
AMISPOUNTry School



'Parity or Plow Up'

How do farmers go about raising their income?

Ed Harrington, manager of the Kensington Cooperation association in Smith county, thinks he knows.

"Parity or plow up," is Harrington's motto. His idea is that farmers should notify the U.S. Department of Agriculture and Congress that they will plow up this year's 32% increase in wheat acreage unless the government guarantees a full parity of \$2.50 a bushel.

"Now is the time for action," Harrington says. "But none of

the farm organization leaders have given me any assurance that they will support the plan."

"This is a better idea than the NFO's plan of boycotting merchants," Harrington says. "If the government wants wheat to ship to India and other countries, then the farmer is entitled to a fair price."

William D. Daniels, Cimarron, Kansas Farmers Union President, says he agrees with Harrington in principle but not in method.

Daniels said he doubted if plowing up Kansas' wheat increase would cause shortages.

"Although Kansas raises onefourth of the wheat in the U.S., the average increase over last year's acreage is only 19 per-

"It would be a magnificent gesture to gain attention but I doubt if it would be effective," he said.

"Since there has been a 43 percent increase across the nation, it would probably only antagonize federal powers."

Harrington argues that the farmer's vote counts for little and though they can't elect representation, they still pay the largest amount of taxes of any group in the nation.

Daniels likened Harrington's plan with the NFO boycott plan. "Both serve only to call attention to the critical problems the wheat farmer faces."

'I doubt if the price of wheat would be affected if every acre of Kansas wheat were plowed up after March 31," he added.

Harrington said he first conceived the idea of demanding parity or plowing after watching farmers come into the Kensington elevator day after day to check the price of wheat, only to find it lower than the day before.

"I have received a great deal of encouragement and questions from farmers about my idea," he said.

"I urge every farmer to contact the county president of his farm organization and request a special meeting to discuss the

"I suggest a petition be drawn up by each group and addressed to the secretary of agriculture.

"This petition should affirm that if the support level of the price of wheat is not raised to \$2.50 per bushel, farmers will plow up the 32 percent allotments.

"The secretary would have until 6 p.m. March 31, 1967 to inform farmers of his intentions. Destruction of the specified acres of growing wheat would begin at 6 a.m. central standard

County presidents could coordinate these petitions with state offices and hand-carry them to Senators Frank Carlson, James Pearson and Representative Bob Dole."





But now the White House has stamped the idea as a social philosophy deserving the attention of a full-fledged presidential commission. And a budding national debate on the issue could lap over into future political

One champion of a guaranteed income is Milton Freidman of the University of Chicago, who was economic adviser to Barry Goldwater in the 1964 presidential campaign.

Friedman's plan, and others like it, are based on what's called a negative income tax.

Under current income tax brackets, Friedman says, a family of four has exemptions and deductions equal to \$3,000. He calls this the "break even"

If a family had \$4,000 income it would pay taxes on \$1,000 of it—that part above the \$3,000 break-even point.

But if a family had \$2,000 income it would pay no tax. It would have a "negative income" of \$1,000 and be entitled to a government payment.

Friedman proposed a negative tax rate of 50 per cent. Thus the family with \$2,000 income would receive 50 per cent of its \$1,000 deficit. This would mean a government payment of \$500, giving the family a total income of

Another proposal, by Prof. James Tobin of Yale, member of the council of economic advisers in the Eisenhower administration, would calculate a break-even point this way:

The government would guarantee a minimum income of, say, \$2,500. Suppose the tax rate is 331/3 percent. The break even point would be three times \$2,500 or \$7,500. If a family earned \$4,500 it would be \$3,000 under its break even point. It would receive a government payment of \$1,000—one-third of its \$3,00 deficit. This would add \$1,000 to its \$4,500 tax free in-

Another idea is to place the whole program under a setup similar to Social Securtiy with employees, employers and the government paying the cost. In







The A.M.A. publication's account referred to a study of medical care prices ordered by President Johnson some time ago. It is being conducted by the Welfare department, the Labor department, and the spokesman said the department had no comment to make on the reported content of the preliminary draft.

Not the Final Report

He said the final report is still in the works and that no time has been set for its release.

The A.M.A. newspaper account says "In addition to working hardship on the consumer of medical services, these rapidly rising (physicians' fees and hospital charges) costs also increase the cost to the taxpayer of governmental medical programs, the report says."

It adds that: "The report minimizes the impact of Medicare on the increase, pointing out that price indexes for adult and child care increased more rapidly in the first half of 1966 than did the indexes applicable to aged persons.

"However, the report did say 'It is possible that physicians increased their fees in the first half of the year partly in anticipation of Medicare.' "

Rise Almost Double

The article quotes the report as saying the Bureau of Labor Statistics index shows that physicians' fees rose 6.1 per cent in the first six months of 1966, compared with 3.8 per cent for all of 1965.

As for hospital charges, the draft reportedly says these increased by 13 per cent in 1966, compared with an average per annum increase of about 6 per cent during 1960-1965.

According to the article, the preliminary draft recommends to President Johnson that the federal government, among other things:

- Encourage alternatives to hospital care.
- Institute area-wide planning for comprehensive health care services.
- Increase the supply and improve the utilization of health

The magazine quotes the preliminary draft as saying "the reason for the long-run rise in physicians' fees is simply that the demand for physicians' services is increasing faster than the supply."



½ cup milk

½ cup sugar dash salt

2 cups flour or enough to make soft dough 2 teaspoons baking powder

1/4 teaspoon nutmeg 2 tablespoons hot shortening

Place a deep fryer pan to heat with enough shortening in it to turn doughnuts easily without pricking them (about three inches deep). Beat egg, sugar and milk thoroughly. Add flour, salt, baking powder and nutmeg which have been sifted together and lastly 2 tablespoons of hot fat. Mix thoroughly and roll out and cook. Talk to any farmer and sooner or later the subject of land prices is bound to come up. Younger farmer's are particularly concerned with the topic, although it is a vital issue to anyone interested in agricul-

Among the most frequently discussed questions is whether

pay for itself if prices for farm products remain unchanged.

Main concern behind this question: Since few farmers can pay for land from previous farm earnings, most buyers must finance based on future earnings from the land.

These buyers must expect that land will provide enough income to meet principal and interest payments, provide a margin to carry the risks involved, and produce some additional labor and management return for family living.

Total returns to the farm business are comparitively modest. This means that most

farmland, at present prices, will land sold is going to those who can handle it with a fairly low labor input.

Declining farm product prices in recent months make one wonder what the future may hold. Yet even during the peak food prices of 1966, food was a bargain compared to other things we buy. Americans spent slightly more than 18 percent of their net income for food in 1966, compared to nearly 25 per cent during 1947-49.

Optimism for the future is based on increasing domestic and foreign demand for food and other agricultural products and greatly improved technology. The latter factor is rising

productivity of land by increasing crop yields and reducing labor requirements through use of improved machinery and equipment.

The prospective land buyer is caught between the trite statements: "The worth of a thing is the price it will bring" and "Land is worth no more than it will produce."

Much farmland in Kansas is selling at prices which are quite high compared to present returns. Thus, an area of conflicts exists between these statements. There are no easy answers that apply to all prospective buyers.

The optimistic outlook for land productivity and demand for agricultural products far outweighs the negative factors. Still, the risks to prospective land buyers are comparatively high.

Careful study of your situation and careful estimation of expected returns are among the final factors which control your decision to buy or not to buy

Additional land which makes the present unit a more effective one may be a profitable investment even at relatively high prices. Land which fails to improve the unit is most often an unwise investment.

Proposed Law Would Force Township Mergers

The continuous consolidation of local taxing units may accellerate a bit more if a bill before the legislature gets thru.

The bill provides for some automatic procedures in consolidating townships, and it has an ominous ring to many farmers, traditional supporters of home rule.

The bill, numbered House Bill no. 1162, would disorganize townships with population of less than 200 and merge them with adjacent townships, unless a petition was filed opposing such disorganization. If such a petition were presented, there would then be a vote to determine whether there would be a merger of townships. As written the bill makes the action mandatory upon the county commissioners.

For townships of less than 100, the bill is even tougher. In such a case, county commissioners are authorized to merge the township with another without asking for the people's decision.

Townships of less than 200 population are most common

thruout the G&G area. Many counties have a majority of townships with populations less than 200.

The Kansas County Commissioners association at its last annual convention favored adoption of such a law.

K-State Offers Field Tests Of Chemicals

Any commercial company, firm or individual may have its chemicals field tested this year by Kansas State University for control of smut on oats, sorghum seed rot, seedling blights and covered kernel smut; wheat seed rot, seedling blights, bunt and stinking smut.

Minimum charge for the KSU service is \$100, but tests are \$25 for the first entry and \$20 for additional rates or formulations of the same treatment.

Advantage to commercial firms is that results of the University tests are public property and are reported to the public through the University's various information channels and media.

The Kansas State University program furnishes both commercial companies and the public results of objective tests that compare the various commercial formulations available or still in the testing stage. The University tests formulations by code when requested to do

Dr. Earl Hansing, professor of botany and plant pathology, has charge of the tests. He is assisted by graduate students in the department.






