Mary KTI students enjoyed attending the Consortium dances because they were a good way to meet other college students in the area.

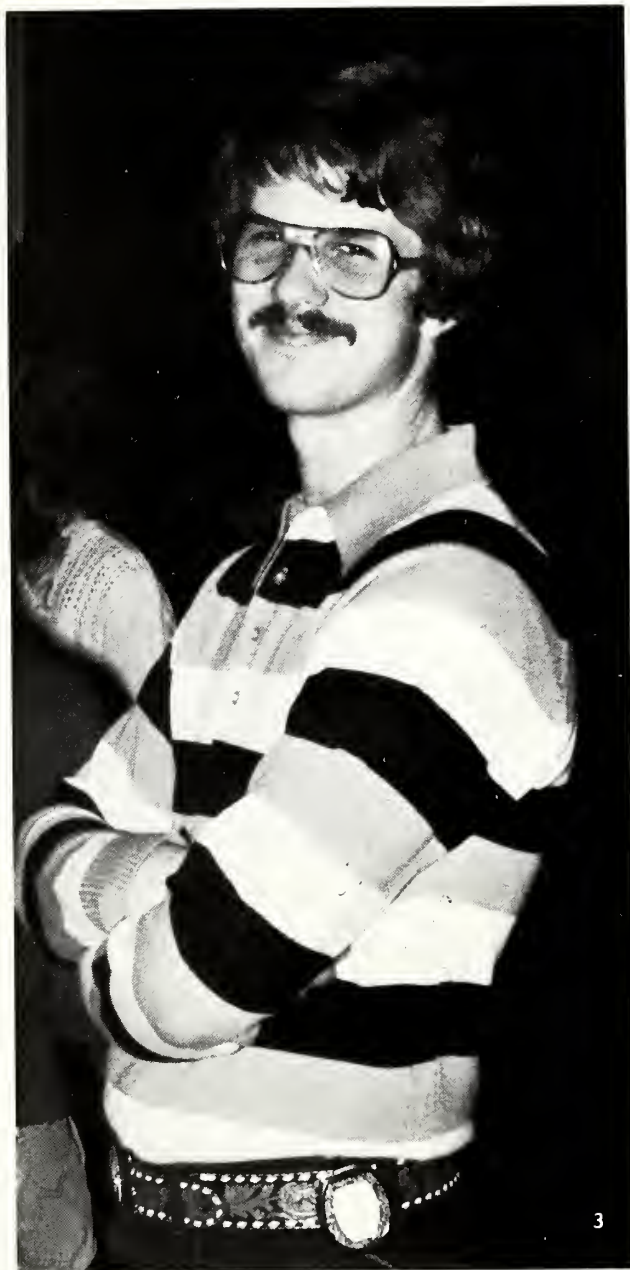

Supervising these events were: Dorm Director, Galen Wiles and Resident Assistants, Jim Bigelow and Mike Hower.

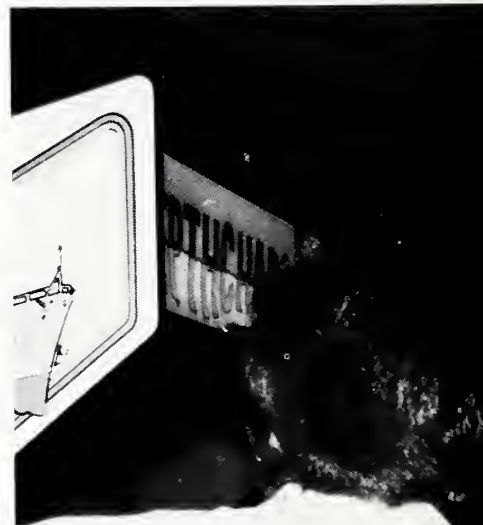

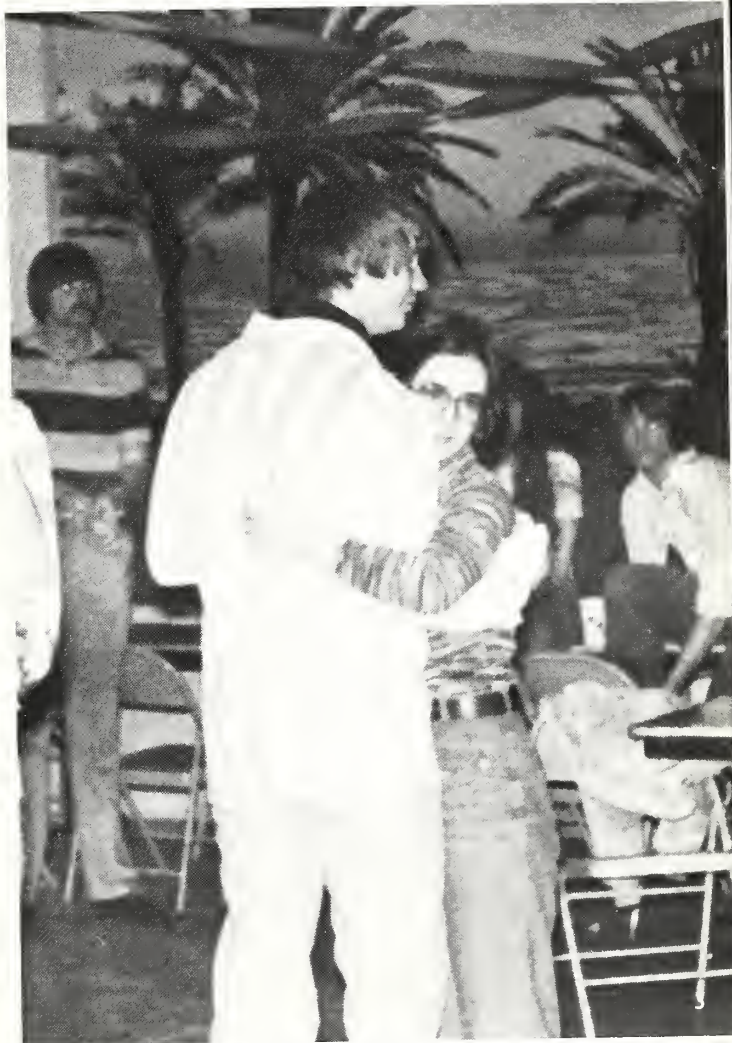


Disco Dance

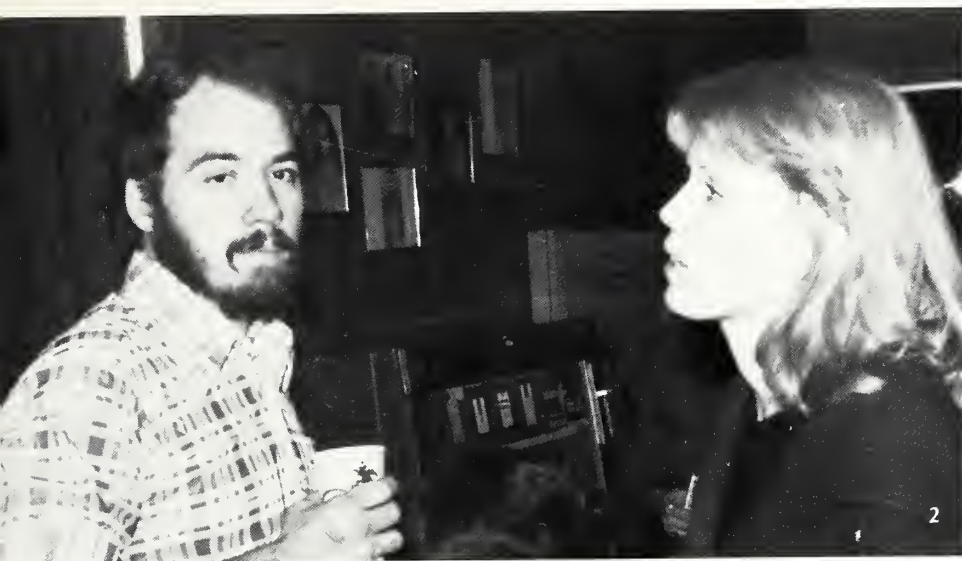
Student Government Association

Newspaper Staff

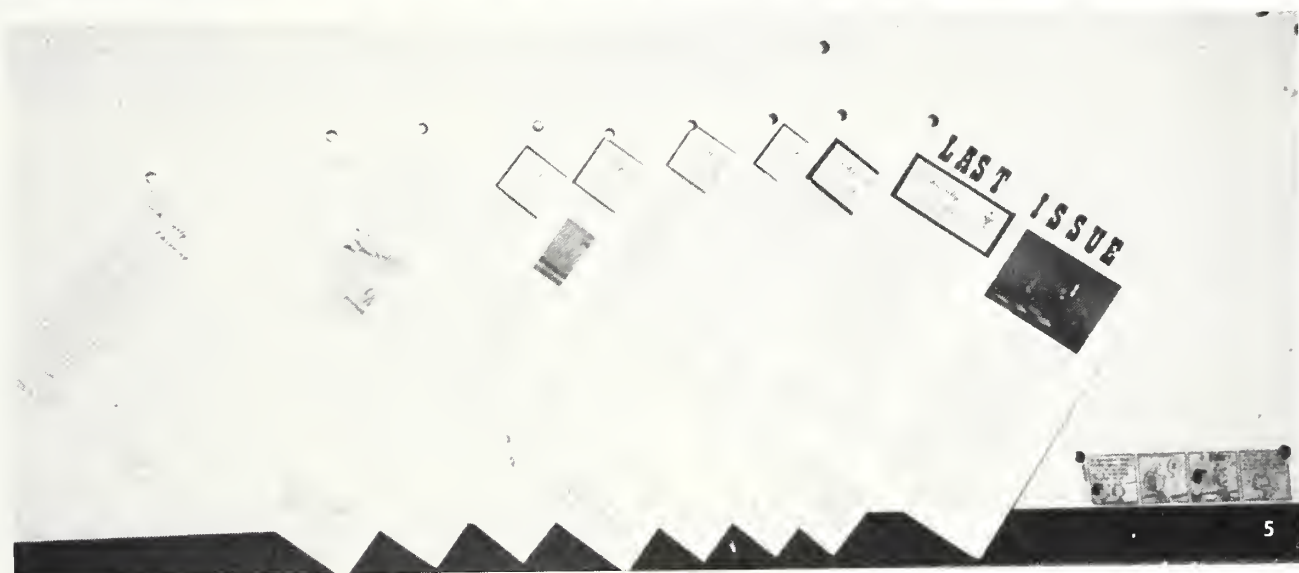

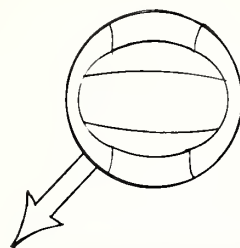
Sports Sends Apathy To The Showers

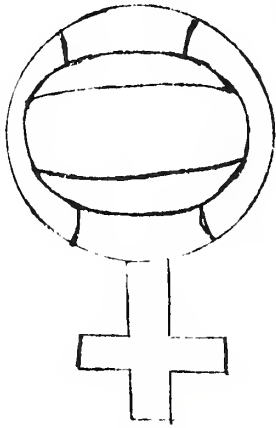
