We Did It!

- Let's collaborate on a DDA project!
- KSU Joins Yankee Book Peddler (YBP) We approached YBP first.
- When YBP could not come up with a collaborative DDA project, we approached ProQuest.

- ProQuest suggested we choose publishers based on usage.
 - 8 were chosen.
 - 4 were willing to participate:

Springer Publishing

Wiley

Taylor and Francis

Wolters Kluwer

- ProQuest agreed to set up a DDA program with short-term loans.
- When a purchase is triggered, KU and KSU together pay 150% of the list price.
- Both schools have perpetual access to purchased books.
- The project was delayed until EBL and ebrary migrated to ProQuest Ebook Central for both institutions.

- Other questions to consider:
 - How much money does each school contribute to the project up front?
 - How does invoicing through YBP take place?
 - How often are the schools invoiced?
 - How would the new account be set up with YBP?

- And more questions:
 - How does each school track their short-term loans and purchases?
 - How often are catalog records received and loaded?
 - What are the tech specs for the full catalog record?

- The first records were compiled on February 20, 2017.
- Records were loaded and went live on February 27.
 - So far, tweaks have been made. Non-linear lending preference knocked out many Routledge titles.
 - Going to 1 simultaneous user as secondary preference caused turnaway problems.

How We Will Do It in the Future

- ProQuest continues to negotiate with more publishers.
- More time, more records in our catalogs = more purchases.
