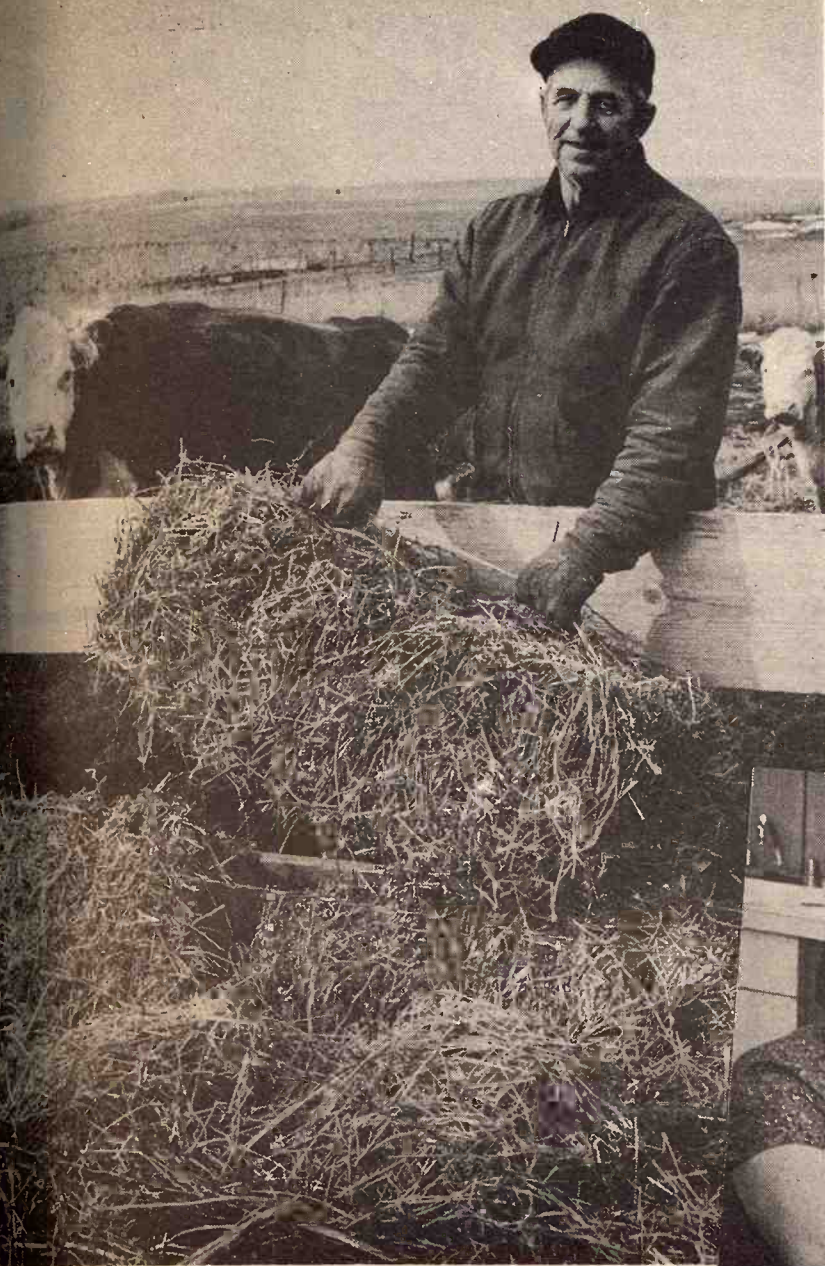

# Timbermen Work Hard On Stand Improvement

MANHATTAN — Does "TSI" ring a bell? It probably doesn't mean anything to most laymen, but it means a great deal to foresters.

TSI is short for timber stand improvement. As Jerry Bratton, explains it, TSI is a shortcut for helping mother nature produce timber faster in Kansas.

Jerry Bratton is a district Extension forester at Kansas State University stationed in Chanute.

Bratton points out that since the beginning of the first Kansas forest hundreds of years ago, mother nature has done a fine job of producing high quality timber.

However, a problem has been developing in recent years. Americans are demanding higher quality timber faster than mother

nature is able to produce it.

That's where TSI — a basic tool of walnut timber management — comes in.

"Walnut is probably the backbone of the timber industry in Kansas," says Bratton.

"Our state is growing thousands of acres of young walnut that are in need of cultural treatment. The idea is to grow walnut faster and have higher quality at the same time."

Research has shown that TSI may double the growth rate — which means a much faster return on investment.

Actually a TSI project is relatively simple. It involves the thinning, releasing, weeding and pruning of potentially valuable walnut timber.

In order to grow a good garden or field crop, weeds must be removed. Bratton says timber also requires care.

In timber management weeding refers to removal of "weed" or undesirable trees. These types may be crooked or hollow and are

generally poor or low value species. Care must be taken, however, not to eliminate den or other trees valuable to wildlife. Retaining scenic beauty is also important.

TSI thinning is necessary when young trees are too thick. They may stagnate, lengthening the growth period. Bratton says spacing is dependent upon the size of the trees and the site on which they are growing. Larger trees generally need more space.

The releasing phase of TSI is used in areas of Kansas where the woodlands have been cut over or severely harvested. High grade harvesting leaves the poor quality, low value mature and over-mature timber in the stand and crowds the remaining trees.

Young, vigorous trees growing under dense, old spreading trees need to be released. The larger "wolf" trees must be removed.

Bratton and other Extension foresters at K-State often talk about quality. The reason is that timber quality means value. In order to produce this quality, the pruning phase of TSI is necessary.

Pruning the limbs from trees allows non-defective wood to grow over old scars and blemishes. Eventually, scars can't be detected, and the tree is suddenly worth \$300 instead of \$30. "Not bad for five minutes work," says Bratton.

Tools used in TSI are unlike those used in normal farm operations.

"For example, we substitute a chain saw for a cultivator to control weeds and we use a pruning saw to

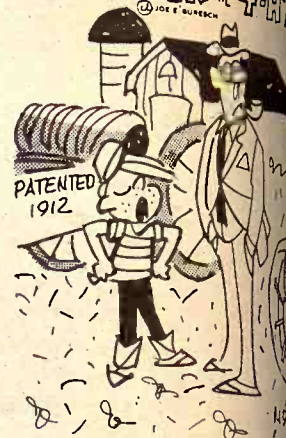
control the quality," explains Bratton.

"There may be a need for chemical control, but caution must be used when chemicals are used. More damage that good may be done if the chemicals are not used properly."

Since the application of a TSI project may be complicated, the advice of a professional forester is recommended.

"These services are available at no cost to all landowners through the Kansas State and Extension Forester at K-State," reminds Bratton. "The best procedure is to contact the county extension agent.

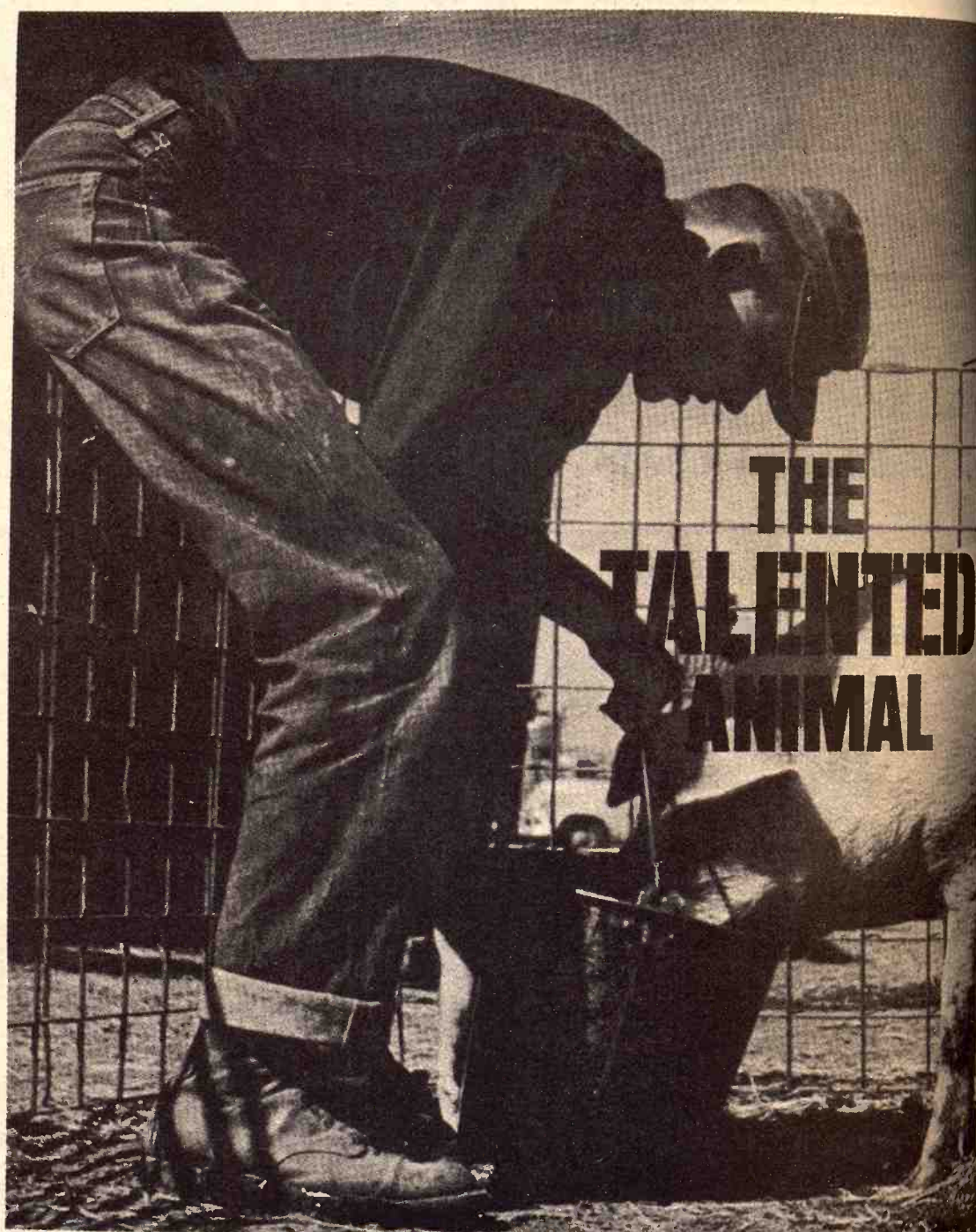

## Useless Medicine For Common Cold

A John Hopkins researcher says many common cold sufferers are given remedies they don't need and some that can be harmful.

A perfectly adequate treatment for the common cold is bed rest, aspirin and nasal sprays, says Dr. Paul D. Stolley of the Department of Hygiene and Public Health of Johns Hopkins Medical School.

"Yet 95 per cent of those who consult their physicians are given prescriptions."

"And 90 per cent of those remedies are preparations like antibiotics and antihistamines, which have not been found effective through controlled tests or which are inadvisable because of possible harmful side effects," Stolley said.

The researcher said that while

antibiotics are valuable for bacterial illnesses, they are useless in the treatment of virus caused disorders.

Antihistamines dry up runny noses, but the drying is a side effect and has nothing to do with the antihistamine action, which can produce unwanted drowsiness, among other things.

"In this overmedicated society of ours," said Stolley, "we treat drugs like breakfast cereals."

"We have about 22,000 drugs and drug products on the market in this country. It is very difficult for any one physician to become familiar with all the drugs and their side effects."

Stolley said the average physician uses about 250 drugs in his practice, and even many hospitals use less than 500.

"I don't think it would be too drastic to cut the 22,000 down to 5,000."

## Continue Hassle Over M.D. Practice At Clay Center

CLAY CENTER — Dr. Ronald Strand may admit patients to the Clay county hospital and perform surgery in emergency situations until March 15.

On that date, a hearing in Clay county district court will determine whether he may continue using hospital facilities under any circumstances.

The district court has issued a temporary restraining order against the hospital board of trustees, requiring them to permit the limited access.

The ruling was based on the court's finding that patients needed attention were refusing to use the hospital because of Dr. Strand's suspension, and the nearest hospital is 40 miles away.

The doctor's petition for removal of his suspension alleges the board didn't conduct a complete hearing on 18 charges against him nor allow him time for adequate defense, and that the suspension was "unreasonable, capricious and arbitrary."

The hospital board suspended Dr. Strand June 30, 1970, on recommendation of the hospital medical staff.

The state board of healing arts later received complaints about the Clay Center physician and conducted hearings of its own.

The state board early this year suspended Dr. Strand's license, then stayed the suspension and allowed him to continue practice, but only under its supervision.

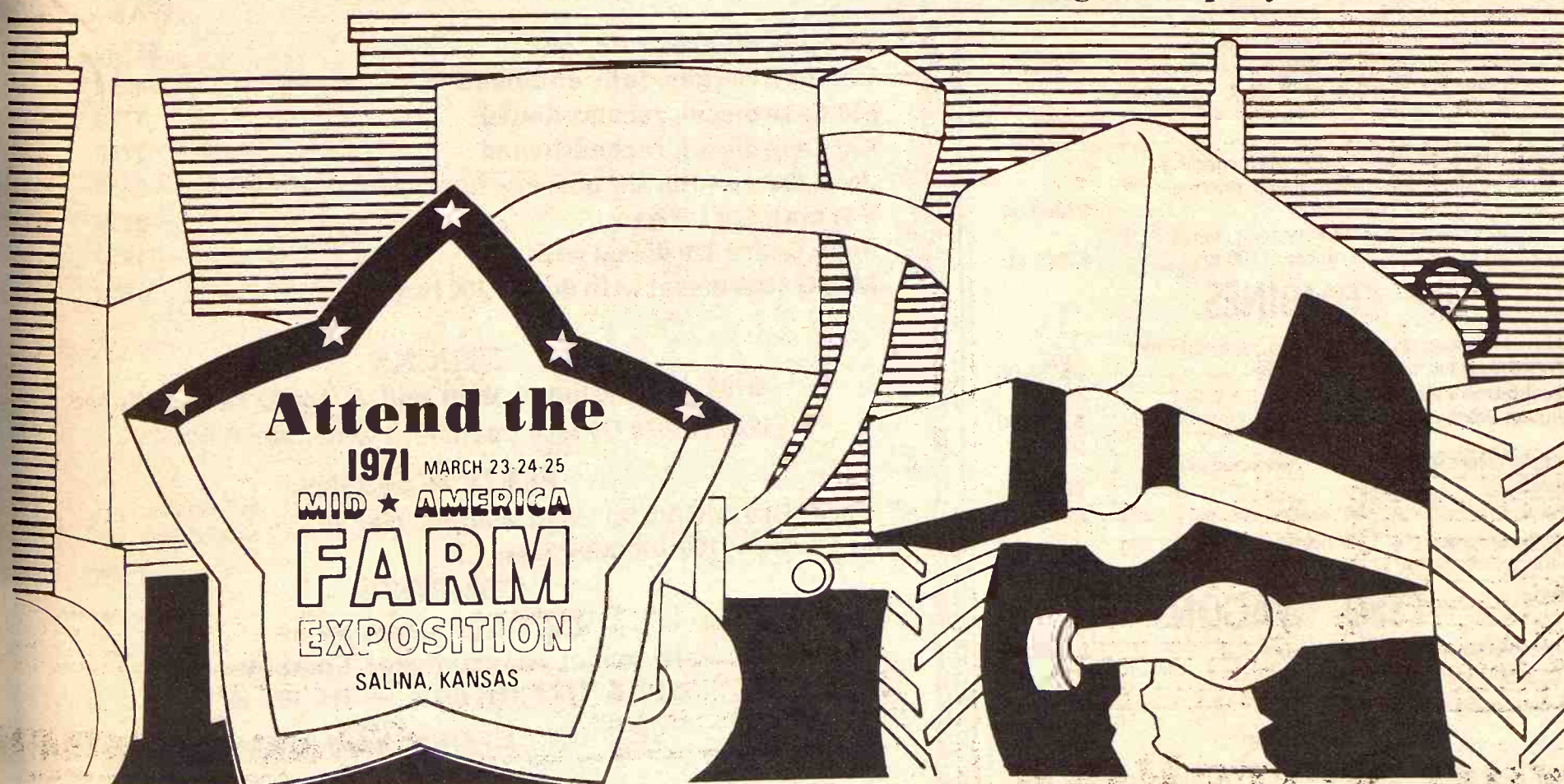

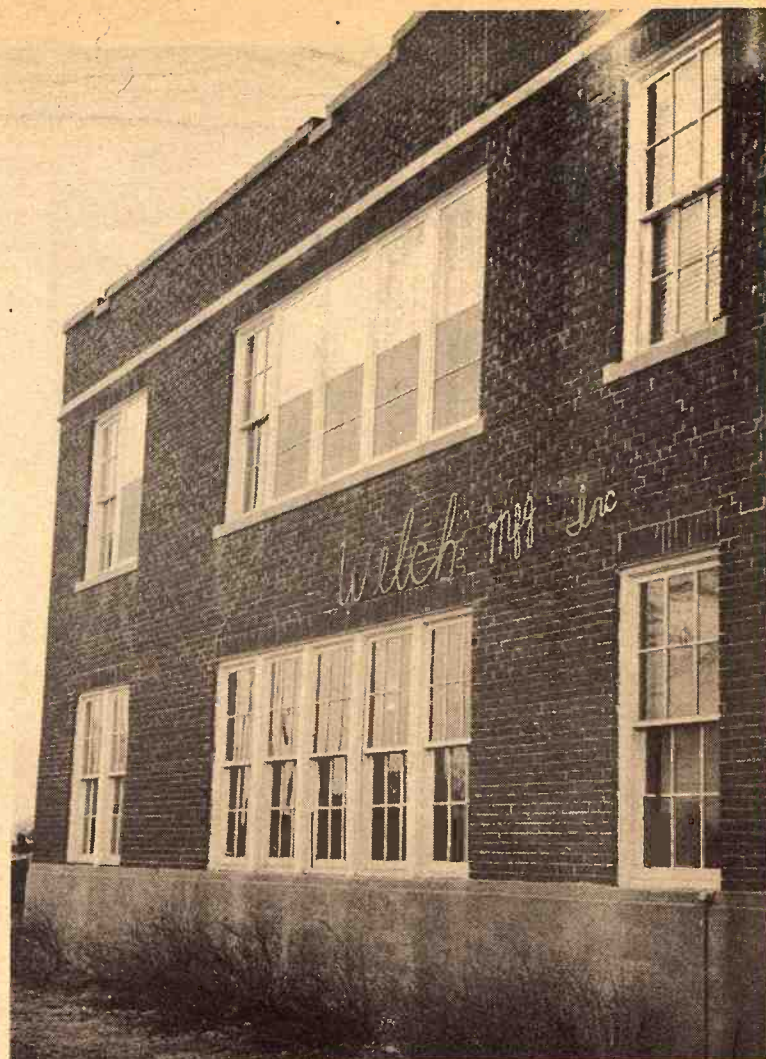


## Factory In Old Ramona School

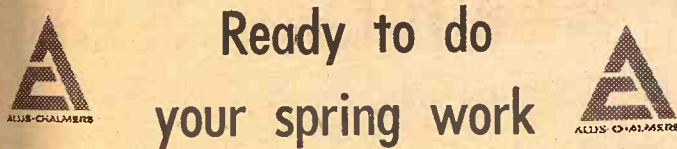

Congressmen Garner Shriver and Keith Sebelius have introduced legislation to provide for a 1974 centennial celebration in Kansas to commemorate the introduction of hard red winter wheat into the United States.

The legislation would provide for a centennial celebration in which Congress would support suitable ceremonies and activities in Kansas to recognize the pre-eminent role of hard red winter wheat in the United States and to recognize the undaunted dedication and service of the wheat farmer.

Congressman Shriver said the centennial celebration would be most appropriate in 1974 in that Russian Mennonite families first planted hard red winter wheat in the community of Hillsboro, Kansas in 1874. He said 1974 would mark 100 years that Kansas has served the nation and the world as the "breadbasket of the world."

Congressman Sebelius said hard red winter wheat had become a major force in the domestic economy and in foreign relations. He

said the wheat industry plays a prominent role in the nation's efforts to eliminate hunger, in the Food for Peace program and in helping to produce a favorable balance of trade.

The congressmen were joined by seven other wheat state representatives: William Ray (D-Kans.), John Melcher (D-Montana), Dave Martin (R-Neb.), Orval Hansen (R-Idaho), Richard Shoup (R-Neb.), John McCollister (R-Neb.), and James Abourzk (D-S.D.).

### NEBRASKA HONORS DON GOOD

A Kansas State University animal scientist and administrator, Dr. Don Good, has been presented a special plaque by the Nebraska Angus Association to recognize "many years of leadership and contributions to the beef cattle industry." The presentation was made recently at the 20th anniversary Nebraska Angus Futurity Show banquet in Grand Island, Neb., by Percy Upton, secretary of the Nebraska Angus Association. Good, who is head of K-State's department of animal science and industry, was featured speaker at the banquet.

## Electric Co-op Scorn For Split Of Ag Department

The National Rural Electric Cooperative Association offers a tongue-in-cheek proposal for carving up the Agriculture Department and distributing its functions among eight departments

instead of the four that President Nixon has suggested.

The four-way split would be undertaken as part of Nixon's plan for reorganizing the executive branch into eight departments instead of the 11 that exist now. The Agriculture Department's duties would be

parceled out to four new departments.

Critics of the Nixon plan say the farmer would lose a cabinet-level spokesman with the elimination of the office of secretary of agriculture.

The NRECA says in its current newsletter that Nixon answers such criticism by pointing out that under his reorganization plan farmers would have four cabinet officers, secretaries, speaking for them.

"Building on that foundation," the co-op newsletter says, "we recommend that UDA be sliced up even further and a little of the action be given to all eight cabinet posts."

In building its case for the eight-way organization, the NRECA cited Nixon's statement recently in Iowa that the question of reorganization is between farmers having an Agriculture Department or better prices and greater opportunities.

"This is the kind of logic made famous by another Madison Avenue slogan: 'What do you want, good grammar or good taste?'" the NRECA said.

Thus, the co-op added, the logical next step is to distribute parts of the Agriculture Department among all eight departments proposed in the new Nixon plan.

"Think of it," the NRECA said, "eight voices speaking up to the White House about the trouble of farmers, none of them really knowing anything about rural problems, but all of them using good grammar."

## Praise — But Not Too Much — For Feedlot Efforts

HUTCHINSON — An official of the federal Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) praised Kansas for its efforts in establishing livestock feedlot pollution control regulations, but also cautioned against allowing feedlots unwarranted reprieves from compliance.

"I would like to salute Kansas as the first state to develop feedlot regulations," David DeWitt Dominick, commissioner of the water equality control division of EPA said.

"I am aware that many of the older established feedlots are seeking legislative moratoriums. In view of the fact a number of these feedlots have had a number of years to comply, I certainly hope there is

no slowdown of these (enforcement) efforts in Kansas," he said.

Dominick was a key speaker at the opening session of the 26th annual joint conference of the Kansas section of American Water Works Association, and the Kansas Water Pollution Control Association at Wichita.

Dominick said there is a need for a "vigorous continuation of the feedlot control program" in Kansas.

He encouraged Kansans to solicit the state legislature to provide state funds to match federal funds available to cities for sewage treatment facilities improvements. He said the new standards require complete bacterial control of the effluent discharged from treatment facilities and waste lagoons. Federal financial aid for effecting the needed facilities improvements is available, he said.

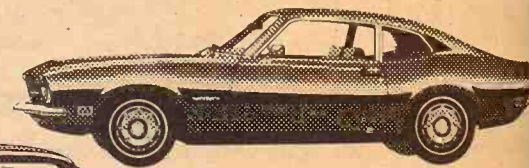

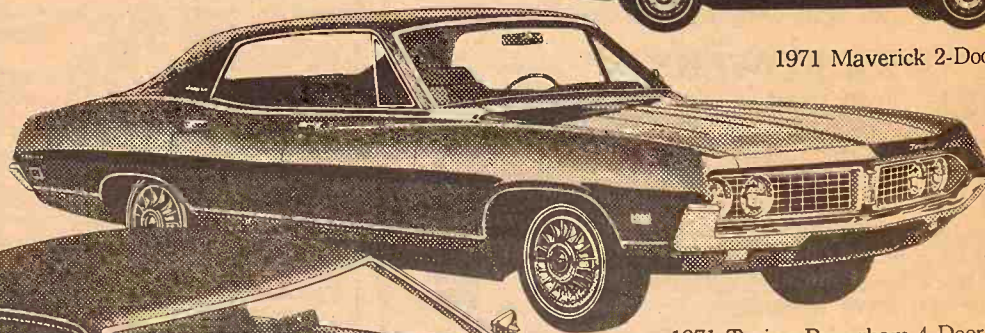

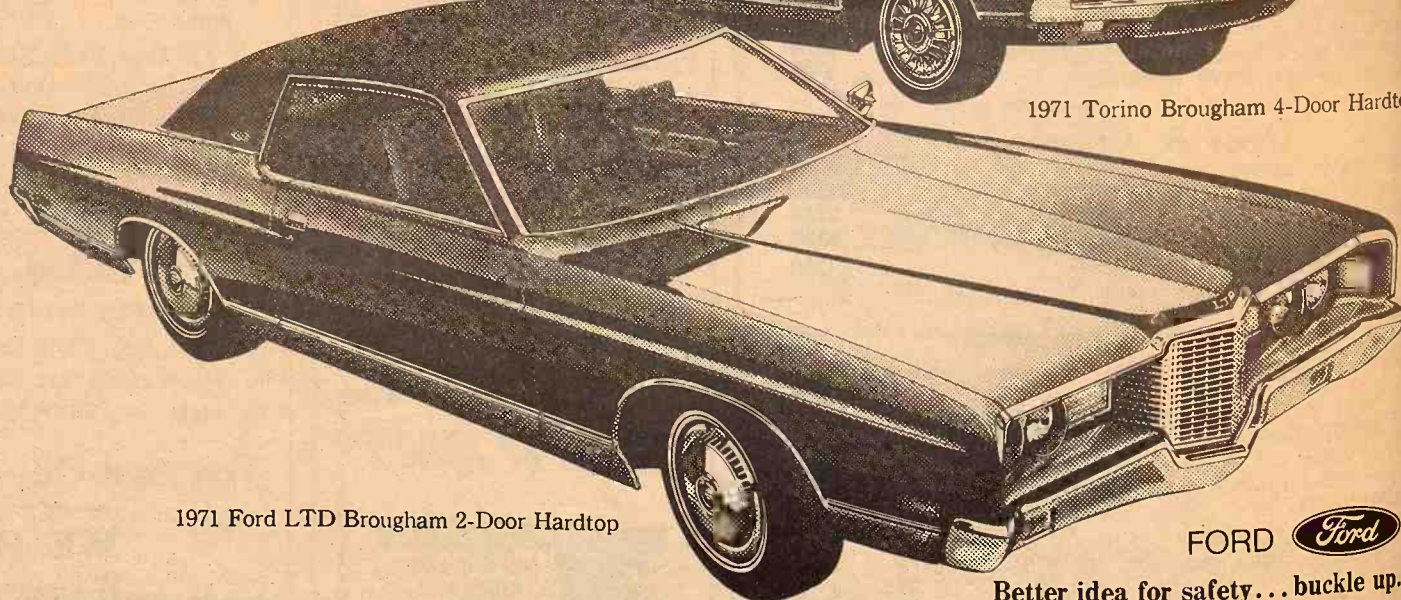

### STATE OF KANSAS Notice of Submission of Proposed Constitutional Amendment at April 6, 1971 General Election

Senate Concurrent Resolution 12, adopted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas on February 8, 1971, reads as follows:

"Section 1. A special election is hereby called, to be held on April 6, 1971, pursuant to section 1 of article 14 of the constitution of the state of Kansas, for the purpose of submitting to the electors the proposition to amend the constitution contained in Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 11."

Pursuant to Section 1 of Article 14 of the Constitution of the State of Kansas and in compliance with Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 11 adopted by the Legislature on February 8, 1971, a proposition to amend the Kansas Constitution reads as follows:

"Section 1, article 5 of the Constitution of the State of Kansas is amended to read as follows:

"Section 1. Every citizen of the United States who has attained the age of eighteen years and who shall have resided in Kansas six months next preceding any election and in the precinct in which he or she seeks to vote at least thirty days next preceding such election shall be deemed a qualified elector. A citizen of the United States who has attained the age of eighteen years and who shall have resided in Kansas in the precinct in which he or she seeks to vote at least thirty days next preceding any general election, may vote for presidential electors and candidates for the offices of president and vice-president of the United States. A citizen of the United States, who is otherwise qualified to vote in Kansas for presidential electors and candidates for the offices of president and vice-president of the United States may vote for such officers either in person or by absentee ballot notwithstanding the fact that such person may have become a nonresident of this state if his or her removal from this state occurs during the thirty days next preceding such election. A person who is otherwise a qualified elector may vote in the precinct of his former residence either in person or by absentee ballot notwithstanding the fact that such person may have become a nonresident of such precinct during the thirty days next preceding such election if his new residence is in another precinct in the state of Kansas."

Sec. 2. The title appearing on the ballot by which this amendment is submitted to the electors of this state shall be the following:

"Shall the constitution be amended to permit persons eighteen (18) years of age and upwards to vote in all elections, to reduce the residency requirement from forty-five to thirty days for electors to vote only for presidential electors and candidates for the offices of president and vice-president of the United States, to permit electors who have moved from the state during the thirty days next preceding the election to vote only for presidential electors and candidates for the offices of president and vice-president of the United States, and to permit persons who move within the state within thirty (30) days of an election to vote?"

I hereby certify that the above Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 12 was adopted by the 1971 Session of the Legislature of the State of Kansas and that the original is now on file and a matter of record in my office. I further certify the foregoing Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 11 is a true copy of the proposed amendment to the Constitution of the State of Kansas contained in Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 11 adopted by the 1971 Session of the Kansas Legislature, the original of which is now on file and a matter of record in my office.

Cash receipts from farming in Kansas increased slightly to a new record high in 1970, but realized net income for farmers declined 10

percent from a year earlier, according to the Kansas Crop and Livestock Reporting Service.

Cash receipts from farming

totalled \$1971 million in 1970, with about 89 percent of the total derived from marketing of crops and livestock and 11 percent from government payments.

Farm production expenses continued to rise in 1970 and totaled over \$1.5 billion, highest of record. Kansas farmers realized a net income for the year of approximately \$443 million compared with \$492 million in 1969.

Cash receipts from marketings of Kansas livestock and livestock products in 1970 totaled \$1193 million, 4 percent above 1969 and a new record high, reflecting a large volume marketed and increased livestock prices in 1970.

Cash receipts from crops in Kansas were \$552 million, 4 percent below last year. A smaller volume of crops was marketed in 1970, which more than offset generally higher prices received for crops.

Net realized income per farm averaged \$5094 in 1970 compared

with \$5587 a year earlier and the record high of \$5871 set in 1966.

Realized gross income per farm set a record high of \$23,567, up from \$23,005 in 1969.

# Rural Aid Plan Would Cut Into Old Programs

President Nixon proposed giving rural America \$1.1 billion under his revenue-sharing plan with no strings attached on how to spend it. But it would eliminate some very popular specific programs and opposition developed swiftly.

If Congress approves the President's plan, such things as the Appalachia Regional Commission, and other such regional organizations, would be abolished. So would the Agricultural Extension Service and popular programs

which give federal grants for tree plantings, farm pond construction and other activities.

In his lengthy message to Congress, Nixon said the states could continue these programs if they wished. Such decision would be up to the governors of each of the 50 states, Puerto Rico, Guam and the Virgin Islands, he said.

Under his plan, \$179 million in new funds would be added to the \$921 million budgeted for farm and rural development programs under the

existing system of giving federal grants for specific projects.

But the money would no longer be tied to such projects and states would not be required to provide matching funds.

The National Farmers Union, one of the nation's larger farm organizations already has come out against the proposal. "I don't think it's got a prayer," said a spokesman.

## SEC Disciplines Wichita Cattle Promoter, AID

Agricultural & Industrial Development Inc. of Wichita and its president Wayne J. Madill have been disciplined by the Securities and Exchange Commission, which found them guilty of stock manipulation.

At the time of the violation, AID owned Key Securities Inc., a Wichita broker-dealer. Action against that firm and its president, Bill Whorton, still is pending.

The SEC barred both AID and Madill from association with any broker-dealer for one year. The agency found that they sold unregistered shares of the company's stock and manipulated the price of that stock and of stock in Hi-Plains Enterprise Inc. and Hays Land & Cattle Co. The violations occurred between February 1968 and October 1970, the SEC said.

The penalties were contained in an offer of settlement in which the respondents consented to the findings without admitting the allegations.

In Wichita, Vernon Meckel, vice president of AID, said, "We don't admit anything."

"We are primarily a feedlot operation," Meckel said, "and we've been trying to get out of the securities business for some time, anyway."

## Drop In Fall Fertilizer Sales

Fertilizer sales in Kansas were down slightly for the six-month period ending December 31, 1970

from the corresponding record-breaking figure ending December 31, 1969. The latest figure was 435,361 tons, third only to 457,362 in 1969 and 445,799 in 1968.

The report, based on commercial fertilizer sales by manufacturers to Kansas dealers, was issued by the Control Division of the State Department of Agriculture. Sales of actual plant nutrients totaled 243,455 tons. This was down 21,689 tons from the previous fall. Nitrogen sales totaled 149,320 tons. Available phosphoric acid sales were 81,971 tons. Potash sales totaled 13,341 tons.

Anhydrous ammonia sales were 99,924 tons, an increase of 9,856 tons. Liquid mixed fertilizer sales were 26,164 tons. Dry mixed fertilizer sales totaled 169,291 tons.

Sumner County led the state in fertilizer sales with a total of 21,866 tons, followed by Reno with 15,844; Harper, 12,286; Sedgwick, 11,700; and Stafford 11,451. Tonnage figures by counties represent reports of sales to dealers and others, and do not necessarily imply actual usage in that county.

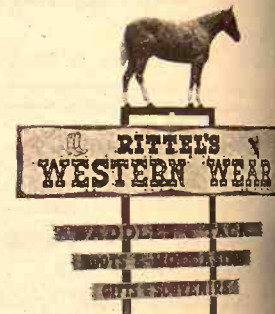

There now are about 1700 workers at the plant, which is operated by Hercules Powder Co. It has been producing rocket propellant.

The plant was deactivated after World War II and opened again in August 1965, reaching a peak work force of 2500 by June 1969.

### Modern Model-T to Run Again in India?

Henry Ford's famous Model-T, which took Americans away from their parlors and brought families to the open road, may do the

same for India. Henry Ford II, who hopes to collaborate with the Indian government to make a "people's car" has outlined the kind of vehicle he thinks should be specially designed for the Indian market. It all adds up to a space age version of the old Model-T. The car will be known as the B-C (for Bullock Cart) and it will be a durable vehicle able to stand up in

use over India's primitive roads. It will have a minimum of parts and gadgets so it will be easy for the non mechanically minded farmer to repair. One feature is that the B-C will have a multiplicity of uses. For example the farmer can put the car up on blocks and run an irrigation pump by attaching a belt to the B-C's rear wheels. Ford said the multi-purpose B-C would replace its namesake, India's familiar bullock cart, that has been the main source of transportation in the subcontinent. Its nearest challenger has been the jeep, which first made its appearance in the war when American troops were stationed in India. The jeep is ideal for roads made impassable for other vehicles by the monsoon rain, but they are too expensive for most farmers who instead depend on oxen to pull their carts through the mud. India's private sector manufactures a limited number of cars, but these too are out of the price range of most of the population. The universal complaint is that the cars, whose design was frozen in the 1950's, are poorly made and don't stand up in rural areas. Prime minister Indira Gandhi's government feels the public sector can manufacture a better and cheaper car. The government is studying bids from other foreign companies who have expressed interest in collaborating in making an initial production of 50,000 cars a year. Among them are Renault of France,

Fiat of Italy and Mazda of Japan. Recently, Ford began manufacturing tractors in India in a joint venture with a private firm, Escorts Ltd. The agreement calls for the production of 6,000 tractors of 50 horsepower a year by the end of 1972. Tractors have been given a high priority by the government. The country is producing only 18,000 a year and has to import 20,000 more, mostly from the Soviet Union and eastern Europe. Since even this does not meet the demand a flourishing black market in tractors is now in operation.

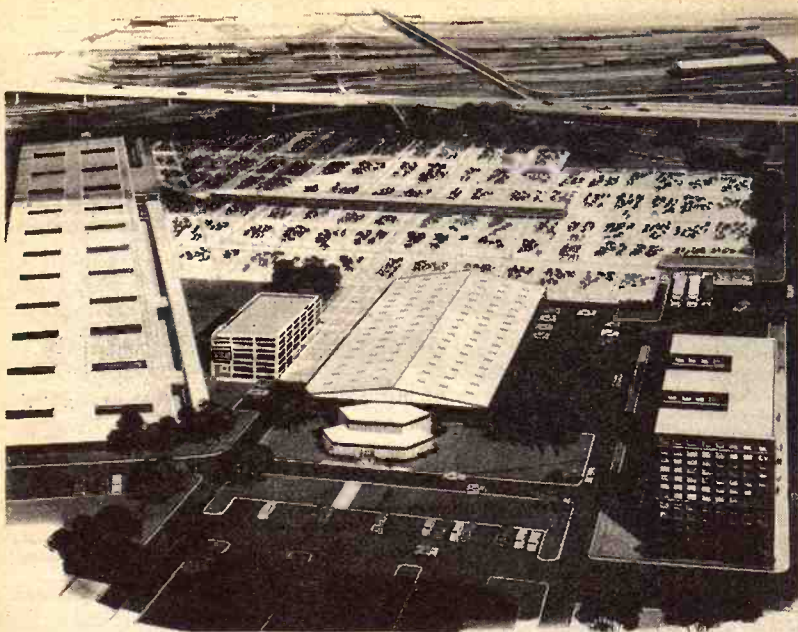

#### INTERSTATE TO CUT OFF KANSAS CITY MARKET

A new interstate highway link will cut off the north end of the yards at the Kansas City Stockyards, forcing some changes which an artist foresees as looking like this sometime in the future. That's the old Livestock Exchange Building at right and the Auction Center to the left.

In this sketch the highway running through the top of the picture is the proposed Interstate 670, which will link I-70 with the Kansas Turnpike and will have on and off ramps for the Central Industrial District.

Overhead docks are being removed from the Kansas City yards. Removal of pens at the north end of the yards forced by the Interstate project will make the yards "more compact and more efficient," said Jay Dillingham, president of Kansas City Stockyards Company.

## Farmer May Be Holding Up Against Synthetics

Competition from synthetics may not be hurting the American farmer as badly as some predictions had forecast for the next decade.

A recent USDA study indicates that man-made fibers have begun leveling off in sales and are now affecting cotton less, and the same is probably true for synthetic citrus products on the real thing.

The USDA task force concludes that farmers may be able to roll with the punches of synthetic innovation and not be hurt badly.

The greatest competition in the next decade will likely come from substitutes for dairy products, and perhaps meat as well.

New ways of concocting cheaper protein mixes are in early stages of development, and livestock producers are watching improvement in the field with some fear.

Probably the most dramatic and readily measurable impact of synthetics in recent years has been in textiles. By 1969, the last year researched by the government team, 45 per cent of total domestic use of broad woven goods was classified as manmade.

During the time when synthetics

were scoring their heaviest inroads, fabric blends of polyesters with cotton began to increase in volume. Domestic raw cotton consumption dropped from 8.6 million bales in 1965 to 8.2 lower cost, superior absorbent its natural advantages of million four years later.

Some comeback is projected for cotton, however, because its insulating properties may offset the strength, permanent press and other qualities of synthetics.

The researchers' outlook for 1980 is that from 55 per cent to 60 per cent of fabrics used in the United States will contain man-made fibers, but that about 40 per cent will use some natural products. The projection is for a rise to nine million bales of cotton by the end of this decade.

The challenge to natural citrus foods is underlined by survey figures showing that substitutes now comprise 21 per cent of the 600-million-gallon annual retail citrus beverage market and that synthetic orange drinks containing no citrus derivatives account for 12.5 per cent of the total.

Powdered synthetics show the greatest impact on natural orange juice because it is easily stored, carried and used. But this has spurred research into development of acceptable powdered natural drinks. This should contribute to an expected 25 per cent increase in natural citrus juices by 1980.

Dairy farmers already have suffered their trauma of competition from the substitution of vegetable oil margarine for butter. In 1940 per capita consumption of butter was 17.2 pounds against 2.4 pounds of

margarine. Twenty-nine years later the score was reversed, 10.8 pounds of margarine to 5.4 pounds of butter. The government team expects further margarine inroads in the decade.

Of greater consequence is the challenge to cream of non-dairy coffee whiteners and dessert toppings. Recent estimates indicate that non-dairy whiteners have taken about 35 per cent of the light cream market and that substitute toppings have captured more than half of the whipped topping trade.

The outlook is for continuing gains for substitutes at the expense of cream, but the survey sees a drop of less than 10 per cent for fluid milk to substitutes by 1980.

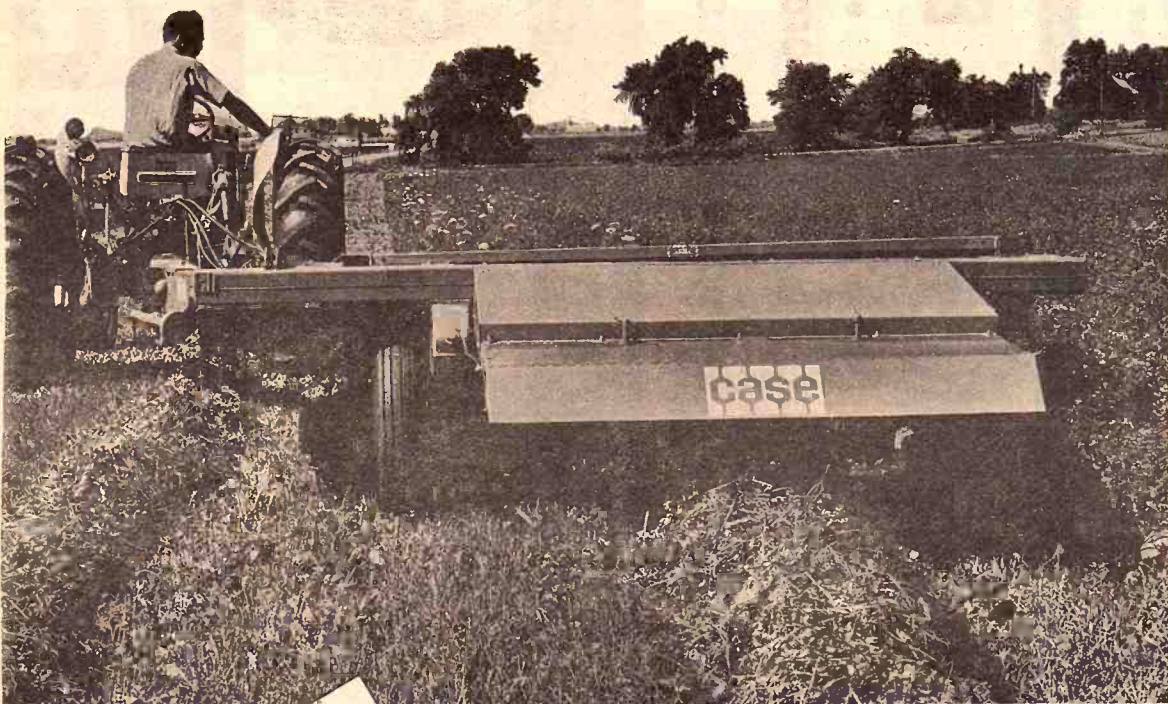
## New Cars Bash Easier

Tests of 1971 motor cars show they sustain greater damage in low-speed crashes than did 1970 models, a Senate committee was told yesterday.

"The base line of low speed crash damage reflected in estimated repair costs generated in our model tests...appears to have worsened," said Dr. William Haddon, Jr., president of the Insurance Institute for Highway Safety.

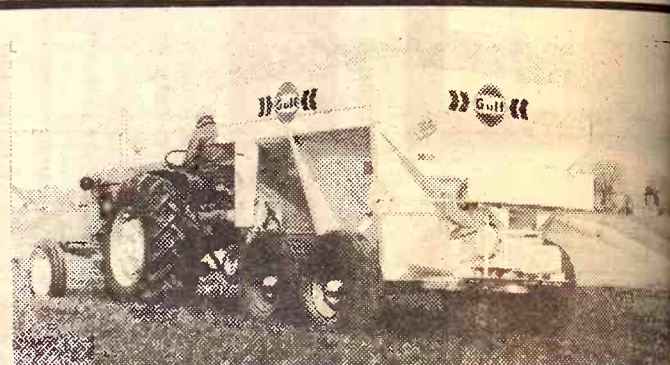

# Veterinary College Gets \$2.3 Million Federal Chunk

MANHATTAN — Funds totaling \$2,300,000 for the second phase of the State University's veterinary medicine complex have been approved by the National Institutes of Health. Receipt of the funds is contingent on that body's approval of the current Kansas Legislature

appropriating \$2,472,402 included in Gov. Robert Docking's recommended budget.

The second phase of the veterinary complex would include a multidisciplinary teaching building costing about 5 million dollars to be paid from the N.I.H. funds and

pending state funds.

Docking also recommended that the Legislature appropriate \$400,000 for movable equipment which won't be needed until latter stages of construction.

The first stage of the complex is under construction at the north end of campus. It is a medical sciences building which will house a state veterinary diagnostic laboratory, other veterinary medicine laboratories, and offices. Its cost is about 3 million dollars to be paid for from state and federal funds already approved.

Dr. Charles Cornelius, dean of the college of veterinary medicine, said the granting of N.I.H. funds was an appropriate recognition of K-State veterinary medical work over the years.

"I think we have placed somewhere around 2,400 men in the profession," he said.

Cornelius said the new complex would enable K-State to become a national leader in preventive medicine which would benefit humans and also one of the outstanding food animal medical facilities in the country.

## Insurance Firms 'Take Advantage' Of Campus Strife

Rates on insurance written on Kansas college and university buildings during the past year are unreasonable, Fletcher Bell, state insurance commissioner, has charged.

The cost of property insurance written on buildings at the state institutions in recent months has skyrocketed. Insurance agents cite the rash of incidents of arson on campuses not only in Kansas but elsewhere in the country as the primary reason.

Most companies are willing to write such insurance only with extremely high deductible clauses.

"I realize that events of recent years are a rightful concern of the insurance industry and dictate the need for some adjustments in rates and coverage provisions," Bell said.

"But when companies take advantage of these unfortunate circumstances to require a huge deductible on windstorm and hail or other 'Act of God' perils, it is time for changes to be made. The citizens of Kansas cannot afford and they

will not condone this type of treatment."

In the speech prepared for delivery at a meeting of the Casualty and Surety Underwriters Association, Bell also urged the company representatives to base their management decisions on their own operations and not to rely heavily on what other insurers are doing.

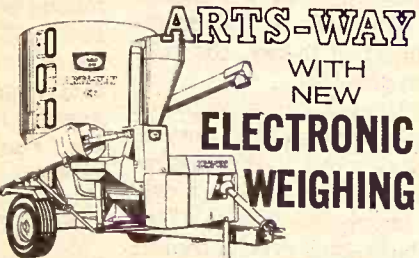
## Kansas Water Standards Get OK

# OUR DAILY BREAD

— by G&G Area Cooks

## Mrs. Wendell Wilgers, Palmer, Wins Prize-Winning Recipe

Winner, Mrs. Wendell Wilgers, Palmer: "I would like to enter my recipe for Raised Donuts in your contest. I always thought I couldn't do anything with yeast — but I finally got brave, I guess. Anyway this recipe turns out great!"

### GLAZED RAISED DONUTS

1 to 120-130 degrees:  
1 1/2 cups of milk  
One third cup of sugar  
1 tablespoon salt  
2 tablespoons melted fat  
Combine in a large bowl:  
2 cups flour  
2 packages quick-mix yeast  
2 packages quick-mix yeast  
milk mixture to flour and blend on low speed of mixer. Then add:  
2 eggs  
3 minutes at high speed. Then add:  
2 cups more flour (gradually with mixer or all at once by hand)  
until well blended. Let set until doubled, then add:  
1 1/2 cups more flour. Total flour 5 1/2 cups  
Use bowl to prevent sticking. Let rise again. Then roll out to 1/2" thickness and cut with large donut cutter or an opened No. 303 can and a wire. Let set 20-30 minutes. Grease tops slightly before laying them on greased waxed paper. Fry in an electric skillet in 1 1/2 inches of oil at 365 degrees till lightly browned. Drain donuts in colander. Let cool enough to handle dip donuts in thin powdered sugar, water vanilla frosting. (About 3 cups powdered sugar). Let drip on waxed paper covered tray. Fry the scraps as they are. The kids love them and they are so much more tender if they are not rerolled.

### HAM LOAF

2 pounds ground smoked ham  
1 cup quick oats (uncooked)  
1/2 cup fresh or frozen orange juice  
2 eggs, beaten  
Scant 1/4 cup chopped onion  
1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce  
1 tablespoon dry mustard  
1/4 teaspoon pepper  
1 11-ounce can drained mandarin oranges  
Make into loaf and bake in pan 8 1/2 x 4 1/2 inches at 350 degrees. Sprinkle 1/4 cup firmly packed brown sugar on top of loaf before baking. Can be made a day ahead and put in refrigerator and bake the next day.

# Silicone Might Put More Bump In Car Bumper

Automotive manufacturers are making plans to develop bumpers that really bump in order to meet proposed new federal safety requirements. Two systems currently under development in Detroit are bumpers that use different forms of silicone to absorb the energy of an impact. A synthetic material, silicone ranges in consistency from a liquid to a rubber to a solid. Bumpers today are just decorative ornaments. They're not equipped to ward off shocks," maintains Dr. James Franklin Hyde, senior research scientist at Corning corporation, which makes some of the silicone used in test bumpers. The proposal by the National

Highway Safety administration — the agency empowered to set automotive safety standards — would require both front and rear car bumpers to withstand the impact of a 5-mile-an-hour collision. Observers say the proposal is expected to become effective by 1973. The next step, they say, will be to produce bumpers able to withstand crash impacts at speeds between 10 and 20 miles an hour. "It takes the same amount of metal, the same manufacturing process to build a safe car as a dangerous one," Douglas Toms, head of NHTSA recently told the automotive industry. "The only difference is in the amount of homework," he said. Menasco Manufacturing company

of Burbank, Calif. is the developer of one of the systems now being tested by automakers. Its system uses silicone rubber. Other companies are working on bumper systems which use silicone liquid and air-oil combinations.

The Menasco system, which now uses a silicone rubber, looks like a plunger. The bumper is attached to a moveable rod which contains the silicone rubber. This rod is attached to a tube which is connected to the car frame by brackets.

When the bumper is hit the rod slams back into the tube. At the same time a smaller rod inside the tube presses through an opening in the larger rod and forces against the silicone rubber which absorbs the impact.

A Menasco spokesman explains the system requires a stronger conventional, fixed bumper.

Hyde at Dow Corning claims silicone rubber possesses certain properties that make it ideal for use in safety bumpers.

It only takes a small amount of

silicone rubber to absorb the energy generated by the crash impact, he says. The rubber is flexible enough to return to its original shape and size after a crash and withstand many repeated crashes. It can also maintain its original properties at very high and very low temperatures and weathers well when exposed to the atmosphere, he says.

Menasco says it has tested its system up to 160 times and rubber silicone still holds up.

The average car is only expected to sustain about eight moving bumper collisions in its lifetime, studies show.

General Motors says tests of the Menasco system and other systems show no injury to cars in crash impacts of nine miles an hour. A crash of this sort might normally cause \$1,000 worth of damage, G.M. says.

G.M. claims these new bumpers should fully protect cars in about two-thirds of all low-speed accidents, which is between 34 and 40 per cent

of all accidents.

The National safety council figures show that 72 per cent of all recorded U.S. car accidents occur at speeds under 30 miles per hour.

Ford Motor company says it plans to offer energy-absorbing bumpers capable of withstanding 5-mile-per-hour impacts on selected 1973 models accounting normally for more than 50 per cent of its production.

While Menasco says its system will probably cost less than \$25, observers note that adapting the car to handle the entire bumper system to the car will probably push the price to the consumer up to about \$100 - \$150.

Another disadvantage to the consumer, observers say, is that the bumpers in front and in back will make the average car about 4 to 6 inches longer depending on size of the car. This could create not only garage and parking problems but also snagging difficulties in tight traffic.

## Area Projects On Highway Bids

The Kansas Highway Commission will take bids for construction and maintenance projects on the state highway system March 18 at Pittsburg, according to state Highway Director John D. Montgomery.

Major projects include: Surfacing on the new location of U.S. 169 in Miami County, and improvement of U.S. 50 in Ford County and U.S. 83 in Finney and Seward Counties; modernizing of the present safety rest areas on I-70 west of Junction City; sign modification on I-70 in Riley and Geary Counties; and lighting on I-35W and I-235 in Sedgwick and Harvey counties.

Other projects listed will offer varied work on county federal aid secondary routes in Cowley, Dickinson, Saline, Sheridan, Harper, Greeley, Cloud, Logan, Wilson, Barton and Ford Counties and resurfacing on 472 miles of primary roadway in the northeast, north central and southeast regions of the state.

# Nixon Detail On Rural Aid

President Nixon has presented to Congress an already embattled program to give the states \$1.1 billion next year in nostrings aid for rural development. He said it is needed to brighten America's farm-life and stem the population tide in the cities.

The proposal, part of Nixon's overall plan to share more than \$16 billion in federal revenues next year, would be derived from some \$921 million which otherwise would be spent on existing programs, adding

\$179 million in so-called new money. The scheme includes the controversial step of disbanding the Appalachian Regional Commission which, in recent years, has poured upwards of \$2 billion along a poverty belt through 13 states. Governors of those states unanimously have opposed dissolving the agency, as have some key congressional figures.

But Nixon said no state would receive less rural assistance than it does under existing programs and

argued that in fact it applied the formula used by the Appalachian Regional Commission. He promised that the commission would continue to receive adequate funding to make good on current obligations.

"For the sake of balanced growth but even more for the sake of the farmer and all his neighbors in rural America," the President said, "...I am proposing that the federal government rethink and rededicate itself to providing the resources and creative leadership those demands need."

He said the rural revenue-sharing coupled with other special elements of his \$16-billion package would mean that "rural and urban communities would no longer siphon off one another's strengths and resources nor shunt problems and burdens from one to the other."

Nixon stressed that, in addition to the money specifically set aside for rural development, farmers and residents of small towns would also receive revenue-sharing assistance from separate programs for manpower, education, transportation, law enforcement and the \$5 billion which would be awarded the states for general purposes.

No strings would be attached to the rural aid other than it be spent in

counties with a population density less than 100 people per square mile, or cities of less than 50,000 persons.

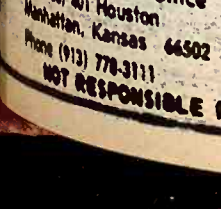
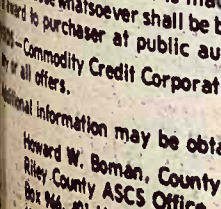
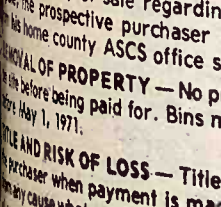
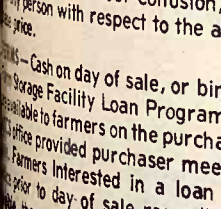
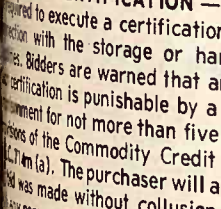
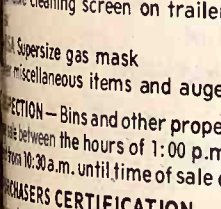
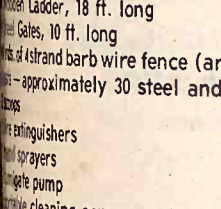
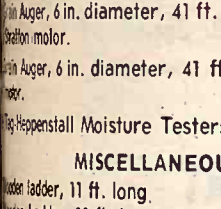
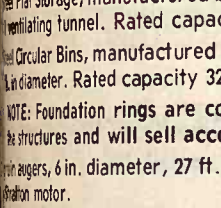
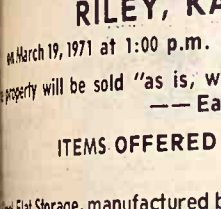
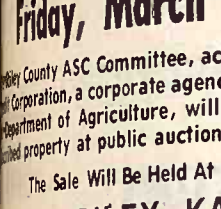
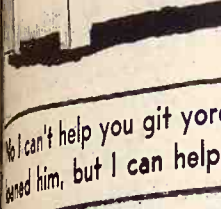
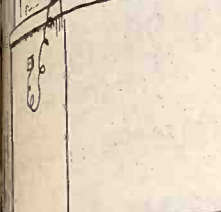
The Agriculture Department reports Japan is about to take "a substantial step forward" in beef production that could mean an expanded market for U.S. feed grains and oilseed products.

The Foreign Agricultural Service in a report that Japanese officials are aiming for a beef herd of 170,000 head by 1975, compared with 64,000 now.

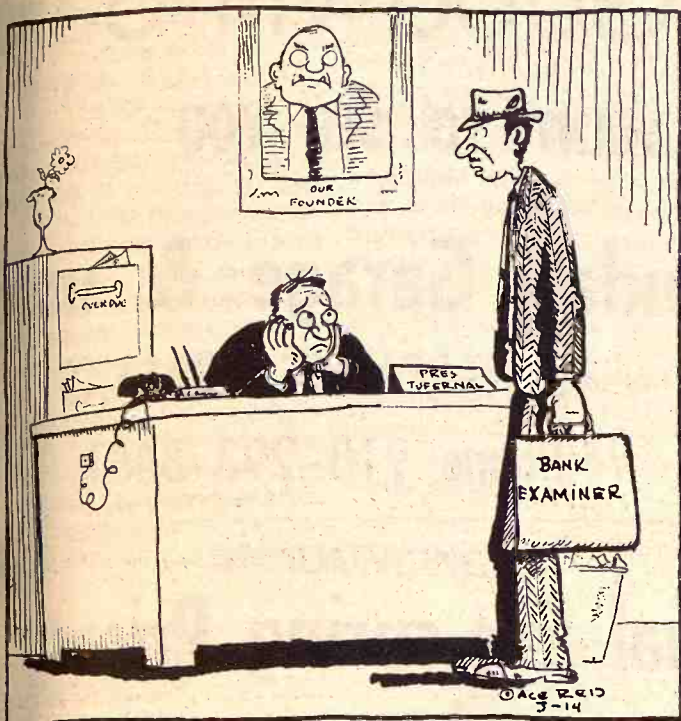

## Plugging New Eagle Wheat Seed Variety

New wheat varieties were brought to the attention of Wichita area farmers at the annual winter review of crops, soils and herbicides at Wichita.

Howard Wilkins, KSU crop specialist, explained the advantages of the new "Eagle" variety of wheat released during the past year by Kansas State University.

The new variety has better standability than Scout, better threshability, exceptionally good milling qualities and production is as good or better than with Scout, Wilkins said.

Wilkins discussed the advantages of Danne variety wheat, developed by Oklahoma State University. This variety is reportedly comparable in production and milling qualities to Triumph wheat.

Wilkins said Kansas alfalfa, a KSU release, is tolerant to late spring frost and high in quality and yield.

Dr. Erick Nilson reviewed suggestions for the proper use of herbicides.

"Most herbicides used in field crops break down during the growing season, but others persist more than one season," he said.

Nilson cautioned farmers to be careful in the use of chemicals and to follow carefully the directions on the labels.

"These agricultural products can be safely used for livestock and also are effective in gardens and lawns and other areas where weeds are a handicap, if instructions on the label are followed," Nilson said.

Leslie Tobin, soil specialist, said that the response has not been good to micro-nutrients on dryland sorghum and wheat.

Micronutrients include zinc,

manganese, boron, copper, iron and sulphur.

"But, under irrigation, sometimes a 20 to 30 per cent increase has been shown on irrigated corn and grain sorghum," Tobin said.

Only a small percentage of crops under irrigation responded to sulphur and iron, Tobin said.

Although Kansas State University doesn't offer plant analysis testing service, if the farmers of an area have something they think is wrong with the crop nutritionally, they should contact their county agent so a KSU agronomist can be sent for a research project, Tobin said.

The 250-room Town House Hotel in Kansas City, Kansas, has been bought for \$700,000 by a Topeka firm headed by Samuel Cohen which will operate the 14-story hotel as a Ramada Inn. The hotel has been closed since June 1970 and should open by this June. The Town House was built as a community interest project in Kansas City, Kansas, in 1951 for \$2 million.

# Studded Tires Must Go Off By April 15

Under Kansas Highway Commission regulations, motorists have a month left to get rid of their studded snow tires, though with the springlike weather in the G-G area the past week, most motorists probably have already tossed the tires in their car trunks.

The regulations provide for motorists to use the tires between Nov. 1 and April 15, but not at any other time, according to John McNeal, state highway engineer.

The Highway Commission is given

authority to regulate the use and type of snow tires under Kansas laws. The regulations set up by the commission make it illegal to use tires with metal studs or spikes before Nov. 1 or after April 15. Drivers violating the regulation are subject to a traffic fine.

McNeal said the studded tires when used on clear pavement not only cause expensive wear on the highway surface, but the impede the effectiveness of a car's brakes.

McNeal said the studded tires are now being outlawed in some states and in one Canadian province. A Canadian study, McNeal said, shows studded tires are capable of causing as much as 3/4 of an inch of wear on a highway surface in one winter season.

# New Book Chronicles Kansas Seed Grower

The Kansas seed production industry has changed many ways since the era 70 years ago when Turkey wheat variety was marketed under more than 25 different names and finding specific varieties to plant was a hit and miss proposition for farmers.

And every step of change leading to the seed industry's status as an indispensable segment of the state's agricultural economy is chronicled

in a recently released book entitled **The Kansas Seed Grower**.

A pert, spry, retired agronomist at Kansas State University, Prof. Alfred L. Clapp, authored the book — which traces the history of the Kansas Crop Improvement Association (KCIA) — in two years of steady work, thereby completing at the age of 82 another chapter in his long and fruitful life.

While other men his age contented themselves by rocking in the rocking chair, Prof. Clapp collected information for the book by poring through reams of old records, newsletters, personal letters, and business proceedings in the office of the Kansas Crop Improvement Association on the KSU campus, then blending them together meaningfully with his personal knowledge of the subject.

"Digging through 70 years of records was arduous at times and I often wondered when the end was coming. But now that it's all over, it definitely was worthwhile," Clapp enthuses.

Clapp was commissioned by the KCIA two years ago to do the organization's history. Howard Wilkins, Extension agronomist at KSU and executive secretary of the

KCIA, says "Prof. Clapp was the only person we could turn to. His many years as an agronomist working with certified seed in the state, including 11 years as KCIA secretary, gave him the unique opportunity to speak from personal experience and intimate knowledge."

The finished book is a truly attractive work. The 260-page volume is bound in a beautiful blue hardback cover. The front cover is graced by a gold engraved replica of the French painter Jean François Millet's famous painting "The Sower." Clapp's daughter Faye drew the sower of seed cover emblem.

Clapp says the book "presents a rapidly moving picture of seed certification evolution in Kansas. To avoid monotony, I've omitted details not essential to the progress of the discussion. Chapter divisions are based on subject matter rather than as a chronicle. Repetition and flashbacks promote clarity."

The book describes the development and organization of the KCIA, lists decisions leading to seed certification and high seed quality notes finances of the organization, lists important persons in KCIA history, and discusses the cooperation between KCIA and other

organizations.

It also gives an account of the organization's advertising and publicity history including a contest in 1941 offering prizes for the best songs stressing the use of certified seed. "The winner was a song called 'Certified Pure Seed' sung to the tune of Auld Lang Syne," Clapp recalls with a chuckle.

Wilkins reports that KCIA members are beaming over the finished book. "It exceeds the fondest hopes we had when we commissioned Prof. Clapp to do the history two years ago."

The association is furnishing complimentary copies to 1971 KCIA members, county agents, vocational agricultural teachers, cooperating organizations, some libraries and to previous members of the association upon request.

## Taxpayer Would Rather Do It For Himself

Millions of Americans are snubbing the government's offer to figure their income taxes under liberalized rules applying to 1971 returns, the Internal Revenue Service says.

The IRS offered this year to figure the tax liability for persons with incomes up to \$20,000 if they take the standard deduction. Under the new rules, their income must be from salaries and wages, dividends, interest and pensions and annuities.

But, the IRS said, only 2.2 per cent of the early tax filers so far had asked for the services. Of about 8 million returns processed only about 212,000 contained a request that the IRS compute the tax, the agency said.

Under the rules taxpayers may only complete certain lines on Form 1040, sent in the return, and have the IRS calculate the tax liability.

Apparently trying to drum up support for the system, the IRS noted that 3.6 million of the million income tax returns filed last year contained errors resulting from taxpayers using the wrong tax table line or column in Form 1040.

## Phone Company Has Bead On Phony Credit Cards

Persons making fraudulent credit telephone calls now do so at greater risk, Southwestern Bell Telephone company says.

Advanced methods of credit processing facilitate identification of violators, he explained. Under the new system, it will be virtually impossible to escape detection, he said. Many times the company can identify the violator with a single call, he said, and predicted that the number of violators prosecuted will increase.

Use of an unauthorized or fraudulent telephone credit card is a violation of state or federal law.

In Kansas, persons convicted may be fined up to \$5,000 and imprisoned five years.

The federal law provides a maximum fine of \$10,000 and five years in prison.

Noting that recent stories in underground newspapers have given instructions on fabricating credit card numbers by using a coin, Bell has stressed the personal risk involved.

# Argentine Beef Woes

The Argentines have eaten themselves into a serious beef shortage that threatens to undermine their economy and political equilibrium. Not only has the price of file mignon, the staple of the Argentine working man's daily diet, doubled in recent months, but also the shortage of economically priced beef has forced the closing of three major export packing houses.

These closings have nearly wiped out about a quarter of Argentina's foreign exchange income, which totaled \$1.75 billion last year.

Equally shocking to the average Argentine has been the news that cattle might have to be imported to bolster "depleted herds."

This news follows reports that Argentina may once again have to buy wheat abroad to meet contractual obligations. Earnings from wheat exports, badly affected by drought, accounts for slightly more than beef sales.

The government has imposed price controls on live cattle in the important Liniers Market here. The price was fixed at 14 cents a pound for live animals, or almost a third below the going rate.

Although this price would enable exporters to compete for supplies, no one in the trade interviewed here recently thought the controls would work for the following reasons:

First, there is a shortage of cattle. Second, as one buyer said: "Controls have never worked here in the past. And if they did, the local trade would elbow us out through black market deals."

He noted that Argentine wages are linked to the rate of inflation, which was officially given as more than 9 per cent in the first two months of this year, compared with 23 per cent for all of 1970.

The price controls so far have not produced any significant flow of cattle to market, although some speculators have unloaded some animals.

To explain the present beef crisis one must go back a century. At that time — before the advent of refrigerated ships in 1870 — cattle and sheep were raised on the lush pampas, or plains, for hides, wool and tallow. The carcasses were burned or given away.

The French-designed refrigerated ships revolutionized the livestock industry and created an extraordinary prosperity that lasted 60 years and caused indescribable misery for those who worked in the slaughterhouses, which were often foreign owned.

Consequently, the beef and wheat barons as well as the packing houses have been the prime targets of government revenue collectors since the depression and also of labor leaders and nationalists.

So it was early last year when land taxes were raised at a time that the pampas were being struck by a drought. There are almost no grain storage facilities in Argentina and relatively little irrigation. Because of the great richness of the Argentine soil, farmers shrug off a bad year now and then.

Moreover, farm and ranch organizations complain that they are taxed out of proportion of their income and cannot afford such facilities as silos and waterworks.

Thus, many ranchers sold large amounts of cattle early in 1970. This move pleased the government because it helped to lower prices and keep the inflation rate from soaring as in past years.

By midyear, Argentine herds dropped to about 45 million head.

Experts claim that the country needs at least 55 million head to satisfy home and export markets.

Only 25 per cent of Argentina's beef output is exported, compared with 80 per cent during the golden age of the beef barons before the depression.

Most of Argentina's beef exports go to Italy, Spain and other European nations. The traditional British market for Argentine beef has been reduced to precut and packaged steak for the most part because of what local exporters bitterly term "empire preferences" for Australia and New Zealand.

Argentines have also developed a sizable United States market for processed meats such as TV dinners, canned corned beef, hashes and pet foods. The present shortage of beef here may cause North Americans to pay more for these items.

This year the local price for file mignon was about \$1 a pound, double that of a year earlier. Although this may not seem high to the U.S. housewife, it is a severe blow for Argentines who average \$100 a month.

The initial government response was to ask Argentines to eat more mutton, poultry, pork and fish. However, the drop in wool prices over the last few years has thinned the once enormous sheep herds. Most persons here think of the other foods as suitable only as side dishes or between — meal sandwich makings, but hardly anything to be considered a main course.

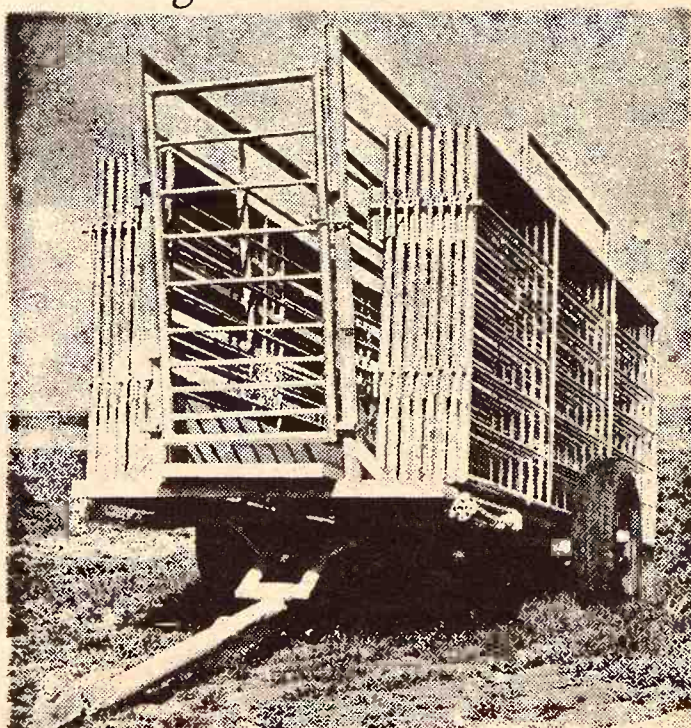

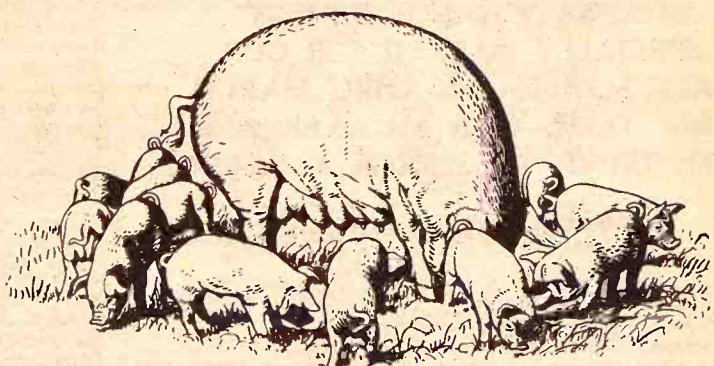

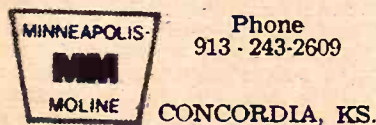

# Kansas Land Value Decline Turns Decade Of Inflation

Kansas led the nation with a 5 per cent decline in farmland values last year, reports from the U.S. Department of Agriculture and the Federal Land Bank show.

With the easing of interest rates, however, the worst of the slump may be over according to William May, vice president and secretary of the Wichita Federal Land Bank.

May listed five major reasons for the land price decline in Kansas, although the United States as a whole gained 3 per cent:

- High cost of money — interest rates were higher and money was harder to get than for many years.
- Uncertainty of farm programs — lack of federal farm programs, especially wheat, caused decline of interest in buying farmland.
- Increased ad valorem taxes — tax increases made Kansas farmland even less desirable.
- Competitive alternatives for investment — 8 per cent bond investments were more attractive than farmland income which was

much lower.

• Decline in oil and gas activity — chances for mineral income lessened.

Biggest decline in prices was in the western part of Kansas where wheat on dryland acreage is the major crop. Some of these county average prices dropped as much as 15-20 per cent, May said.

The past year ended a decade of constantly increasing land prices in Kansas and the United States. Kansas land prices went up 56 per cent in the decade. At the same time, however, Oklahoma land prices went up 106 per cent.

Although Kansas led the plunge in land prices last year, California followed closely with a 3 per cent decline. The U.S. ended the decade with a total increase of 75 per cent in land prices for the 10-year period.

May said with the easing of interest rates and availability of money for borrowing, the taking of loans for land purchases has been going back up in recent months.

The inflation attitude on a nationwide scale could also be

driving people back to borrowing money for farmland purchases, he noted. With the philosophy of inflation being believed more widely, people naturally incline toward

buying land for more stable values in which to invest their money, he said.

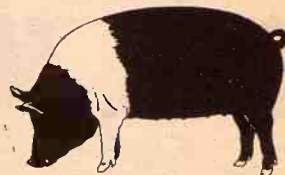

## Kansas, California Land Value Loss

The worth of all farm real estate estimated at \$210.7 billion — less than \$200 billion — a year ago. The average value of land per acre was up three per cent — from \$190 to \$195. The value of a farm unit rose seven per cent — from \$750,000 to \$800,000.

Sharpest increases in real estate values were in Maryland, Pennsylvania, Massachusetts, Virginia and Georgia — all up per cent.

Declines occurred in Kansas down five per cent; California three per cent; and Arizona, and Indiana, down one per cent.

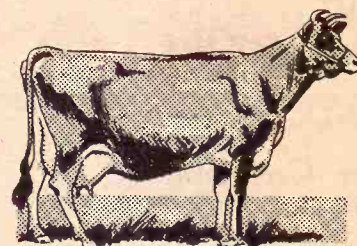

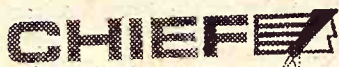

A 3-year goal was set for reducing the county highway department staff from 40 to 33 employees. At the same time the commissioners have asked elected officials and supervisors to submit recommendations for salary increases.

## Taxes Nearly Doubled In Past 15 Years

Tax collections have almost doubled in the last 15 years a private research organization reports. Since 1956 total federal, state and local tax revenues have increased by 181 per cent, Tax Foundation, Inc., estimated.

In fiscal 1956 collection were \$2,045 per U.S. household or a little more than 100 billion dollars. For fiscal 1971 the foundation estimates collections will average \$4,328 per household or about 281 billion dollars.

The study also noted that government expenditures have risen at a comparable level during that time. "There is clear evidence that huge budget deficits are once again becoming a way of life for the federal government. Taxes and

# Same Limits On Meat Imports

The United States intends to limit meat imports this year to the same amount shipped by foreign suppliers in 1970, Secretary of Agriculture Clifford M. Hardin has announced. Most of the meat is beef used primarily for manufactured products, including hamburger. Australia and New Zealand normally supply about 70 per cent. Hardin officially estimated the imports for all of 1971 at 1.16 billion pounds, the same as he had projected for 1970. Actual net imports last year totaled 1.15 billion pounds.

The estimate was the first official one from the administration on what it expected 1971 meat imports. Hardin is required by law to make the estimate on Jan. 1, but no public announcement was made until now.

Under the law a quota formula based on U.S. beef production requires that imports for the calendar year be no more than 110 per cent of a basic allocation. The adjusted basic allocation, Hardin said, is 1.02 billion pounds. The law provides further that if estimate exceeds the 110 per cent "ceiling level" — in this case 1.12 billion pounds — the President must claim strict quotas rolling imports back to the basic allocation.

However, the law also provides such quotas can be suspended because of "over-riding economic interests" of the United States and a

higher import figure set. This was done by President Nixon to coincide with Hardin's announcement. The quotas were imposed, immediately suspended and the larger import estimate announced.

"The estimate for 1971 is based upon a new voluntary restraint program which the Secretary of State is negotiating with the governments of the principal supplying countries," Hardin's announcement said. "These countries have agreed that the restraint program should be continued."

Observers believe that the negotiations among individual countries, which Hardin said are still underway, are the reason for the lag in announcing 1971 estimates.

So-called "voluntary restraint"

agreements have been used since late in 1968 to curb rising meat imports so that the United States would not be forced into taking stiff quota action against the supplying countries.

Last year, after imports rose more than expected during the first half, the quotas were invoked, suspended and a new voluntary lid announced. It was the same procedure that was used last week.

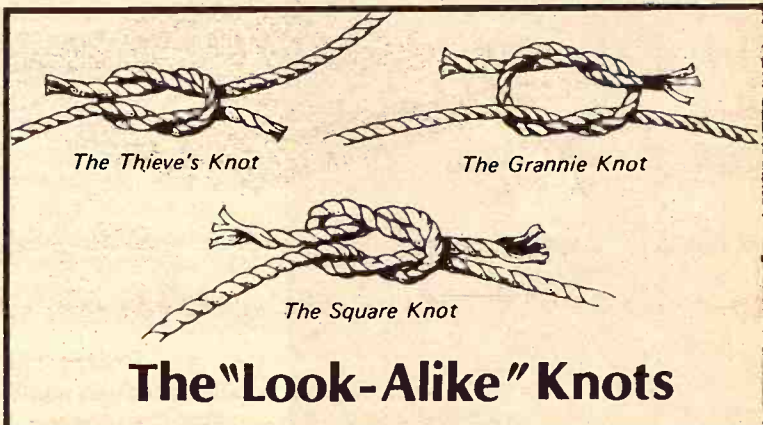
There were no estimates for individual countries announced for the 1971 import program.

The decision to hold the line on meat imports this year was a major concession to U.S. cattlemen who have lobbied effectively against opening the door wider to meat imports.

Consumer groups, on the other hand, have urged a more liberal meat import policy to help put more

of the cheaper meat in supermarkets and take the edge off rising food prices.

The damage apparently occurred when a large truck equipped with a boom or crane drove across the bridge. The damage was estimated at \$35,000 they added.

The bridge probably will be closed at least until summer, according to Al Wilkinson, Topeka, highway department chief bridge engineer.

Officials were trying to determine whether repairs can be made with highway department equipment, or if the work will have to be done by a bridge contractor.

Any vibration, even from the weight of an auto, could make the bridge collapse, Wilkinson said.

Traffic has been rerouted over the south lane of the westbound bridge, a side of the damaged structure.

Officers were uncertain when the damage occurred, but they were looking for the driver of the vehicle which caused the damage.

The bridge was constructed in 1930.

## Santa Fe Antes For More Big Grain Hoppers

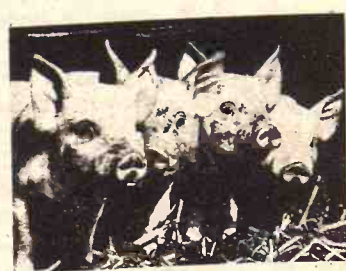
Santa Fe Railway has ordered an additional 500 - 100-ton covered hopper cars to be delivered in time for the 1971 grain harvest according to John S. Reed, president, Chicago.

"This \$8 million order increases our 1971 purchases of covered hopper cars to 1,300" Reed noted, "which will substantially enhance our ability to handle this year's grain harvest. With delivery of these cars, Santa Fe will have more than 9,700 high capacity covered hopper cars which are also suitable for potash and other bulk commodities."

Reed announced that Pullman Standard is providing these 500 covered hoppers plus 400 similar cars from a previous order, Greenville Steel Car will build 400 - 100-ton cross hoppers and 250 - 100-

ton, highside gondola cars; AMCAR will construct 400 - 100-ton covered hoppers and 400 - 70-ton non-insulated box cars; Pacific Car and Foundry will build 300 - 70-ton in-

ulated box cars. Santa Fe's shops at Topeka will construct 400 mechanical refrigerated cars. Delivery of the cars will be completed this summer.

# ASDA Nervous About Planting 'Clarification'

March 16, 1971

Administration farm of officials are sending out "clarifications" of a controversial decision to let farmers plant corn, beans, and other key crops on land devoted to conservation. The Agriculture department affirmed that special information was sent to state and county agricultural Stabilization and Conservation service officials. Spokesmen said the intent was to gain further the new instructions about March 4 which gave county committees authority to readjust farmers' "conserving base" acres to allow more crop production. The March 4 decision specifically authorized county ASCS officials to readjust a farmer's "conserving base," or the acreage customarily used for soil-building crops such as hay and other forage. The decision, according to department sources at the time, paved the way for the possible production of several million acres to production of food and fiber. An estimated 97 million acres currently tied up in the conservation uses.

Kenneth E. Frick, administrator of the ASCS, earlier this week disputed the possibility of expanded production as a result of the rule change. He said that only "mineral" increases in crop acreages were expected this year because of the order. However the possibility that counties might go overboard on readjusting conserving bases has worried officials here. State ASCS offices were sent a suggested "press release" to be issued to local media to clarify the department's order. "Naturally," the proposed news release said, "we don't know how many adjustments will be requested and granted locally, nor for how much acreages, but U.S. Department of Agriculture officials feel that conserving base adjustments on a national scale will not be of major consequence." Frick followed up with a letter yesterday to all county committee members who oversee federal farm programs locally.

"It has been widely interpreted both by some elements of the press and others as being designed to free substantial additional acres for cropping," Frick's letter said. "It is not designed to permit a shift of conserving base into set-aside acres, land that must be taken from production to qualify farmers for subsidies or to bring acreage into production which is not suitable for continuous cropping."

"It was designed to help farmers move away from a type of operation that is uneconomic or no longer suits his particular situation."

Carroll G. Brunthaver, associate administrator, told a reporter that the clarifications were not an attempt to dampen the original order for clearing the way for conservation adjustment.

At least some county ASCS of-

ficials contacted are reading between the lines to assume that the Agriculture department wants to hold a closer rein on the land adjustment regulation.

One official cited a part of Frick's letter which stated:

"We have confidence you will use your best judgment in seeing that economics and proper land use will be the major factors in substantiating bona fide changes from conserving to non-conserving crop acreages."

## FLBA's, FHA Have Finance Plan For Young Farmer

A joint lending procedure for the Farmers and Home Administration and federal land banks will make it easier for young men to enter the farming business, officials disclosed in Wichita.

Four state FHA directors met with Wichita Federal Land Bank president William G. Plested Jr. to adopt formal procedures for the new policy affecting both agencies.

The four state directors attending

were E. Morgan Williams, Topeka; Spudds Widener, Oklahoma; Carol Hunton, New Mexico, and Leo French, Colo.

The arrangement provides simultaneous processing of initial farm ownership loans by FHA and long-term real estate loans by federal land banks to the same borrowers.

Under the plan, the bank would have first mortgage on the land, while FHA would have a second mortgage on the property. Both would advance money for farm ownership loans to qualified borrowers.

The officials said emphasis will be placed on helping young, qualified men to enter farming practices.

The plan was adopted as national

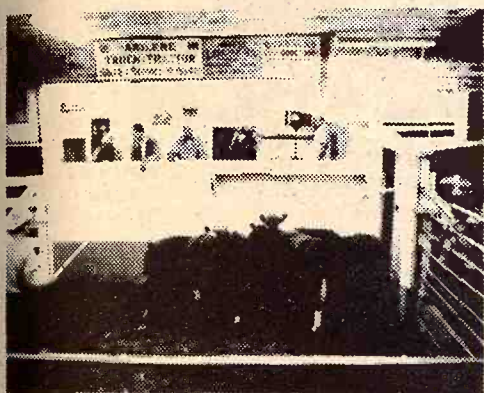
