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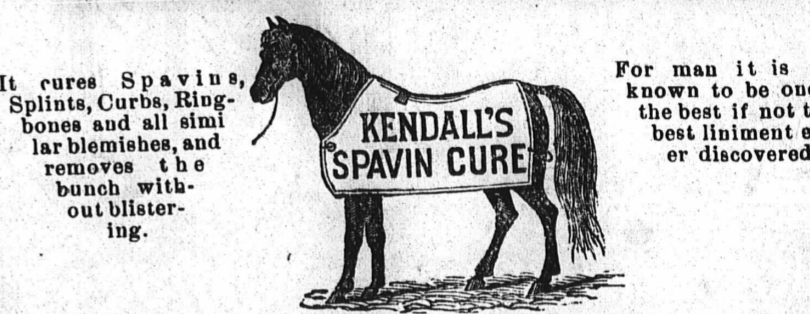

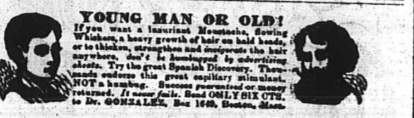
Rev. A. J. May, a senior of Lane University, has secured a position as chief clerk in the State Auditor's office at Topeka.

The first three months of a pig's existence is the most critical, and to its owner, important period of its life, for it is during this time that its constitution is either established, weakened, or destroyed.

Some of the Legal Rights and Duties of the Farmer.

WATER RIGHTS AND DRAINAGE. Water is flowing and fleeing, and the rights of farmers therein are much of the same kind. If a stream of water flows through a farm, the owner has a right to use any reasonable quantity of it as it flows along for watering his stock, irrigating his land, or supply his house for domestic use.

So, if a natural stream becomes obstructed by leaves, sticks, and rubbish, you have a right to go on the land and remove the obstruction, so that the water will flow as freely as before.

The rights and liabilities of farmers in surface water are very different in some States from those in flowing or running streams. By "surface water" is meant not only that which comes from falling rains and melting snows, but also that which oozes out of the ground from springs or marshy places, and which finds its way over the surface or through the tussocks, but is not gathered into a bed or current like a brook or rivulet.

As to the underground water, the law does not recognize any right of ownership therein; and consequently, if your neighbor's well is fed by springs and underground rills from your land, you may dig down on your land to any depth you please, even near to the line; and it, by chance, you cut off the supplies to his well, and leave it dry, he must bear it as well as he can.

TRESPASSING ON THE FARM.

The general rules in regard to trespassing on another's lands are pretty well understood in the community, but on one point there is sometimes an erroneous impression. It is often thought that, if a person simply crosses your land for twenty years, he has by that means acquired a right to continue the practice; but this is far from being universally true.

As to the object in coming into your premises to steal your fruit, etc., that is itself a crime, although he does not accomplish his purpose; and you may put him out by force after notice to leave, using no unnecessary violence.

The recent law authorizing fish commissioners to lease large ponds to private parties, may, of course, modify the former rights of the public therein.

As to salt-water fishing, the law is somewhat peculiar; for although the owner of the upland ordinarily owns the land and the fish, if a person may go there and dig clams or other shell fish, if he can do so by water, and without crossing the upland in going or returning. The Legislature may sometimes abridge or modify this right, but the ordinary rule is as above stated.

Random Hints.

An occasional feed of hard-boiled eggs made fine and mixed with cracker crumbs is good for canary birds. Feed a couple of thimblefuls at a time.

Saleratus is excellent for removing grease from wood-work, shelves, table, etc. Spread thickly over the spots, dampen and let remain a few minutes, and scrub off with soap suds.

Old, clean newspapers are excellent for laying under carpets. Put a light layer of straw upon them. The dust will not arise when sweeping is done, but will pass through into the paper.

When you begin cleaning house take the upper rooms first. Take things easy - a room a day. The work will last longer, to be sure, and so will you.

Starch paste, a little thicker than for clothes, is the best for fastening paper loosened from the walls.

To remove blood-stains from cloth saturate with kerosene, and after standing a little wash in warm water.

It is said that the juice of matured cucumbers will kill bed-bugs. Wash the bedstead, once a week, for two or three weeks and the thing is accomplished.

In baking get the oven sufficiently heated and have the stove contain enough fuel to continue the operation. Added fuel reduces the temperature and checks the process at precisely the time when it should not be checked.

Vinegar will remove the disagreeable odor of kerosene from tin ware.

In trying cakes when you take them out of the fat lay them on a clean piece of coarse brown paper. The paper will absorb much of the fat.

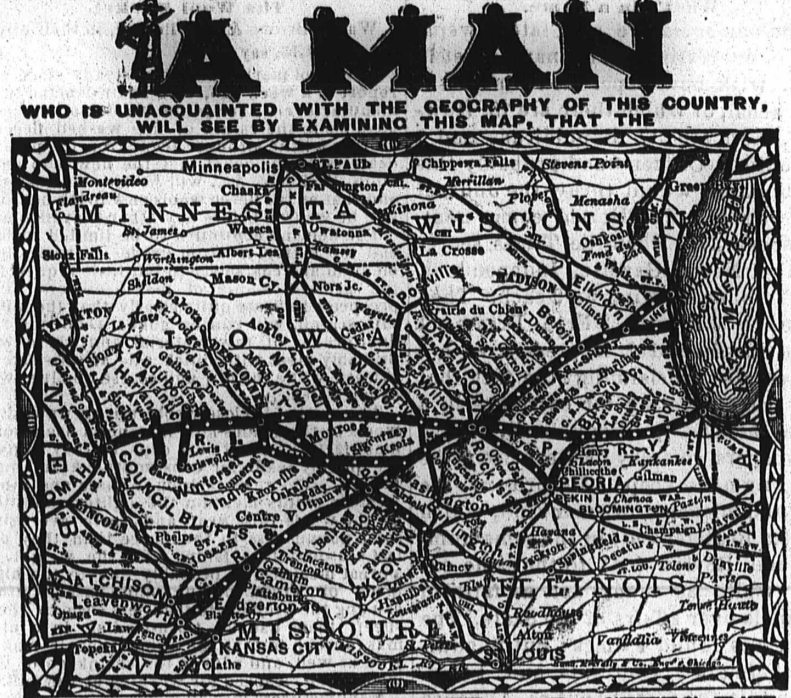
