"Now with hundreds of acre-feet of water handy for use, there's a sense of security we've never had.'

With completion of the projects, floods in Butler and Cowley counties . on the Walnut River are believed to be a thing of the past.

When watersheds are at a virtual standstill in many places in Kansas, why has Butler County forged ahead?

"Butler County with its large area pasture land is an ideal place for watersheds," Woods explained.

"After the drought of the 1950sand floods that followed-residents became water conscious. The county has had 100 per cent cooperation of landowners in donating easements for building the dams and land covered by the lakes.

"Now that the dams are completed, landowners have found the land with the lakes is much more valuable. In one case, land that was \$80 per acre sold recently for \$300. Farmers lease the lakes to various groups for fishing and recreational purposes. Covered by water, the land is actually more valuable."

Brangus To Change Mix?

A meeting of the International Brangus Breeders Association at Texas this month may supply a decision by that group whether it is going to liberalize its registry so that it will be easier for a breeder to switch over to the Angus-Brahman

The organization has a G&G area cattleman, Royal Buckley, who has a Brangus ranch near Ottawa, as its president, and Kansas City has been the headquarters of the association since it started 20 years ago.

But most of the membership has been in the Southwest. The organization has about 700 members and in two decades about 32,000 head of cattle are registered. With new competition from exotic breeds, some members of the organization fear it can no longer survive without a new spurt of growth.

A Brangus is five-eighths Angus and three-eighths Brahman. If a breeder wants his own genetic mix without buying registered stock he must use Brahman bulls in a herd of Angus cows, all registered in their own association. If everything goes well, he could reach the proper genetic ratio in three cattle generations.

The six to eight years required to reach the proper genetic balance might produce the proper fractions but it isn't sure of producing the kind of animal the breeder is looking for.

In the meantime, he must keep careful records, separate the halfbloods and quarter-bloods and be sure that the right animals are mating.



Usable Reserves

According to USDA estimates, the carryover of feed grains at the end of the present marketing year will total about 35 million tons. (It has been around 50 million tons in recent years.) Essential pipeline supplies figured as 10 per cent of a year's requirements, would be around 17 million tons. That would leave about 18 million tons of usable carryover, enough to meet normal needs for about five weeks.

No one knows how much corn and other feed grains will be produced this year, but the big grain users have been making forecasts which they keep to themselves. Although producers could do the same, most of them are too busy with farm work. So we will offer some figures that may be of use to farmers who must decide when to sell - or buy - corn and other feed grains.

Production forecasts must be based on some assumptions. If farmers plant about the same acreages of feed grains as they reported in March and if yields are about the same as last year's (ali below normal), 1971 production would total about 170 million tons. Added to the expected usable carryover, this would make a total usable supply of around 188 million tons.

Prospective Needs

The need for feed grains next year probably will be between 170 and 175 million tons, compared to this year's estimated figure of 173 million tons. If the usable supply of feed grains for the next marketing year is around 188 million tons and if use and exports total 173 million tons, that would leave a usable reserve in the fall of 1972 of 15 million tons four weeks requirements.

The corn market is always nervous during the growing season. But it will be unusually excitable this year, because of the uncertainties caused by the southern corn leaf blight.

Horse judging, feeding and managing, grooming and care are some of the topics to be discussed. During the past year more than 3,600 Kansas 4-H'ers were in the horse project.

Surplus Milk To Cheddar Cheese At Hillsboro Plant

A new plant operating at Hillsboro, is converting Kansas' surplus milk into cheddar cheese, according to Jim Moore, Kansas division manager of Associated Milk Producers Inc., at Wichita.

The new plant opened recently in Marion County will have a capacity of 25 million to 30 million pounds per month converted into a Kansas manufactured product, he said.


The plant is running a single shift but when in full operation should handle much of Kansas' surplus milk, Moore said.

Some 42,000 dairymen in 17 states from Texas to Wisconsin have now joined hands under the Associated banner, Moore said. They produce 14 per cent of the nation's milk.

The cooperative enables dairymen in a surplus area, such as Kansas, to market milk in 14 "deficit" areas, he


The expanded facilities of the Wichita AMPI plant now handles 8 million to 10 million pounds of milk per month distributed to 8 to 10 outof-state processors and manufacturers, Moore said.

Facilities of the local AMPI plant now enable it to store 38,000 gallons of milk, Moore said.



front it "replaces" . . . and it serves an identical purpose. As carefully constructed and handsomely finished as fine furniture, such shelving is doubly functional in that it may be moved from wall to wall and rearranged to fit changing space patterns.

Better shelving systems also provide the flexibility of special purpose shelves - some deep enough to hold stereo and television equipment, slanted shelves which act as magazine racks and small ones which highlight single decorative items.

Floors Need Wax Stripping Periodically

Resilient floor coverings need to be stripped of old wax periodically to prevent "yellowing" and make cleaning easier.

Stripping old wax does not have to be done frequently as some homemakers mistakenly think. Two or three times a year, depending on the traffic conditions and frequency of waxing, is adequate.

To strip a floor properly, sweep floor thoroughly to remove dust and dirt. Then apply a liberal amount of wax remover over a three-foot square area. Let stand two or three minutes and then rub with a stiff brush, fine-grade steel wool, or an

electric floor scrubber.

Wipe away cleaning solution and old wax with a sponge mop or cloth. Repeat procedure over entire floor. Rinse the floor with clean, cool water. Let floor dry. It should look dull but clean. Apply a new coat of wax. Two coats may be needed for sufficient gloss.

Lubricating Mask

For a lubricating mask for your face and neck, mix some baby oil with soap lather. Massage this over the skin for five minutes, then rinse with warm water.

Loosens Tight Fitting Shoes

To make a pair of tight shoes more comfortable, soak a cotton ball with rubbing alcohol and swab the vamp of the shoe. With a pair of nylons on your feet, put on the wet shoe and wear it until it is dry. Do it over again if comfort does not result the first time and don't be afraid to wet the shoe. This is more applicable to leather than vinyl shoes.

Sharpens Needles

To sharpen dull needles, run them through an emery cloth.

Reinforce Plastic Cloth

A plastic tablecloth will longer if you crisscross two strips of adhesive tape to derside of the cloth where corner edges might rub again



But he did say anything that disrupts the business climate of a state or community disturbs businesses and makes them wish they were

Lacy added: "Civil rights commissions exist in all 50 states. Our problem here is probably less severe than it is in some other states."

Complaints filed by two men against an Ottawa, Kan., firm which are being processed by the commission on civil rights have stirred a controversy.

Troy Scroggins, executive director of the rights commission, said the rights commission is only carrying out its statutory responsibility to investigate all complaints in the Ottawa case.

"It certainly is not our policy, purpose or intent to harass, to badger or hamper any business in Kansas," Scroggins said.

Lacy said Kansas has developed a "spirit of co-operation" in working to attract and hold business in the state. "We must continue it," he said. He said employers in Kansas are becoming "more concerned with competence than with education" and said employers have added a fourth R to the training they want their employees to have.

Helping minorities achieve the competence desired by employers is a problem, he said. In recent years, Lacy said, the civil rights movement and the war on poverty have also generated interest in the basic skills necessary for employment.

"These skills have been of continuing concern to employers who desire to employ the best qualified worker in each position, and are perhaps of even more concern to the

potential worker himself. Often people possessing adequate technicals skills are still not able to obtain employment or, if hired, are not able to keep to the job because of certain other deficiencies," Lacy

In the ranking of cities by population Kansas City, Mo., moved up a notch in the last decade from 27th to 26th, the Census bureau reported.

The Kansas City 1970 population is listed as 507,409 compared with 475,539 in 1960.

St. Louis slipped from 10th to 18th and from 750,026 to 622,236.

Wichita, the largest city in Kansas, is ranked 51st in size in the nation with 276,554 compared with 254,698. That is the same rank it held 10 years ago.

Kansas City, Kansas, now is 80th with 168,213, compared with 98th a decade ago when the population was 121,901. Topeka is 115th with 125,011 persons. Ten years ago it was 100th with 119,484.

The 10 largest cities by rank: New York, 7,867,760; Chicago, 3,366,957; Angeles, 2,814,152; Philadelphia, 1,948,609; Detroit,

1,511,482; Houston, 1,233,802; Baltimore, 905,759; Dallas, 844,401; Washington, 756,510, and Cleveland, 750,903. Of those only New York, Los Angeles, Houston and Dallas gained population. All the others lost.

The bureau said there were 153 cities of 100,000 or more in population in 1970 compared with 130 in 1960. It noted 59 lost population in the last decade, 26 gained as a result of annexation or consolidation, and 68 showed population increases within their 1960 city limits.

Resigns As Head Of Controversial Tech Institute

Resignation of H.M. Neely as president of controversial Kansas Technical Institute, Salina, has been received by the Kansas Board of Education.

Neely told Salinans and his staff he had been accused of being unwilling to work with Salina residents to promote KTI, was said to have been unwilling to take advice and criticism, and was unable to convince persons across the state of the need for the institute.

The House Ways and Means committee voted in April to begin phasing out the institute, which has been accused of duplicating other programs in the state. However, money was included to operate KTI for another year.

Neely, the school's first and only president since its creation five years ago, fought for continuation of its programs. He negotiated last year with the Salina Area Vocational-Technical School on merger plans, which proved fruitless.

A state vocational advisory committee headed by a former state school superintendent, Merle Hayden, recommended the merger, but the state board disagreed. Phasing out also was recommended by James Bibb, state budget director



Methodists Study Support Of Two Area Colleges

A special study committee has recommended that United Methodists decide whether they want to retain Kansas Wesleyan and Southwestern colleges as churchrelated colleges.

At the Kansas West church conference at Wichita, Dr. George Richards, Wichita, presented the resolution to hire a research consultant to assist the committee in preparing a final report to the 1972 annual conference on the future of the 2 church-related schools in Salina and Winfield.

Conference delegates were told the "crisis situation" with regard to finances and enrollment can be solved but the most urgent decision is "whether the church should be involved in higher education".

> Dr. Richards said that almost every United Methodist conference across the nation is facing the same problem of support denominational schools. But the Kansas West conference is the first one to propose this kind of crisis study and decision, he said. This is the most drastic appraisal of this problem that this conference has ever made, he added.

> "We must not try to use a mild remedy to solve such a deep problem, and we can't wait too long", said Dr. Orville Strohl, president of Southwestern.

Dr. Richards said the special committee believes the church "does have a vital stake in higher education, but the extent of its committment and the degree of obligation it is willing to assume is not readily apparent.

He said the proposed state tuition grant program "would help, but it alone will not solve the problems"

"There is evidence that some of the clergy have begun to develop a fresh appreciation of the significance of the church-related college," he said, "but lay people do not seem to share this enthusiasm. One of the most obvious needs is reappraisal of the role of the church in higher education. If we solve this, we can take care of the financial problems."

Committee members besides Dr. Richards include Paul Adrian, Salina; the Rev. Charles Curtis, Hays; the Rev. Chester Osborn, now of Newton but Moving soon to Salina; Dr. Charles Barnes, Dodge City; Nancy Eastridge, Wichita, and Ralph Thorne, Hutchinson.

McLouth Votes More Taxes

McLOUTH - Voters in McLouth School District No. 342 have approved a 6-mill increase in property taxes. The vote in a special election was 225 for and 165 against increasing the levy to 31.87 mills.

"This record astounding illustrates a united effort involving federal, state and local co-operation directed by local citizens yet, only 36 per cent of the 29,623,793 cropland

adequately for conservation and erosion control."

Stable Job Market For Ag Graduates

MANHATTAN — An annual survey of job opportunities by 14 Midwestern colleges of agriculture reveals starting salaries this spring are up an estimated 3.2 per cent over a year ago, reports Dr. Carroll V. Hess, dean of the Kansas State University College of Agriculture, one of the participating institutions.

Analyses by placement directors for the North Central Region Colleges of Agriculture reveals that approximately one and a half jobs exist for each available B.S. graduate in agriculture.

Hess says strongest demand for graduates is in sales and management positions, with attractive opportunities also in the food sciences and in vocational agriculture teaching positions in high schools.

For those with advanced degrees, the strongest demand is in food sciences, and in university teaching and research, he adds.

The same survey shows that average montly starting salaries for 1970 graduates were \$682 for those with a bachelor of science, \$822 with State, Lincoln, Michigan State, a master of science, and \$1,122 with a doctor of philosophy. Comparable North Dakota, Ohio State, Purdue, starting salaries for 1969 graduates South Dakota State, Southern were \$661, \$796, and \$1,066 re. Illinois, and Wisconsin universities.

The K-State Career Planning and Placement Center reports starting salaries for recent K-State agricultural graduates to be \$8,400 a year for those with B.S. degrees; \$8,500-\$12,000 for those with M.S. degrees; and \$10,000 to \$15,000 for those with Ph.D degrees. Twentyeight per cent of the firms and agencies which interviewed on campus this year were looking for agricultural graduates.

In 1970 the 14 Midwestern university colleges of agriculture graduated 4,144 students with B.S. degrees, 1,108 with M.S. degrees, and 672 with Ph.D. degrees. These graduates were placed as follows: private industry, 23 per cent; graduate study, 17; teaching and extension, 9; farming and farm management, 10; government work, 7; military services, 21; other, 13.

Court Decision May Strike Out Responsibility Law

The U.S. Supreme Court Monday has struck down a Georgia "Financial responsibility" law that revokes the driver licenses of uninsured motorists who are involved in accidents, regardless of whether they are at fault.

Kansas has a similar law, under which the indefinite suspension of 'quite a few licenses a year" has been effected, according to a spokesman in the State Motor Vehicle Department.

Under present law, a Kansan who is involved in an accident loses his license if he does not buy a liability insurance policy, post a bond or put up cash to show he has "financial responsibility."

The liability rates were increased at the 1971 session from \$10,000 per person; \$20,000 for an accident and \$5,000 for property damage to \$15,000 per person; \$30,000 per accident and \$5,000 for property.

"I would assume that the (high court) decision hits our law too," said Rep. John Hayes, R-Hutchinson, chairman of the House Insurance Committee.

The court, in an opinion issued by Justice William Brennan, Jr., declared that Georgia, and therefore other states, may continue to use its law only if it gives motorists "fault" hearings before revoking their licenses, or if it decides to revoke licenses only after courts have found uninsured motorists liable for damages in civil lawsuits.

Justice Brennan said the "financial responsibility" scheme violates the constitution's due process clause because motorists are stripped of their licenses without an opportunity to show that they were not negligent, although they are liable for damages only if they negligently cause injuries.







Brandt placed the Department of Administration, the largest state agency with jurisdiction over five major state government divisions, into a motor pool operation in

Last month he said his pilot motor pool project proved the pool system "cut about in half" the cost of using state automobiles assigned to his department.

Brandt said in his memo to agency heads, "In a further effort to promote efficiency in the use of state automobiles, a request is made of all agency heads who have state cars under their jurisdiction to make every effort to eliminate all commuting time, i.e., trips between office and home, at the earliest possible time."

The Dept. of Administration director said he had a meeting with representatives of the larger state agencies recently, and that they estimated state cars were used about 10 per cent of the time for 'commuting purposes."

Brandt said state-owned cars are driven a total of about 36 million miles a year. A 10 per cent cutback in driving them would represent a saving of about 3.6 million miles.

Brandt noted in his memorandum the state has clamped a moratorium on the purchase of any new automobiles due to lack of available necessary to restrict the use of state because of a subsidy on cars sold to

"Kansas statutes limit the purchase price of a state automobile to \$2,000," he said in the memo.

"Under existing conditions, it is impossible to purchase automobiles for this amount. Thus, it becomes thereby increasing the life of the turers. automobile," the Brandt memo said.

14 Locks To **Bring Waterway** To Wichita

ARKANSAS CITY-Cost of extending the Arkansas River Navigation system from the port of Catoosa, Okla., to Wichita, by way of Arkansas City, is estimated at 700 million dollars, Lt. Col. E. L. Morris, of the Army Engineers in Tulsa, said.

"Preliminary analysis of the proposed navigation extension into Kansas looks feasible," Morris said, and he added that the Corps of Engineers' feasibility and survey studies are scheduled for completion in 1977. Navigation as far north as Wichita could be a reality in the 1990s, he said.

Morris said several methods of extending the system into Kansas are under study, but the two principal routes in Kansas are past Arkansas City and by the Walnut river to a point near Augusta for a port of Wichita, and the other route is all the way to Wichita by way of the Arkansas river

Morris expressed the opinion that greater savings would be realized by using the Arkansas river route entirely, but that the Arkansas-Walnut route is not yet counted out.

A Plan To Level Out Gas Bills

People who are bugged by high gas bills in the winter can ease their pain a little under a new plan by the Gas Service Co., the Kansas Citybased utility which serves some 735,000 customers in the Midwest, many of them in the G&G area.

Customers of Gas Service can pay their bill on an averaged basis, paying the same amount each month

The plan is optional and available right now. Gas Service calls the plan "LPP," Level Payment Plan.

Probable gas bills for the year are totaled and divided by 12 to arrive at monthly payments. Customers will be billed equal amounts until May of each year, when they will receive a statement to balance the account.



Washington Announces Lifting Of 21-Year Old China Trade Embargo

announced last week that a 21-year old trade embargo on trade to Red China has been lifted.

President Nixon made public the list of exports that U.S. industry may ship to the Communist country under a general license, meaning the products can be shipped without further government approval.

Nixon said the list includes most farm, fish and forestry products, tobacco, fertilizers, coal, selected chemicals, rubber, textiles and some metals.

> This is the way the United States now handles exports considered to be of a strategic nature to the Soviet Union and Eastern Europe. In order to ship products not on the general license list, U.S. exporters must make direct application to the Commerce Department.

Nixon also decided to permit all imports to enter from China under a general license. But he retained authority for future controls in imports if necessary.

"Imports from the People's Republic of China will be subject to the tariff rates generally applicable to goods from most Communist countries," he said.

Nixon announced in April that he was relaxing the embargo on China trade established in December 1950. He said only nonstrategic goods would be permitted for export.

The list of goods permitted under what is termed a general license includes largely nontechnological items with such highly sophisticated products as computers, diesel engines, electronic equipment and jet engines omitted.

Businessmen may ask the government to approve export of items not on the list, but they must obtain a specific license to do so. Although shipment of some of these items has been allowed, approval is slow and uncertain.

Recently, for example, the Commerce Department approved export of \$85 million in trucking equipment of the Soviet Union, after holding back the application for two

In announcing easing of the trade barrier with China, President Nixon included it as part of a general effort to normalize U.S. relations with Peking and end the isolation of the Asian giant from the rest of the

The move certainly won't provide a vast new field of profit for American exporters, not if experience with Soviet Union is a valid measuring stick.

In 1970, U.S. exports to Russia

totaled \$118.5 million, a small part of the United States' more than \$40 billion trade with other countries.

Officials expect trade with China will make up a similarly small part of total U.S. exports, at least in the next few years.

China's trade with non-Communist countries is estimated at \$2 billion, although expanding in recent years.

"The main impetus behind the expansion in this trade was the pressing need in China for technologically advanced machinery, industrial raw materials, fertilizers, and wheat," the Commerce Department said in a recent report.

"In exchange, the free world obtained primarily agricultural materials, textiles, and foodstuffs.'

Another barrier to expanded ('hinese trade is an absence of longterm credit from other countries, forcing China to trade largely "on a eash, short-term or barter basis," the department said.

The United States helped to remove that barrier somewhat when it announced last month it was removing all restrictions on dollar transactions with China.

Without emergency hunger programs last year, Miss Garrity said, there probably would have been widespread hunger and malnutrition, possibly even starvation. This extends not just along




