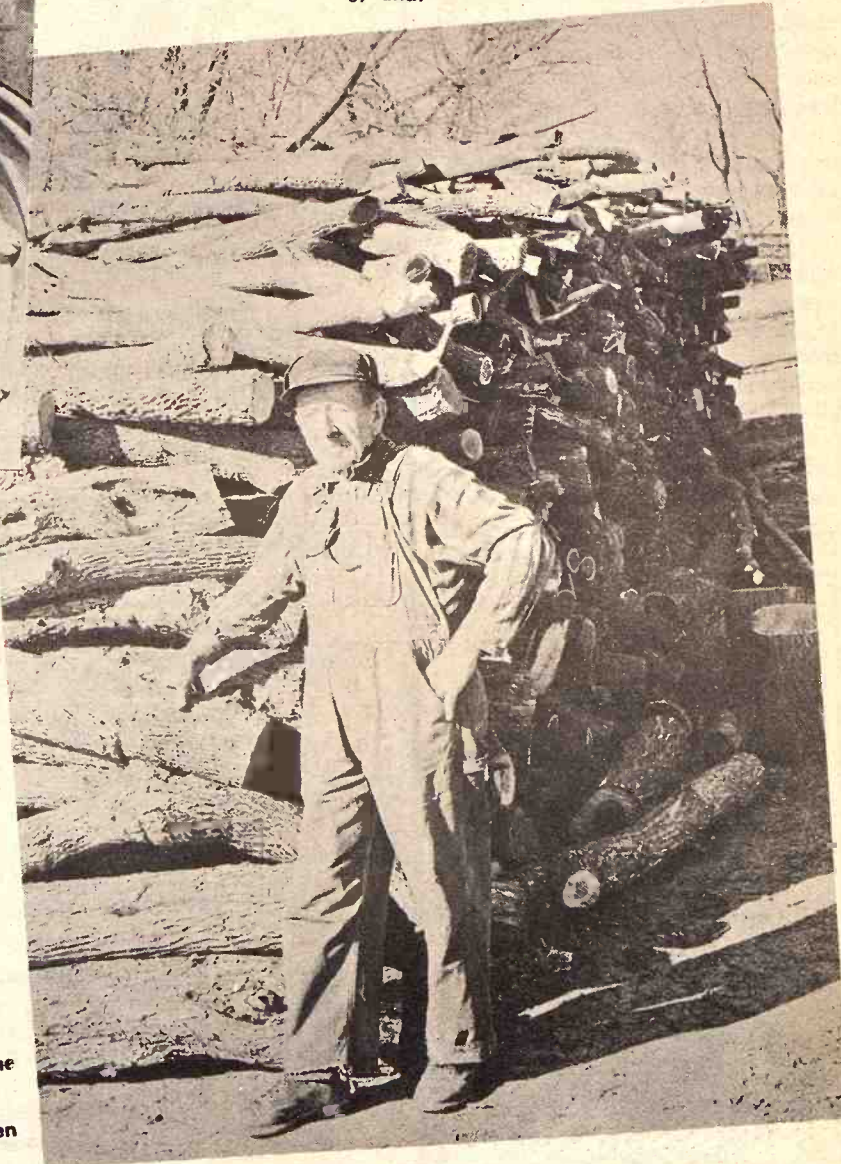

## Lumberjacking At 83

## Soviets May Be Back In Market To Buy Wheat

Western economists believe the setback dealt to the Russian winter grain crop by an unusual cold wave has increased prospects for a new Soviet purchase of American grain, possibly when President Richard Nixon visits Moscow in late May.

Moscow has disclosed the purchase of food grains from Canada valued at \$330 million. Western specialists interpreted the size of the deal as further evidence of the seriousness of the agricultural situation.

Slightly more than one-fourth of the winter wheat, barley and rye—or about 15 million metric tons of grain—may have been destroyed by the cold from Moldavia and the Southern Ukraine and into Central Asia.

Foreign analysts foresee an even tighter squeeze than normal on Soviet purchases of foreign computers and machines unless crop losses are reversed by replanting. This could mean cutbacks in industrial development plans.

So far there is no confirmation here on reports abroad that the Russians may be selling gold for the first time since 1967 to finance grain purchases. Unlike other Soviet purchases abroad, they are not offset in the short run by Soviet exports.

This means that after such setbacks economic planners have to divert funds from modernizing industry or new plans like the massive truck factory on the Kama River, to pay for the foreign grain purchases.

With a major replanting effort and warm, moist spring weather, the Soviets could recoup the winter losses, according to foreign economists.

## Place Values On Shade Trees

When you plant a shade tree, plant a good one. Trees vary in value as much as a tusked, wild boar and a tested, top herd sire.

Jim Nighswonger, an extension specialist, environmental forestry, at Kansas State University, Manhattan, used these examples for maximum values of shade trees in eastern Kansas with trunk diameters of 14 inches: cottonwood or Chinese elm, \$277; hackberry, \$831; red oak or sugar maple, \$1385; ginkgo, \$2770.

Nighswonger used the National Shade Tree Conference formula to determine the maximum value of such trees in home yards. Value of a tree in different sections of Kansas also varies with life expectancy, branching structure, durability, growth rate, and freedom from insect and diseases attacks.

Nighswonger says that trees' functions are as important as their beauty. They can provide shade on exposed roofs or windows, protect from wind, frame a view, furnish a background, screen an unattractive view, or absorb traffic noise.

Consider both their function and their appearance before you plant them. Extension foresters are a good source of information on trees for your area.

Leonid I. Brezhnev, the Communist party leader, and other members of the ruling Politburo have held two important meetings in the last two weeks with regional and agricultural officials to spur them to extraordinary efforts to

recover from the winter losses. But weather forecasts for March are not favorable.

Soviet consumers will not know for three or four months how the winter setbacks will actually affect them. By mid-June and as early as late

May, when Nixon is here, the Kremlin will have a good idea whether its replanting campaign has succeeded.

In November the Soviets ordered \$140 million in American feed grains to be delivered by July 1 to help

maintain and expand livestock herds. In the current 5-year ending in 1975, economic plans have made a commitment to up the herds to give Soviet consumers more meat and products.

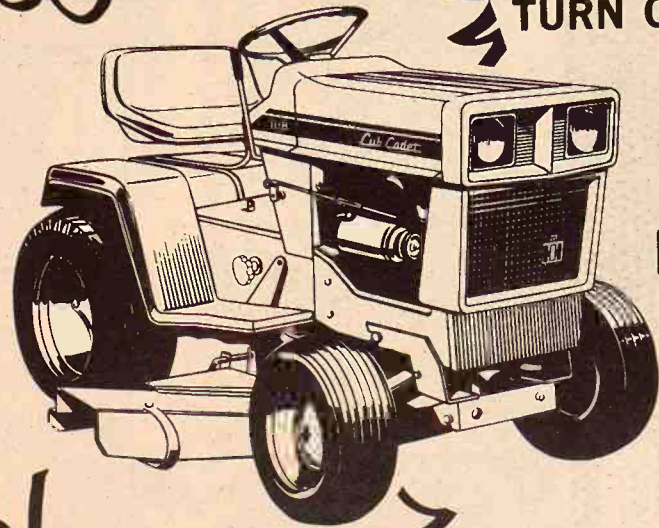

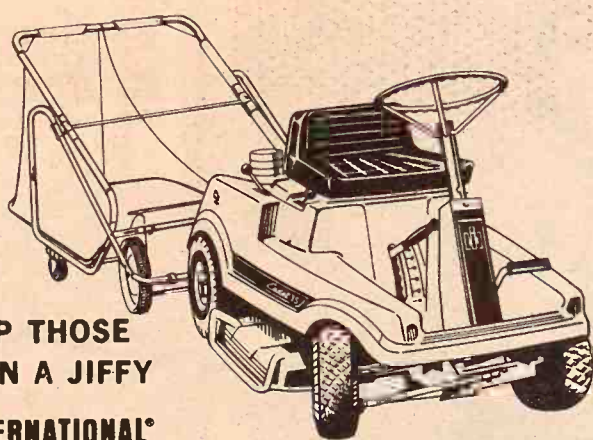

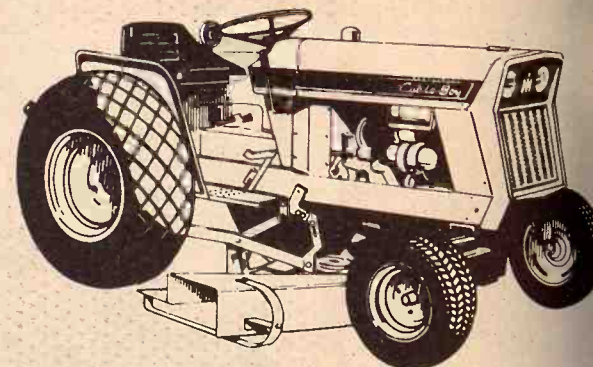

## DES Findings From Arizona Cattle

The U.S. Department of Agriculture has reported finding diethylstilbestrol (DES) residues in cattle livers sampled by federal inspectors in Arizona. These

are the third and fourth DES-positive samples reported since a mandatory certification program for the growth-promoting hormone went into effect Jan. 8. Officials said muscle tissue samples from both animals were negative for DES.

USDA's Consumer and Marketing Service said one liver sample, containing 1.5 parts per billion of DES, was from a steer presented for slaughter by GILA Bend Feed

Residues were confirmed in both samples March 3. C & MS said that in both cases, the livestock had been certified before presentation for slaughter.

Officials said the positive findings have been reported to the Food and Drug Administration which has jurisdiction over animal feed additives.

As a result of the positive findings, officials said, certifications will not be accepted from the two feedlots on future shipments of livestock. They will have to have their animals held 7 days prior to slaughter or have the animals slaughtered and retained pending the outcome of laboratory analysis, C&MS said.

C&MS explained that the mandatory certification gives producers and feeders three options for handling livestock. The animals may be certified as not having been

fed DES or as having been withdrawn from feed containing DES at least 7 days prior to presentation for slaughter. Alternatively, the animals may be held at a slaughter plant 7 days prior to slaughter, or slaughtered and retained at the plant until liver and muscle samples are tested for DES residues.

# Millions 'Misspent' On Medicare, Auditors Say

Health insurance companies have misspent millions of Medicare dollars, federal auditors have found, because of business inefficiencies and excess payments to doctors.

Previously undisclosed audits by the Department of Health, Education and Welfare questioned practices ranging from the purchase of 2,100 monogrammed golf balls to payment of \$320 million to Florida doctors without assurance that the fees were reasonable.

The auditors' reports also showed that:

- Based on 129 processing errors round in 520 typical claims, the Colorado Medical Service (Blue Shield) paid in 1968 and 1969 an estimated \$775,000 overcharge, plus \$167,800 in duplicate bills, and another \$1.5 million for unnecessary services by doctors.

- Connecticut General Life Insurance Company, between 1966 and 1969, made errors on 6.7 per cent of Medicare bills. The 36,000 duplicate or excess payments totaled \$1.2 million.

- Aetna Life Insurance Company had an 8.5-per-cent error rate between 1967 and 1969, issuing 156,000 excess or duplicate checks totalling \$4.5 million.

- 13.5 per cent of Medicare doctor bills paid by Florida Blue Shield between 1967 and 1970 were processed with error or deficiency.

- Massachusetts Blue Shield made duplicate Medicare payments of \$1.9 million between 1966 and 1968. "Positive action to collect these overpayments has yet to be taken," the auditors said.

- In 1970 Occidental Life Insurance Company paid \$3.2 million in Medicare benefits to Southern California doctors who had "past histories of irregular or unusual billing practices without adequately reviewing the propriety of the services or the amounts claimed." Some of these doctors had already been indicted for Medicare fraud, the audit said.

Spokesmen for the Social Security Administration and the insurance companies said many of the

deficiencies disclosed by the audits have been remedied. Some insurers also challenge parts of the findings, objecting to the HEW auditors' statistical projections of misspending from an analysis of sample payments.

The claims of corrective action could not be verified. The audits run two years late, and the Social Security Administration won't open current files to newsmen.

A staff report of the Senate Finance Committee on the 33 Blue Shield plans, 15 commercial companies, and two independent insurers acting as Medicare payment agents for doctor bills had this to say:

"Carrier performance under Medicare has in the majority of

instances been erratic, inefficient, costly and inconsistent with congressional intent...Unquestionably millions of dollars of public funds have gone to subsidize carrier inefficiency."

Thomas M. Tierney, who runs the Medicare program for the government, had a different assessment. "I think in the over all, they (carriers and intermediaries) have done an effective job in administering a very complex program," he said. "This is not to say there are not problems."

The insurance companies and "blue" plans funnel government money to health institutions and doctors who treat Medicare patients. They assume no risk, administrative expenses are paid in full and no profit is allowed.

The HEW audit findings, which will be aired this month at hearings by the Senate antitrust and monopoly subcommittee, are serving as ammunition for proponents of government-run health insurance.

"The weaknesses demonstrated in

the audits should disqualify business from any role in new health-care, insuring arrangements," said Max Fine, executive director of the Committee for National Health Insurance.

President Nixon, among others, proposes to funnel billions of dollars into the carriers and an expanded, government-required and subsidized health insurance.

The federal auditors' most common complaint involved overcharges—failure by companies to limit physicians' payments to "reasonable, customary and usual fees," as defined by doctors themselves.

The Social Security Administration, under prodding from Congress, has recently removed

some companies from the program or cut their Medicare business. Cleveland Blue Shield lost its contract. Thirteen counties in southern California were taken away from California Blue Shield. Chicago Blue Shield lost six ties.

The auditors also spotted expenses they said were charged improperly to Medicare.

They included those golf, country club and social memberships, liquor and leased cars.

In addition, 21 of 74 Blue Cross plans have built new offices since Medicare began, financed in part with government money. The government considers this expenditure legitimate.

#### To Dry Celery

To dry celery leaves for use in soups, stuffings, and meat loaves, place leaves in shallow pan and dry in a gas oven with just the pilot for heat or use a very low temperature electric oven. When dry, store in a tightly sealed jar.

## Correct Fit Important For Growing Children

Children's shoes have become bright and fashionable, and being "in" is a factor to be considered when purchasing them. But still the most important thing to remember when buying children's shoes is fit.

Proper fit is as important to a child's growth as fresh air and vitamins. Because you can't depend on a child to tell you his shoes don't fit, it is up to the parents to buy shoes that fit well.

A child's foot grows at uneven intervals. From ages one to six he needs to have his feet measured for a possible shoe change every four to six weeks. Some shoe stores mail frequent reminders to parents, but many don't. So it is up to the parents to remember to check their children's shoes.

Youngsters from 6 to 10 can go for about three months between size checks, and 10-to-12-year-olds should have new shoes four times a year. Less frequent checks may result in injury to youngster's feet.

It is best to shop at a shoe store which specializes in children's shoes and ask for the same salesman each time you shop.

If you shop in a self-service store, you must be very careful about fitting a child correctly. A rule of thumb to follow is that the shoe should be three-quarters of an inch longer than the longest toe measured while the child is standing.

Two pairs of shoes are needed to

alternate for school wear. Shoes and feet need to rest from one another. And if one pair becomes damp from perspiration or weather, they need at least 24 hours to dry.

It is a bad practice to save an outgrown pair of shoes for another child. Shoes conform to the shape of the wearer's foot. Even if the size is correct, the younger child's foot is forced into the shape left by the older child, which may cause foot defects.

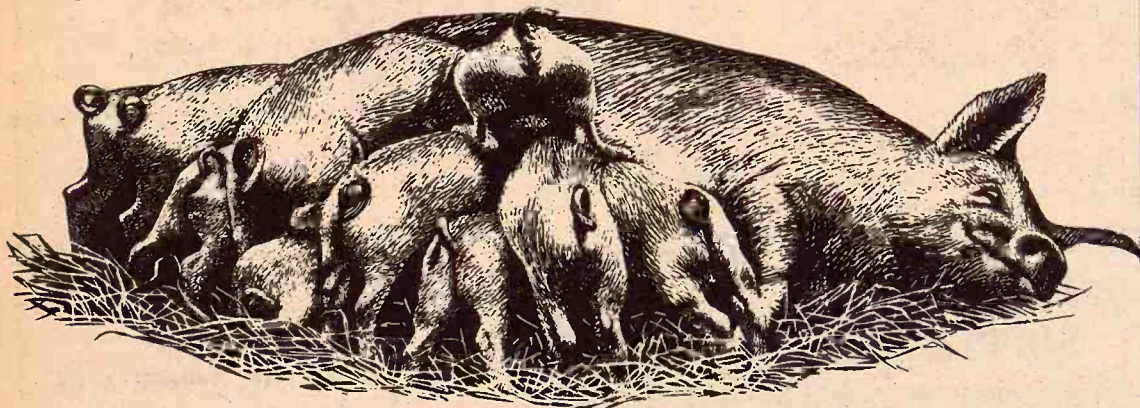

## Divider Wall Favored to Separate Room

the divider wall is still favored as a practical way to split a room's personality. Divider walls come in many sizes, from floor-to-ceiling to low-chest walls.

If the full height is used, the divider wall goes up over two-by-four studs to the floor and is anchored to the floor and ceiling.

Over this simple walling, it is recommended that the owner install hardboard wall panels, because these panels lend themselves to techniques that are simple for the amateur to master.

Hardboard panels come in a variety of woodgrains, decorator colors and a selection of neutral

shades for any decorating schemes. Also available is a deeply textured panel somewhat resembling Spanish plaster, but the general impression is of monolithic stone that is most attractive.

When installing a divider wall, the two-by-four studs should be spaced 16 inches apart and nailed to the floor and top plates. The paneling may be bonded directly to the studs by a cartridge-type adhesive.

## Cherries May Lose Color

When you buy maraschino cherries, you probably visualize the bright red color that sometimes puts a finishing touch to your desserts.

The bright red may be no more. There has been controversy over the red dye used in maraschino cherries.

If you find bright yellow cherries (instead of red), you'll know it is the natural color of the cherry. It tastes the same.

Only the color has been changed. Maraschino cherries are the first food to be marketed without the traditional coloring.

What's next? It's hard to tell. Would you be willing to buy oranges that are ripe but with a green skin? We buy and eat what looks good to

us. Sometimes we reject perfectly good food when it does not have the color we have come to expect.

## Egg-Buying Time

You may put two dozen eggs into your shopping cart this week instead of one dozen. It's that time of year when good cooks depend more on eggs for their daily supply of protein. It's the lenten season.

This is the time of year, fortunately, when more eggs usually appear on the market.

## Food "Specials"

What makes food prices fluctuate? Some types of price fluctuation reflect store advertising and promotion. Stores offer price specials to attract your attention to shop at a certain store.

Milk, bread, ground meat, and chicken are good examples of important specials. Many times you buy these foods at a price below cost.

## Preserve Documents

Wrap important paper documents in blue tissue paper to prevent them from yellowing with time.

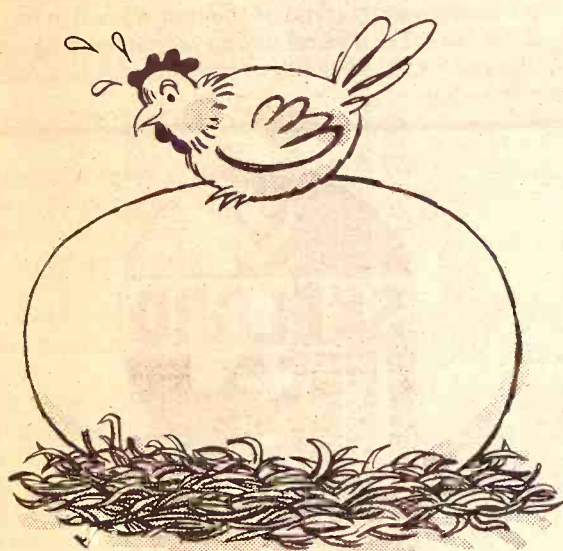

A real attention-getter at the KSU seed orchard at Milford is this graft from the tree at Leavenworth. After two growing seasons it is seven feet tall and shows early signs of being an outstanding walnut tree that will benefit Kansans in the years ahead.

A two-year-old walnut tree growing in Kansas State University's seed orchard at Milford Reservoir near Junction City represents a potential scientific breakthrough.

The seven-foot tall tree is shooting up at an eye-popping rate, and foresters will watch with keen interest as its third growing season approaches.

Originating as a small twig atop a 117-foot tall tree at Fort Leavenworth, the KSU tree has all of the desirable characteristics of the parent.

The Leavenworth skyscraper happens to be one of the best walnuts in the U.S. KSU foresters are trying to grow duplicates of it at their outdoors laboratory at Milford.

If they succeed, the achievement will boost the walnut veneer log industry and also pack a sizeable economic wallop for Kansas.

Normally, a walnut tree requires 80 years of growth to produce marketable veneer logs. Researchers the world over have been trying for years to develop walnuts that will produce logs in less time, say 20 or 25 years. The answers may be found right here in Kansas.

Walnut logs are highly salable items in the U.S., with foreign countries becoming a ready market. Prices paid by log buyers continue to skyrocket as the demand increases. That's why foresters consider a walnut plantation an outstanding investment.

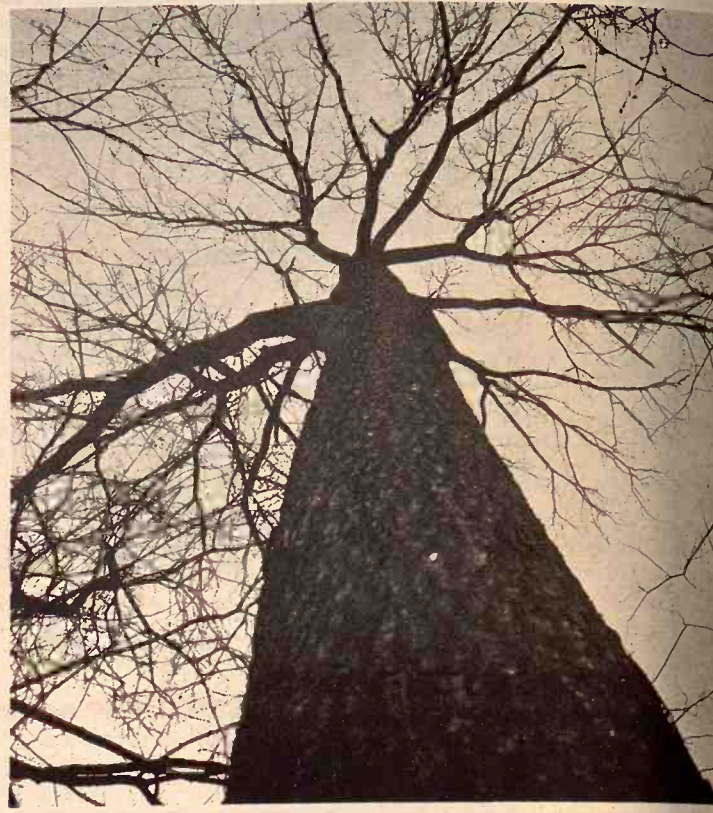
In charge of the tree improvement program at K-State is Loy Shreve, Extension forester, a soft-spoken West Virginia native.

It's his job to grow superior trees

in the KSU orchard so Kansans will have improved trees to plant in the years ahead. First, he must identify an existing superior tree, collect twigs from it, graft and transplant in the orchard.

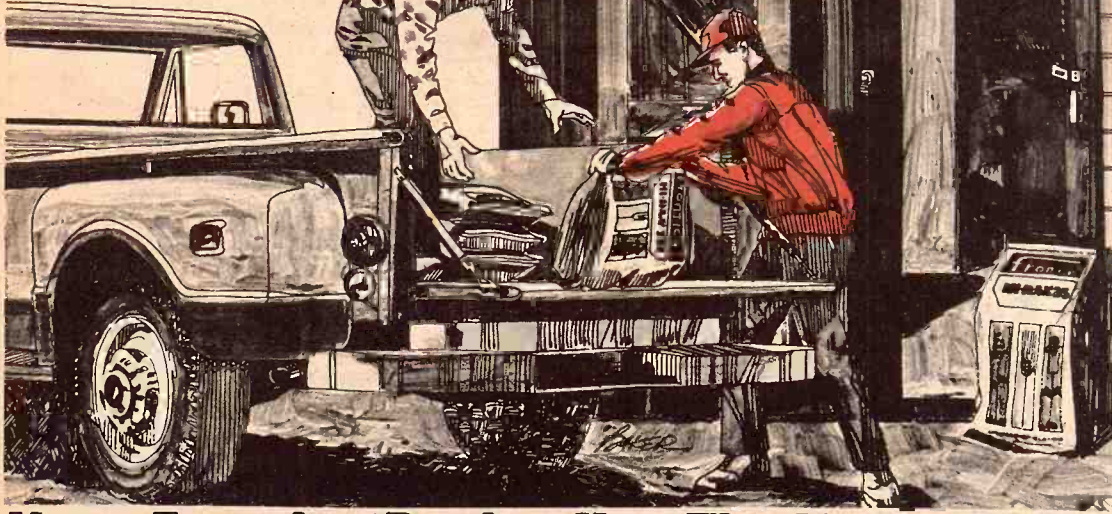
Al Herrig, forest technician at Fort Leavenworth, informed State foresters several years ago about the walnut trees growing in a woodlot there.

he had some excellent trees.  
"Every person who has ever seen  
the best walnut tree here calls it the  
best or one of the best walnuts in the  
U.S.," says Herrig, who gloats over  
it like a proud father.

While the U.S. Army conducts  
periodic timber sales at Leaven-  
worth (proceeds go into the U.S.  
Treasury), Herrig says as far as  
he's concerned the No. 1 Leaven-  
worth (so named by Shreve) is not  
under any circumstances because  
this and future generations will  
benefit from its offspring.

Case in point: the seven-footer at  
Milford. As a graft, the KSU tree is  
a genetic duplicate (from the point  
of graft up) of the parent tree.  
Already it is exhibiting some of the  
parent's superior characteristics  
including an absence of lower  
branches.

Timber buyers drool over walnut  
trees that have no lower branches.  
Obviously, they make better logs,  
but there aren't many around.  
"The fact that our tree at Milford  
has no lower branches while  
growing in an open field where they  
could grow easily is a phenomenon,"  
says Shreve. "It has buds, but the  
buds haven't grown branches."  
Most walnuts that grow without  
lower branches were bud pruned  
when young. Shreve hasn't touched  
this one.

Near this potential record-setter

in the orchard is another walnut tree  
growing from a seed taken from the  
same Leavenworth No. 1. The seed  
was planted three years ago, but the  
tree growing from it is only as tall as  
the graft, which was planted a year  
later. (A tree growing from seed has  
only random genetic characteristics  
of its parent).

Shreve is working on the ultimate  
in tree propagation — inducing a  
twig to grow after developing its own  
roots in the greenhouse. This  
process would result in a pure  
genetic duplicate of the parent.

Twigs which have grown root  
systems through techniques  
developed by Shreve have been  
planted in the orchard and appear to  
be doing well. While many scientists  
say it won't work, Shreve thinks it  
will.

Also growing in the K-State orchard  
are Persian (English type)  
walnuts acquired by Shreve from  
growers living in Germany, Russia,  
Romania, Hungary and other  
countries. Some are from cold  
regions such as the Himalayas and  
appear to be adapted to Kansas  
conditions.

Shreve reciprocates by sending  
Kansas walnuts to his foreign  
friends. No telling how many Kansas  
walnuts are growing behind the Iron  
Curtain!

## No Smoking In HEW Buildings

The huge Department of Health,  
Education and Welfare has ordered  
a partial smoking ban in its  
buildings across the country.

The department's 107,000 em-  
ployees will be advised of the decision  
by HEW Secretary Elliot L.  
Richardson.

The new policy prohibits smoking  
in conference rooms, auditoriums,  
clinics and elevators. No-smoking  
sections will be established in  
cafeterias and working areas where  
practicable.

"It is our hope that this will  
adequately safeguard the health and  
well-being of those who use our  
buildings without preventing those  
who may wish to smoke from doing  
so," Richardson said.

Richardson said the smoking ban  
will not apply in lobbies, corridors  
and restrooms because "smoking  
does not present a serious problem  
in these places where ventilation is  
adequate and where enforcement  
would be very difficult."

A trial run the last several months  
on smoking bans in conference  
rooms in the main HEW building in  
Washington has met with spotty  
success. Since ashtrays were  
removed, some persons now  
smuggle in their own ashtrays in  
briefcases.

## Vietnam Force Now To 120,000

Another major troop cut in  
Vietnam leaves the U.S. with about  
120,000 men in the area, down from  
the peak of 543,000 in April 1969.

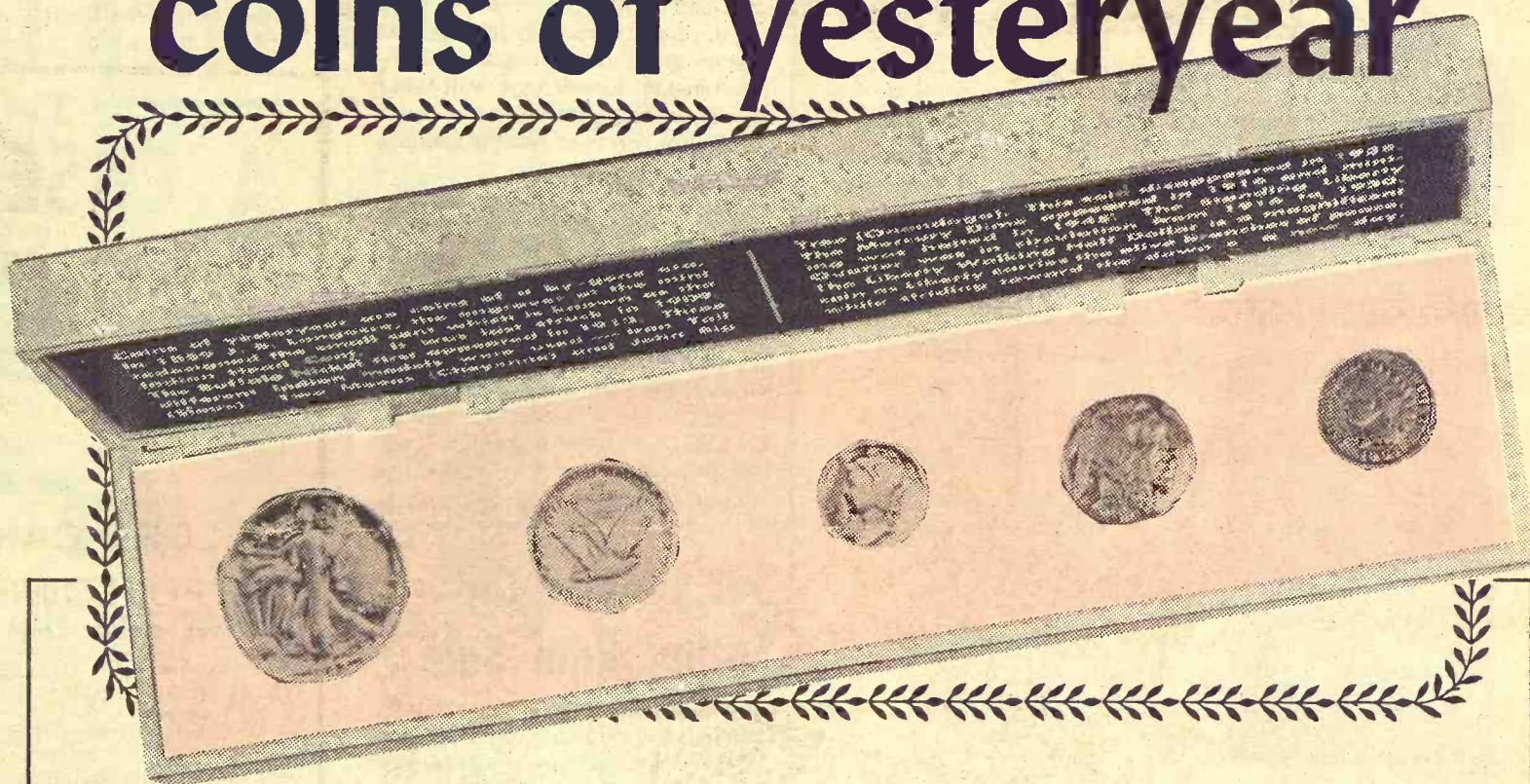
The Army estimates that of the  
120,000 men, only about 10,000  
actually do any ground fighting,  
although about 50,000 are considered  
to be in combat duty or combat  
support. The other 70,000 are in  
services, personnel, maintenance,  
and duty with no direct connection to  
combat.

In addition to the 120,000 men in  
Vietnam, there are 32,000 men in  
Thailand and 15,000 men or more  
aboard Navy ships operating off the  
coast.

The force of 120,000 men in Viet-  
nam is scheduled to be reduced to  
69,000 by May according to orders  
from President Nixon.

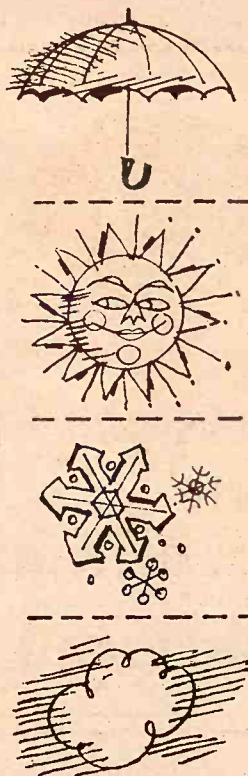

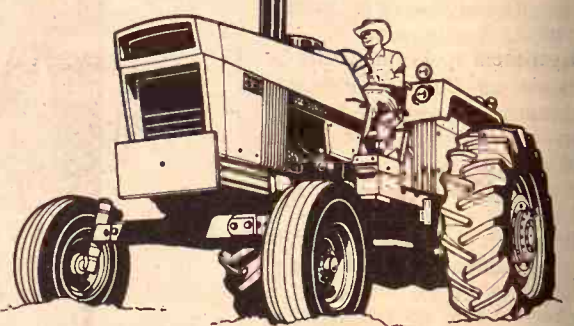

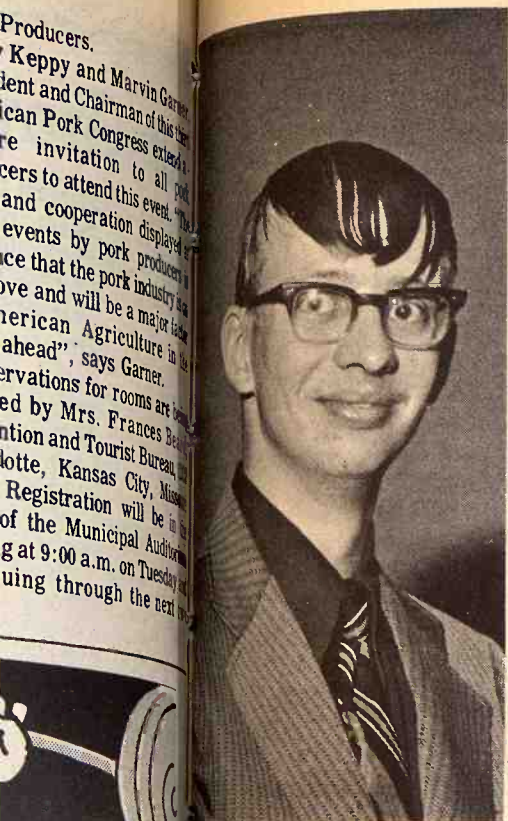

## Newer On Giant Subsidy List

The government says only two farms, both in the sugar business, got million-dollar farm subsidies last year, compared with nine in 1970. According to an Agriculture Department list, the biggest recipients last year were the Hawaiian Commercial and Sugar Co., Puunene, \$1,277,725; and the U.S. Sugar Corp., Clewiston, Fla., \$1,267,401.

The list did not show a subsidy payment in 1971 for the J. G. Boswell Co., Corcoran, Calif., which lead the 1970 list with \$4.4 million in federal payments.

A department spokesman said he understood the Boswell firm sold leased out all or most of its 1971 cotton allotments, a practice permitted by law.

The Agricultural Act of 1970 put a cap of \$55,000 per crop in payments an individual farmer may receive in the government's cotton, wheat and feed grains programs.

Sugar payments are regulated by another law and are not covered by the \$55,000 limitation. Also exempt are farms operated by states and other government bodies or on Indian reservations.

Other subsidy leaders of the past and their payments for 1971 compared with 1970 included:

Griffin, Inc., Huron, Calif., \$1,090,912 in 1971 and \$4,095,114 in 1970; South Lake Farms, Fresno, Calif., \$24,111 and \$1,875,454; Salyer and Co., Corcoran, Calif., \$66,492 and \$1,547,174; and Vista del Llano

Farms, Firebaugh, Calif., \$273,518 and \$1,105,762.

H. M. Tenneco, Bakersfield, Calif., another farm subsidy leader was not in the published list. A spokesman said, however, Tenneco received \$113,168 in payments last year compared with more than \$1.3 million in 1970.

The official said a "computer error" apparently resulted in Tenneco not being on the list.

The California list showed a 1971 payment of \$55,000 to Howard Frick, Bakersfield, whose brother Kenneth E. Frick administers farm programs as head of the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service in USDA.

Kenneth Frick has a share of the family farm operation but it is held in trust, he has said. The record showed a payment of \$39,111 to K. Frick, Bank of America Trust, Bakersfield, Calif.

In all last year, more than \$3.1

billion in government farm payments went to 2,396,094 recipients. That compared with more than \$3.6 billion to 2,424,687 farms in 1970.

The lower subsidy total last year, however, has been attributed to reduced benefits for some crops, not to the \$55,000 limit.

## Two Southwest Kansas Packers Cut Slaughter

The manager of the Farmland Meat Plant in Garden City has said last week that the facility was closed temporarily.

The manager, Don Feder, said 71 employees were furloughed last week, in addition to 64 employees laid

off. Feder said the situation is only temporary and he hopes the plant will soon be reopened.

Meanwhile at Liberal, a spokesman at the National Beef Packing — John Jacobson — said the number of cattle being slaughtered at that facility has been cut back from 1,800 per day to 1,500.

Jacobson said the cause of the depressed beef market in southwest Kansas and the Oklahoma Panhandle is feed lots in the western

Kansas area are asking too much for their cattle. Jacobson said he is shipping in cattle because he can buy them cheaper than the price on the local market.

## Rustling Term To Ex-Sheriff Of Atchison Co.

George Duncan, 28, former sheriff of Atchison County, Kansas, has been sentenced to five years in federal prison by Judge George Templar of the U.S. District Court here. Duncan was convicted of interstate transportation of stolen cattle.

In another case later in the day Duncan pleaded guilty to the theft of two cows. Judge James W. Lowry deferred sentence until completion of the federal sentence.

A district court spokesman here said Duncan will undergo further psychiatric evaluation, possibly at the U.S. Medical Center in Springfield, Mo., before he begins his sentence. The evaluation will last three months.

Duncan and a former special deputy sheriff in his administration, Howard L. Higgins, 35, Atchison were charged with transporting 15 head of black Angus on or about Nov. 12, 1971, from the farm of Richard Lanter in Doniphan County, Kansas, to the St. Joseph stockyards for sale. They reportedly received a large amount of money by check when the cattle were delivered.

The Atchison County court action involved the theft of two cows Oct. 25, 1971, belonging to John Burke, Denton, Kan., from pastureland he owned in Atchison County.

Federal warrants for Duncan and Higgins were issued in early December. A federal grand jury in Wichita indicted Higgins and also his wife, Mrs. Deon Bettie Higgins, 27, in December on the transport charges. Duncan pleaded guilty in Topeka, but sentencing was deferred pending a presentence investigation.

After the sentencing Duncan was given a 10-day stay of execution and is to report to the U.S. Marshal at Topeka at 10 a.m. March 13 for transfer to the Springfield Center. The former sheriff is free on a

recognizance bond and the Atchison County Sheriff's office reported he is living in Carbondale, Kan.

According to J. David Farris, Atchison County attorney, Higgins and his wife will appear in a week or 10 days in Atchison for a preliminary hearing in connection with the Burke cattle theft. The Higgins's trial on the charges of illegal interstate transportation of stolen property is scheduled in April, the county attorney said.

The two also are free on recognizance bond. While awaiting trial Higgins is working at an Atchison grain storage facility in its maintenance department.

Duncan took office in Jan. 1, 1971. He sent a letter of resignation in August. Gov. Robert Docking then sent another letter saying he did not

intend to resign.

Later in September the Kansas Bureau of Investigation completed a probe of the Atchison County Sheriff's Department and turned it over to the county attorney. The report stated it had not found "sufficient competent evidence" for ouster proceedings against Duncan. Duncan resigned again Oct. 1, 1971, with a demand for a grand jury inquiry into city and county government in Atchison County. He surrendered to the U.S. Marshal's office in December in Topeka to face the federal charges.

## Fewer 'Points' Cutting Costs On Home Mortgages

The cost of buying a home through government-guaranteed loans may be hundreds of dollars less than last summer even though federal mortgage rates are the same.

The reason is a narrowing in the last few months of the so-called "point spread." Points, which are charged to sellers of homes at the time a mortgage is closed and are

normally passed on to buyers in the form of higher prices, amount to a one-time mortgage surcharge imposed by the lender.

Mutual savings banks and savings and loan associations charge points in order to make up the difference between the 7 percent federal ceiling on mortgage rates for Veterans Administration and Federal Housing Administration loans and the rate of return on alternative investments such as corporate bonds.

The 7 percent ceiling has been in effect for more than a year but as interest rates have eased, the

number of points tacked onto government-backed mortgages has fallen from the neighborhood of 8 to 9½ last summer to about 4½ points, the Mortgage Bankers Association of America says. An 8-point spread is the equivalent of about 1 per cent interest.

The drop in the point spread means that a \$20,000 home could be financed through FHA and VA loans for \$700 to \$900 less than last summer, according to the bankers group. About a third of all mortgages are government backed, it says.

The effective interest rate on conventional mortgages, which lack government guarantees, had eased to 7.78 per cent last December from a 1971 high of 7.83 per cent in September and October, the association reports.

Further narrowing of the point spread on VA and FHA loans is unlikely because of the recently announced sharp boost in the federal budget deficit, the association says. Lenders are under pressure to charge more points in order to protect themselves against the inflation that they expect to result from the deficit, it says.

But the anticipated increase in points should be small enough to enable homebuyers still to save hundreds of dollars, the bankers association says.

# Detail On Happy Beef Year

Beef cattle producers in Kansas received an average price of \$29.60 per 100 pounds for all beef cattle (excluding calves) sold during 1971, according to the Kansas Crop and Livestock Reporting Service. This was an increase of \$190 from

1970 and \$0.50 above the previous high set in 1951.

Monthly prices for all beef cattle in 1971 were above the previous year in all months except March.

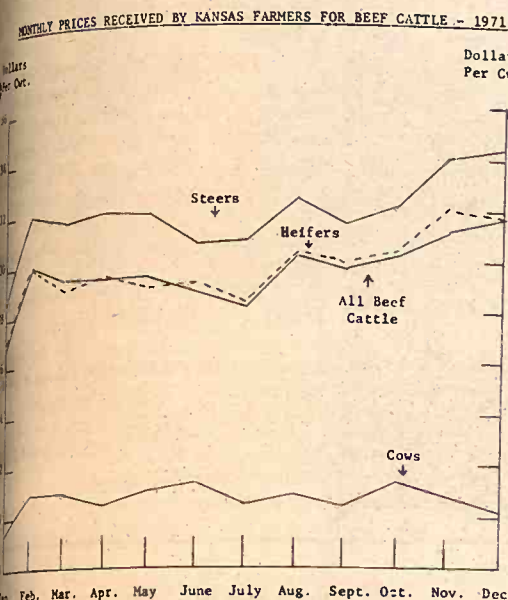
The all beef cattle price in January was at a low for the year of

\$27.20. Prices from February through October varied mostly in the \$28-\$30 range but reached a high of \$31.50 in December.

Steer prices averaged \$31.60 per cwt. in 1971, up \$1.80 from 1970. Monthly prices of steers ranged from a low of \$28.80 in January to a high of \$34.30 in December.

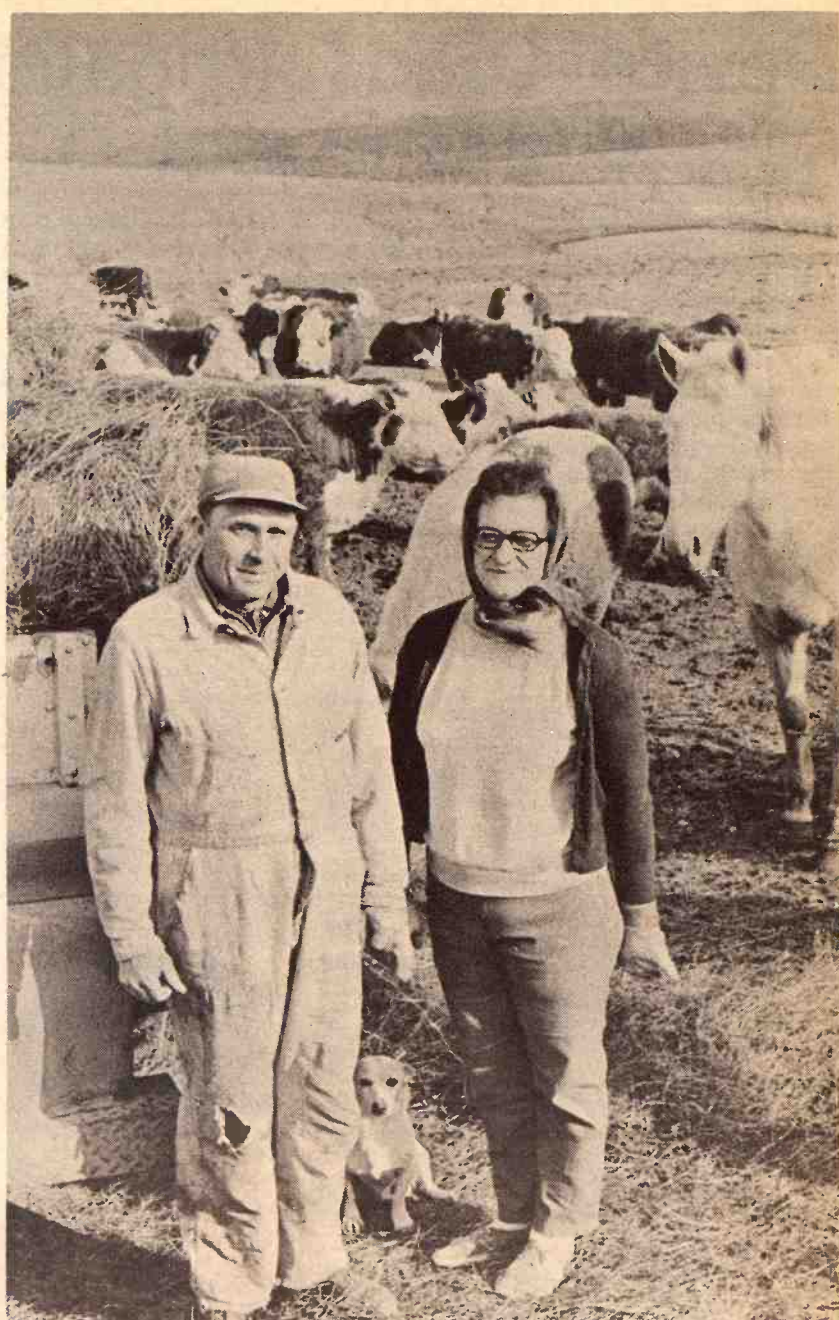

## Device Loads Irrigation Pipe

Two Kansas State University seniors in agricultural engineering are building a large automatic irrigation pipe loader and handler for display March 17-18 during the 48th annual KSU Engineering Open House.

The loader-handler, designed last fall by K-State agricultural engineering seniors in a Design of Agricultural Machinery class, is nearing completion. Fabricators of the mobile home-sized implement are Stanley E. Briggs, Delphos, and

John H. Stout, Sedan.

The innovative device is being developed to solve a problem Briggs had on his farm. It automatically disconnects, loads, and stacks up to a third of a mile of gated irrigation pipe.

Pipe can be stacked on the trailer-like implement, or unloaded as a unit for temporary storage and reloaded again when needed. The loader-handler can also be used to lay down pipe. The pipe is automatically reconnected as it is set on the field.

Cost for building the implement with used materials is between \$1,000 to \$1,200.

"With our machine, there is a tractor driver but the rest of the operation is automatic. The implement is conceived to operate smoothly at a maximum speed of three miles an hour. It only takes 10-15 minutes to pick up a full load."

"Using available methods for performing the same work, it takes

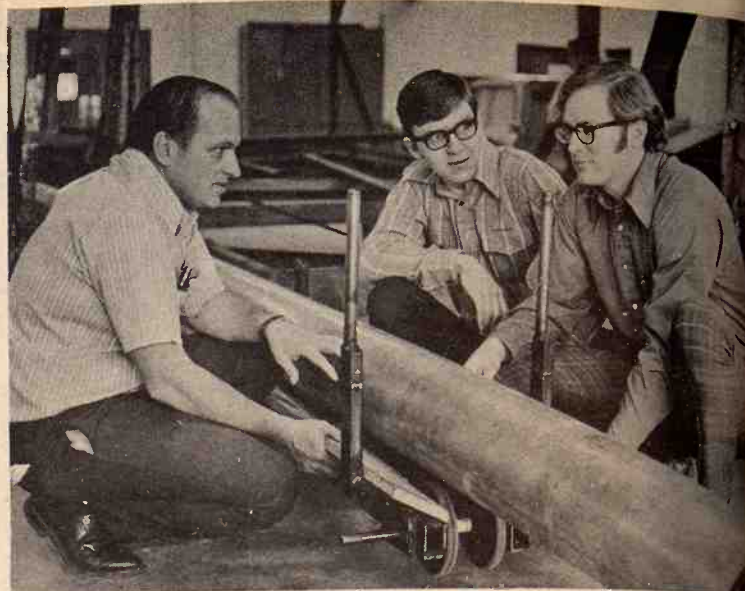
three men — one to drive and two others to disconnect, load and stack the pipe — an hour to do roughly the same task. So this device represents, potentially, a considerable savings in terms of money, manpower, and time," Briggs said.

Briggs wants to use the implement on his farm near Minneapolis. "We won't be able to field test it until after the Open House," he said.

Briggs and Stout are being assisted in the building of the implement by Paul R. Beshoner, Elmore, also a KSU senior in agricultural engineering.

"It's completely automated. We started building it during the Christmas break. It should be nearly operable by Open House time," Briggs said.

Briggs, Stout, and Beshoner are erecting the pipe loader-handler as their senior project in agricultural engineering. Their adviser is G.E. Fairbanks, K-State professor of agricultural engineering.

## Charolais Assn. To Allow Dairy Cross Registering

The board of directions of the American International Charolais Assn. has approved a change in its bylaws allowing recordation of half-blood Charolais cattle, regardless of the breed of the foundation dam.

Prior to the board's action, recordation of one-half blood Charolais was limited to those out of foundation dams of beef breeding only. The action now opens up to recordation those calves out of dairy cows.

In other action, the board approved the hiring of a new export director to seek and promote the export of American Charolais. The move was made following some discussion about reduced AICA revenues and a reduction in the export committee's budget. The new export director is to be hired on or before the board's June meeting, with the added qualification that the AICA must be in the black at that time. Recent increases in association fees are expected to change the revenue picture.

## Laying Hens React To Protein Ration

The level of protein in a laying ration influences both egg size and production.

F. E. Cunningham and J. N. Butts, poultry scientists at Kansas State University, tested a commercial strain of layers with rations containing 12, 14, 16 and 18 per cent protein.

"The layers receiving 16 and 18 per cent protein produced more and larger eggs," Cunningham said. "Eggs from these hens also contained more protein and performed better in baking tests."

The hens on the 12 percent protein ration consumed the most feed, but produced fewer and smaller eggs. Cunningham explained that the low protein diet apparently was deficient in methionine and cystine, two essential amino acids.

The K-State researchers found that dietary protein levels had no effect on the total amount of solids or mineral content of the eggs, but as dietary protein increased, the total protein increased substantially, both in the egg white and in the whole egg mixture.

Cash receipts from farming and other sources reached new record highs in 1971, according to the Kansas Crop and Livestock Reporting Service. Cash receipts from farming totaled \$2,197 million in 1971 with 33 percent of the total derived from crops, 57 percent from livestock and products and 10 percent from government payments. Production expenses con-

tinued to rise in 1971 and totaled about \$1.7 billion, also the highest of record.

Kansas farmers realized net income for the year of approximately \$546 million compared with \$424 million in 1970 and the record of \$558 million in 1966.

Cash receipts from marketings of Kansas livestock and livestock products totaled \$1,260 million in 1971, 3 percent above 1970 and a new record high.

Cash receipts from marketings of crops in Kansas were \$719 million, 31 percent above last year and the highest of record. Although prices were lower than the previous year for some crops, a much larger volume of crops was marketed in 1971.

Net realized income per farm averaged \$6,354 in 1971, well above the \$4,877 a year earlier and exceeding the previous high of \$5,871 set in 1966. Realized gross income per farm was a record \$26,296 exceeding the previous high of \$23,745 set last year.

averaged about what they do now, expenses were much less. For the year the parity ratio was 107 percent. A year later, the ratio was about 100 percent — the point theoretically in which prices and expenses were in balance.

A year ago the parity ratio got down to 72 percent — lower than anytime since 1933 when it was 64. Highest point was in 1947 when the ratio got to 115 percent.

USDA for the past year has been trying to dislodge the old 1910-14 base on farm prices and expenses. The guide the USDA is trying to push is based on 1967 levels. In the current report the 1967-based ratio is displayed on page one and the old 1910-14 based figures are on pages seven and eight.

According to the newer guideline, prices are up to 122 percent of their 1967 levels. But prices paid are up to 124 percent.

That means even by the new

guidelines that farmers are two percent worse off than they were five years ago.

## Parity Ratio Out Of Balance By Either Yardstick

No matter how it's sliced, farm income can't seem to keep up with farm expenses.

Using the old 1910-14 base which has been the yardstick for parity for many years, farm income up to February 15 rose to 310 percent of the 1 year old base. That's the highest it's been since February 1951.

But farm expenses, on the same scale, rose to 423 percent of the 1910-14 base. Thus, parity ratio — prices received compared to prices paid — was only 73 percent, better than a year ago by three points but not much compared to the level of 21 years ago.

In 1951, when farm prices

# See A 15% Bigger Cow Herd By 1980

The nation's total cow herd increased 12 percent and beef output rose nearly 45 percent in the decade of the 1960's. What can livestock producers expect by the end of the decade of the 1970's?

Don Paarlberg, director of agricultural economics of the USDA, says American livestock producers should expect a larger total cow

herd, in the vicinity of 15 percent above the 50 million head on hand at the start of 1972.

All of the cow herd increase will be in beef cows, because further declines are expected in dairy cows, however the rate of decline will continue to be slow, he predicts.

Beef production projected for 1980 would mean a rise of around a third

over that produced in 1970. This is a slower rate of increase than from 1960-70. On the hoof, this means cattle slaughter of approximately 47 million head. Last year, cattle slaughter totaled about 36 million head. The increase in beef output, according to the economist, would be about twice the projected increase in the cow herd because of the increasing proportion of beef cattle and the continued decline in number of calves slaughtered.

Thus in the years ahead, according to Paarlberg, the pace of expansion in beef output will slow, but the expansion in the breeding herd will accelerate. This is because we have used up the bulk of our beef "output bonus" that came about from the reduction in calf slaughter and the increase in the proportion of cattle being fed.

Increases in the breeding herd will occur in those parts of the country that can expand forage supplies most readily. The greatest possibilities appear to be in the North Central and South Central States and the Southeast. This is where we expect a large part of the increase in beef cow numbers to

occur in this decade, says the economist.

He sees a further substantial decline in the total number of feedlots, but a continued increase in the number of large feedlots. In the 22 major feeding states in 1970 there were 146 feedlots that had a capacity of over 16,000 head. These feedlots marketed about six million head, nearly a fourth of total marketings. In 1964, he says, there were only 44 feedlots of this size and they marketed less than a tenth of all fed cattle.

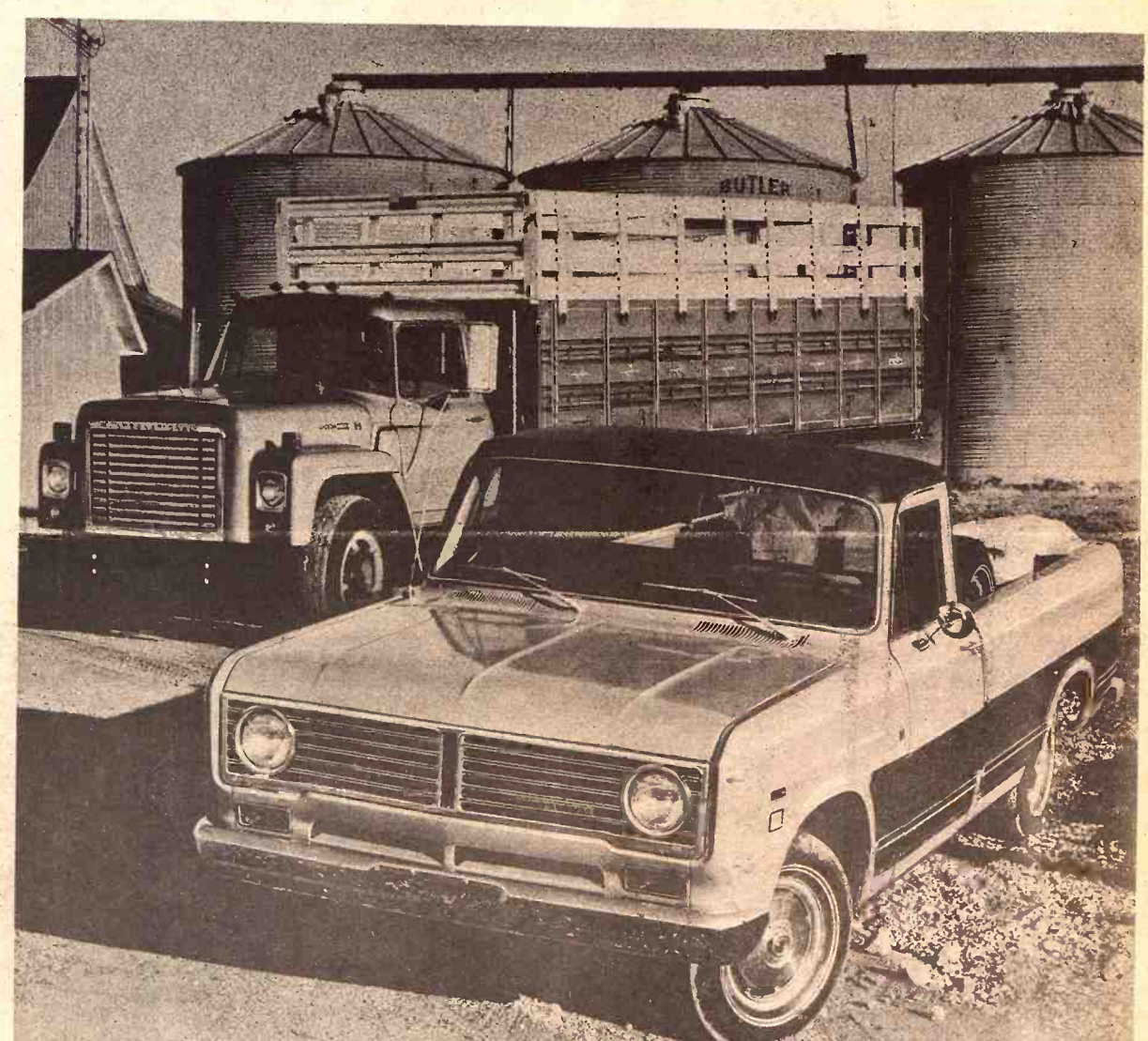

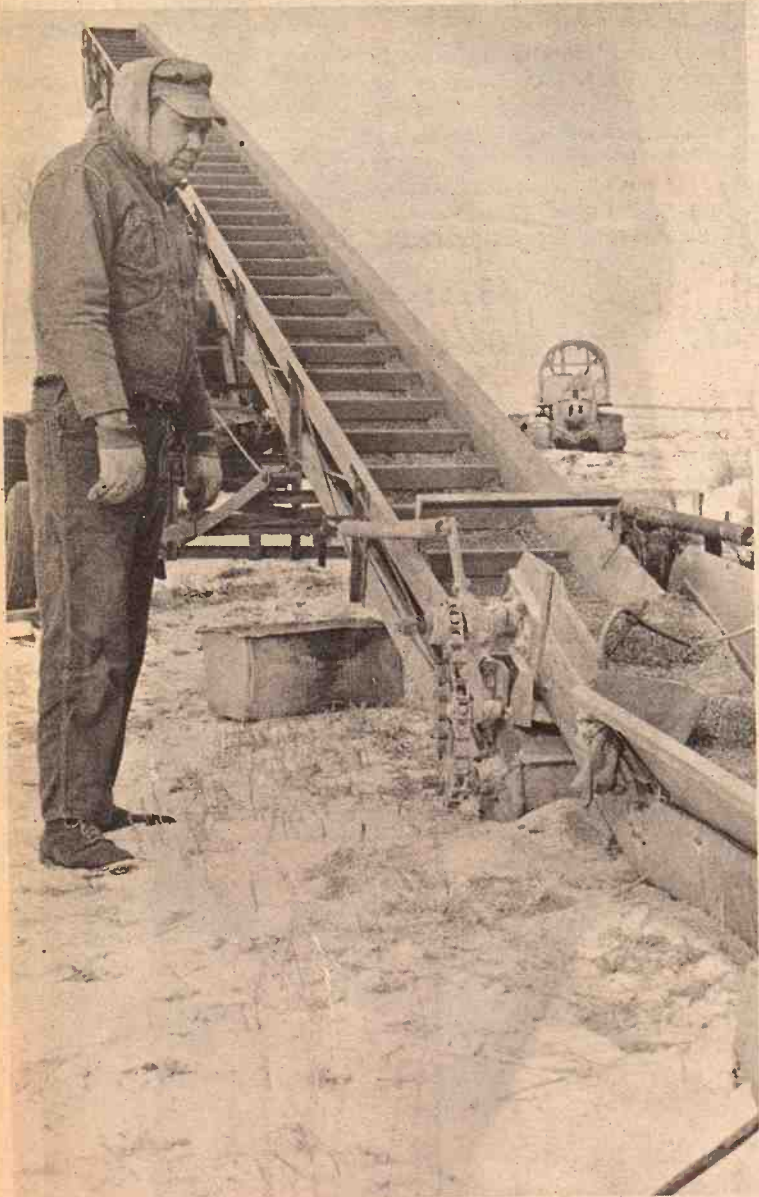

#### HE'S CLEARED A PASTURE

Art Lang of DuBois, Nebraska, checks on machinery as he loads up milo for sale. He was selling the milo to Stalder Cattle Co. of Salem, Neb. Milo and some wheat are the principal products on the Lang farm. Art's two sons Allen and Arden do most of the farming as Art is a contractor for soil conservation work. He recently cleared brush and trees from a hillside on his farm and sowed it to grass. "After only two and a half years, it's ready for light grazing" he said.

#### Rural Aid Dollars Would Trickle Down Slowly

Kansans are taking a closer look at the \$580 million rural-development aid bill which was recently passed by the U.S. House, and sent on to the Senate.

Rural leaders in northeast Kansas view the bill as a step in the right direction but add that it isn't really so much money when distributed among counties in 50 states.

The legislation deals new grant and loan power to the Farmers Home Administration and the Soil Conservation Service, providing aid for pollution-control programs in rural areas and expanding assistance for water and sewer projects. It also authorizes money for programs of industrial and community development.

The bill is aimed at rural towns with populations up to 5,500.

About one of every five Kansans lives in towns of this size. There are almost 600 Kansas communities in this category with almost a half-million of the state's citizens living

in them.

It is feared the bill's effectiveness will be reduced unless the government recognizes that present binding regulations increase expense and hinder community efforts.

Richard Cunningham, associate director for the Kansas League of Municipalities, said the big question will be "who gets the money?" A \$300 million House increase to the bill was earmarked for construction of water and waste-disposal projects. But with the Senate vote to come yet, "It's a long way from passing all hurdles," Cunningham said.

Morgan Williams, state director for the Farmers Home Administration, said the money is intended primarily for FmHA with some funds going to the Department of Agriculture's Soil Conservation Service.

"Basically it's to beef up proposed new grant and loan authority for pollution control," Williams said. "It would make industrial and community loans available. Until now our loans have only been for housing, water and sewage development.

"This could add loans for utilities development, industrial parks and community buildings. They would

be job-creating loans."

Kansas has \$7.3 million for FmHA loans this year, most ever, Williams said. He added that an additional \$700,000 allotted for grants has been insufficient in Kansas.

Williams explained that many rural areas can't afford the water and waste disposal facilities they need. In sparsely settled areas this can raise the costs per person to the point where many potential customers can't afford a water gill, he said.

Since such a community can't afford a loan, the only answer is grants but the funds just aren't here, Williams said. He hopes the new rural aid bill will remedy the grant money deficiency.

## No Increase On Dairy Supports

Agriculture Secretary Earl L. Butz has decided not to raise dairy

price supports, but producer spokesmen and milk-state members of Congress are gearing up to fight the decision.

Butz announced the current support price of \$4.93 per hundred weight for manufacturing-grade

milk will continue in effect for the new marketing year beginning April 1.

The decision drew immediate fire from the National Milk Producers Federation, which has pushed for an increase to \$5.28 per hundredweight.

"It is astounding that the administration, in reaching such a decision, completely overlooked the economic necessity of adjusting prices paid dairy farmers so that they could keep pace with increased production costs," Patrick B. Healy, federation secretary said.

Healy said his organization will ask Congress "to rectify this injustice to dairymen" by raising the support price.

Butz has the legal authority to set milk price supports at between 75 and 90 per cent of parity, the formula used to relate farm costs with prices.

Last year, then Agriculture Secretary Clifford M. Hardin set the 1971-72 rate at \$4.93 after pressure from dairy groups and milk-state lawmakers was brought against the Nixon administration.

Hardin, only two weeks earlier, had announced that no change would be made from the \$4.66 rate in effect for the 1970-71 marketing year.

A year ago, the bonus \$4.93 price support was equal to 85 per cent of parity. But now, since production costs have risen, it is less than 80 per cent.

# Fish & Game Attorney \$23,000 Position Eliminated

The House Ways and Means Committee abolished the \$23,000 position of chief attorney for the Kansas Forestry Fish and Game Commission, held by Warner Moore, Wichita, former county Democratic chairman.

The committee also cut the agency's budget by nearly \$18,000. That money was earmarked to pay and support an assistant director that the agency did not request.

Rep. Duane S. McGill, R-Winfield, member of the Ways and Means Committee, said \$12,000 in contractual service was substituted for the attorney's position.

Describing Moore's job as part-time, McGill said "Supreme Court justices only make \$23,500, the governor makes \$20,000 and the attorney general even less."

"This gentleman only works part-time, and he doesn't even live there. It's only a part time job under present conditions. This is something that we should have done

years ago. He's the highest priced attorney in state government I know about."

## OK Fertilizer Price Hike

The Federal Price Commission has approved American Oil's application for price increases for anhydrous ammonia and Crop-Mate

## Weather Causes Ban On Open Burning In Nebr.

A statewide ban on open burning in Nebraska has been issued to counter the threat of more grassland fires.

The order came from State Fire Marshal Joe Pluta and will remain in force until Nebraska gets enough rain or snow to alleviate the threat.

The announcement took note of damaging fires which have occurred in the Mullen, Seneca, Thedford and Burwell areas. Conditions conducive to fires were described as "very high to extremely hazardous," and weather reports "indicate no change in the immediate future."

"Should the occasion arise where burning must be accomplished during this ban, a special written permit must be obtained from the local rural fire district or town fire chiefs, plus this burning must be done only if the fire chief and firemen are available and can be present with their rigs.

"This ban will not be lifted until Nebraska receives a sufficient amount of precipitation over the state."

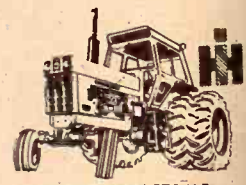

The compounds are all used in control of predators and have been under fire from environmentalists because of indiscriminate use.

The other two poisons banned are thallium sulfate and a compound commonly called 1080 but technically named sodium monofluoroacetate.

Thallium sulfate is a rat poison but is sometimes misused to control livestock predators. Two other products containing thallium sulfate were suspended by the Environmental Protection Agency last summer as the probable killer of 20 eagles in Wyoming.

The order does not affect the use of poisons for rat control, EPA administrator William Ruckelshaus said these uses are under review also.

The government barred the use of poisons for predator control on public land and in federal programs last February except for emergencies. The latest action now takes these poisons off the commercial market immediately and

opens action toward their permanent cancellation from the federal registration program.

## Better Look Into Bacon Package

A proposal to require that shingle-packed bacon packages give consumers a better look at what's inside before they buy will be published soon in the Federal Register, the U.S. Department of Agriculture has announced.

The proposed regulation will spell out requirements that would make a substantial portion of a bacon slice in a shingle-packed bacon carton visible to consumers.

Mrs. Virginia Knauer, Special Assistant to the President for Consumer Affairs, has held meetings with representatives of companies who package bacon and with USDA in an effort to develop a package which would satisfy consumer requests for a better look at packaged bacon. She reports that several companies have now developed packages which offer a major improvement.

Current Federal meat inspection regulations require that windows in bacon packages be clear and colorless and not be bordered immediately by red graphic matter.

Officials said regulations for bacon packaging, if adopted after consideration of the public comments, will probably become effective before the end of the year.

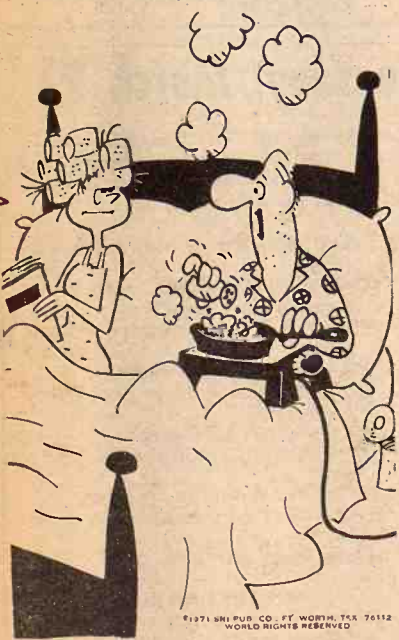

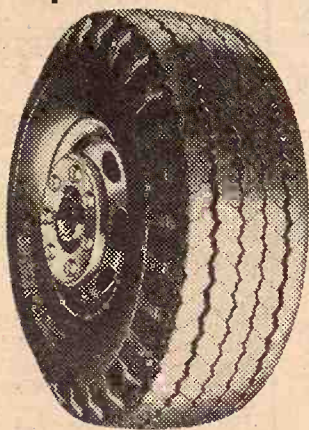
