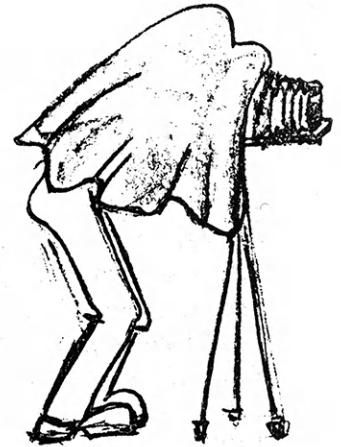

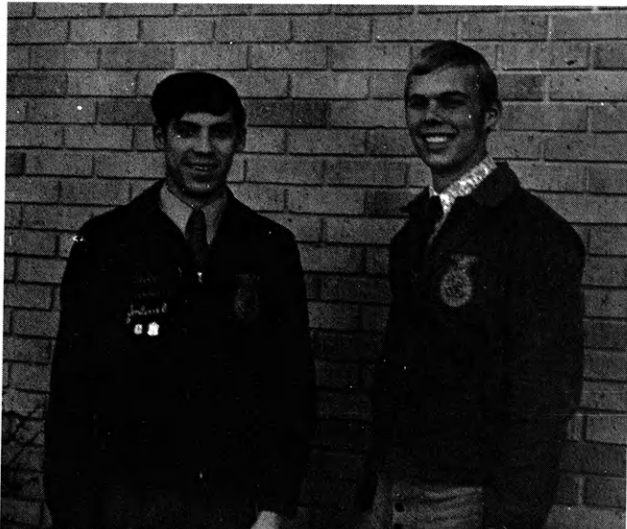

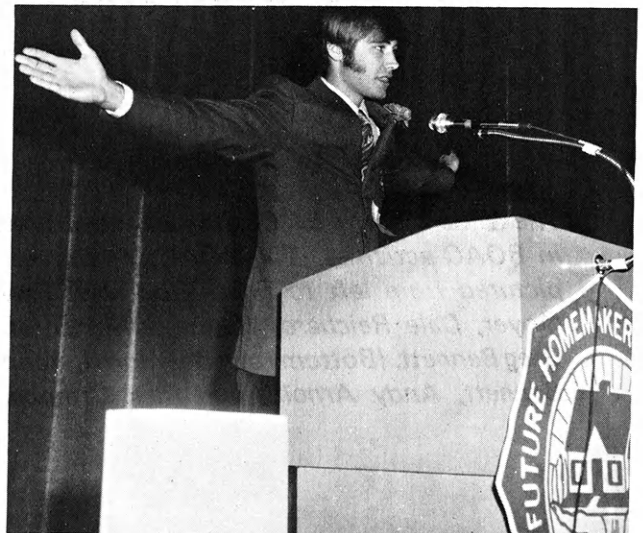

### 1972 STATE FFA PUBLIC SPEAKING CONTEST

State FFA Public Speaking Contest information will be mailed from the Ag. Ed. Office on the Kansas State University campus on May 1, 1972. Entry blanks and three easy to read copies of the manuscript will be due in the Ag. Ed. office, KSU, on May 15, 1972.

The State FFA Public Speaking Contest preliminaries will be May 31, 1972 beginning at 8:30 a. m. in Denison Hall (Room 113A) and Justin Hall (Room 109). The top speaker in each preliminary section will compete at the Wednesday evening session of the State FFA Convention for first and second place in the state.

### FFA SEMINAR, WASHINGTON, D. C.

Dr. James Albracht, Head Teacher Educator at Kansas State University, and Harold Shoaf, State FFA Executive Secretary, were among the 100 adults and student FFA leaders from 48 states and Puerto Rico in Washington, D. C. March 6-9 who participated in an FFA Seminar on adapting the youth organization to the challenges of the '70's. Major topics of discussion at the four day seminar centered on involving FFA members in community development and adapting the organization to changes being made in the high school vo-ag program.

Sponsored by Lilly Endowment, Inc., of Indianapolis, Indiana, as part of the Building Our American Communities program, a major portion of the seminar was devoted to FFA and vocational agriculture involvement in the BOAC community action program. Keynote speakers for the program included James V. Smith of the U. S. D. A. 's Farmers Home Administration; Congressman John Kyl of Iowa, Jerry Baldree, President of the Berrien County, Georgia, FFA Chapter, winner of the National BOAC Award in 1971; Gus Douglas, Commissioner of Agriculture in West Virginia, and Robert Worthington, Associate Commissioner, Vocational and Technical Education, U. S. Office of Education.

Speakers stressed the importance of adapting the FFA to changes in society and in the nation's educational program. They also pointed out the importance

of becoming involved in community development to help provide jobs and make a better life for people in both rural and urban America.

This seminar is only the beginning of the new FFA, relevant and flexible.

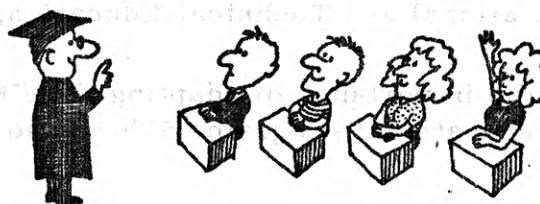

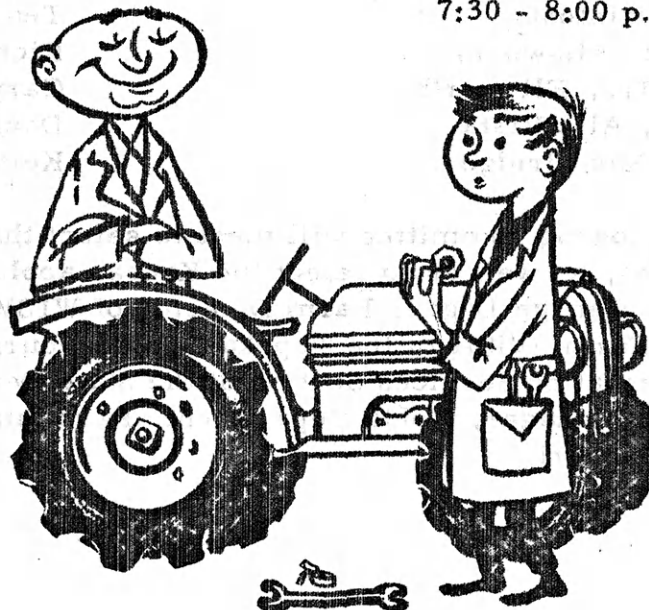

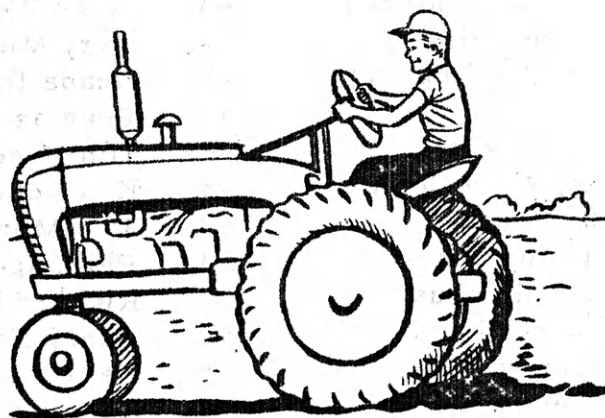
