I will send you plans by the building commission. For specifications, as the old system is to be extended it seems impossible to make definite enough statements to cover all particulars. In general a 4'x16" Du. boiler boiler is to be set with connections complete so that either or both boilers can be used on the whole system. Radiators must conform in style and finish to those now in use, i.e. vertical tubes with open base and perforated cast-iron top. All to be heated by direct radiation. Pumps must be below the water line, and must depend upon return pipes besides leaders & steam pipes.
