About 800 Feedlot Permits In By Deadline

More than 800 applications for licenses to operate as commercial feedlots, under control provisions to prevent water pollution, have been received at the offices of the state board of health, officials say.

Vern Heble, chief of the water pollution control section of the board, estimated that the applicalions received covered about 1,300,000 head of cattle being fed in enclosed feeding facilities.

He estimated that from 400 to

600 applications remain to be filed by lot operators and said the department will start compliance activities as soon as the current applications are proces-

Under an act by the 1967 Legislature, feed lot operators were directed to seek permits from the board of health by January 1, 1968. This deadline, however, was extended by the board to give lot operators and the board additional time to comply

Under provisions of the law, feeders are deemed in compliance if they file their application for licensing as directed by the board of health. Heble said he expects almost all of the feeders to file their applications during this week.

After the applications are received, they are checked by resident engineers of the board of health and inspections are made of the sites to determine if there is a water pollution hazard.

If it is found there is no apparent danger of stream pollution the lots are licensed. If it appears there is likely to be stream pollution the engineers will direct that corrective measures be taken and will outline procedures, Heble said. After the hazards are corrected the lots will be licensed to operate, he added.

Heble said feeders have been cooperative in correcting defects in their lots and that there have been few complaints about the requirement of filing applications for permits.

He said the board has been receiving from 50 to 60 applications a day and has been unable to keep up with the mail voler, was in grass, and the Ham- ume.

Area Land Auction Grosses \$425

One of the largest land sales ever held in the G&G area has grossed \$425,000, with the proceeds to go to five charities.

The land, all of it close to Bennington in Ottawa county, totaled 1705 acres, nearly all in cropland and much of it subject to irrigation, averaging close to \$250 per acre.

Sale proceeds, along with other funds in the Eunice Nelson estate, will go to the Asbury hospital in Salina; Kansas Children's Service League; Presbyterian Home for the Aged, Newton; College of Emporia; and a \$25,000 scholarship fund for graduates of Bennington high school, Evan Carman, Mineopolis attorney, said.

Miss Nelson died in September 1966. She was the last of four children of W. B. Nelson, an immigrant from Norway.

The children were Della, Helen, George, and Eunice. Della is the only one who married but she had no children.

her mother's side side was Dent Nelson, also a Norwegian immigrant. Dent Nelson was a prospector and farmer. He searched for gold and silver in the West and Alaska before settling at Eureka, Kansas, where he is buried.

"Miss Nelson was a quiet and unassuming person," Carman recalls. "She wouldn't have liked all the publicity the sale of her estate is getting."

The land sale certainly earned its publicity, with five of the 12 tracts selling for \$200 or more per acre.

The major buyer at the sale was George Frisbie, Gypsum contractor, who bought four tracts of land totaling 541 acres for a gross price of \$172,500. Altho this averaged well over \$300, Frisbie declared. "This land sale was an exceptional opportunity. It's outstanding land, much of it irrigated. I'm disappointed I couldn't buy more.'

Frisbie had been on the sell-Miss Nelson's grandfather on ing end during the month too.

An auction of 960 acres of land he owns in Osborne county was held in mid-March, but Frisbie decided not to sell it.


Organize To Halt Grove Dam

A crash program to halt progress on the proposed Grove Reservoir Dam has been started by people around Silver Lake in western Shawnee coun-

The dam site, which was relocated at the confluence of Soldier and Little Soldier creeks, was originally funded for a site on Soldier Creek just upstream from the Jackson-Shawnee county line.

Albert Glotzbach of Silver Lake said that the organization will hire an attorney to handle legal matters and initiate a leter-writing effort.

The reservoir at the new site would control runoff from 260 square miles and provide water storage yielding more than 20 million gallons daily at minimum usage.

Writer Sylvia Porter Covers Farmers Share Of Food Dollar

The syndicated financial writer Sylvia Porter covered the farmer's share of the market in a column last week, pointing out that for every dollar the consumer spends the farmer gets only 5½ cents of it, only about half as much as he got in 1947

These are the "brutal facts," said Miss Porter, behind the new round of threats of the National Farmers Organization to withhold key food products from the market in order to force up prices they receive.

The tone of the article gave some comfort to farmers who fear that their side of the cost of groceries doesn't often get a good hearing. Miss Porter's column not only suggested sympathy for the NFO effort but for the establishment of a national agricultural relations board at the federal level to serve U.S. farmers in the same way the National Labor Rela-

tions board serves other U.S. workers, or to give farmers a new way to unionize on a national scale.

Miss Porter then gave several examples of what proportion of the food dollar a farmer gets for his product that goes into the final retail item. Here they

Chrysler Market Share Up

Five years ago Chrysler Corporation was producing barely 10 percent of all U.S. cars, and competitors were rather patronizingly wishing it well.

Today, Ford and GM aren't wishing anymore for Chrysler, and they think that the number three carmaker in the country is getting more than its share at 18 percent of the market.

In fact, around Chrysler management there is talk now of getting a 25 percent slice of the car market..

Chrysler hasn't been getting its gain from an overall industry sales increase. Total sales of U.S. made cars have fallen the last two years, so Chrysler is making its gains right where it hurts GM, Ford, and the

Chrysler's surge puzzles many in the car industry. The company has been accused for years of being a couple years behind in styling and many think that

Chrysler products are still too bland and boxy.

How, then, have they gained? At the expense of profits, making more cars but making less per car? In years past Chrysler profit margins have generally been behind Ford and GM. Last year Chrysler's net profit

was 3.2% of sales. GM's figure was 8.1%. Ford's was less than one percent in 1967 because of its strike, but it netted 5.1%

Actually, Chrysler's profit has been rising and Lyn Townsend, board chairman, predicts a wider profit margin as start-up costs of a \$1.7 billion expansion program are mostly behind Chrysler now.

Financial publications like the Wall Street Journal have suggested that Ford and GM management think that Chrysler did not fight hard enough against union demands ine last two bargaining rounds.

In 1964, rivals recall the UAW made Chrysler its first negotiating target. Chrysler avoided a strike by settling at the last minute for the biggest wage and benefit boost the union had ever won. GM and Ford had to match, but both were struck for varying periods over other demands.

Last fall the UAW came to Chrysler after striking Ford for two months. Chrysler settled without a company-wide strike, in part by agreeing to bring wages at its Canadian plants up to U.S. levels. Ford did not grant this concession, and GM's Canadian plants have been struck since February 9.

There does appear little doubt that Chrysler dealers have often been able to sell cars because they deliver them, while Ford and GM were slower in deliver-

Whatever the reasons for its gain, the figures are there to indicate that Chrysler has increased its share of the market. The buyer of any product seldom suffers when competition goes up among manufacturers of any commodity he buys.





CROP PRICES

The crop price index at mid-March was 165 percent of the 1910-14 base period, 1 point above February but 28 points below a year earlier.

Wheat, at \$1.38 per bushel, was 1 cent above February but 25 cents below the previous

Corn averaged \$1.12 per bushel compared with \$1.10 in February and \$1.30 in March of

Oats, at 77 cents, and barley, at \$1.01, were both unchanged from February but 3 cents below a year ago.

Sorghum grain averaged \$1.81 per cwt., up from \$1.78 a month earlier but fell below the \$1.91 per cwt. last year.

Soybeans, at \$2.51 per bushel, were 1 cent above the previous month but 17 cents below last year.

MEAT PRICES

The livestock and livestock products price index was 312 percent of the 1910-14 base at mid-March compared with 307 percent in February and 294 percent last year. The meat animal price index was 370, slightly above the 363 percent in February and moderately above the 342 percent above last year.

Hogs brought \$17.90 per cwt., 80 cents below February but 10 cents above last year.

Beef cattle, at \$23.80 per cwt., were 70 cents above the previous month and \$2.10 above last year. Steers and heifers brought \$25.00 per cwt., slightly above the \$24.60 in February and well above the \$22.80 last



When Choosing Carpet

However, the margin for error can be eliminated with some attention to individual home needs and some easily knowledge of these important on your home furnishings list.

First on the list is color. If you're going to be pleased with your carpet over a number of years, you must be satisfied with its appearance.

It is essential to pick a carpet or style you really like. Perhaps it is not so surprising that more mistakes can be made on the side of timidity than otherwise. 

Payoff In Large Litter

MANHATTAN - Hog producers hear continually of the importance of increasing litter size to improve profits. But is the careful management necessary to obtain larger litters worth all the efforts?

A Kansas State University Extension economist believes the answer to this question is "yes."

with Massate Scanomists

Wilton B. Thomas has made a study of the costs and returns involved.

For example, he found that management return per litter sale price minus cost - averaged \$47 for a six-pig litter, \$73 for a seven, \$101 for an eight, and \$130 for a nine-pig litter.

Thomas calls this difference of \$57 a "management premium." For the producer who can average nine pigs in each of 50 litters, the figure is \$2,850.

At the other extreme, cost of producing a litter was \$17 less for six pigs than for seven. Difference in return was \$26. So the "management penalty" for six-pig litters is \$1,300 for 50 lit-

ABILENE — The bankrupt Abilene Flour Mills Co. here has been sold to Archer-Daniels-Midland Milling Co., Minneapolis.

Officials did not reveal the purchase price.

The sale needs approval of several contract clauses by all concerned parties, according to W. O. Brooks, Wichita federal receiver.

The conditions include:

Ability to consummate a

lease - or lease-purchase agreement - for a grain storage terminal adjacent to the mill.

 Reaching an agreement on a new labor union contract.

 Assignment of proper leases on Union Pacific Railroad right-of-way.

The sale must be approved by the Federal District Court, Wi-

Brooks said that with court approval the sale could be completed by April 15. Company officials have not announced when production would resume.

The sale includes the com-

pany's main milling plant, and storage tanks north of it.

A 2,084,000 bushel storage terminal, built in 1959, is not included. However, it will be operated by the new owners. It is owned by 14 former employees of Abilene Flour Mills Co.

An office building also was not included in the sale.

Total grain storage capacity at the mills will be three million bushels, officials said.

The new owners indicated that a small office staff will be employed here, but most bookwork will be done in Minneapolis.

The number of Americans living on farms, continued to decline last year to 10,817,000 about one out of every 18 persons, the Census Bureau has re-

This estimate is 778,000 lower than the 11,595,000 persons the bureau figures lived on farms in 1966.

The farm population represented about 51/2 per cent of the total estimated population last year of 197.4 million.

The survey was based on averages for a 12-month period, centered on April of 1967.

Negroes comprised about 12 per cent of the total farm population and their numbers cantinued to decline at a faster rate than whites - 10 per cent between 1960 and 1967 compared with 4.5 per cent for whites.



Woodbine Group Will Try For Third Time 2-Mill Levy Proposal

WOODBINE - Lyons Creek construction from a two-mill Watershed District will try for a third time to implement a method of financing watershed

tax levv

The board of directors has adopted a resolution for a maximum two-mill levy on all taxable tangible property within the watershed. It would finance all costs, including improvements in the modified general work plan.

Voters have twice rejected financing plans after valid protest petitions were filed by 20 per cent of the district's land-

A request for federal funds has been held up by the state because a local method of financing has not been approved. The work plan provides 55 floodwater retarding structures. The federal government will finance 22 at a cost of \$1.8 million.

A multipurpose structure at Herington, which will provide a municipal water supply and recreation area, will cost \$765,-000. The government will pay \$410,000 and Herington will provide \$355,000.

Hayes B. Beck of Junction City, district president, said a Kansas Supreme Court ruling last month held that funds derived from the two-mill levy may be used to finance improvements. This opened the way for adoption of the new resolu-

The district is currently levying two mills for administrative and engineering expenses. A portion of these funds, under the new resolution, will be used for improvements, Beck said.

"In two previous elections there was considerable fear and many rumors among the voters that the two-mill levy would be in addition to the presently authorized levy of two mills, making a possible levy of four mills," Beck said.

"It is not the intent or desire of the board to levy more than two mills and the resolution directly specifies that the levy for all purposes cannot exceed two

Honor Three State Sheepmen

Three Kansas sheepmen were honored for outstanding management at the annual Sheep Day on the Kansas State University campus. They are Robert W. Lukens and J. W. Severence, Beloit; and Harold W. Heitschmidt, Natoma.

These men were top in the Kansas Market Lamb Production Program sponsored by Kansas Farmer magazine in cooperation with KSU. They represent outstanding accomplishments in the percent of lamb crop and the weight of lambs when marketed, V. E. McAdams, Extension livestock specialist, said in presenting each with a trophy.

Lukens is sweepstakes winner for excellence in management. A special trophy was given for this honor. Lukens has 233 head of western ewes and raised 111 per cent lamb crop last year. He utilized native, brome, and sudan pasture in the summer phase. Lambs were marketed at an average of 101 pounds.

Severance owns 218 western ewes, and Heitschmidt has 240 westerns. Each produced 105 per cent lamb crop. Heitschmidt marketed lambs at an average weight of 93 pounds, and Severance's lambs averaged 101 pounds.

Native sudan pastures were used by Severance, and Heitschmidt utilized native, brome, and alfalfa pasture.

Each of these top sheep producers use Hampshire rams.

This production program has been conducted the past 17 years. Main purpose is to encourage and recognize master ewe flock managers in Kansas.







ARMY CUTWORMS: The first reports of any army cutworms damaging wheat (12-16 per foot of row) were reported from Rooks County.

March 9-15: One wheat field in Ottawa county had army cutworms 3-5 per sq. ft. 1/4 of the examined fields in Lincoln, Ellsworth, Rice, Kingman, Sedgwick, Sumner, Harvey and Dickinson counties showed less than 1 cutworm per sq. ft.

Yellowing wheat (soil borne mosaic? or lacking nitrogen) with some army cutworms was reported from Stafford, Rice and Pawnee counties.

March 15-22: Army cutworms ranged from 1-10 per foot of row in Cowley county, 0-2 per row in Sumner county. Wheat growth east of Pratt-Ellis counties is abundant enough to take considerable cutworm feeding (4-5 per linear foot). The crow population through the central area should be a factor in destroying cutworm populations.

PALE WESTERN CUT-WORMS: A report just in from Les DePew saying that there are some pale western cutworms showing up in Finney county. This could be a potentially serious problem in view of the small plant growth and lack of moisture that exists in much of the western area.

GREENBUGS: The fall infestation of greenbugs in central and western Kansas was greater than had been observed for many years. Some fields were destroyed by greenbug feeding before winter dormancy of plants. They survived temperatures of -16 degrees in northern Kansa sand 7 degrees in southwest Kansas.

January 16-19: Live greenbugs 1 to 10 per foot of row found in Sedgwick, Sumner and Harper counties.

Jan. 20-26: 5 to 15 per foot of row in Phillips, Rooks Smith and Osborne counties. One field in Phillips county had 40-50 per foot of row.

February 3-9: Light numbers 1 to 10 per foot of row found in Finney, Kearny, Grant, Stevens, Seward, Meade, Clark and Commanche counties.

February 10-16: (a) Phillips county populations 25 to 50 per linear foot; (b) 0 to 9 per foot of row in Kingman, Pratt, or Edwards counties; (c) None were found in Barton, Rush, Russell, Ellsworth or Rice.

March 9-15: Phillips county population dropped to 0 to 2 per foot of row. None found in Lincoln, Ellsworth, Rice, Kingman, Sedgwick, Sumner, Harvey, Marion or Dickinson coun-

GRASSHOPPER OUTLOOK:

Last year's fall survey indicated a rise in grasshopper populations. The fall survey indicates where farmers and ranchers should closely watch. The areas are indicated on the map below.

The 1965 fall survey showed no infested areas in Kansas; 50,000 acres in the fall survey of 1966; and 625,000 acres in the fall survey of 1967. An infestation is considered to be of economic importance when as many as 8 grasshoppers per square yard are found.



A Possible Breakthru In Gold Mining

Development of a new process for extracting gold from previously unworkable ores, a breakthrough that might open huge new gold deposits to mining, has been announced by the U.S. Bureau of Mines.

If successful, use of the pro-cess could help meet the gold needs of U.S. industry, but it would scarcely dent the Treasury's gold-stock shortages.

An 8000-square-mile area of Nevada, the Bureau said, is known to contain gold-rich ores which contain carbon compounds that hang on to gold so tightly that conventional cyanide process can't extract it economically.

its Metallurgy Research Center in Reno have invented "an aqueous chemical treatment" to break up the gold-carbon love affair; once that is done, the cyanide process can extract the gold.

The new method is said to permit economical recovery of 90 to 90 per cent of the gold in these ores, compared with previous recovery of only 20 to 35 percent.

But so far it has been performed only in the laboratory. Pilot scale tests are being conducted, the Bureau said.

The bureau said the carbonaceous ores of Nevada are believed to contain some 10 million to 30 million ounces of gold, compared with the nation's known reserves of some 9.4 million ounces economically mineable by present methods.



A Freight Cut On Export Grain

An Interstate Commerce Commission board has decided to permit the Chicago, Rock Island & Pacific Railroad to reduce rates about 17 per cent on wheat and grain sorghum destined for export.

The lower rates became effective April 6, but ICC observers said they expect other railroads and several trade associations to appeal and therefore block the reduction

The lower rates would be effective on grains shipped from Kansas, Missouri, Nebraska, Oklahoma and New Mexico to Galveston, Houston and Texas City, Tex.

Ask For State Watershed **Funds Back**

Rep. Garner E. Shriver, R-Kan., and Thad Kinnaman, Cedar Vale, Kans., representing the watershed districts of Kansas, last week urged Congress to restore budget funds cut by President Johnson for watershed planning and construction for fiscal 1969 beginning July

Shriver and Kinnaman appeared before the House of Representatives appropriations agriculture committee.

The two Kansans requested that \$10 million be allowed for

watershed planning and \$125 million for construction.

Kinnaman told the committee that Kansas watershed district administrators sent their thanks to the committee for previous appropriations.

He outlined the number of projects which had been completed with previous appropriations and that maintenance expenses now were being borne by the members of the local watershed districts.

He assured the committee that Kansas watershed project sponsors were capable and ready to fulfill their responsibilities in the federal-state partnership as had been demonstrated by the projects already complet-

He pointed out that the greatest need now was for construction funds and that many planned structures were awaiting action by the present Congress to give approval to such funds.


