Kip Hoffman, along with his brother Stony and father Wendell, is one of many in the G&G area who have turned farmland over to the promise of profit from Christmas trees and evergreens. The Hoffman farming and livestock operation is in Geary county, between Interstate 70 and Alta Vista along K177.

HOFFMAN DOUBLE BAR PINE CHRISTMAS TREES YOUR OWN FANCY BALLED & BURLAPPED



About 40 acres of the Hoffman operation have been turned over to raising and selling Christmas trees and evergreens for landscaping. The first seedlings were planted about eight years ago and many have just reached marketable size. There are both Austrian and Scotch pine varieties here. Kip thinks Austrian pines are superior because they keep their needles longer.

When a tree gets to six or seven feet tall, it has about reached a maximum size if it is to be sold as a Christmas tree. When the trees were put out as seedlings they were less than one foot high. Kip says the Hoffmas have about 40,000 trees on the 40 acres.

The Hoffmans sell their trees thru a marketing cooperative, with most sales within this state and in Texas. Sales last year by the Hoffmans totaled about 2500 trees. They also donated 150 trees to the welfare department in Manhattan for needy families in the area. The parents live in Manhattan, where tather Wendell bases as a network television cameraman. Here's Final 1970 Wheat Report

Sumner County produced more wheat than any other Kansas county in 1970 for the seventh consecutive year, according to the Kansas Crop and Livestock Reporting Service.

Sumner's 10,693,000 bushel crop was 12 percent below the county's 1969 record 12,195,000 bushels, but still ranked as its fourth largest.

Reno County with 8,854,000 bushels ranked second, Ford County was third with 7,185,000 and Thomas County ranked fourth with 6,933,000 bushels.

In Four Counties

In four Kansas counties Greeley, Hamilton, Osborne and Rooks - new high records for wheat production were set in 1970, and in many other counties the crop was the largest in a decade or more.

In seven Kansas counties over 6 million bushels of wheat was produced in 1970 and in fourteen counties over 5 million bushels. The State's 1970 wheat crop totaled 299,-013,000 bushels, the third largest

Production

crop of record but 2 percent smaller than in 1969.

Leading counties in acreage of wheat harvested for grain in 1970 were Sumner with 302,000 acres, Reno with 272,000, and Thomas with 202,000 acres.

Some 15 counties in the western two-thirds of Kansas harvested 150,000 acres or more of wheat in 1970. The three central crop reporting districts of Kansas accounted for 50 percent of the State's harvested acreage, the three western districts 40 percent, and the three eastern districts 10 percent.

Farmers in Kansas planted 9,690,-000 acres of wheat for the 1970 crop, 10 percent less than a year earlier. Of these, 9,061,000 acres were harvested for grain, 8 percent less than in 1969. Abandonment was light in most parts of the state this year.







QUICKY PEACH CAKE

1 (21/2 size) can sliced peaches 1 box butter brickle cake mix

1/4 teaspoon almond flavoring

1/2 teaspoon butter flavoring 1 stick margarine or butter, melted

1/2 cup chopped pecans

Empty peaches, juice and all in a well-greased 9x13 inch pan. Stir in almond flavoring. Sprinkle dry butter brickle cake mix over top of peaches. Melt margarine or butter and combine with butter flavoring. Pour over top of cake mix. sprinkle on nuts. With a fork work cake mix into peach juice until all is moistened. Bake in 375-degree oven about 45 minutes or until done. Serve with whipped cream or whipped topping, if desired. Delicious hot, but very good cold. Can use other kinds of fruit also but the butter brickle and peaches have a wonderful flavor.

SAUERKRAUT SOUP (ZELOVKA)

Home-made sauerkraut is best for Czech Zelovka, because it is the addition of the sauerkraut juice which makes it so good. Lacking that, used canned sauerkraut, adding about three times as much water as there is kraut. Add 1 teaspoon caraway seed and a bit of finely chopped onion, if desired. Cook for about one-half hour. Thicken a carton of sour cream with

flour, add to the kraut. The consistency should be like a very fine gravy. Then dribble 1 or 2 raw eggs into the soup and let cook a few moments before stirring so that egg will be shirred rather than smoothly blended in. Small new potatoes, cooked, may be added, or a scoop of mashed potatoes may be placed in the center of each serving. Another variation: Eggs may be added, stirring carefully after each egg is dropped in, making sure that the eggs rema**in** whole. Cook until eggs are poached in the gravy. Prepare one egg for each person served.

WHITE BREAD (Straight Dough Process)

1 cake yeast foam or magic yeast ½ cup lukewarm water

4 teaspoons salt

4 tablespoons sugar

4 tablespoons shortening

1 quart lukewarm water 31/2 quarts (or more) sifted flour

In the evening, soak the yeast cake 20 minutes in 1/2 cup lukewarm water. Mix well in a bowl to a medium dough the salt, sugar, shortening, lukewarm water, flour and dissolved yeast. Knead about ten minutes. Cover. Let raise in moderately warm place overnight or about ten hours. Knead down. Let raise until doubled. Make into four or five loaves. Let raise to double size. Bake 45 - 60 minutes in a moderate oven. In cool weather, warm flour before mixing. Avoid materials becoming chilled. Rolls



3 tablespoons cooking oil Finely chop candy bars and sprinkle with the 1 tablespoon flour on waxed paper. Set aside. Spoon or pour 21/2 cups flour into mixing bowl. Add sugar, baking powder, salt and orange rind to flour. Stir well to blend. Combine eggs, orange juice, water and oil in small bowl. Beat well. Add liquid ingredients to blended dry ingredients all at once. Stir until all ingredients are

moistened. Stir in candy bar mix-

ture, reserving a few pieces for tops of loaves. Pour batter into two welf-greased waxed paper lined 73/8 x 35/8 x 21/4 inch pans. Bake at 350 degrees for 50-60 minutes. Cool five minutes and remove from pans.







CHERRY CRISSCROSS PIE

Tapioca Gives Consistency

To Cherry Pie Filling

4 teaspoons quick-cooking tapioca

1 cup sugar

1/8 teaspoon salt

2 cans (1 pound each) drained water packed pitted red sour cherries

½ cup drained cherry liquid 6 drops red food coloring

1/4 teaspoon almond extract (optional)

Pastry for 2-crust 9" pie 1 tablespoon butter

Combine tapioca, sugar, salt, cherries, cherry liquid, food coloring and almond extract. Mix thoroughly and let stand for about 15 minutes. Roll half of the pastry 1/8 inch thick. Line a 9-inch pie pan and trim pastry at edge of rim. Roll remaining pastry 1/8 inch thick. Cut into 1/2" strips. Fill pie shell with cherry mixture. Dot with butter. Moisten edge of bottom crust. Adjust pastry strips in lattice across top. Trim and press ends to edge of bottom crust. Flute edge. Bake at 425 degrees for

Perhaps that most note-worthy bill to be introduced is an anticorporation farming proposal. It was introduced in the House by Reps. Richard C. Loux, D-Wichita, and James Bucehle, D-Topeka.

the labeling requirements for mixed livestock feed. Current law requires labeling of ready mixed feed to carry a list of ingredients. The proposed law would allow the feed to carry just the chemical analysis.

For example, the bag labels would carry percentage listings for proteins, carbohydrates, animal and vegetable fats, and other component parts of the ration.

After consideration, the bill was introduced as a proposal from the Agriculture and Livestock Committee of the Senate.

Final Push To Order Seedlings

improve the environment around their farms and carry on the century-long tradition of tree planting in the state can do so at minimum expense by immediately ordering tree and shrub seedlings from the Division of State and Extension Forestry at Kansas State Universitv

The tree distribution program is an annual event for the KSU Extension foresters. However, Gene Grey, assistant state forester, says the "need for tree planting is greater than ever in view of the future needs of Kansas and the nation.

"Our Kansas settlers saw the need in this state for tree plantings and the fine old hardwoods and stately pines stand in testimony of their hard work and foresight. We can carry on this heritage by planting trees and still reap the many practical and aesthetic rewards during our own lifetimes," Grey explains.

This year landowners will have their choice of 28 species of tree and shrub seedlings to choose from. The seedlings are either bare-rooted or potted in thin tarpaper pots.

Grey emphasizes that the seedlings are for windbreaks. shelterbelts, woodlots, erosion control, wildlife habitat, farm ponds, or Christmas tree plantings - not for ornamental or landscaping

should be bought from commercial nurseries

Landowners can order from seven evergreen, 13 deciduous, and eight shrub species. Popular bare-root species distributed in past years include Scotch pine, Austrian pine, white pine, Eastern redcedar, black walnut, Russian olive, silver maple, lilac, Nanking cherry, and American plum.

Native pecan and black walnut nuts - stratified to hasten germination — are another popular

Prices are \$8.00 per hundred for bare-root tree and shrub seedlings and \$2.00 per hundred for stratified nuts. Trees and shrubs must be ordered in multiples of 50. Bare-root and nut orders are shipped parcel post from late March through April.

Five evergreen species — Scotch pine, white pine, ponderosa pine, Austrian pine, and Eastern redcedar will be available in small tarpaper pots. "Potted trees survive and grow better in dry conditions," Grey

explains. Price for potted seedlings is \$7.50 per 30 seedlings. Minimum orders forestry standpoint, too. High must be for 30 trees of each species

Kansas landowners desiring to purposes. Plants for these purposes Manhattan, Topeka, Hiawatha, Erie and Lawrence.

Landowners must specify on their order blanks where they want to pick up their potted seedlings. They will be notified when the plants are delivered. Delivery will be in late April, depending on weather con-

A new feature for 1971 is wildlife bundles. "They're a ready-made package of 50 American plum, 50 fragrant sumac, and 50 common lilac, plus a mixture of six evergreen and deciduous trees and five pounds of mixed native grass seed. When planted near a food supply such as a grain field, they will enhance wildlife habitat," Grey explains.

Each wildlife bundle will cost \$15.00 and will be shipped by parcel post from late March through April.

Grey urges landowners to order and plant trees for both practical and aesthetic reasons. He notes that 200 Kansas stockmen reported that when 100 or more head of cattle were involved, a tree windbreak saved them \$500 per year in extra gains. and reduced calf losses.





Kansas Livestock Values At \$1.18 Billion

Farmers and ranchers in Kansas began the 1971 year with cattle numbers at a record high and hog umbers up sharply, according to the Kansas Crop and Livestock Reporting Service.

Cattle and calves on January 1, 1971 totaled 6,618,000, 10 percent above a year earlier and a new high record.

Hogs and pigs totaled 2,202,000 on December 1, 1970, up sharply from a year earlier and the largest number on Kansas farms since the middle 1940's. All sheep and lambs totaled 328,000 on January 1, 1971, down 13 percent from last year and the smallest number since 1924.

Chicken numbers continued to decline with 4,635,000 on hand January 1, down 5 percent from last year and the smallest in records covering 47 years. Turkey numbers on farms January 1 totaled 38,000, slightly above the 35,000 the two previous years but otherwise mallest in records covering 43

Total value of all livestock and oultry on Kansas farms and ranches January 1, 1971 was \$1,182,068,000, up 8 percent from last ear and the highest of record.

Cattle

All cattle and calves on hand January 1, 1971, numbered 6,618,000, the largest number ever on Kansas farms. More cows, a larger calf crop in 1970 and a sharp increase of inshipments of feeder stock for new and expanded feedlots were contributors to the increase.

All cattle classes increased from a year ago except milk cows and milk replacement heifers.

All cows totaled 2,097,000, 6 percent more than a year earlier. Beef cows totaled 1,899,000, up 7 percent from January 1 last year.

Interest Lags In Low-Lead Gas

Gasolines with less lead in them may reduce air pollution, but not if drivers don't buy them.

And indications in Missouri where several oil companies have reducedlead gasolines on sale are that there is no great demand.

Standard Oil's Amoco is the only low-lead gas promoted in the G&G area and records of its sales are not known. In Kansas City, however, Standard says sales of lead-free Amoco are running only about 10 per cent of regular-grade volume.

In Missouri, where Gulf, Shell, and Clark as well as Standard have lowlead gas on sale, the sales record is similar. Gulf said sales were "moderately low," and Shell figured sales were about 5 per cent of total sales.

The companies indicated that interest in low-lead gasoline tapered off after an early interest when it first went on sale.

NORTON — It was Norton county's first rustling case in a number of years, and possibly its first case of women rustlers.

The outcome is that Mrs. Doris Henry, 45, and Fanny Post, 53, both of Logan, are on 3-year probation and can no longer associate with each other. They had known each other for at least 10 years, had worked together in a Logan restaurant, and recently had been living on a farm rented by Mrs. Henry near Logan.

The 2 women pleaded guilty in Norton county district court to 2 counts of cattle theft and one count of hay theft. They were paroled from

concurrent 1-to-10 year sentences to Kansas State Industrial Farm for Women, Lansing, on each cattle charge, and fined \$100 on the hay

Sheriff Max Archer said the women came under suspicion early in the investigation.

The first incident was theft of 30 bales of hay Dec. 18 from the Dale

About midnight on New Year's Eve, according to the charge, the 2 in early March. The three-building women shot and butchered a cow in a pasture on the Lew Ninemire farm 191/2 miles southwest of Norton. When apprehended, they allegedly still were in possession of that meat.





research scientists may use each other's facilities as the need arises.

Included in the program for the new facility will be grain drying research with a potential saving of \$22.5 million annually in farm and handling costs; grain conditioning and storage problems with possible savings up to \$26.4 million annually; grain handling methods currently costing \$15 million annually; regional systems analysis for grain handling and marketing, now valued at \$64 million annually; transportation equipment studies and transport systems studies, a \$75 million annual job.

In the area of field crops and animal products, the center will be grading and handling, control of deterioration from insects and other forms of damage during storage and handling; developing instruments and techniques for handling and milling and developing more efficient methods for determining milling quality and protein of wheat and other grains.

Through controlled environmental research in the new laboratories, the ARS scientists hope to learn new ways of controlling insects to keep down use of pesticides and possible residues in food and feed grains and new means of detecting and controlling insect infestations in field and stored grains.



NEW U.S. GRAIN MARKETING AND RESEARCH CENTER

There's no shortage of space at the U.S. Grain Marketing and Research center which will open near the Kansas State University campus in March. But only 20 scientists will occupy this building this spring instead of the projected staff of 150.

There is 56,000 square feet of office and lab space, some 18,000 square feet of space in the pilot plant, and nearly 15,000 square feet of research space in the elevator.





Surprise At Swift Turn Toward Sterilization

Last year 750,000 Americans chose the most drastic means of birth control. They had themselves sterilized.

Increasing numbers, at a rate that surprizes even the experts, both men and women are turning to sterilization as a way out of the birth control dilemma

Just a year ago, only one clinic in the United States was performing vasectomies - the male sterilization operation. Now there are 15, and the Association for Voluntary Sterilization (A.V.S.) in New York estimates there will be 50 throughout the country by the end of

The A.V.S. had anticipated only 150,000 vasectomies in 1970. But a nationwide survey found that about 275,000 had been performed in the first six months of the year, many of them in doctor's offices.

A total of 3 million Americans men and women - have been sterilized, according to projections prepared by a population expert, Christopher Tietze, who was a member of President Lyndon B. Johnson's population study com-

Of the 750,000 persons sterilized in 1970, the A.V.S estimates 200,000 were women - a figure based on both surveys and referrals to doctors and clinics. A new device called a laparascope enables physicians to perform operations on women in about 30 minutes — one possible explanation for the increasing popularity of the procedure.

Take-home pay and food costs jumped 5.5 per cent each in 1970, with 16.7 cents of each dollar going to food bills. It was the same costper-dollar as in 1969, a point reached in gradual declines since a peak of

time in 12 years, the agriculture 20.9 cents in 1958. This year, the report said, total food costs will continue to rise but at a slower rate, perhaps only 2 to 3 per cent. In fact, the report said, food bought at retail stores in 1971 may average only 1 to 2 per cent higher, compared with a 5 per cent supermarket boost last

> But prices in restuarants will continue rising at a faster clip. Last year they went up 7.5 per cent, an increase the report said might be shaved a bit in 1971.

> Retail store prices for pork, eggs, poultry, potatoes and some vegetables are expected to drop, while higher prices are forecast for fish, dairy products, cereals, sugar and processed vegetables.

> In all, the nation's food bill could total between 118 billion and 121 billion dollars in 1971, compared with 114.3 billion last year, a 9billion-dollar gain from 1969.

> Although the U.S.D.A. report indicated hopes food prices may not gain as much this year, the

Officials said lower prices for farm products are chief reasons for the current outlook on a slower gain in 1971. Economists have indicated net farm income will be down this year from 15.8 billion in 1970.

Frontier Airlines, the primary supplier of air service in the G&G area, says it lost nearly \$2.8 million in 1970. The company had increased passenger traffic and income but not enough to get into the black. Frontier lost \$4.7 million in 1969.

Property Taxes Up 3% With Tax Lid Control

Property taxes across Kansas increased by only 3 per cent from 1969 to 1970, the Legislative Council Research Dept. told a House committee in the first analysis of the impact of the "tax lid."

It was the lowest amount of growth in property taxes in the last five years, the Research Dept. memo said, "The 'tax lid' was a major factor in reducing the annual increase in tangible property tax levies."

The report was delivered to the House Assessment and Taxation Committee by Richard Ryan, assistant director and chief fiscal analyst for the Legislative Council Research Dept.

The increase of 3 per cent in property tax from 1969 to 1970 contrasts vividly with the 80 per cent increase that was experienced during the 10-year period from 1960 to 1970, the Research Dept. memo

Even though property taxes rose by only 3 per cent from 1969 to 1970, total tangible property levies went up by \$14.5 million, the report said.

Tax levies rose by that amount despite the "tax lid" because a number of property tax levies are exempt from provisions of the 1970 act, the report said.

It noted "the state, townships, special districts and Washburn University are not covered, by the 'tax lid' law. Their combined levies increased by \$1.1 million from 1969







There have been news reports in Grass & Grain and other newspapers that the NFO was taking credit for gains in hog prices in recent weeks. Local NFO groups have even taken ads in some area newspapers to document their claims.

This contention has drawn rebuttal from John Adrian of Moundridge, who in a letter to the Hutchinson News aimed at claims of Don Willms, NFO bargaining supervisor in Reno county.

Here is what Adrian wrote:

"I would be the last one to say that the NFO doesn't do some good for agriculture as an organization.

"The NFO philsophy of organizing farmers into a strong and effective group to be run by and made up of only farmers who seek to improve the economic plight of agriculture, is sound and logical. But their approach, methods and claims of success are something else.

"Willm's statement that three weeks ago people were saying the 'hog prices couldn't go up' and that about it. (according to Willms) because of the NFO 'hog Carvans' and their so called 'Hog Lift' demonstrations,

mortal taking credit for the sunshine. Parading a few hogs in front of our nation's capitol and the hauling of a few loads of pigs through Hutchinson and Wichita is hardly 'earth shaking' enough to cause hog buying stations to rush out and generously pay all of us hog men a better price. Those people who yiewed the caravans and read the publicity were bettter informed possibly, and in that a service was rendered but any impact on prices is highly debateable.

"I would also like to remind Willms that both of the markets that I sell my finished hogs to in Arkansas City and Wichita have told me personally that the huge runs of marketing appeared to be tapering off some and that an improved price could be expected in the near future.' This information was given to me many weeks ago when the hog price was still hovering between \$15 and \$16

"Willms contention also that the policy of moving hogs from one area to another, (called 'Hog Lift' by him) was being done long before either he or NFO every through

"Cudahy Packing Co. at Wichita isn't able to buy nearly enough hogs on the Wichita market daily to keep prices started up, is irresponsible to their plant operating, so consay the last. Almost like some sequently they purchase more hogs

"The same is true of Maurer-Neuer Packing plant at Arkansas City. In fact they buy hogs two days a week at Newton and one day at Hutchinson and other areas as well, and all of these hogs are trucked (or 'Hog Lifted' if your prefer) to their plant at Arkansas City.

"These are both good markets and Maurer-Neuer does buy hogs on a 'grade yield' from anyone and not only NFO members, and very often a producer gets \$1 or more per hogs over the market price.

"I would agree with Willms that the USDA livestock reporting service leaves something to be desired but so does NFO's.

"I know of one county that has less than 50 members out of a total of about 1,500 farmers in the county and certainly that can't provide a very reliable reporting service.

"In fact, I would question that the entire NFO membership in Kansas is adequate for any kind of an accurate count.

"I guess my 'pet peeve' with NFO is that they are so quick to take credit for good prices and ignore responsibility for low prices. I don't reall them ever taking credit for low wheat prices.

"Bargaining with the processor for a better price collectively is good if done from a position of strength but that strength comes basically from two sources - membership and keeping production under control and NFO seems to ignore







Breeding ewes 1 year old and older on farms and ranches January 1, 1970 were down 5 per cent from a year earlier and ewe lambs under 1 year old were down 2 per cent.

The lambing percentage for 1970 (number of lambs saved per 100 ewes 1 year old and older on hand January 1), at 96, is 3 points above 1969. The 13 Western States lambing percentage, at 93, and the 35 Native States percentage, at 106, were 4 points and 1 point respectively above the previous year.

Western States

The 1970 lamb crop in the 13 Western States (11 Western, South Dakota, and Texas) totaled 9,533,000 head, down 112,000 head from the 1969 crop of 9,645,000 head.

The number of breeding ewes 1 year old and older on January 1, 1970, at 10,228,000 head, was down 5 per cent from a year earlier. The

lambing percentage during 1970, at have not been affected by lay-offs. 93, is 4 points above 1969.

The lamb crop was larger than a year earlier in Texas, up 4 per cent; New Mexico, up 3 per cent; and Utah and Washington, both up 2 per cent. The number of early lambs (dropped before March 15) in the Western States was down 2 per cent from 1969.





Milford. The Tulsa district of the Corps of Engineers decided to try a lake control plan proposed by the Kansas Fish & Game Commission. Aimed at improving water quality, the plan included a milo planting along the edge of the reservoir to help produce spawning sites for game fish.

Fishing writers say that early results on crappie fishing at least are spectacular. Even after the lake had mostly frozen over, there were some fantastic winter fishing

Lyle Jones, owner of a marina at Council Grove, said that eight men fishing in two parties in Munkers Creek thru the ice caught 400 to 500 crappie in one morning.

Jones, who collects many of the samples for water quality tests, is ecstatic. "The water is so much better than it used to be." He figures he may have the door open some nice days in March, even tho he won't officially open until April.

US 24 Set For **Improvements**

Bids will be taken February 25 at Salina for highway improvements on U.S. 24 in Douglas and Leavenworth Counties and other construction and maintenance work.

Also up for bidding will be repair work on three bridges on I-70 at two locations in Kansas City, Kansas. One will be the on-off ramp to southbound Seventh street traffic, and the other on Seventh street over I-70 for both east and westbound traffic.

Upgrading of U.S. 24 to modern 2lane standards will extend from the Jefferson-Douglas County line, east for 25 miles to the 4-lane pavement nine miles east of Tonganoxie in Leavenworth County. The work will include widening, asphaltic concrete overlay and stabilized shoulders.

With this aid, Kansas farmers have constructed over 56 million bushels of grain storage. As of December 31, 1970, repayments had reduced the total of loans outstanding to \$3.2 million.

The interest rate has been lowered from 71/2 percent annually to 6 percent because of recent lowering of the borrowing cost of money to the Commodity Credit Corporation, Patton said.

Other changes in the program:

The maximum loan or outstanding aggregate balance increased from \$25,000 to \$35,000. This removes the \$5000 loan limit on drying equipment and permits such loans to 85 percent of the cost or \$35,000. The restriction has been removed on various kinds of equipment. Operating equipment essential to the practical operation of the storage or drying unit may be included in a loan for storage or drying equipment.

- Loans may be made to add essential equipment to an existing storage or drying unit and costs of foundations and electrical wiring may be included in the loan.

Palton said the changes were made to assist farmers in more orderly marketing of their commodities by allowing them to hold their products and take better advantage of market prices.

Kansans were assured of a vote April 6 on a constitutional amendment permitting voters 18 years old and older to vote in state and local elections as well as federal elections when the Senate took final action to submit the question.

The Senate concurred with House amendments to the resolution after the House had given the necessary two-thirds vote to the proposal earlier in the day.

The vote was 37 to 1. Sen. Charles Hinchey (D-Kansas_City, Kansas), who voted against concurrence, said he believed that those 18 years old were "to immature to vote."

"I voted against it because I just feel that 18-year-olds are really to immature to vote in these elections," Hinchey said. "I think they may be old enough for some things but I just don't think they are


