent protein feeds bring the best feed conversions.

A tour of a controlled spawning research project at the Hutchinson Kansas Power and Light generating plant was conducted by Prof. Ralph Lipper of KSU Agricultural Engineering Department.

'Raising the temperature of water to 80 degrees by injecting warmer water from the plant into the pool has stepped up the spawning

needed amino acids, central amino acids must be obtained from food.

But vegetation protein such as wheat and soybeans vary in quality because of the amount and kind of amino acids present. That's where food complements can benefit producers and consumers, says Henry. Through advancements in food technology, the more desirable qualities of wheat and soy protein can be combined, thus providing better nutrition to the consumer and creating a new usable product from less desirable meat and fat.

"In no way are we going to replace steak," Henry emphasized. "We can't hurt the livestock man, but we can be a help by complementing his product."

Meat protein is of excellent quality, he pointed out, but some meat contains high levels of fat, some as high as 50 percent. Fat doesn't contain protein, but it contributes highly to the juiciness and flavor of meat.

"Through food technology, we are able to build the fat portion up with textured vegetable protein, primarily soy protein, and provide a finished product that tastes good, is nutritious and provides relatively low calories. In addition, we can process wheat protein along with other cereal proteins to produce flavor enhancers which bring out the desirable aroma and flavor of

foods," he said. Imported beef is a case in point. Millions of pounds of low fat beef go into canned goods, and most of this beef is imported. This imported beef is cheaper than domestic - both in price and quality. Imported beef has little fat - its meat is thin and stringy, not suitable for steaks, roasts or other quality cuts.

"You can't make imported beef into steaks because it would be as tasteless and tough as a desk," he said.

"They're way ahead of wheat producers," he said. "Wheat has 25 years of catching up to do what they are doing."

FAR-MAR-CO has taken a giant step forward for wheat producers in a battle to increase wheat utilization in food processing and industrial usages, Henry claims.

"We're unique and probably the first in removing components from the wheat berry while maintaining the nutritional and biological value of the product," Henry said. The firm has applied for patents.

In the past, there was no way to remove the components economically, he said.

Henry believes these components will have tremendous value to the United States

"We are a snack-eating country and most of our snack foods have little protein value," he said. "We have a lot of work to do in this field to try to make snacks nutritionally sound. We have to make it nutritious so that consumers will get good nutrition in spite of themselves."

The use of good food complements could also boost the nutritional value of cereal breakfast foods, which have been criticized recently.

Henry defended the cereal industry to a degree, saying, "It's a matter of evloution. Breakfast cereal processors found that American liked cereals and they just assumed the nutritional value found in grain was still there in their product."

Indian Claim On Idle Campus

ST. MARYS - A band of Pottawatomie Indians think that they have a claim to 320 acres of the St. Marys College campus. The property has belonged to the Jesuit Society since the 1960s.

The Missouri Province of the Jesuits closed the campus in 1967. It had served as a training center for priests before that. Prior to that an undergraduate college operated until 1931.

The Indian claim, made in a newsletter of the Prairie Band of the Pottawatomie Indians, many of whom live northeast of here, is based on a contention that the Indians never agreed to a treaty in 1868 in which the Jesuits acquired title to the land.

The Pottawatomies came to Kansas in 1838 from Indiana, first settling in the southeast part of the state. They later settled along Mission Creek south of the Kansas River. The Jesuits started a Mission School for Indians there in 1848.

The newsletter, called the Prairie Band Drummer, outlines plans for the area if they should gain title to the land and buildings. These include a manufacturing plant, food processing plant and slaughter house, tribal farm, feedlot, tree nursery and game reserve.

Plans also include an educational program for pre-school children, college-age people, and oder adults. The Pottawatomie envision an Indian language center, Research Center, Museum and Indian National Conference and seminar conference.

CRACKER JACKS EATEN FOR 100 YEARS







Algae A Source Of Protein Feed?

Michael Aitken, a 21-year-old St. John, Kansas, scientist, believes development of the proper strain of algae could revolutionize livestock and feeding and even be a source of inexpensive protein for the world's undernourished.

Aitken has formed a corporation to perfect methods of growing and using algae as livestock and human foodstuffs.

"I think it is entirely feasible to feed cattle a ration of algae combined with straw and other non-nutritional roughage at a cost per pound of gain considerably under present methods," he said.

Animal waste disposal at feedlots can be solved with algae, he said. Wastes from 1,000 head of cattle, drained into a lagoon, would provide nutrient for enough algae to keep the same 1,000 head of cattle fed.

"Of course, with this type of feeding, we probably won't be able to feed livestock grain or alfalfa anything that contains protein," Aitken said.

Algae have a somewhat fishy taste that livestock find palatable but it could be processed to make it completely tasteless, which probably would be desireable for use

as human food, he said.

Several national firms are interested in Atiken's work. "I might deal with them on various sectors of the product but I want to keep control of the entire process myself," he said.

Aitken said he chose Kansas because it "has enough sunlight and proper soil nutrients to obtain maximum growth of algae. In addition the air here is clean and algae is sensitive to air pollutants."

Aitken said he thinks the best form of algae is the African Spirulina alga, which has a protein content of from 62 to 68 per cent.

By comparison, soybeans contain 30 per cent protein on the average, beef 18 to 20 per cent, eggs 16 to 18 per cent and wheat around 10 per cent.

In the beef man's factory, the production machine is the cow. The number of cows on U.S. farms in the middle 1950's was a few less than 50 million. Today, the number is just over 50 million.

How then could the cattle industry produce so much more beef with approximately the same size "factory".

Here's the story:


The beef industry, which includes all kinds of farmers and ranchers handling cattle in any manner, operating almost constantly under a cost-price squeeze, made a big shift from dairy to beef cattle.

It should be understood that all cattle, dairy and beef, eventually go to slaughter, but the beef type animal produces more meat per head than the dairy type.

In the mid 1950's, the ratio of dairy cows to beef cows was one to one. It now is three beef cows to one dairy cow. This shift was made possible by the fact that the remaining dairy cows give so much more milk than before. The country gets all the milk it requires with far fewer milk cows. Thus, efficiency on the dairy farm has helped the beef factory.

The cattle farmer (dairy and beef), by careful operational practices, has managed over the last 15 years to increase the number of calves born from 100 cows by about five. This means that from the 50 million cows on U.S. farms, around 2.5 million more calves are available each year now than in the mid 1950s.

Once upon a time, millions upon millions of calves were slaughtered as vealers, producing carcasses of around 120 pounds. Now, almost all



Again once upon a time, millions of cattle went to market "grass fat." The boom times at the Kansas City stockyards are remembered as the days when hundreds of thousands of grass fat cattle were marketed each fall from the ranges of the Southwest.

Now all this is in the past. Virtually all cattle now are fattened (grain fed) in feedlots. Such cattle go to market at heavier weights and their carcasses dress out more



actual beef than the thinner, grass fat animals. In the mid 1950s, 10 million head of cattle were fed in feedlots annually. Last year, the number was 26 million.



Forestry Dept. **Primes Effort Toward Towns**

The Extension forestry department at Kansas State University, Manhattan, is trying to save Kansas' largest forest.

It's one that most Kansans have taken for granted-if you have ever been in the air over a Kansas community you will have noticed this forest, within the city.

Of the three types of woodland acreage in Kansas, urban forests account for approximately two million acres. Natural woodlands cover more than one and a half million acres, while planted forests account for nearly a quarter million acres.

Traditional forestry is limited primarily to eastern Kansas.

"Many people wonder why Kansas has a forestry department," Gene Gray, Extension forester, said. "Yet trees are one of Kansas' most valuable assets-proportionately more valuable because we have fewer than most other states."

Now the Extension forestry department is moving into full swing trying to help small Kansas towns improve their forests. They have created a program that will help towns establish a forestry program in their local government.

Most of the large cities realize the importance of incorporating the right trees into the city landscape and the need to care for the existing trees, Gray noted. The problem

areas are smaller towns that have no program to protect their trees. Dutch Elm Disease has made the K-State program even more important because more than 75 percent of the trees in many communities are either American Elm or Chinese Elm. This disease has been reported in almost every county in Kansas and as far west as Denver, Colo. It's just a matter of time before every community in Kansas will be faced with the problem.

"Iola, for example, used to be a. city of trees with elms forming arch-ways over its streets," Gray recalled. "Between 1962 and 1970 more than 6,000 elms in Iola fell victim to Dutch Elm Disease, leaving a beautiful city with a barren look."

The Extension forestry department can help only those towns willing to establish a forestry program in their local government, "because our job is to advise," Gray explained.

Extension foresters will investigate the budget, equipment, and organization of each town's forestry program. They will make a physical inventory of public trees, such as those along streets and in parks.

After inventory, they will make recommendations for tree removal, new varieties, landscaping, and local organization.

Sanitation, the removal of trees infected with Dutch Elm Disease, is one of the major goals. As elms are lost, new trees will take their places.

"Our goal is to put the right tree in the right place," Gray explained. "For instance, under highlines we want to plant trees that we can keep out of the wires, and over sewer lines we want trees that won't put their roots through the pipes."







Corn was worth \$1.15 per bushel, unchanged from last month but 19 cents below a year ago.



Prices were higher than in January for meat animals, wheat, hay, soybeans, and wool.


Price decreases were noted for eggs, milk, sorghum grain, barley and oats.

stituency in towns as well as farms and to organize along more regional. than county lines, Kansas State Extension has dug a spade into the ground toward these goals.

Ground has been broken in Hutchinson on a new building which will house a regional Extension office' serving 19 counties. The building is being constructed privately and will be leased to Kansas State University

Plans are for a 30-man staff. Counties served are Barber, Butler, Cowley, Dickinson, Harper, Harvey, Kingman, Lincoln, Marion, Mc-Pherson, Ottawa, Pratt, Reno, Rice, Saline, Sedgwick, Sumner and Ellsworth.

Robert Wilbeck of Hutchinson will build the facility, estimated to cost \$100,000. It will have 7200 square feet and be the first structure in a new commercial area in South Hutchinson near US 50 and K61.

Lawrence Cox of the K-State Extension staff at Manhattan will move to Hutchinson to head the new facility by July 1.

Another regional Extension facility is being built at Garden City and another building will be rented

Colby. Three farm management fieldmen already stationed at Hutchinson - Hobart Frederick, Larry Kepley, and Bill Collins — will move to the new facility at South Hutchinson. So will Hank Deutsch, a district forester, and Kenneth

McReynolds, area economist. A rural development specialist will be one of the city-orientated additions here. The specialist will handle every aspect of economic. development of communities. This will include working with city residents, citizens' committees and helping groups find national funds for local projects.

"He will work primarily with city and county officials and area planning commissions," Cox said. Funds from the National Forestry Service are available to hire a forester to work with watersheds in the area. Cox is hopeful the forester will be here around May 1.

Next in priority, but not yet. approved, is an animal science specialist. Cox said the basic income industry for the 19-county area comes from crops and livestock, creating a need for the specialist.

Two other staffers will join the area office within six months after the office opens in July.


Both will be primarily concerned with city residents' needs. An area home economist would work with programs designed for women in urban areas and work with county home economists on local programs. The same would be true for the home management specialist.





Obviously, Mayer is going to have competition for those hogs. Mauer-Neuer, Theis, and many in-state pork processors have to get their supplies. Presently Kansas is a considerable exporter of hogs, and many out-of-state processors buy in the G&G area.

What a major Oscar Mayer pork plant would seem to mean to the G&G area is a great increase in hog raising. About 80 percent of the hogs raised in the state come from the G&G area. Two strips, one horizontally along the Nebraska border and the other vertically through Marion, Wichita, and Ark City, dominate production. The southeast part of Nebraska, another part of the G&G area, is also a major pork producer.

The area of course is not insulated from production of hogs and grain outside this region, but the Oscar Mayer plant would appear to be a great economic boost for both pork and grain production in the G&G area.

Projections for the plant aim at a payroll of 700 workers at full production. This perhaps would produce a \$6 million payroll annually, another boost for G&G area farmers, who might provide some of the labor pool for the plant.

Oscar Mayer officials have talked about land purchases of considerable size — around 700 acres. Presumably a land purchase of this size for the plant would indicate that the company would irrigate and use effluent from the plant on the adjacent land as a means of pollution control.

Oscar Mayer has eight U.S. plants presently and is planning one at Dallas as well as the G&G area location. Home office is at Madison, Wisc. There is also an overseas plant at Caracas, Venezuela.

The G&G area plant would not be the largest in the company but indications are that it would handle processing of weiners, lunch cuts and bacon and perhaps supply red





through. The K18 bypass has been in the mill since late in 1969 when military authorities requested removal of the route from the reservation. The diagonal bypass from near Ogden would extend south and west, requiring a major Kaw River crossing of about 1200 feet.

It would join I-70 about five miles west of the Clark's Creek interchange on Government hill, east of Marshall Field.

The Manhattan interest in the longer bypass centers around the possibility that commercial jets might one day be used at the Manhattan airport. The 10,000-foot runways - about two miles long would be required to handle larger jets such as 727s and 707s.

The present runways at the Manhattan airport are 5500 feet and allow nothing larger than a Convair 580 jet-prop, presently regularly scheduled by Frontier Airlines. The 8000-foot runways could handle medium-range jets like the 737.

Frontier flies some pure jets but has never given any indication that it would serve the Manhattan area with them.

Farmers Union **Motion For** Family Farm Only

A new program designed to protect the family farmer has been adopted by the National Farmers Union.

The action came at the annual convention of the 250,000 family group at Houston.

Tony Dechant, Denver, who was re-elected president, said the program would permit family farms to receive direct income support and force large corporate farms to shift for themselves.

It provides for mandatory supply management in order to prevent



undue surpluses. It also would provide 100 percent of parity for family farms, based on pounds or bushels of production with the exact levels yet to be determined on the basis of an independent study by the Library of Congress and the General Accounting Office.
