What difference does 4-H make?

According to the 4-H Study on Positive Youth Development from the Institute for Applied Research in Youth Development at Tufts University:

- ❁ 4-H youth are three times more likely to contribute to their communities compared to youth not in 4-H.
- ❁ Girls in 4-H are twice as likely to participate in science, engineering, or computer technology than their peers.
- ❁ When compared to other youth, young people involved in 4-H are more physically active and two times less likely to use drugs, cigarettes, and alcohol.
