

Kansas 4-H Foundation

In this 35th year of Kansas 4-H Foundation service, I am pleased to express the appreciation of the Kansas 4-H Foundation Board of Trustees for the contributions that you make for the good of 4-H Clubs in Kansas.

Without your help, the many worthwhile services of the Foundation would not be possible. 4-H'ers benefit immeasurably from Rock Springs 4-H Center, 4-H Journal, leadership training, scholarships, trips and awards. In addition, benefits accrue to 4-H members through Foundation support of projects to enhance the 4-H program as identified by a committee of Kansas 4-H agents. Clovia houses at Kansas State University and Fort Hays State University are also supported by the Foundation.

Total contributions from the 1,511 contributors during 1987 amounted to \$759,743. These contributions, combined with income from other sources, such as our endowment income, enabled us to continue to expand 4-H services and opportunities throughout our state, as well as support continued growth and development at Rock Springs. Rock Springs continues to be one of the outstanding facilities for youth training and recreational activities in the entire midwest.

Members of the Foundation Board are happy to have the opportunity to contribute to the leadership and planning necessary to make the Foundation an effective instrument for development, promotion, and enhancement of 4-H Programs throughout the state of Kansas. The success of our efforts is, however, entirely dependent upon the generosity and philanthropy of you, the donors, whom we honor at this time.

We know that many of you, along

with members of our Board, visit the Rock Springs Center, frequently to observe the organization in action, not only on special occasions such as Friends of 4-H Day and Board Meetings, but also at other times when hundreds of young people are in residence for training and recreational programs.

We are extremely proud of the excellent history of management, quality, and effectiveness of effort of the staff which we have both in our Manhattan office and on the campus of the Rock Springs Center. All of us involved in the 4-H Program at every level throughout the State of Kansas are grateful for your support, and with your continued help, we will keep the 4-H Program growing in service and opportunity for the young people of Kansas.

Celebrating 35 Years of Service

A belief in 4-H and its benefit to young people is the cornerstone of the Kansas 4-H Foundation's philosophy. Many dedicated and generous donors have enabled the Foundation to build upon that cornerstone one of the strongest 4-H Foundations in the nation. As the Kansas 4-H Foundation celebrates its 35th anniversary, it is a time to reflect back and examine the original framework established on that cornerstone.

A committee of Kansans interested in providing youth with citizenship and leadership opportunities were the creators of the Foundation. On Nov. 21, 1952, the Foundation was officially established in Wichita, and the first Board of Trustees was elected with W. Dale Critser as chairman - a position he held until 1971.

One reason which prompted the decision to form a 4-H Foundation was the need for a non-profit organization to hold the title of Rock Springs Ranch property.

Other 1952 projects included: international programs, leader training, a supply service and sponsorship of trips, scholarships and awards. All of which are still an important part of the Foundation's services today.

The building years continued as the Kansas 4-H Journal was added to the growing list projects in 1956 when it was accepted as a gift from Elizabeth and Frank Pettit of Topeka. It began as a 16-page newsletter for Jefferson County 4-H members then expanded to serve Douglas and Shawnee Counties

before it was given to the Foundation for statewide distribution.

Construction at Rock Springs continued. Many new facilities were dedicated during this time establishing the size and scope of the now nationally recognized year-round camping and conference center. A dining hall, health center, permanent housing and an auditorium were among the first buildings erected.

In 1960, the initial Memorandum of Understanding was signed by the Kansas 4-H Foundation and the Kansas 4-H Cooperative Service outlining responsibilities of each concerning programs, services, and facilities; thus, the formal partnership of the Foundation and Kansas 4-H was established.

Continuing to build on the already existing list of projects, the Foundation became landlord of the newly constructed Clovia 4-H Scholarship House at Kansas State University in 1967. The house allowed 62 young women to continue 4-H ideology while enjoying the savings and benefits of the cooperative living experience. A Clovia house was established in 1977 for those attending Fort Hays State University.

The Lutheran camp WaShunGa adjoining Rock Springs was purchased in 1969, and the Lake Perry 4-H Center was established by a lease of 273 acres from the Corps of Engineers in 1971. Southwest 4-H camp followed in 1975. WaShunGa is still a Foundation owned entity today.

Throughout this time period, new buildings at Rock Springs and WaShunGa were dedicated. The

Wiedemann Dining Hall, Johnson Administration Building and Heritage Hall added to the facilities available to Kansas 4-H'ers. Other new housing buildings were constructed along with expansion of the outdoor educational and recreational areas at the center.

While the traditional projects continued, the '80s brought a change in the Foundation and a new emphasis was placed on endowment funds, long-range planning and additional program funding.

The Foundation funding policy was redefined directing funds in three areas. The areas included: ongoing, established Foundation projects; incentives and awards for 4-H participation; and growth and enhancement grants with potential for statewide benefits to the 4-H program. Funding requests are considered as prioritized and requested by the state 4-H office.

A three year statewide 4-H campaign began in 1986 and was officially announced in 1987 capturing the attention of the statewide media. The \$2.6 million campaign goal is to be completed in three phases. Funds generated through the campaign, known as A Step Ahead, are designated to several areas: Kansas 4-H program restricted fund; Kansas 4-H program endowment fund; Kansas 4-H Foundation support; National 4-H Center; Rock Springs 4-H Center sustaining endowment; 4-H program unrestricted fund; Rock Springs 4-H Center Education Building; and the campaign operating expense. To date, the campaign progress is \$1.7 million.

Now is an exciting time for the Foundation. The campaign is in full swing, and efforts continue to register 4-H alumni in the Clover Countdown. Currently, over 13,000 4-H alumni have registered and many took part in activities hosted by the Foundation at the 75th anniversary of the Kansas State Fair last year.

Remodeling, and renovation of many buildings and areas, as well as, construction of new outdoor

educational facilities are underway at Rock Springs. The Manhattan Clovia members are enjoying their newly remodeled lobby, and the 4-H Journal has a new format with emphasis on statewide 4-H programs and events. New scholarships are being established and award programs are being endowed for the first time.

In just 35 years, a strong foundation has been built by efforts of many generous Kansans, and in-

dividuals who set the original "cornerstone and framework" of the Kansas 4-H Foundation. In adhering to the founding philosophy, the Foundation will continue to bring money from the private sector together with Kansas 4-H allowing young people the opportunity to develop skills and friendships which last a lifetime.

Teen Leaders Go To College

“Teen Leader College is a neat non-competitive learning experience,” said Steve Sawyer, 15-year-old Barton County 4-H'er.

“It helped me to deal with others, to be stronger and to learn new ways of working with people,” Sawyer said.

Sawyer was one of 56 teen leaders and 12 adult sponsors, from 12 counties, to attend the statewide Teen Leader College, April 9-10, at the Great Bend Holiday Inn.

Teen Leader College is a program developed by Marcia McFarland, state 4-H and youth Extension specialist, for 15 to 19-year-old 4-H youth in Kansas. The program helps them grow and teaches them how to become project leaders or assistant organizational leaders, and is funded by a grant from the Kansas 4-H Foundation.

The teen leaders are just moving out of the stage of needing to be like everyone else, McFarland said. They want to do things that identify them as individuals and teaching in front of a group is appropriate, she said. Most of the teen leaders have been learning skills in 4-H for a long time.

“They're ready to give back their acquired skills to the organization,” McFarland said.

“The kind of training the teen leaders need in order to work with younger children will be good training for good family skills,” she said.

For many, many years, youth have received the title of teen leader when they reached a certain age, now age 12, automatically. One of the primary reasons for starting the Teen Leader College is to put more meaning into the title of teen leader, said C.R. Salmon, State 4-H Leader.



“The hope is to train the older teens in the area of human behavior. This will help them to understand the development and growth of younger boys and girls,” Salmon said. “They will understand why a seven-year-old can only sit still for seven to 20 minutes or why an eight-year-old wants to do things with his/her hands.”

The Teen Leader College program is taught in two different sessions.

Teen leaders must attend the first session to attend the second session. The sessions are taught by McFarland and Nancy Anderson, leadership trainer, Leavenworth County.

Anderson said they taught in 15 counties and reached approximately 153 teen leaders in the first session.

The first session, six hours, of Teen Leader College is taught on the county or multi-county level. (cont.)

Six ground rules are set at the beginning of the session. Those rules are:

1. **ACCEPT OTHERS** — If we are accepting of each other, we will feel safe in being honest with each other.
2. **SPEAK FOR OURSELVES** - We cannot accurately speak for anyone other than ourselves.
3. **AVOID PUT-DOWN** - Our goal is to support - not criticize - either seriously or in fun.
4. **IT'S OKAY TO PASS** - We will agree to let each person determine the degree to which they can respond - without judging.
5. **YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE** - It will be up to you to determine how much you will be involved and how much you will gain from this experience.
6. **EXPECT UNFINISHED BUSINESS** - Learning and growth are never

completed. We are developing skills and uncovering ideas.

These ground rules produce a trusting environment, Anderson said.

Session one begins with group building exercises. These exercises help the youth become better acquainted, allows them an opportunity to share something about themselves and to become aware of their own interests plus the variety of interests in the group.

"It was difficult to open up to other people," Sawyer said.

The group then moved onto activities building self-esteem, listening skills, responding skills plus recognizing and clarifying values.

It is very important youth know and accept themselves and become comfortable with their own feelings, so they can be comfortable with other people, McFarland said.

Listening skill activities teach teen leaders how to encourage others to continue sharing ideas and feelings. Eye contact is important when communicating with people. It makes them aware of how well they express their ideas and if other people understand them.

The activity for values helps the group clarify where they want to go, Anderson said.

"A lot of teens are already using what they learned from session one," she said.

The teen leaders were asked at the first session what project area they were most interested in. McFarland then narrowed the responses down to the top six projects in preparation for the second session. (cont.)



... through Project Leadership

The statewide Teen Leader College, second session, dealt with group process. How to work with a group, how to help the group identify their values and turn those values into goals. Also how to help the group make decisions and measure what they have done so they feel good about themselves as a group, then celebrate it.

On the morning of April 9, teen leaders went through group building exercises.

After lunch, they went to one of the six project areas; rabbits, sheep, nutrition, clothing, photography or rocketry, for specific training in those areas. Two sessions were taught by six leaders.

An optional area, assistant organizational leader, dealt more on the club level and was taught by Anderson.

During this same period of time, McFarland was working with the adult sponsors. They explored ways for these teen leaders to be utilized in their counties after completion of training. The adult sponsors committed themselves to help the teen leaders get started in their respective counties.

Most counties in Kansas have had adult leaders attend the organizational leader labs, so they understand the concepts of this program. Therefore, it should be easier for youth from those counties to go back and perform what they've learned, Anderson said.

After dinner, the youth returned to the meeting room for another hour of decision making skills teams.

Following nine hours of group process exercises, learning activities and project training the time of fun and relaxation came. It started with some of the youth swimming, and finished with a D.J. dance.

On April 10, the teen leaders attended three more hours of training and a graduation ceremony receiving certificates and metal pins engraved with project leader and their name. These signified they had completed

their training and were ready to be leaders of a project or an assistant organizational leader to their club.

McFarland and Anderson said they were very impressed with the teen leaders and surprised at how quickly they grasped the material.

"The basic underlying purpose of all this training is to keep people feeling good about who they are and the group they are in, so they can function at their peak," McFarland said.

This reporter, serving as an instructor and observing the group as a whole, could see and feel the development of closeness between 56 youth, of confidence, of respect and of total

involvement and commitment given by the teen leaders.

"I really think that Teen Leader College will enable us to put a little more meaning into what we call a teen leader and will better prepare them in subject matter, better prepare them in leadership skills and better prepare them in the area of socialized skills to be a leader," Salmon said.

Fifteen-year-old Sawyer said he would encourage others to attend the Teen Leader College.

Outdoor Adventure Camp


If you're a Kansas youngster who enjoys the outdoors, NOW is the time to make plans to attend the Outdoor Adventure Camp.
