KANSAS STATE UNIVERSITY Manhattan, Kansas Two American composers of the twentieth century,

Elie Siegmeister (b. 1909) and Norman Dello Joio (b. 1913),

have contributed significant works to the intermediate
level piano repertoire.

A professor at Hofstra University from 1949 to 1976, Elie Siegmeister has won many awards for his compositions. Often containing jazz idioms and folk materials, Siegmeister's works are intended to appeal to a wide audience. This is evident in the attractive tunes and catchy rhythms of his piano teaching pieces. While demonstrating some twentieth-century compositional devices, his compositions generally project a firm sense of tonal center, and dissonance is at a minimum. Selections from three collections by Siegmeister are analyzed and performed in this lecture-recital: "City House" and "Doll House" from <u>A Set of Houses</u>; "Sunny Morning" and "Playing Clown" from <u>The Children's Day</u>; and "Boogie" from American Kaleidoscope.

Also the winner of many awards, Norman Dello Joio taught at the Mannes College of Music and later became dean of Boston University's School of Fine and Applied Arts. His works are noted for their jazz and popular dance rhythms, and for their use of Gregorian chant. The piano works by Dello Joio analyzed and performed here are "Lullaby" and "Bagatelle," from Suite for the Young; "Prayer of the Matador," from Lyric Pieces for the Young; and "Arietta," "Chorale" and "Giga," from Diversions.
