## At President's Conference — Farm Groups Calm, But Still Divided

Farm groups showed at an agricultural conference they are sharply divided on legislation to broaden the farmers power to bargain for better prices.

The Johnson administration sought farm expressions on bargaining in a conference recently to which it had invited officials from more than 150 farm and rural development organizations.

The conference did not, however, bring sharp criticisms of the administration's present farm policies, as a similar meeting did a year ago.

Most of those speaking said there is need for government programs designed to stabilize farm production and prices. Several endorsed recent recommendations of President Johnson that Congress extend parts of farm programs expiring either at the end of this year or at the end of next year.

But there were no expressions of views from the American Farm Bureau federation, a major critic of government participation in agriculture. Representatives of this farm organization attended the conference, but kept silent.

The Farm bureau is supporting legislation pending in Congress to eliminate some of the control in farm payment programs.

The lack of criticism and complaints about farm programs was in sharp contrast to that which marked last year's conference. This contrast brought expressions of surprise from some farm spokesmen, since farm income dropped 11 per cent last year and prospects for improvement this year are uncertain.

Strong support for the administration came from leaders of the National Farmers Union, the National Grange, and the Missouri Farmers Association as well as from several commodity organizations.

On farm bargaining, these organizations gave general support for a bargaining bill introduced in Congress recently by

Sen. Walter F. Mondale (D-Minn.). This bill would set up a farm bargaining board similar to the Labor Relations board which supervises labor bargaining.

But C. W. McMillan, executive vice-president of the American National Cattlemen's Association, said present laws permitting farmers to work together for better conditions are adequate. He said his organization believes it can attain satisfactory prices through a voluntary self-discipline program of production restraints.

But advocates of a stronger farm bargaining legislation argued there could be no effective bargaining without legal authority to control production of crops and products which would be subject to price bargaining with processors.

## Moylans Buy Council Grove Sale Barn

COUNCIL GROVE, Kans. — Alvin G. (Butch) Lowe has announced the sale of The Council Grove Livestock Sales to Jerry and Pat Moylan, brothers, from Emmett, Kans. The new owners have changed the sale day from Saturday to Monday, the first sale under new ownership is to be held April 1.

The Council Grove barn is one of the oldest continuous family livestock sales in Kansas. It was started by Lowe's father more than 40 years ago, the first sale being held near the park in downtown Council Grove.

Lowe suffered a heart attack shortly before last Christmas, and since then has been unable to manage the business. His health, however, has improved and he is not house-confined.

The Moylans are farmers in the Emmett area. Jerry has worked at the Zima barn in Emmett. Both plan to make Council Grove their homes as soon as schools close for the summer.

## Imports 'Bugging' U.S. Carmakers Again

Imported cars once more are causing U. S. auto makers to press the panic button.

Import sales soared to 773,000 cars last year, up 17% from 1966. So far this year imports are selling at an annual rate of a million cars. The 1968 pace has given imports 10.5% of the total U. S. new car market to date this year, compared with a 9.2% share of the market for all 1967 and a 7.3% share in 1966.

"The industry is mighty stirred up about this import thing right now," says John Z. DeLorean, the vice president, who heads General Motors Corp.'s Pontiac division. "That's too big a slice of the market going overseas."

Only eight years ago Detroit crushed a similar import sales surge by introducing compact cars. But as the U. S. compacts gradually grew bigger and costlier, import sales began inching upwards. By the end of 1966, Detroit was worried again.

The three big auto makers tried to fight back by offering U. S. customers more "captive imports," the small models built by their own subsidiaries in Europe. American Motors Corp. cut list prices on its cheapest cars to pit them against popular imports. When these efforts proved notably unsuccessful, U. S. auto men were thrown into a quandary. "This is the biggest problem the auto industry has faced in a long time, and we really don't know the full answer," says one Detroit executive.

### Drastic Action

But auto officials say drastic action is needed to meet the rising foreign competition. So the auto makers are dolling up their captive import models, launching ad campaigns that knock popular foreign cars, designing a couple of cheap new U. S. compacts and studying price cuts on some low-priced U. S. models.

Both GM and Ford Motor Co. are working on new compact cars. GM's probably won't be introduced before the fall of 1970, but Ford's may go on sale about a year from now.

The Delta is slightly smaller than the original Falcon introduced by Ford in 1959 — and probably more than three inches shorter, three inches narrower and 500 pounds lighter than the 1968 Falcon. Plans currently call for the Delta to use a small Falcon engine. But industry sources say Ford is hard at work on a new side-valve small-car engine designed to be lighter, cheaper to build and more efficient than existing overhead-valve engines.

Meanwhile, U. S. auto makers are looking for ways to shrink the price gap between the U. S.

models and the high-volume imports such as Volkswagen, Toyota, Datsun, Fiat and Renault. Four rounds of price increases on U. S. models in the past two and a half years have widened that gap. Volkswagen, the biggest-selling foreign car (443,400 sales in the U. S. last year), now costs \$250 less than the list price of the cheapest American Motors Car and \$525 less than the cheapest Ford, GM and Chrysler Corp. cars.

**A Dig At Volkswagen**  
GM is thought to be considering cutting the list prices on some of its Chevy II models. If it does cut them, Ford and Chrysler undoubtedly would reduce the prices of some of their smallest cars, too.

GM's Chevrolet division recently introduced a clutchless, semi-automatic transmission priced at \$65 as optional equipment on its Chevy II and Camaro cars. Chevrolet officials have pointed out in public statements that the new transmission costs "about half the price of a recently announced similar transmission on a leading foreign car" — Volkswagen's new \$135 option.

Volkswagen is also the target of one of the ad campaigns aimed at imports. "Why buy a Bug, when for \$1,946 you can buy a car?" asks American

Motors in its Rambler ads. In GM's anti-import ads, Chevrolet's Corvair, the rear-engined car that hasn't been advertised much lately, suddenly is being ballyhooed as the car with "all the advantages of an import — plus some big home grown ones." Chevy II ads ask: "Had your foreign car fling?" They boast that Chevy II offers "much more car for not very many more dollars."

## Two New Corn Chemicals Under State Testing

Two new insecticides have received federal label registration for corn rootworm control, reports Dr. H. Leroy Brooks, Extension entomologist at Kansas State University.

Dyfonate, a product of Stauffer Chemicals, is an organophosphate formulated as 10 percent granules for a planting time application rate of 7½ to 10 pounds per acre. The acute oral toxicity is 16 mg/kg and while the dermal toxicity value is not available, it is assumed to

be in the highly toxic range.

Dasanit is Chemagro's product, and it is the latest to announce label clearance. It is a 10 percent granular product with the registration rate of 5 to 10 pounds per acre. With either Dyfonate or Dasanit, more total material per acre must be used where less than 40 inch rows are involved.

Both of the new insecticides were in K-State tests in 1967 and have shown promise for corn rootworm control. K-State recommendation will be for trial use only in 1968. Quantities will probably be quite limited for the coming season, but growers who have a chance to obtain small quantities may want to compare one of the new materials with their present rootworm insecticides, Brooks suggests.

The simplest way for a grower to evaluate rootworm insecticides is to put the trial material in half of his applicator boxes, and use the regular insecticide in the other boxes.

"Try to make the test in the part of the field where root-

worm populations are usually the highest," the K-State entomologist advises. "When you begin, make sure that you have marked the rows that are treated with the new material, and check the plant root systems in late June or early July for signs of rootworm injury."

Brooks gives this final word of caution. Both Dasanit and Dyfonate have high toxicity values comparable to parathion. Therefore, wear a respirator, gloves, and protective clothing when handling these products.

## G&G Area Road Work Set

A new 7-mile state highway providing access to the Pawnee Indian Village Museum north of Courtland in Republic county is one of the projects which the State Highway Commission plans this year.

Bids for it and other state highway improvements will be taken at Chanute on April 18.

The new road in Republic county will be numbered K266.

Other major projects scheduled include a basic improvement in US59 in Labette county; resurfacing of US50 in Reno county; and bituminous sealing of 185 miles of existing highways in the state.

In preparation for the approaching tourist season, improvement is planned also for seven miles of interior roads in three state parks located at federal reservoirs. Roads scheduled for grading and surfacing include the Pleasant View area of

April 2, 1968

Milford State Park; the Hell Creek area of Wilson State Park; and the Cedar Point area in Lovewell State Park.

County highway improvements are also set for 3 miles south of Troy in Doniphan county; grading and bridges southwest of Herington, Dickinson county; 4½ miles, north of Solomon; 3 miles, north of Cuba, Republic county; 4 miles north of Scandia, Republic county; 9 miles south of Great Bend, Barton County.

# Cut Corn, Build Soybean Acreage

Many farmers are planning big cuts in acreages of corn and sorghum grain, but they expect to plant more soybeans, oats, and barley than they did last year. These facts are shown in the 1968 report on Prospective Plantings, issued by the USDA on March 15.

Farmers expect to plant 64.9 million acres of corn — 8 percent less than last year and 17 million acres of sorghum grain — 19 percent less than a year ago.

The prospective oat acreage was listed at 21.2 million acres — up 3 percent. Barley acreage was shown at 10.3 million — also up 3 percent from the 1967 figure. Farmers' responses indicated that they would plant 41.8 million acres of soybeans — 3 percent more than they planted last year.

The report was based on a careful survey of farmers' intentions about March 1. In previous years, the Prospective Plantings report has provided a good guide as to the acreages that farmers would plant.

With these figures in sight, what can we expect for the 1968 production of these crops? And for supplies during the next marketing year? We can make some useful estimates of these items. The estimates will be based on average weather; but we know that the weather is likely to be a little better, or poorer, than normal.

**Corn.** If farmers plant 64.9 million acres of corn (as they reported the intention of doing), there would be about 55.5 million acres for harvest next fall. We would figure the average yield per acre at 80 bushels. Such a yield would be 2 bushels over the 1967 record, but it would be in line with the rising trend of recent years. We expect Illinois to have lower yields this year than in 1967, but some other important corn states should have higher yields. The expected acreage and yield would produce 4.4 to 4.5 billion bushels. (Last year's crop was estimated at 4.7 million bushels.)

The carryover of old corn next October 1 seems likely to be 1 to 1.1 billion bushels. Thus, the total supply for the 1968-

69 marketing year may be 5.4 to 5.6 billion bushels, compared with the estimated supply of 5.55 billion for the present marketing year. Use and exports of corn during the next marketing year may reach 4.6 to 4.7 billion bushels. If so, the carryover in the fall of 1969 could be 700 million to 1 billion bushels.

**Soybeans.** If the acreage of soybeans is increased by 3 percent, there will be about 40.7 million acres for harvest next fall. Soybean yields have been

at 25 bushels per acre (give or take a half a bushel) in each of the past six years, except in 1964 when the average was 22.8 bushels per acre. The 1967 average was 24.5 bushels. At 25 bushels per acre, the intended acreage would produce about 1,000 million bushels of soybeans, compared with the 973 million reported last fall.

The carryover of old beans next September 1 is expected to be 140 to 175 million bushels. Thus, the total supply for the 1968-69 marketing year could be somewhere around 1,150 to 1,175 million bushels, compared with 1,063 million available in the current marketing year. The use and exports of soybeans in the next marketing year could run 925 to 950 million bushels, so the carryover in the fall of 1969 might be 200 to 250 million bushels.

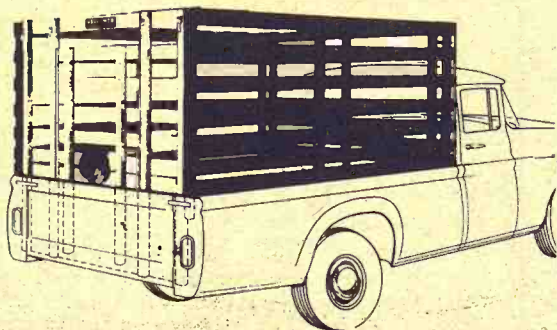

## Tax Limit? It's What Taxpayer Will Stand

For Americans groaning under steadily mounting tax bills, there's some feeble solace in economists' views that taxation has its limits.

But the solace is mental rather than monetary, for none of the government economists who were asked if there is a limit to taxes was willing to speculate on where the limit lies.

Under the Constitution, there is no legal ceiling on how much federal, state and local governments can collect in taxes from their citizens.

Government economists regard the limit as the point at which private incentive would be destroyed and people would balk at working only to pay a

huge share of their wages in taxes.

One economist, declining to be quoted by name, said that fixing the limit is more a question of figuring out how much the public will stand for than a question of social or economic theory.

A breaking point of a political nature already has arrived for some Americans who have said they refuse to pay part of their income taxes in protest against the Vietnam war.

Another economist cited tax-financed programs like medicare and Social Security as examples of government services which have pushed taxes up but which could not possibly be repealed, tax limit or no tax limit.

The experts who help develop the nation's economic policies do not believe the country is anywhere near the breaking point—even assuming that Congress approves the 10 per cent tax surcharge proposed by President Johnson to reduce the projected federal budget deficit.

With the surcharge enacted, Americans still would carry one of the lowest tax burdens of any industrial nation.

The following figures for the year 1966 show where the United States stands in relation to the tax burdens in other countries. Expressed as a percentage of the nation's total economic wealth, these are total tax burdens:

Despite lower federal tax rates, America's 27.3 per cent figure is higher than it was during World War II — 25 per cent — and during the Korean War, when it was 26 per cent.

The U. S. position in relation to other major industrial nations probably comes as small consolation to the taxpayer, who sees more and more of his dollars pouring into federal, state and local treasuries.

As the federal share has gone down in the 1960s, state and local governments have increased their share.

## Gas Tax In Ontario: 18 Cents

The government gets more in taxes out of a gallon of gasoline than the industry does in much of Canada.

Ontario has recently increased its tax on the imperial gallon to 18 cents, which coupled with the 2.1 cents the federal government gets, is more than the 18.5 cents the industry sells gas for. There are similar situations in Nova Scotia and New Brunswick.

There are five imperial gallons to six U.S. gallons, accounting for some of the difference in prices and taxes.

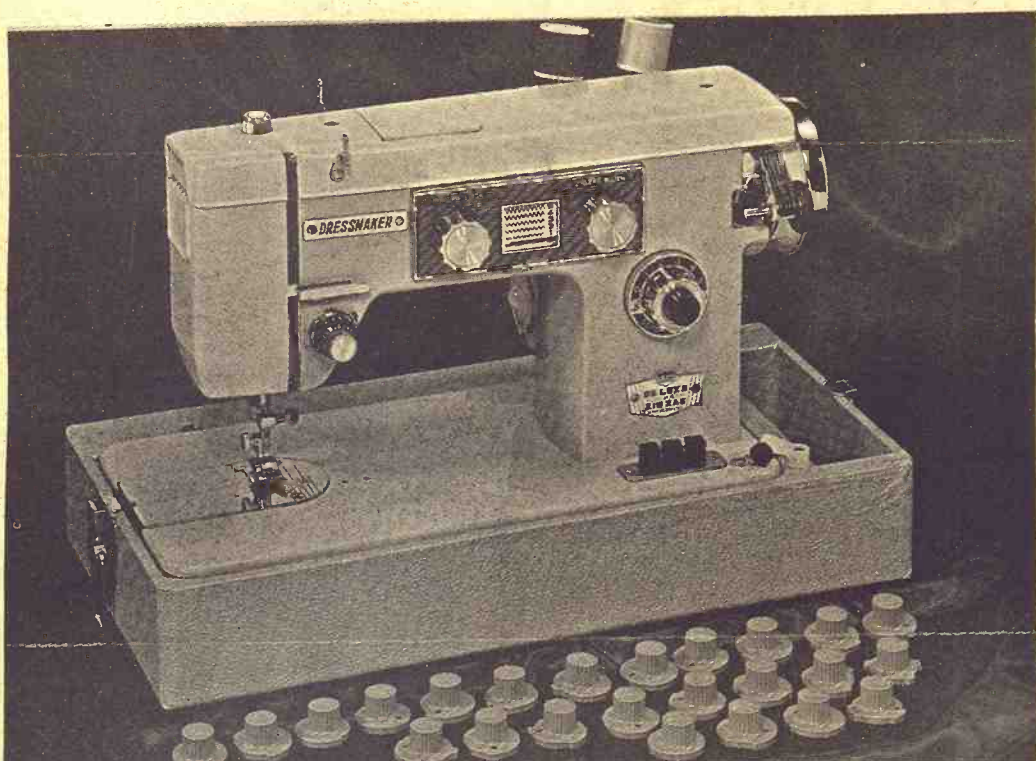

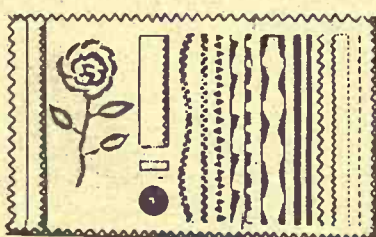

#### MOCK CHICKEN FRIED STEAKS

1 pound ground beef  
2 teaspoons onion salt  
2 teaspoons parsley flakes

2 cups cracker crumbs  
Mix ground beef, parsley flakes, onion salt, egg, salt, chili

powder and half of the cracker crumbs. Divide mixture into balls. Sprinkle rest of the cracker crumbs on board and roll balls out into steaks. Be sure each side is well coated with crumbs. In a medium size saucepan melt butter. Remove from heat and blend in flour, onion, parsley, basil, marjoram and salt. Gradually blend in evaporated milk, then water. Stir and cook over medium heat until cheese melts and sauce is well blended. Serve over hot cooked and

drained asparagus. Makes about 2½ cups sauce (enough for 4-6 servings).

### Tastier Vegetables

A trick practiced by good cooks is that of adding a touch of sweetness when cooking tomatoes, corn and peas. 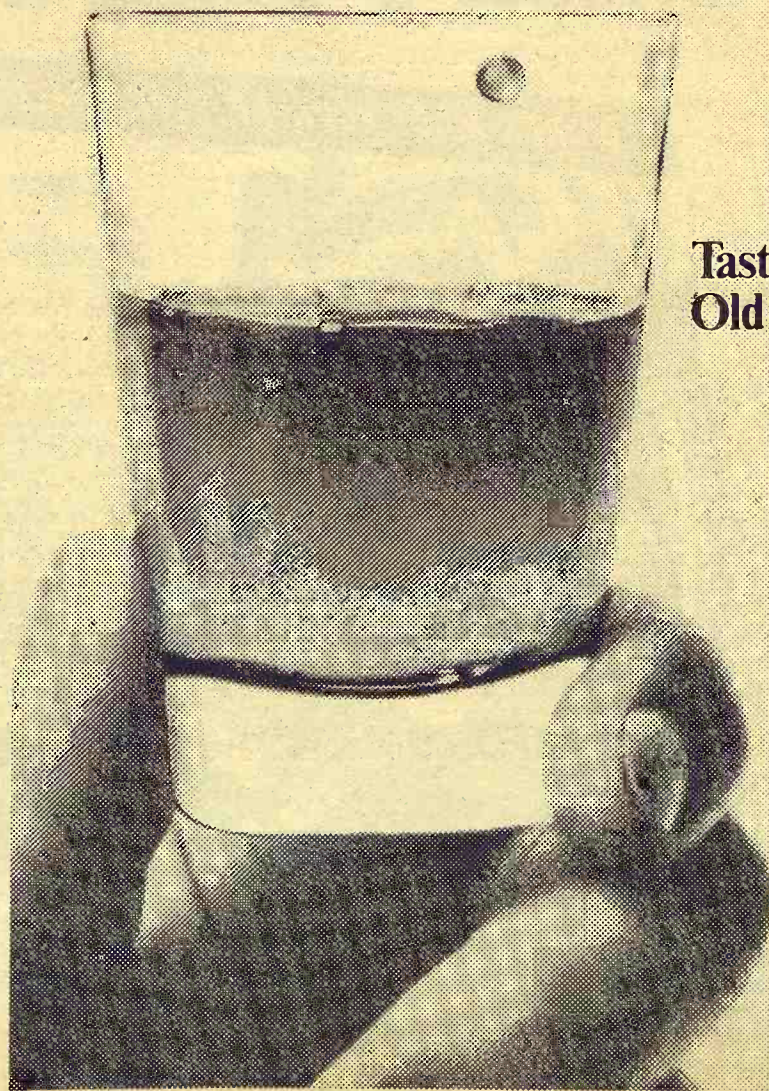
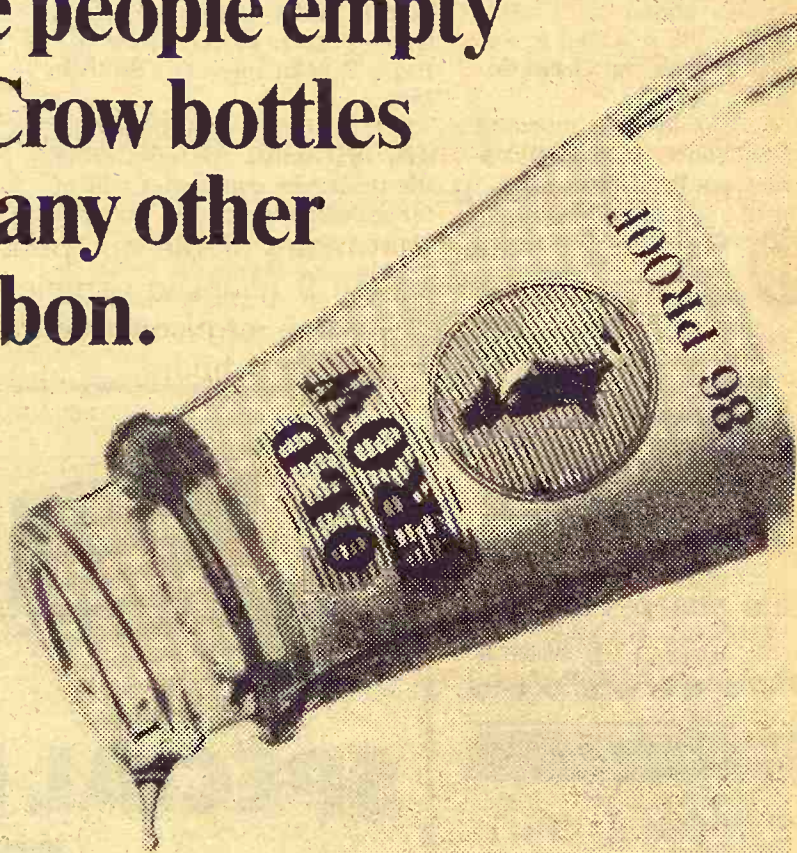

## Homeowners Insurance Up By 25%

The cost of homeowners insurance issued by 250 companies in Kansas has increased by an average of 21 percent effective March 25, the state insurance commissioner's office has announced.

The total cost of the increase statewide was estimated at \$1.5 million annually for Kansas homeowner policy holders.

The firms affected sell about one-half of the homeowner insurance in the state.

It applies to homeowner policies that are "package" policies insuring owner-occupied dwellings and their contents against losses caused by fire, wind, storm, hail, explosion, riot, theft, vandalism, aircraft, vehicles, smoke, the policy holder's legal liabilities and limited medical coverage for persons other than the policy holder and his family.

A spokesman in the commissioner's office said this type policy is held by the majority of Kansas homeowners.

Insurance Commissioner Frank Sullivan said the need for increased homeowners premiums are substantiated by the loss experience of the companies involved.

"Information furnished by the insurance companies indicated that for each premium dollar earned in 1966, the companies incurred \$1.69 for losses and company expenses," Sullivan said in a prepared statement.

The last statewide increase in homeowners rates authorized by the insurance commissioner was on June 1, 1965, when rates went up by 16 percent.

The rate increase was filed for by Multi-Line Insurance Rating Bureau, the Transportation Insurance Rating Bureau and the Kansas Inspection Bureau, licensed rating organizations in Kansas for the 250 companies.

Sullivan said losses used in the filing did not include the full effect of the tornados and heavy hailstorms that occurred in Kansas in 1966.

"In fact, the rating formula used by the companies resulted in the elimination of 81 per cent of the losses caused by 'catastrophes' such as the (June 8, 1966) Topeka tornado," Sullivan said.

The insurance commissioner said that under the new filing, the insurance companies will offer a deductible option that previously was not available.

This new feature is a \$50 deductible on all perils insuring the dwelling and contents, Sullivan said.

At present the majority of homeowners policies are written with a \$50 deductible only on all wind and hail losses.

The commissioner pointed out that many homeowner policyholders who presently have a

\$50 wind and hail deductible clause in their policies will not have to pay increased premiums if they are willing to accept a \$50 deductible on all perils insured against by terms of the policy.

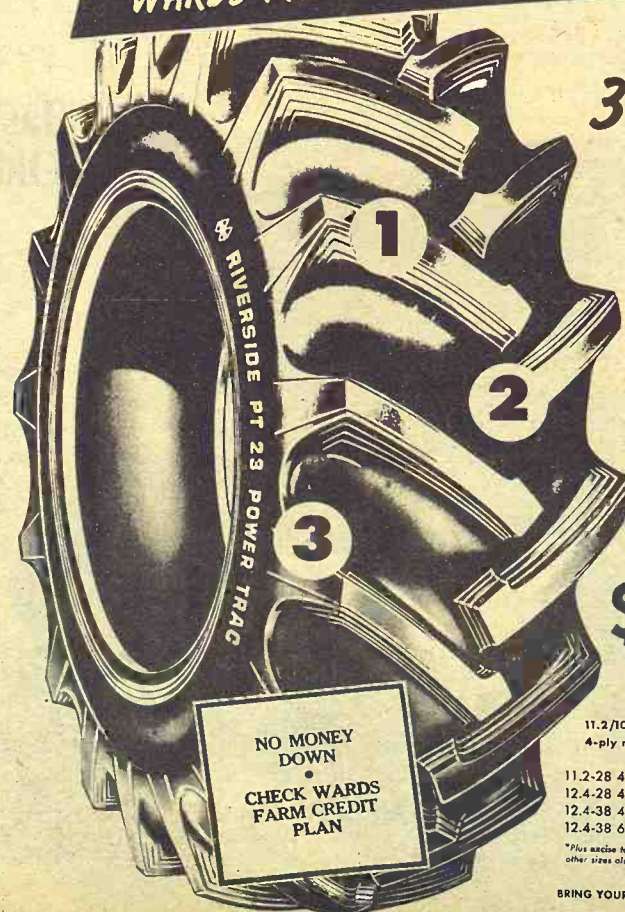

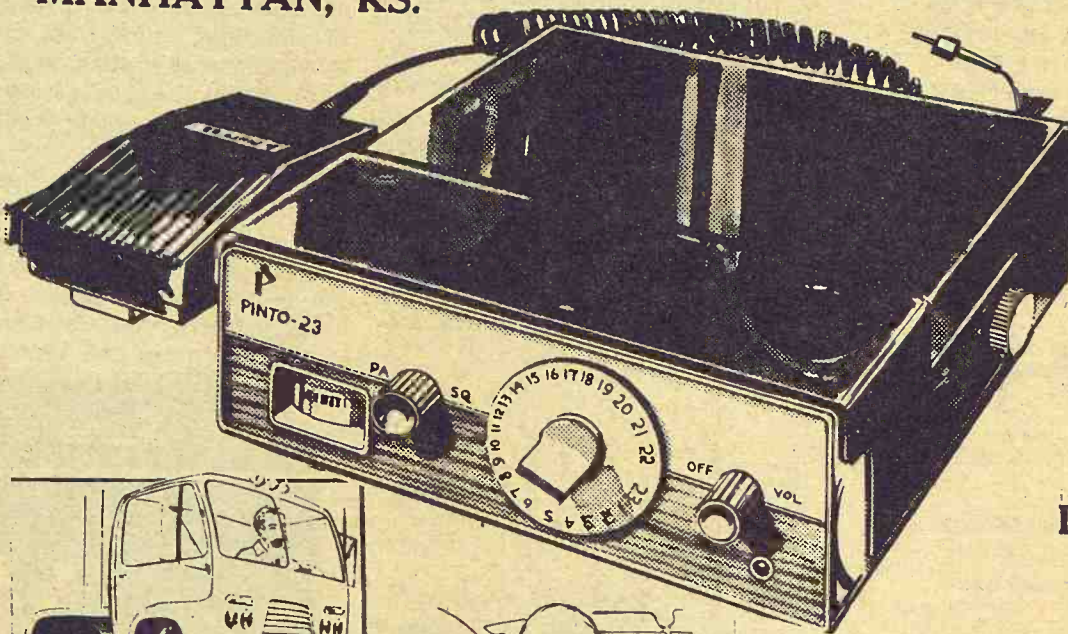

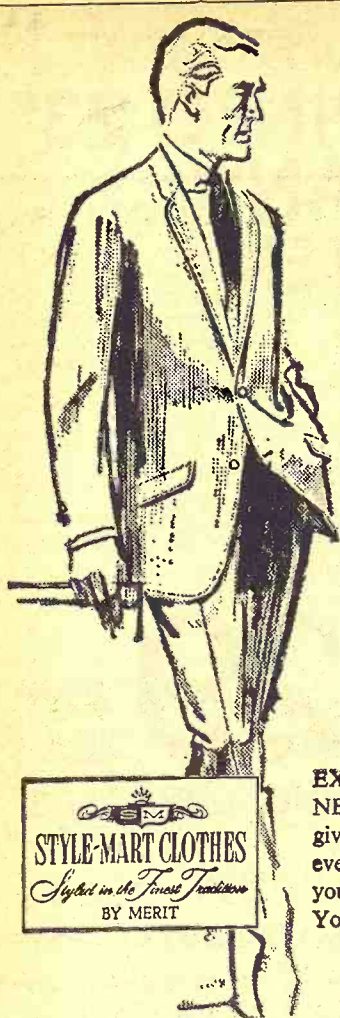

## C&H Sugar Gets \$2.7 Million In Farm Payments

The corporate growers of Hawaiian cane sugar, who collect millions of dollars in federal agricultural subsidy payments each year, get a \$2 million annual bonus thanks to an Agriculture Department definition of "farm."

An example of how the system works: Eight plantations controlled by one corporation, C. Brewer and Co., Ltd., each

collected a separate sugar subsidy. The total amounted to \$2.74 million.

If the Agriculture Department had based the payment on the total production of the parent company, it would have amounted to just under \$2 million, a saving to the government of \$775,000.

No matter how the subsidies are calculated, some members of Congress think they are much larger than they need to be to attain the goal of encouraging domestic sugar production.

Among other things, they point to the fact that the corporate growers control their products from the cane fields to the grocer's shelf, where it is marketed under the C&H brand of the California and Hawaii

Co., a cooperative which the growers own and through which they process all of the sugar produced in Hawaii.

One congressional critic, Rep. Paul Findley, R-Ill., has argued that government subsidies add 4 cents a pound to the retail price of sugar.

Another, Sen. John J. Williams, R-Del., has tried for years to get Congress to limit farm subsidy payments on sugar and all other crops to anywhere from \$10,000 to \$50,000 a year to any single farm.

# Insect Battle Never Ends

Kansas farmers seldom reach for the trusty rifle or put their wagons in a circle these days, but they still have to be fighters sometimes.

A never-ending battle is the farmer's fight to protect his crops from the ever-changing insect population, notes Dr. H. Leroy Brooks, Extension entomologist at Kansas State University.

Farmers have been forced to add insect control practices to

their farming programs. And the control practices put extra demands on the farmer's time and add to his crop production costs.

All in all, farmers get pretty annoyed when they spot insect damage in one of their fields. Many farmers have switched to preventive control applications to eliminate possible crises, Brooks says.

A list of the top five most-wanted insects in Kansas looks like this:

**Corn Rootworm** — Thisascal comes in three varieties. He feeds on corn roots and sometimes damages the silks. He is found in 79 Kansas counties. Those free of infestation are primarily the southern border counties. This insect costs Kansas farmers about \$3 million in 1967, and has the potential to wipe out entire fields. In addition, he is a recurring pest and control measures must be applied on a preventive basis since no satisfactory method exists at the time when he is doing the greatest damage to corn.

**Chinch Bug** — This eastern Kansas enemy occasionally returns to remind farmers of the problems they faced 30 years ago in attempting to control the bugs with barrier ditches and creosote oil. Outbreaks occurred in 1966 and to a lesser extent in 1967. Spring surveys indicate chinch bugs could again go on the rampage in portions of south central and southeast Kansas.

**European Corn Borer** — This pest experienced a rough year in Kansas in 1967. Spring beating rains limited his first generation activities in most parts of the state, and only occasional fields of late corn were dam-

aged by the second brood. But he'll be back in 1968 and especially those farmers who plant early will have to watch for him.

**Grasshoppers** — Kansas might well be called the home of grasshoppers. Over 200 different species occur here. Fortunately, only four or five are of major economic importance to crops though several others are pests of rangelands. Grasshopper outbreaks usually come in longtime cycles. Infestations are currently on the upward surge and this could be a year of grasshoppers aplenty. Survey entomologists found no potential problems based on fall surveys for 1966; 50,000 acres with economic infestations for 1967; and a potential problem involving 625,000 infested acres for 1968.

**Army and Pale Western Cutworms** — These two species damaged 427,000 acres of wheat last year. They attack in early spring and often catch farmers off guard, causing extensive damage before being detected. Occasional army cutworms are now showing up in fields from Hays to the southwest corner of the state. Last fall, light trap counts for the adult pale western cutworm indicated a heavier than normal flight. Signs of infestation in wheat are anticipated within the next four weeks.

10000 persons would view the more than 60 exhibits during the two-day period.

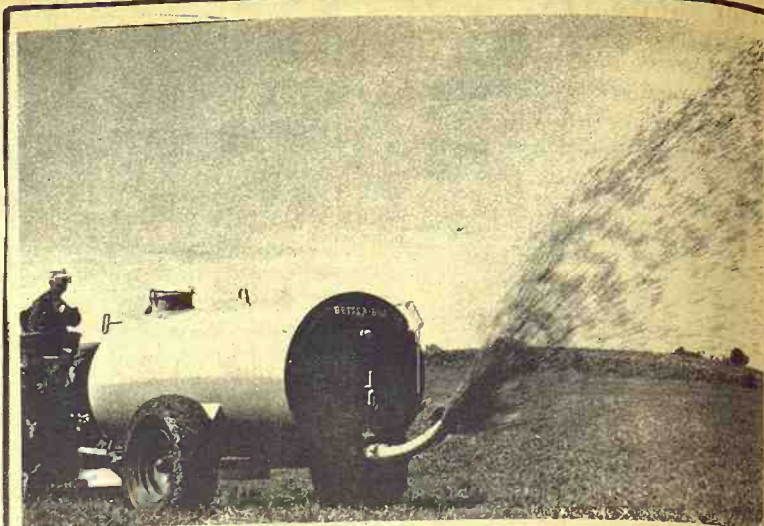
Displays were full of various kinds of tractors, hay-handling equipment, livestock handling equipment, irrigation systems and other farm machines.

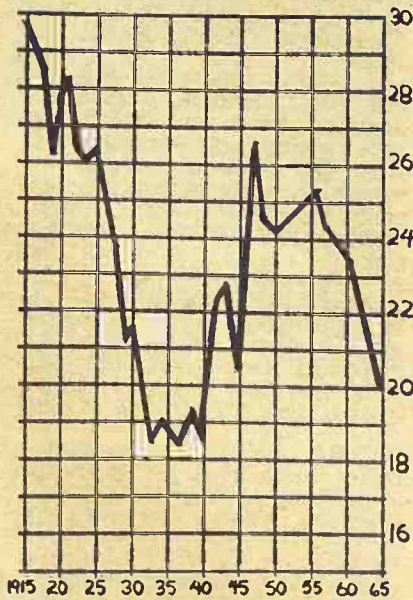

## Record Low U.S. Birth Rate



The national birth rate reached an all-time low in 1967. Experts predict it will drop even further in the years ahead.

The chart above shows the U. S. birth rate in births per 1000 population since 1915.

The 1967 rate for the nation was 17.9 births for every 1,000 Americans, a figure below the previous record of 18.4 births set in the Depression years of 1933 and 1936.

### REASON IS ELUSIVE

Experts can't pinpoint an exact reason for the decline. They note that after both World Wars, there was a predictable surge when servicemen returned from overseas.

But they don't know how to account for the drop during the prosperous 1920's and the affluent late 50's and 60's.

One authority, Natality Statistics Chief Arthur A. Campbell, has said the lowering birth rate has nothing to do with fertility. In fact, he says,

women are proving more fertile than the mothers of 30 years ago.

Campbell, quoted in a recent issue of Time, does not hold the Pill solely responsible either. He points out that the drop in births during the '20's, before today's sophisticated contraceptives were available, was equally steep.

### Changing Fashions

What seems to be causing the birth drop, Campbell claims, is changing fashions in family planning. After World War I, the ideal family was a set of two children, a boy and a girl, he says.

During the Depression, the birth rate declined because of hard economic realities.

After World War II, the vogue for large families, with three, four or more children, peaked in 1947 and continued for a full decade.

Campbell claims today's pattern is for women to have children earlier and to settle for fewer of them. The average family is 2.7 children.

Another reason for the birth drop might be that an increasing number of women are graduating from colleges and universities.

### Worthwhile Career

The woman with a degree often settles into a worthwhile career and may prefer not to abandon her career even if the husband has a sizable income to raise a family.

Robert C. Cook, president of Washington's Population Reference Bureau, says: "There is a growing realization on the part of younger couples in America that rearing children in this complicated and expensive world presents big problems."

Among those Cook cites are rising costs of living and increasing competition for education, especially at the college level.

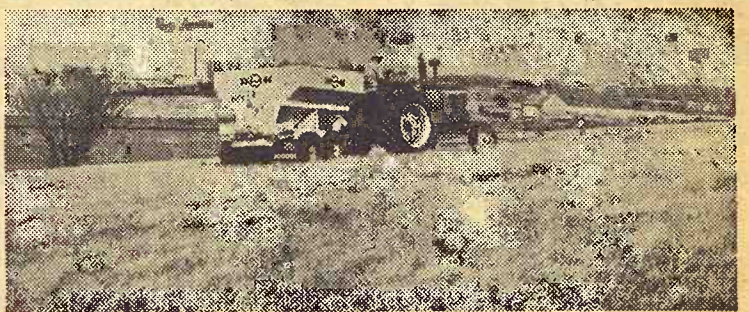

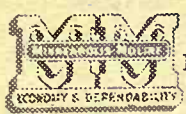

## Organization Set On Area Feeder Calf Sales Pool

LEAVENWORTH — A sales pool, through which northeast Kansas beef cow owners with herds of 30 cows or less will have the advantage of large scale selling, has been organized for this area.

Organized as the Sunflower Feeder Livestock Assn., it has set its first sales locations as Kansas City, St. Marys and Overbrook with three sales scheduled in October.

Two-thirds of Kansas beef cow owners, with small herds, frequently find their calf crop is sold at a disadvantage because of small numbers. Buyers looking for large numbers of uniform weight and quality won't come after small lots at local sales or on the farm.

Feeder-calf pools have been in existence since 1925. U.S. Dept. of Agriculture researchers have found that pooling feeder cattle into larger lots increases prices.

Under the column headed "Dam", the first number is the dam's tattoo, the second number is the average rank of her last three calves. If a number such as (2) appears after the average score this indicates that only two of her calves have been weighed.

Under the column headed "Rank" is listed the individual's rank at weaning. Under "wt./da. of age-etc." is listed the individual's weight per day of age on the indicated date.

Under "Sire" — K—Royal Husker K31; 0707—Sph Heir Evident 8; T—Tex Real Onward 95; G—SPH Heir Appnt 3; H—SPH Heir Evident 16.

These bulls were raised without creep feed on native pasture with their mothers, wintered on silage and 3 lbs. of milo, grazed till Oct. 9, 67, when they were put on hay, sorghum silage, and 4 lbs. of milo. After 150 da. on this ration they were weighed and prices were arrived at considering both rate of dry lot gain and over all weight for age.

## Small Nations New Customers For U.S. Farmers

Some of the smaller developing nations have substantially increased their buying of U.S. farm products in recent years. A foreign agricultural service spokesman said this decreases their dependence on U.S. food

aid under the Food for Freedom program.

Raymond A. Joanes, the agency's administrator, said some of these countries find their economies improving with annual increases in their gross national products of from 5 to 10 per cent in recent years.

Taiwan, South Korea and Israel are among countries receiving substantial food for freedom aid which has helped them and other needy nations to buy

the time needed to develop their own agriculture program, Joanes said.

The trend for more dollar-buying of food, Joanes said, has been noted in these countries:

**JAMAICA, THE BAHAMAS.** The tourism that Cuba once enjoyed is combining with other factors to create prosperity.

**LIBERIA.** Iron ore and rubber exports are helping to bolster its economy.

**LIBYA.** New oil fields are expanding the purchasing power of its people.

**SOUTH AFRICA.** Dollar buying of U. S. farm products increased from 13 million dollars in 1957 to over 47 million dollars in 1967.

**ISRAEL.** This country continues its rapid rate of development despite tensions.

**TAIWAN.** Dollar buying has risen from less than 1 million dollars in 1957 to 59 million dollars in 1967.

**OKINAWA.** This is a "sleeping" giant that has expanded its purchases of U. S. farm products from 3 million dollars to 20 million dollars in the last decade.

**SOUTH KOREA.** Economic development is moving forward rapidly.

For all practical purposes, the United States ships farm products to two "export worlds."

Most of the commercial, or dollar, sales are in the developing world and in fiscal year 1967 these exports totaled \$5,200,000,000. The remaining one-fourth of food products shipped — about \$1,600,000,000 worth — went to the underdeveloped countries of Asia, Africa, and Latin America under the Food for Freedom program.

## Shuman Sees Major Production Under Contract

President Charles B. Shuman of the American Farm Bureau Federation predicted last week that within 10 years one-half the products of farms will be produced under contract between grower and buyer.

Shuman told a meeting of the National Agricultural Advertising and Marketing Association at Kansas City there has been rapid growth in contractual production and it will expand to include major crops.

Now, he said, a large part of the total output of processed fruits and vegetables, sugar

beets, certified seed, broilers, turkeys and eggs is grown or purchased under contract.

He predicted these developments will increase the need for organized marketing and bargaining. "While Farm Bureau members do not believe that such programs are an overall panacea for farm problems, they do believe they are a key

to improved income," he said. "In contrast to control programs, which are aimed at cutting supply to force higher prices," he said, "farm bargaining and marketing seeks to increase farm income by producing the quantity and quality of commodities that will cause consumers to pay higher prices."

William S. May, vice president of the Federal Land Bank of Wichita, will be featured speaker at the annual stockholders' meeting of the Federal Land Bank Association of Manhattan to be held in the Student Union Ballroom, Kansas State University, Manhattan, on April 8 beginning at 6 p.m.

May is in charge of appraisals for the Wichita Bank and is recognized as one of the outstanding authorities on farm land values in the midwest.

Laurence J. Hoover, president of the association, will preside at the business meeting which will include an annual report to stockholders and the election of directors to fill the expiring terms of Laurence J. Hoover of Junction City and Clifford R. Bergmeier of Wakefield.

## Firm Up Dairy Support For '68

The U. S. Department of Agriculture has announced increases in fluid milk prices to dairy farmers for the coming year in all federal milk order markets except in Florida, which are being considered separately.

USDA's Consumer and Marketing Service officials said the price actions include a continu-

ation of the 20-cent increase in the Class I price differentials currently in effect, and a minimum basic formula price of \$4.33 a hundredweight, to be effective through April 1969. In a few eastern markets using economic price formulas, comparable action is being taken.

The decision is based on evidence presented at a public hearing on national milk order prices Feb. 23 in Memphis, Tenn., held at the request of dairy farmer cooperatives.

The farmers asked for action by USDA to assure price stability in federal milk order

markets across the country. With the assurance of improved milk order prices farmers said they could better plan their dairy operations for the coming year, and be able to continue providing steady, sure supplies of high-quality milk for consumers.

## Bad Year For Wool Producers

Shorn wool production in Kansas during 1967 totaled 3,612,000 pounds, according to the Kansas Livestock Reporting Service.

Wool production for the year was down 3 per cent from a year earlier and was 23 per cent below the 1961-65 average.

The smaller clip was due primarily to a reduction in the number of sheep shorn while average fleece weight was slightly higher than in 1966.

Wool produced in Kansas during 1967 represented shorn wool from 421,000 head of sheep and lambs compared with 434,000 shorn the previous year.

Fleece weights averaged 8.6 pounds compared with 8.5 pounds a year earlier and the highest average since 1956.

The average price farmers received for the 1967 clip was estimated at 31 cents a pound compared with 43 cents in 1966.

The total value of the 1967 clip was \$1,120,000 compared with \$1,594,000 in 1966, and an average value of \$1,890,000 for the 1961-65 period.

### UNITED STATES

Production of shorn and pulled wool in the United States during 1967 amounted to 211 million pounds, grease basis. This is 4 per cent below the 1966 production of 219 million pounds.

Shorn wool production in 1967 totaled 188 million pounds, a 4 per cent decline from the 1966 production of 195 million pounds.

Farmers and ranchers in the United States during 1967 received an average price of 39.8 cents per pound for shorn wool.

Native States (which account for most of the "fleece" wool production) received an average of 36.6 cents per pound in 1967 compared with 51.8 cents

The total value of shorn wool produced in 1967 was \$75 mil-

lion, a decrease of 26 per cent from the 1966 value of \$101 million.

# Hog Prospects Up

Things may be looking up for hog producers.

The USDA Pig Crop Report (issued March 21) showed that farmers are holding the line on swine production. But many men in the hog business tell us

that there were big sales of breeding stock last fall. Such sales indicate that some farmers are increasing hog production this year.

In the past, we have found that the government surveys

and reports were better measures of changes in hog production than the comments obtained by visiting with farmers.

There is no indication of a big increase in hog prices. Most producers don't want that anyway. But there are signs of steady to slightly higher prices during the next 12 months.

**10-State Survey.** The quarterly Pig Crop Report covered 10 Corn Belt states, which produce 76 percent of the nation's hogs. The most important items in the report are as follows:

1. The number of hogs and pigs on hand March 1 was estimated at 39 million — 1 percent more than the 38.8 million on hand a year earlier.

2. The number of breeding animals on hand was listed at 7,051,000 — 3 percent less than last year.

3. Farmers reported intentions to farrow 3,241,000 sows during the March-May quarter — 3 percent less than a year ago.

4. Farmers said that they planned to have 2,183,000 sows to farrow during the June-August quarter — also 3 percent less than year-ago farrowings.

The indicated changes in hog production are small. And that is good — or at least it is better than the big changes that often occur.

Big changes are bad for the industry. Big increases in production bring bigger slashes in prices, while large cuts in pork output lead to the loss of markets to poultry.

**State Changes.** Illinois farmers seem to be holding their share of the hog business fairly well. As compared with last year, our farmers reported 1 percent more market hogs and pigs on hand March 1 — the same as the total increase for the 10 Corn Belt states. They also reported 4 percent fewer breeding animals on hand, while the 10-state total was down only 3 percent.

Other states that showed cuts in breeding stock were Indiana,

down 12 percent; Wisconsin, down 5 percent; Iowa, off 3 percent; and Minnesota, off 2 percent. Missouri swine producers reported 5 percent more breeding animals than last year; Nebraska, 4 percent more.

**Price Prospects.** The Pig Crop Report points to market supplies close to year-before levels during the next 6 months, and a slight reduction for next fall and winter. Supplies of competitive meats, principally beef and poultry, are expected to be moderate — close to year-before levels.

Consumer buying power is up about 7 percent from a year ago. Pork is one of the "best buys" to be found.

Prices for hogs during the next 12 months now seem likely to swing around the year-before average — about \$19.50 for barrows and gilts at central markets. Higher-than-average prices probably will prevail during the summer, say from May thru September.

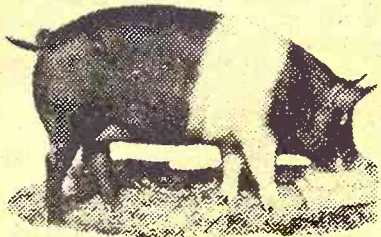

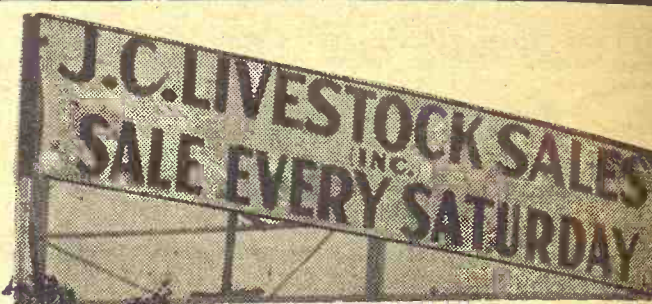

# Largest Winter Pig Crop In 18 Years

The largest winter quarter pig crop in 18 years of records was produced on Kansas farms this year.

Sows farrowing were slightly above the previous year although pigs per litter were below last year, according to the Kansas Crop and Livestock Reporting Service.

The December 1967 to February 1968 pig crop totaled 537,000 head, 4 per cent more than the same period last year and 21 per cent above the 1962-66 average.

Sows farrowed during the December-February quarter totaled 74,000 head, a 6 per cent increase over last year. Pigs per litter averaged 7.26 during the

quarter compared with 7.40 last year.

An estimated 104,000 sows will farrow during the March-May quarter, 6 per cent above last year and 7 per cent above the 1962-66 average.

Indicated farrowings by months show slight increases from a year earlier for March and April while the increase in May will be somewhat larger.

The number of sows to farrow in March, April and May are indicated at 40,000, 38,000 and 26,000 head, respectively. Prospective farrowings for the June-August quarter are estimated at 74,000 head, 2 per cent above the previous year.

The inventory number of all hogs and pigs on Kansas farms is estimated at 1,530,000 head, up 6 per cent from last year and 19 per cent above the 5-year average.

Breeding hog numbers totaled 230,000 head while those being kept for market purposes totaled 1,300,000 head.

The weight distribution for market hogs was as follows: 494,000 under 60 pounds, 268,000 in the 60-119 range, 306,000 weighed 120-179 pounds, 182,000 in the 180-219 pound group and 32,000 weighed 220 pounds and over.

to farrow 3,241,000 sows during the March-May quarter, 3 per cent less than last year. Kansas and Nebraska each show increases while the other 8 States expect decreases.

### Corn Belt States

The number of hogs and pigs in the 10 Corn Belt States on March 1, 1968 is estimated at 39.0 million head.

This is an increase of 1 per cent from the year earlier total of 38.8 million head, and is down seasonally from the 44.1 million on hand December 1, 1967.

Of the total March 1 inventory, 7,051,000 head were being kept for breeding purposes, 3 per cent less than a year earlier. Hogs and pigs other than those kept for breeding, are estimated at 31,953,000 head, 1 per cent more than the 31,532,000 on hand March 1, 1967.

The December-February 1968 pig crop for the 10 states totaled 12,719,000 head, slightly below the crop for the same period a year earlier. The average number of pigs per litter for the December-February 1968 quarter at 7.28, was down slightly from a year earlier. Farmers reported intentions

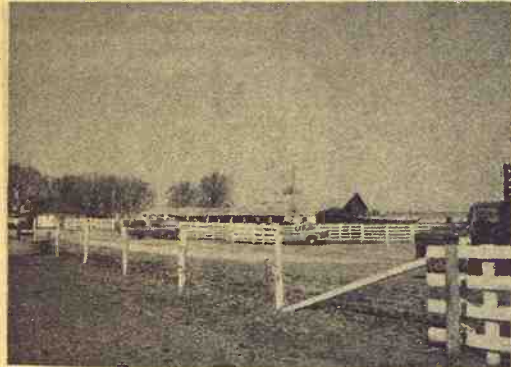
