Rachel Dirks is an active conductor, clinician and educator. She holds cello performance degrees from the University of Texas at Austin and Bethel College, and she is currently working towards her Ph.D. in music education and orchestral conducting at the University of Kansas. As a guest conductor, she has been invited to conduct orchestras throughout the United States. In addition, she has traveled and performed with her orchestras throughout Italy, Austria, Ireland, San Francisco, Chicago, and has performed twice in New York's Carnegie Hall. She is excited to join the Department of Music, Theatre, and Dance and looks forward to an exciting season with the K-State Symphony Orchestra.

Jerry Jay Cranford, professor of theatre at KSU, performed the roles of Prouvaire/Enjolras in Les Miserables on Broadway and the national tour performing with Colm Wilkinson, Norm Lewis, Sutton Foster and Lea Salonga. He was the Genie in Disneyland's musical Aladdin, as well as serving as a Master Clinician teaching workshops in theatre and music. Cranford starred in tours of Singing in the Rain-Don Lockwood, Anything Goes-Billy Crocker and was featured dancer on the European tour of Evita directed by Larry Fuller. He worked with Fosse's assistant John Sharpe and studied briefly with Fosse's wife and muse Gwen Verdon. Recently, he directed KSU's Into the Woods, worked with Dreamworks Studios on their TYA world premiere of Madagascar: A Musical Adventure and directed KU Opera Theatre's Candide for the National Bernstein Symposium (yes, KU). In summer of 2018 he choreographed the New Theatre's production of Sister Act the Musical then directed and choreographed the Kansas City and Omaha premieres of Newsies the Musical as well as Kansas City Starlight's production of Hairspray the Musical. Mr. Cranford is a 30-year member of Actors Equity Association and the proud father of two sometimes well-behaved girls.

Amanda Arrington has served as faculty collaborative pianist at the Kansas State University School of Music, Theatre, and Dance since 2010. She maintains an active performing career collaborating with faculty artists, guest artists, and students in a variety of performances. She is an advocate of new music, having premiered works nationally and internationally. Amanda holds degrees in Music Education from Kansas State University and Piano Pedagogy from the University of Central Missouri.

Alicia Williard is a freelance musician in the Manhattan area, working primarily as a pianist at KSU, in addition to accompanying the Flint Hills Children's Chorus and First Lutheran Church Choir. She earned her degree in Music Composition from the University of North Carolina School of the Arts in 2012 and is a member of the American Society for Composers, Authors, and Publishers (ASCAP). Alicia has an extensive background in vocal coaching and music directing, as well as composing, performing, and teaching privately throughout the country. She has most recently been seen as Music Director/Pianist for Manhattan Arts Center's production of "My Fair Lady."
