#### The Four Evangelists

(Northwest corner stairs, left of audience)



Matthew is symbolized as the winged man because he begins his gospel with the human descent of Jesus.



Mark as the winged lion since he opens his gospel by describing John the Baptist as the voice of one crying in the wilderness.



Luke as the winged ox

– he tells most fully
about the sacrificial
death of Jesus (ox or
calf is the symbol of
sacrifice).



John as the eagle – from the first to the last his gospel soars on eagle's wings to the throne of Heaven.



The Twelve Apostles (west side)



Peter is symbolized as the crossed keys

– the keys to
Kingdom of Heaven



Matthias portrayed as Halbert on the Book. He took the place of Judas and was beheaded by a battle axe after missionary work in Judaea.



Andrew as crossed fish. He was a fisherman and later crucified.



Simon Zelotes as a fish on the book depicting a fisher of men through the power of the Gospel.



The Twelve Apostles (west side)



John symbolized by the Chalice and snake. When he made the sign of the cross over a poisoned cup of wine the poison came out in the form of a snake.



Thomas is represented by spear and carpenter's square. He went to India and built a church with his own hands. Killed with a spear by pagan priest.



James the Greater represented by a pilgrim's staff and wallet, symbols of his missionary efforts.



Philip represented by a patriarchal cross and basket holding spear and cross symbols of his missionary activity, feeding of multitude, and martyrdom.



The Twelve Apostles (west side)



Bartholomew depicted by an open Bible and flaying knife, symbolizing his faith in God's Word and his martyrdom.



Matthew is represented by 3 money bags and axe. Purses recall nature of his work before following Jesus.



James the Lesser represented by a saw recalling the fate of this apostle whose body was sawed to pieces after he was killed by the Jews in Jerusalem.



Jude represented by a club which is a symbol of his martyrdom. He usually is represented by a sail boat recalling his many missionary journeys with Simon.



 General nature of the bible: (west side) Communion, Ten Commandments, Holy Bible, Noah's Ark





Four Major Profits: (east side) Daniel, Ezekiel, Jeremiah, Isaiah



Daniel thrown into lion's den remained unharmed.

Ezekiel's prophecy of destruction of Jerusalem by King of Babylon Jeremiah was stoned to death

Isaiah: the saw was the instrument of his reputed martyrdom



Of the 12 Minor Prophets: (east side) Zephaniah, Amos, Joel, Obadiah



Zephaniah: Book on a scroll. He foretold a new order for the remnant of Israel. Amos: Shepherd's crook. He was a herdsman of Tekoa. Joel: Lion & horn.
Joel said "the
enemy is like a
lion" and "blow
ye the trumpet in
Zion."

Obadiah: Scroll is a symbol of prophecy. He foretold future restoration to Israel.



Of the Twelve Minor Profits: (east side) Haggai, Nahum, Micah, Jonah



Haggai: the word of the Lord, revealed to Haggai, urged the rebuilding of the Temple Nahum: the Lord has his way in the whirlwind and in the storm and the clouds are the dust of the Lord's feet Micah: house of the Lord shall be established on top of the mountains Jonah: punished for disobedience by being swallowed by a fish



 Of the Twelve Minor Prophets (east side) Malachi, Zechariah, Habbakuk, Hosea



Malachi: Angel.
"But unto you that
fear my name shall
the Son of
Righteousness
arise with healing
in his wings."

Zechariah: Eyes of the stone. "Upon one stone shall be seven eyes." Habbakuk: Temple. "The Lord is in His holy temple, let all the earth keep silence before him. Hosea: Scroll with a message, letters from one of his messages. His message was one of compassion.



 Symbols of Old Dispensation are the Laver (found in the outer court of the temple used to wash sacrifices by priests), The Menorah (found in the temple representing 7 gifts of the spirit – wisdom, honor, strength, glory, power, blessing, and riches), Altar of Burnt Offering, Ark of the Covenant (northeast stairs, right of audience)



Quatrefoils encircle the circles & are in the colored bands.



The crown represents Jesus, the Alpha and Omega symbolize the beginning & ending, the total, the complete fulfillment of Christianity. The circles represent eternity. The quatrefoil symbolizes the 4 evangelists. The trefoil the trinity.
